GAME PREVIEW

The state's lone NCAA Division I football programs square off once again this week as the University of Delaware and Delaware State take part in the Route 1 Rivalry with the winner earning the First State Cup.

This week's game is the third regular season installment of this series, which began with an NCAA FCS first-round playoff matchup back in 2007 when Delaware won 44-7.

Delaware has won all three meetings by an average win margin of 30.6 points per game, including a 27-17 win in 2009 and a 45-0 victory last season.

Both teams enter this week's game having posted a victory in their season opener last weekend. Delaware downed long-time rival West Chester 41-21 on Thursday night in Delaware Stadium while Delaware State knocked off Virginia Military Institute 17-10 Saturday in Dover.

FIRST STATE CUP

The University of Delaware and Delaware State University, the only NCAA Division I programs in the state of Delaware, will faceoff on the gridiron for only the fourth time in history and the third time during the regular season as they square off in the officially named: The First State Cup.

The First State Cup was adopted as the official name of the game after a name-it promotion was conducted by *The News Journal* and delawareonline.com during the summer of 2009.

The First State Cup Trophy will be presented to the winning team following the contest.

Delaware vs. Delaware State contests are scheduled to take place each year into the future.

Currently scheduled dates are Sept. 7, 2013, and Sept. 6, 2014, both at Delaware Stadium. Specific dates for games after 2014 will be announced as they become available.

NATE BEASLEY GAME MVP AWARD

The most outstanding player in this year's Delaware-Delaware State matchup will once again receive the **Nate Beasley MVP Award**.

Media members who cover the game will have the opportunity to place their vote for the game Most Valuable Player Award and select the winner.

The MVP award is presented each year as part of the postgame ceremonies that will also include the presentation of the First State Cup Trophy to the head coach and captains of the winning team.

Delaware quarterback **Tim Donnelly** received the inaugural Nate Beasley Award in 2011 after throwing for 221 yards and two touchdowns in a 45-0 Blue Hen victory.

The award is named in honor of the late **Nate Beasley**, a standout running back for the Blue Hens in 1973-75 who started his playing career at Delaware State.

A native of Dover, Del., Beasley was inducted into the University of Delaware Athletics Hall of Fame in 2011 and was inducted into the Delaware Afro-American Hall of Fame in 2009. He passed away in 2011.

Beasley's punishing running helped him rank No. 2 alltime at Delaware with 2,697 career rushing yards. The 1976 Delaware graduate was a two-time All-East selection and earned third team All-American honors in 1974.

Beasley's wife, **Romaine**, is expected to once again help present the award on the field following the game.

KEELER VS. BLOUNT: ROUND 3

Today will not be the first time that Delaware head coach

K.C. Keeler and Delaware State head coach Kermit Blount
square off on opposing sides here at Delaware Stadium.

Keeler was a sophomore linebacker and Blount was a junior quarterback in 1978 when the Blue Hens posted a dominating 41-0 victory over Winston-Salem State in the NCAA Division II semifinals.

Blount threw for 126 yards while Keeler posted six tackles, including one on Blount. Delaware held Winston-Salem to just 11 first downs and 162 total yards to advance to the national title game.

The two met for the first time as coaches in 2011 with Keeler gaining the upper hand during the Blue Hens' 45-0 victory at Delaware Stadium.

Junior quarterback **Tim Donnelly (below)**, making his first career start, was nearly flawless, completing 13 of 14 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns, running backs **Andrew Pierce** and **Walter Davis** each went over the 100-yard mark, and **Nihja White** caught seven passes for 122 yards to lead an offense that piled up 512 yards of total offense.

Davis (108 yards) surpassed the mark for the first time in his career, gaining all of his yards in the second half. It marked the first time since 2005 that the Hens have had two players pass the 100-yard rushing mark.

Donnelly, who completed his first seven passes, was selected as the Nate Beasley Most Valuable Player for the game by a vote of media members.

His .928 passing percentage for the game was the second best in school history, trailing only an 11 for 11 performance by Bill Vergantino vs. Towson in 1992, and his 272.6 passing rating was the sixth best single-game mark in UD history.

