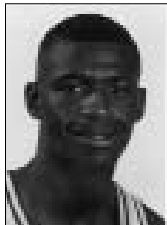

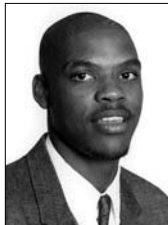

Want a great shot at playing in the NBA? Then play for the Crimson Tide. The University of Alabama was nicknamed the NBA's Pipeline by *Sports Illustrated* because of the large number of players it has pumped into the NBA — ten since 1992 — including 2001 1st-round draft pick Gerald Wallace and its most recent, 2003 2nd round pick Mo Williams.

Alabama players have played on 31 different NBA teams.

Alabama's men are among the most successful and the biggest names in the NBA, and include six-time NBA World Champion Robert Horry, 2000 U.S. Olympic Gold Medalist Antonio McDyess and Latrell Sprewell — one of the league's best.

A total of **38** University of Alabama men's basketball players have taken their game to the NBA and dozens more have found basketball success in Europe and professional leagues around the U.S.

In 1999, Alabama ranked fifth nationally and first in the Southeastern Conference in the number of players on the NBA's active rosters. Going into the fall of 2005, the Tide had six active players in the NBA, Robert Horry (San Antonio), Latrell Sprewell (Minnesota), Antonio McDyess (Detroit), Gerald Wallace (Charlotte), Mo Williams (Milwaukee) and Kennedy Winston (Memphis).

**Fourteen** University of Alabama players have been first-round draft picks. From the 1992 through the 1996 drafts, Alabama had a first-round draft pick each of those years. In 1992 and again in 1995, the Tide produced two first-round selections.

- **Latrell Sprewell** donated \$100,000 to Madison Square Garden's Cheering for Children Foundation, the largest single donation in the foundation's history.
- **Robert Horry** is only the 2nd player in NBA history to win world titles with three different teams (Lakers, Rockets & Spurs) and he ranks 1st (behind Michael Jordan) in NBA Finals history in career 3-point shots made.

### HORRY CAREER NOTES

**NBA Highlights:** Owner of six NBA World Championship rings; Only current player in the NBA to have that many: three with the Lakers (2000, 2001 and 2002), two with Houston (1994 and 1995), and, his latest, 2005 with San Antonio...Holds the NBA Playoffs record for most 3-point field goals made in a game without a miss (7 of 7 against the Utah Jazz in Game 2 of the 1997 Western Semifinal)...Holds the NBA Finals record for most steals in a game with 7 against the Orlando Magic in Game 2 of the 1995 NBA Finals...Ranks 1st in NBA Finals history with 38 3-point shots made... Has played in 198 career play-off games ...Ranks fifth in Rockets franchise history in 3-point field goal percentage (.365) and 6th in blocked shots (.343)...Set a Rockets franchise record with 9 3-pointers against Cleveland on 2-22-96 and set a single-season career high with 142 three-pointers made...Scored career-high 40 points (8 3-ptrs) against Milwaukee on 11-16-95...NBA All-Rookie 2nd Team in 1992-93...The first Rockets' rookie to average in double figures since Olajuwon...A 1st round pick by the Rockets in 1992 and was traded with Sam Cassell, Mark Bryant and Chucky Brown to the Phoenix Suns for Charles Barkley in August 1996. 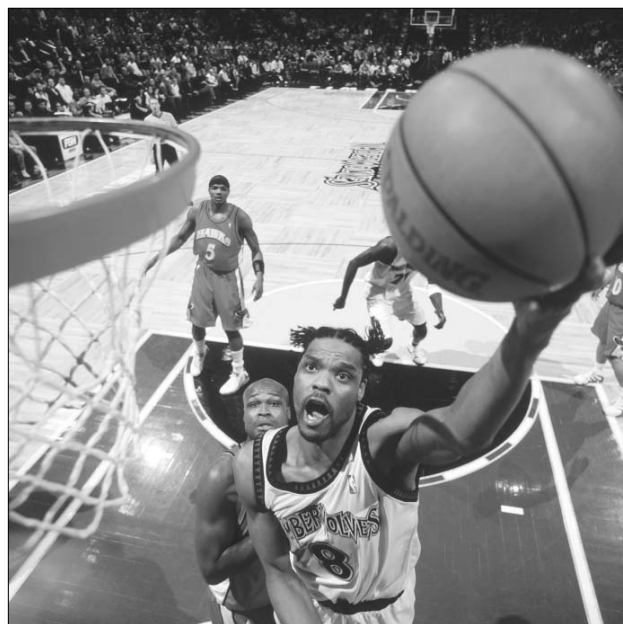

### MCDYESS NOTES

**NBA Highlights:** 2001 NBA All-Star...Gold Medal winning member of USA's 2000 Olympic team...3rd team All-NBA in 1998-99...Helped Detroit to 2005 NBA Finals...Led Denver in 1999 in scoring (21.2 ppg, 9th in the NBA) and rebounding (10.7 rpg, 7th in the NBA) as well as blocked shots, steals & double-doubles...1995-96 NBA All-Rookie 1st team, ranking 6th among NBA rookies in scoring (13.4 ppg) and 3rd in rebounding (7.5)...Recorded the 2nd-most blocked shots (114) of any rookie in Nuggets history...Competed in the Schick Rookie Game during the 1996 NBA All-Star Weekend in San Antonio...Led Suns with 19 double-doubles in 1996-97 season...Career highs are 46 points & 21 rebounds (twice)...Was NBA Player of the Week for 2/28/99 when he averaged 24.2 ppg, 12.2 rpg, 3.60 bpg and 1.6 spg...Has 42-inch vertical leap and one-step leap of 47 inches...A 1st round pick by Denver in 1995, he was traded by the Clippers with Randy Woods to Denver for Rodney Rogers and Brent Barry in June 1995...Nuggets traded him to Phoenix in a three-way deal with Cleveland for three 1st round picks, two 2nd round picks and an undisclosed amount of cash in October 1997.
