

US Embassy in Tripoli to Open Visa Section on August 27

Tripoli- In a long awaited move, the United States embassy in Tripoli has announced Thursday that it will be opening the visa section on 27 August.

In an op-ed, the American ambassador to Tripoli Mr. J. Christopher Stevens announced that "the Consular Section will offer a full range of services, including nonimmigrant visas for travel to the United States and services to American citizens who reside in Libya."

Mr. Stevens said "'Ahlan wa sahlan,' You are welcome in America."

He also said Libyans may begin scheduling visa interviews using a simple, online process that they can find on the visa section's website at http://libya.usembassy.gov/visa s.html.

Stevens said since his returning to Libya as Ambassador in May 2012, one