The two schools, the state's only NCAA Division I institutions and located 45 miles apart, never met on the football field until a 44-7 NCAA playoff win by the Blue Hens in 2007.

"I was so happy with the way we prepared this week and with the kind of game we played tonight," said Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler**. "We came out and played clean from the outset and so many kids did great things. Tim (Donnelly) was off the charts and defensively we played a lot cleaner. We know the competition is going to get a lot stiffer going forward, but at the same time our guys did everything we asked them to do this past week and prepared the way we needed them to. Now the challenge is to come out and do it again this week."

The Delaware defense was just as dominating Saturday night as the Blue Hens held the Hornets (2-1) to just four first downs and 112 total yards while forcing three turnovers, including a 32-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Jake Giusti that extended the lead to 28-0 in the second quarter.

The Hornets,who were off to a 2-0 start for the first time since 2007 under rookie head coach Kermit Blount, produced - 3 yard rushing for the night and were 0 for 10 on third downs.

Andrew Harrison added a fumble recovery, Ricky Tunstall intercepted a pass, and Paul Worrilow, the lone Delaware native in the UD starting lineup, recorded nine tackles.

Pierce carried 15 times for 106 yards and scored three touchdowns, including a seven-yard scamper with 11:25 left in the third quarter that pushed him over 100 yards for the game and over 2,000 for his career.

Delaware got things going early as Donnelly hit tight end Colin Naugle all alone over the middle for a 43-yard scoring toss on the Hens' first possession and Pierce capped a seasonlong 96-yard march on the second drive of the game with a three-yard dive for a 14-0 lead first-quarter lead. The drive

consumed just over seven minutes as the Hens controlled the ball for nearly 12 minutes in the opening stanza.

White hauled in an 11-yard touchdown pass from Donnelly just over a minute into the second stanza and Giusti followed with his fumble return for a score just three minutes later. A one-yard burst by Pierce with 7:58 left in the second quarter gave the Hens a 35-0 cushion at the break.

Unlike the previous week when the Hens let a 21-0 first quarter lead against West Chester vanish before holding off the Rams for a 28-17 victory, Delaware did not let up this time. Pierce's seven-yard scoring run with 11:25 left in the third quarter pushed the lead to 42-0 and Sean Baner's career-long 47-yard field goal with 4:44 left capped the scoring.

The Blue Hens produced their most one-sided victory since a 48-0 win over league foe Towson last Nov. 6.

LAST TIME OUT FOR DELAWARE

NEWARK, Del. (Aug. 30, 2012) -- Sophomore quarterback Trent Hurley threw for 310 yards in his Blue Hen debut and sophomore wide receiver Michael Johnson scored twice as 15th-ranked Delaware opened the 2012 season with a 41-21 victory over longtime rival West Chester Thursday night at Delaware Stadium.

Facing the NCAA Division II Rams for the final time in this longtime rivalry, the Blue Hens (1-0) put up 487 total yards on offense and took advantage of four turnovers to down West Chester for the 19th straight time.

The rivalry, which began in 1941 for these two schools just 25 miles apart, ends with Delaware holding a 47-6-1 advantage in the series.

The series ends as both teams look to face opponents from their own divisions to help their post-season playoff chances in the future

"It's a start and we are 1-0 so we are happy about that," said Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler**, who began his 11th season at the helm of his alma mater. "It's a process and I thought there were some good things we did tonight that we can build on. You saw that Trent is a pretty talented kid and he threw the ball well. And I thought we did a good job in protection. West Chester does a good job offensively but we were disappointed that they were able to run the ball at us. We have to do a better job on that."

Hurley *(pictured above)*, a first-year transfer from Bowling Green who earned the starting nod after a pre-season battle with incumbent starters **Tim Donnelly** and **Trevor Sasek**, hit on 24 of 35 passes for 310 yards and three touchdowns, including a 19-yard strike to Johnson and two scoring passes to **Rob Jones**.

