# INTRODUCTION

Based in and around Croydon and surrounding regions, there are many LGBT organisations which exist but are hard to access due to lack of knowledge of their existence and due to accessibility of these community and supportive LGBT organisations and networks.









# THIS DIRECTORY AIMS TO:

- Raise the profile of LGBT organisations which exist and the services/support they provide
- Raise awareness of LGBT organisations not just in Croydon (which are limited), but a wide range of organisations within easy community distance from Croydon in Central and Greater London, as well as Brighton
- Be a valuable source of information for ALL LGBT's and their families.

# CROYDON REGION:

- Croydon Police Community Safety Unit (CSU) is based at South Norwood Police Station ■ 020 8649 1265. The Safety Unit has Lesbian and Gay Liaison Officers specifically trained to assist victims of hate crime. Liaison Officers from the Safety Unit have been working with the LGBT community to find ways of reducing hate crime which have resulted in the initiatives listed on the Croydon anti homophobia website. In emergency ■ 999.
- The police also hold surgeries between 5pm and 8pm at the Goose and Carrot Public House (Windmill Bridge) on the 1st Tuesday and 3rd Thursday each month. For further information call the Police Community Safety Unit on \$\infty\$ 020 8649 1265.
- Lesbian and Gay Liaison Officers are part of a commitment by the Metropolitan Police Service in conjunction with the LGBT Advisory Group. About 6 are currently in post in Croydon and their main roles are:
- 1. To be a point of contact for LGBT communities and venues
- **2.** A borough resource to assist other officers in the investigation of incidents that affect LGBT people by providing specialist knowledge.
- **3.** Developing close links with the LGBT communities to build trust and confidence in the policing of the borough.
- **4.** To work in partnership with LGBT communities to assist in forming strategies to combat hate crime.

It is the role of the investigating officer (usually from the Community Safety Unit) to investigate the crime. The Liaison Officer will assist and provide support for victims where appropriate. Contact the CSU

# Sexual Health/HIV services & support

Many sexually transmitted infections are curable, and all are treatable to some extent, so it is vital to have a sexual health check up with one of the services listed if you have any symptoms, or if you think you have been at risk of infection.

The GUM clinic is a free, confidential and non-judgmental service which provides:

- treatment for all sexually transmitted infections
- information and advice on HIV, other STIs and sexual health
- confidential HIV testing
- counselling and support with specialist health advisors
- Specialist HIV services including Consultant clinics, HIV nurse specialist clinics, services for adults and children
- Emergency contraception
- Separate male/female clinics and access to male or female doctors (check who will be on duty)
- Walk-in service no appointment needed, although it is advisable to telephone and book an appointment if possible, as the clinci gets very busy and you may not be seen on the day if you just turn up towards the end of a clinic
