In 2007, she pursued a Master's of Public Health degree at American Public University System after completing a BS degree from SUNY New Paltz. She began her career as a Microbiologist and advanced from managing a large microbiology lab to serving as a Foreign Service Officer for the U.S. Department of State addressing health, food and water concerns stateside and overseas.

Kim's work responsibilities as a Foreign Service Officer require that she travel internationally often. Distance education made it possible for her to continue her education. In September 2009, Kim completed her master's program, graduating with Honors and a perfect 4.0 GPA.

Earlier this spring at the U.S. Embassy in Mexico City, Kim collected samples during the H1N1 outbreak for a study by the Army Research Institute. The samples turned out to be the most complete genetic sequence as well as the first confirmed instance of person-to-person transmission.

Megan Tate is almost completely blind due to retinolental fibroplasia of prematurity, a disease of the eye caused by disorganized growth of retinal blood vessels leading to retinal scarring and detachment. Tate previously had difficulty in other educational environments. Her grandmother found Hadley on a homeschooling mailing list when her family decided to search for other options. She enrolled at Hadley in 2003 at the age of 14.

Hadley is a distance education school that provides coursework to people who are blind and visually impaired, their family members, and professionals working in the blindness field. Hadley's courses allowed Megan to study at her own pace and work one-on-one with her instructors.

After graduating from Hadley, Tate enrolled at Liberty University, in Virginia, to study theology. She is pursuing a career as a fiction writer and southern Gospel singer.

"Hadley has taught me skills I can use in my daily life. The courses fueled a new love for learning that I will carry with me for the rest of my life. I am the first person in my immediate family to graduate from high school and my diploma means the world to me."

Upon returning from a high priority Special Operations mission in Iraq, Mr. Gregory A.
