Participation in programs designed to promote outreach	WETM-TV "Weather Wisdom" Program: Each week during the school year WETM Chief Meteorologist Joe Pasquarelli or another WETM meteorologist visits area schools in the Twin Tiers. Mr. Pasquarelli teaches a two day lesson plan about the weather in each school he visits. Each lesson is approximately 45 minutes. On the last day of his visit, WETM videotapes a selected student asking a weather question, then plays the question on air with Mr. Pasquarelli providing the answer live on-air. During this reporting period Mr. Pasquarelli made over 60 visits to approximately 30 schools, teaching weather and meteorology to more than 1,500 students.
