### Can SU Garden Party Continue?

Syracuse's somewhat improbable and dramatic march through the BIG EAST Conference Tournament reaches its peak on March 11 when the Orange face off with Pittsburgh in the championship game.

SU will defend its 2005 title despite entering the tournament as the number nine seed. No previous ninth-rated team has reached the final. For the first time in the 27-year history of the event, a team will win four games. Both Syracuse and Pittsburgh have won three straight days.

The Orange are in the BIG EAST Tournament title tilt for the 13th time. Syracuse won the championship in 1981, 1988, 1992 and 2005. Pittsburgh is the final for the fifth time in the last six years. The Panthers won in 2003.

Pittsburgh defeated Syracuse during the regular season, 80-67. The Panthers have won the last three pairings with the Orange. SU leads the overall series, 60-33, and owns a 3-1 edge in BIG EAST Tournament encounters with Pittsburgh.

Coach Jamie Dixon's club features senior guard Carl Krauser (15.0 ppg., 4.7 avg.) and junior Aaron Gray (13.8 ppg., 10.5 rpg.). The duo has started all 30 games for Pitt.

## GMAC Mania! SU Beats Hoyas

For the third consecutive day Syracuse defeated a foe it had lost to during the season and advanced in the BIG EAST Conference Tournament. This time it was SU beating Georgetown, 58-57, and earning a spot in the tourney title game against Pittsburgh.

The latest Orange victory had drama similar to the previous two in the event -- the buzzer-beater against Cincinnati and the overtime win versus top-ranked Connecticut. Syracuse did not take the lead until its last basket, a duece created by a **Matt Gorman** steal, a dynamic left-handed pass by **Gerry McNamara** and **Eric Devendorf's** layup with 9.3 seconds left.

Syracuse recovered from a 15-point halftime deficit to win, its most significant comeback of the campaign.

Once again, the victory was orchestrated by **McNamara**. After a first half that saw him play just 12 minutes and score two points, **McNamara** jump-started the Orange with a three-ball to begin the second-half scoring. By the 10 minute mark, the Hoya advantage had been trimmed to four, 45-41, and **McNamara** had tallied four treys and an assist.

**Gorman**, who played 18 minutes in the second half tied the score at 49-49 with a three-pointer off a **McNamara** pass at the 7:18 mark.

Georgetown answered with an 8-4 spurt and led 57-53 heading into the final two minute.

Following an SU timeout, **McNamara** drilled his fifth three-pointer of the half with 48 ticks left. Georgetown ran down the shot clock but was unable to find an opening in Syracuse's 2-3 zone and **Gorman's** steal set up the finish.

**Gorman** equaled his career-high by logging 23 minutes and added six points and five rebounds.

## Another McNamara Miracle!

**Gerry McNamara** continued his storybook run at the end of his collegiate career by leading SU past #1/1 Connecticut, 86-84 in overtime, in the BIG EAST Conference Tournament quarterfinals on March 9. **McNamara's** three-pointer from NBA distance with five seconds left in regulation pushed the contest into the extra session and his three free throws in the final 1:15 helped secure the upset. **McNamara** finished with 17 points and a career-high 13 assists, just one dish shy of the BIG EAST Tournament record.

It marked the second time in program history that the Orange had knocked off the nation's number one team -- on February 1, 1999 Syracuse defeated top-rated Connecticut, 59-42.

For the second consecutive game, Syracuse benefitted from five starters who produced double-digit scoring. Frontcourt performers **Demetris Nichols** and **Terrence Roberts** helped SU get off to a great start with 13 and 12 points, respectively in the first half alone as the Orange jumped out 10-0 and led at the intermission, 39-28. **Darryl Watkins** had 12 of his 14 points after the first half, including a three-point play and two additional free throws in overtime.

**Nichols** finished with 17 points, his top scoring effort since he had 24 against Rutgers on February 1. **Roberts** had 16 points and seven rebounds and **Watkins** had a club-best eight boards and three blocked shots. **Eric Devendorf** had 13 points, including a key layup in overtime.

The SU defense limited the high-powered Connecticut offense to .303 (23-of-76) shooting from the field. The Huskies were 2-of-15 in the overtime period.

## SU 1,000 Point Scorers

Syracuse had been steam-rolled by the Huskies during the regular season by margins of eight and 23 points but managed to defeat Connecticut in the BIG EAST Tournament for the second consecutive season. In 2005 the triumph came in the semifinals.

SU got key contributions from reserves **Louie McCroskey**, who had four points and six rebounds, and **Josh Wright**, who had five points.

**McNamara** moved past Sherman Douglas into fifth on the school's career scoring list. He played 41 minutes in the game and moved into a tie in career minutes played at SU with 4,688, equaling Derrick Coleman. He had the 101st double-digit scoring game of his tenure, tying Hakim Warrick for fifth at Syracuse. **McNamara** also upped his career assist total to 634, passing Adrian Autry and moving within three of Pearl Washington in third place.

## McNamara Saves The Day!

Gerry McNamara, fresh off a final regular-season home game that featured 29 points against Villanova, added another clip to his personal highlight reel in the opener of the BIG EAST Tournament on March 8.

McNamara dribbled upcourt and, with time running out, split the Cincinnati defense and drained a three-point basket to give SU a 74-73 victory. The ball went through with .5 seconds left in the contest, securing the triumph.

McNamara led five SU players in double digits with 17 points and added nine assists and three steals. Terrence Roberts added 16 points and nine rebounds, Darryl Watkins had a career-best 15 points and seven boards, Eric Devendorf contributed 12 points and Demetris Nichols finished with 10. It was the second time this season the Orange had five players in double digits.

Syracuse and Cincinnati had split their two regular-season matchups, eaching winning on the opposition's home court.

It was the second time in the 27-year history of the BIG EAST Tournament that SU played in the event's first game. Syracuse won the other time as well, defeating Notre Dame in 1997.

The win game SU 20 victories for the 28th time in Coach Jim Boheim's 30-year tenure.