Johnson also ran for a 19-yard touchdown, backup running back **David Hayes** scored on a three-yard run in the final minutes, and **Sean Baner** converted two field goals to lead the attack as the Hens won their eighth straight opener and improved to 10-1 in opening games under Keeler.

Jones caught six passes for 101 yards, including a nineyard bullet from Hurley in the final minute of the first half and a 63-yard bomb down the left side early in the final stanza, and surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for his career. **Nihja White** added seven catches for 77 yards and Johnson hauled in six passes for 88 yards and a score.

On the ground, Delaware junior All-American **Andrew Pierce** ran 22 times for 86 yards and became just the fourth
player in UD history and the first junior to reach the 3,000yard mark.

Delaware's defense, despite allowing 410 total yards to West Chester, including a career-high 209-yard rushing effort from running back Rondell White, did come up with some big plays when it needed them, recovering two fumbles and intercepting two passes. Three of those turnovers set up Blue Hen scoring drives.

LAST TIME OUT FOR DELAWARE STATE

DOVER, Del. (Sep. 1, 2012) --- Nick Elko ran four yards for a touchdown with 45 seconds left to lift Delaware State to a 17-10 season opening win over VMI at Alumni Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The touchdown capped off a nine-play, 55-yard drive that consumed a minute-45 seconds.

VMI drove to the Delaware State 38-yard line on the game's final possession, but Erik Kordenbrock's desperation pass was intercepted by DSU's Ronald Robinson in the end-zone as time expired.

Delaware State led 10-0 at halftime, but VMI scored a touchdown in the third quarter and added a field goal with 2:35 left in the fourth quarter to tie the game.

After VMI tied the game, DSU's Malcolm Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 38 yards to the Hornet 45-yard line to jumpstart the game-winning touchdown drive.

The Hornets faced a fourth-and-one at the VMI 46 when Williams rushed two yards to sustain the drive. On the next play, Elko completed a five-yard pass to Justin Wilson to the VMI 39. A VMI personal foul on the play gave the Hornets a first down at the Keydets' 26. Two plays later, Elko and Travis Tarpley connected on a 14-yard pass to the VMI 12.

Delaware State faced a second-and-goal at the four when Elko faked a hand-off then scampered around the right end to the endzone to give put the Hornets ahead 16-10.

"I'm really proud of our guys for not hanging their heads after VMI came back to tie the game," said DSU head coach Kermit Blount, who improved to 2-0 vs. the Keydets. "Our defense came up with some big stops deep in our territory to keep VMI from taking the lead and the offense had some great execution on the winning drive."

Delaware State was outgained 383 to 239 in the game. VMI had 158 yards rushing and 225 yards by the pass. The Hornets rushed for 83 yards, while recording 156 through the air. Elko completed 18 of 33 passes for 156 yards and a touchdown. Williams led the Hornets with 76 yards rushing on 13 carries. Wilson had eight catches for 71 yards.

JOHNSON, BREAKER, BANER EARN FIRST WEEKLY BLUE HEN TOUCHDOWN CLUB MVP AWARDS

Sophomore wide receiver **Michael Johnson**, senior strong safety **Tim Breaker**, and junior kicker **Sean Baner** were the first winners of the Blue Hen Touchdown Club Game Most Valuable Player Awards.

The three are scheduled to be honored at the weekly Blue Hen Touchdown Club Luncheon this Thursday, Sept. 6, at 12 noon in the Bob Carpenter Center Lounge.

Johnson, from Gainesville, Fla. (Gainesville HS) earned the Offensive MVP Award after catching six passes for 88 yards and one touchdown and rushing for a 19 yard score on his only carry of the game.

The award was the second of Johnson's career as he also was honored for the Towson game in 2011.

Breaker, from Pilesgrove, N.J. (Glassboro HS), earned the Defensive MVP Award for the first time in his career as he was in on two turnovers that set up Delaware touchdowns and also collected eight tackles. He forced a fumble with a big hit that set up Delaware's first touchdown and later intercepted a pass at midfield that resulted in another Delaware score.

