# Introduction

### **Neighbourhood Profiles**

Neighbourhood profiles have been developed as the first step in the neighbourhood planning process and ultimately towards producing comprehensive neighbourhood plans. The profiles focus on individual neighbourhood planning areas, which are made up of one or more neighbourhoods and surrounding open spaces, and describe the key characteristics of the area using statistical evidence from a range of sources. The profiles play an important part in the identification of issues and priorities within neighbourhoods.

#### Neighbourhood Plans

Neighbourhood plans are intended to tackle issues particular to a neighbourhood, ensuring that local services are co-ordinated, effective and are accountable to local people, meeting their expectations. Plans are pivotal in joining up service delivery at a local level and narrowing the gap for the most disadvantaged communities.


Plans initially examine the characteristics of each neighbourhood through the completion of a neighbourhood profile. The plans then describe and evaluate the services that are delivered there. The plans will also identify the issues experienced by local people and will ultimately form an action plan for tackling the challenges identified.

The five key stages are described below:

- Stage 1 Creation of a baseline report or neighbourhood profile, outlining the neighbourhood characteristics, assets and issues.
- Stage 2 Gathering the views of elected representatives.
- Stage 3 Creation of a service profile describing the service offer in each neighbourhood.
- Stage 4 Consultation process with local people that gathers issues and challenges facing the neighbourhood and residents views of service delivery.
- Stage 5 Formation of an action plan for the neighbourhood.

### Sheriff Hill Neighbourhood Profile


This profile primarily uses neighbourhood level data. In some instances data is only available at other geographical levels such as wards and Lower Layer Super Output Areas, which are boundaries created by the Office for National Statistics to present Census and other data for small areas. However, whatever geography has been used, all tables show all of the geographical units within or substantially within the neighbourhood management area and highlight in red, the neighbourhoods within Sheriff Hill neighbourhood planning area. In addition, all tables indicate the Gateshead average as well as highest and lowest values. All of the VI maps display the area covered by the plan area in blue and the five maps below identify neighbourhood, plan area, LLSOA and pre 2004 ward boundaries for reference purposes. Where necessary geographic units containing data on less than 5 individuals have been excluded to prevent disclosure.

There are 25 Lower Layer Super Output Areas (LLSOA's) in Central. LLSOA's contain a minimum of 1,000 residents and around 1,500 on average.



# Demographic Profile Sheriff Hill Plan Area

Sheriff Hill is located in Central Gateshead. It is located within the wards of Deckham, Windy Nook & Whitehills and High Fell.

Sheriff Hill has a population of around 5,051. 47% are males and 53% are females.

29% of the population are young people aged 0-19. However, 15% of the population are older people aged 65+

2.0% of people in Sheriff Hill are from a BME group. 41% of those in a BME group are from the Asian or Asian British ethnic group.


In terms of health, 15% of the population say they are not in good health. 27% of the population say they have a limiting long term illness.

55% of households have no car or van.





Tables only show those units within or substantially within the area. In addition, tables indicate the Gateshead average, high and low values.

Overall Vitality Index (Gateshead quintiles)


The Gateshead Vitality Index identifies and monitors the quality of life in areas across the borough. The Index ranks 84 of the 85 neighbourhoods in Gateshead on the basis of quality of life indicators, including income, crime, education, health, housing and unemployment.

In Sheriff Hill, 1 neighbourhood falls within the lowest performing 20% in Gateshead as measured by the overall Vitality Index quality of life indicators (20% equates to 17 neighbourhoods in Gateshead).



Proportion of 45-64 year olds in neighbourhoods (Gateshead quintiles)






Proportion of 0-19 year olds in neighbourhoods (Gateshead quintiles)






Proportion of all pensioner households in neighbourhoods (Gateshead quintiles) (Source: Census - 2001)





#### Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) measures areas of deprivation nationally. It ranks 32,482 Lower Layer Super Output Areas (LLSOA's) in England on the basis of quality of life indicators. 1 of the 2 LLSOA's in Sheriff Hill was within the top 5%. None were within the top 10%. 1 was within the top 20%.