Baner, from Southampton, Pa. (William Tennent HS), earned the Special Teams MVP Award after connecting on all five extra point attempts and on both field goals attempts - from 22 and 37 yards - for 11 points.

Baner, who has now hit seven straight field goals dating back to last season, earned the award for the second time in his career.

FORMER BLUE HEN CAPTAIN JOE HARVANIK TO SERVE AS HONORARY GAME CAPTAIN

Joe Harvanik, who served as team captain of the 1957 Blue Hen squad for head coach David Nelson, will serve as Honorary Captain for this week's Delaware State game.

The Honorary Captain program honors friends of Blue Hen football who continue to make outstanding contributions to the UD program.

Harvanik, a native of Linden, N.J. where he still resides, was a three-year letterwinner as a standout tackle on Delaware teams in 1955-57 under Nelson. He led the team to three straight winning seasons, including an impressive 8-1 mark in 1955.

He anchored a defense that allowed just 84 points the entire 1957 season (12.0 ppg) and was honored with the Wilmington Touchdown Club's Baker-Taylor Award for outstanding team contributions that year.

He earned his degree in business management from Delaware in 1957 and served in the Marine Corps.

Harvanik was self-employed with businesses in construction, home building, paving, home furnishings, and home appliances. He also has his license in real estate and insurance. After he retired, he was elected councilman of the city of Linden, N.J. at the age of 75.

He has two daughters, Sari & Joli, and three grandchildren, Anthony, Joseph, and Casidi.

HURLEY GETS NOD UNDER CENTER, SETS MARK IN DELAWARE DEBUT

Sophomore **Trent Hurley**, a first-year transfer from Bowling Green, earned the starting quarterback spot after a spring and summer battle with incumbent starters **Tim Donnelly** and **Trevor Sasek**.

After a strong showing in practice and in the two pre-season scrimmages, Hurley, a sophomore from Connellsville, Pa. emerged as the UD starter. Hurley played in four games as a backup at Bowling Green in 2011 and threw for 115 yards.

Donnelly, a senior from Myrtle Beach, S.C. who will enter the year as the team's No. 2 quarterback, started nine games a year ago and hit on 165 of 263 passes for 1,732 yards and 11 touchdowns with 10 interceptions.

Sasek, a junior from Limerick, Pa., earned the starting job to open the 2011 season but suffered a knee injury in the opener vs. Navy. He missed several games before returning

vs. Rhode Island in October and re-injuring the knee, thus ending his season. He underwent knee surgery in the off-season and is still looking to return to 100 percent.

Hurley performed well in his Delaware debut last Thursday, leading the Hens to a 41-21 victory over West Chester at Delaware Stadium. He completed 24 of 35 passes for 310 yards and three touchdowns, including scoring tosses of 19, 9, and 63 yards, and led an offense that piled up 487 total yard. He overcame three interceptions.

The 310 yards marked the highest total by any player in Delaware history in his debut with the Blue Hens.

Delaware, which has long had its share of outstanding transfer quarterbacks, looks ready to continue that trend this season with Hurley. In fact, Hurley's Delaware debut was more productive than any of UD's previous transfer quarterbacks under head coach **K.C. Keeler.**

Andy Hall went on to lead Delaware to the 2003 national championship and was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles; Sonny Riccio led the Hens to the 2004 NCAA quarterfinals; Joe Flacco, currently a fifth-year starter in the NFL with the Baltimore Ravens, led the Hens to the 2007 national title game; and Pat Devlin, a current NFL backup with Miami, led UD to the 2010 national title game.

Also out this week is starting WE **Nihja White**, who suffred a knee injury vs. West Chester. His status for next week vs. Bucknell is still not determined but he is expected back for the William & Mary game on Sept. 22.

Among the other UD players expected to be out for the remainder of the season due to pre-season injuries are LB David Mackall (foot) and LB Derek Battle (knee), and TE Cody Magill (knee).

On the positive side, DE **Quincy Barr** (knee) and DT **David Tinsley** (elbow) are both expected back this week vs. Delaware State after missing the opener vs. West Chester with injuries suffered in pre-season camp.

DELAWARE EYING ANOTHER 2-0 START

A win over Delaware State this Saturday will give Delaware a 2-0 start for the second time in three years and for the fifth time in 11 seasons under head coach **K.C. Keeler**.

Delaware also started 9-0 in 2003, 3-0 in 2005, 5-0 in 2007, and 7-0 in 2010.

The Hens have gone on to the NCAA Tournament each of those seasons except in 2005 when the Hens finished 6-5.

DELAWARE SCORING STREAK REACHES 198... AND COUNTING

Delaware extended its streak of scoring a point to 198 straight games in the 41-21 season-opening victory over West Chester last Thursday.

Delaware has not been shutout in any game since falling at Villanova 27-0 back on Sept. 14, 1996 and have not been held off the scoreboard at home at Delaware Stadium since suffering a 24-0 setback to Holy Cross way back on Nov. 12, 1983 (a streak of 191 straight games).

The current scoring streak breaks the previous UD record of consecutive game scoring a point of 154 set in 1983-98. Delaware's streak of consecutive road games scoring a point now stands at 89 games.

During the streak, the Hens have scored 30 or more points 86 times (44 percent of the time).

The current streak ranks No. 2 among Colonial Athletic Association teams, just one game shy of New Hampshire's league-high streak of 199 straight games.

HOME SWEET HOME

Delaware boasts one of the top home-field advantages in all of college football. Not only do Blue Hen fans pack Delaware Stadium each week - helping UD become the only NCAA FCS team in the nation to average 20,000 or more fans per regular season home game each of the last 12 seasons - they see consistently winning football.

Delaware has posted an impressive record of 56-17 (.767) in 11 seasons under **K.C. Keeler** at Delaware Stadium - among the top marks at any division.

The Blue Hens had been riding a seven-game win streak at home - the fourth longest streak in the nation at the FCS level at the time - before falling to Massachusetts 21-10 on Oct. 15, 2011.

Even with the loss, the Hens have still won 16 of their last 18 home games since a 20-8 setback to James Madison on Oct. 31, 2009.

Of Keeler's 17 home losses, seven have come by six points or less or in overtime. The Hens have scored more than 20 points in all but nine of those 73 games.

Delaware has also won 27 of its last 35 home games and is 284-88-4 (.761) in 61 seasons all-time at Delaware Stadium, including a mark of 20-5 with eighth straight wins in the post-season.

RB ANDREW PIERCE NAMED TO WALTER PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

University of Delaware **Andrew Pierce** has earned a spot on the prestigious 2012 Walter Payton Award Watch List.

Pierce, a junior running back from Bridgeton, N.J. (Cumberland Regional High School), was among 20 athletes named to the Watch List in July.

The Payton Award, sponsored by The Sports Network for the 26th year, is presently annually to the top offensive player in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision.

Pierce was one of 12 players who were finalists for the award last year. Also a pre-season TSN All-American, Pierce finished 14th in the Payton Award voting last season.

The award is selected by media relations directors from FCS member schools and media members who cover those teams. After the season, the most outstanding player in the FCS will join a list of Payton Award greats such as Steve McNair, John Friesz, Brian Westbrook, Tony Romo, Brian Finneran, Armanti Edwards and 2011 winner Bo Levi Mitchell.

In addition to Pierce, the 2011 finalists returning to the Watch List are quarterbacks Casey Brockman of Murray State, DeNarius McGhee of Montana State and Brad Sorensen of Southern Utah; running backs Shakir Bell of Indiana State, Jordan Brown of Bryant, Jamaine Cook of Youngstown State, Timothy Flanders of Sam Houston State, and Terrance West of Towson; fullback Eric Breitenstein of Wofford; and wide receivers Aaron Mellette of Elon and Rodrick Rumble of Idaho State.

The Sports Network also presents the Buck Buchanan, Jerry Rice and Eddie Robinson awards. The Buchanan Award honors the FCS defensive player of the year, the Rice Award goes to the FCS freshman of the year and the Robinson Award honors the FCS coach of the year. Those three winners will join the top three Payton finalists at the national awards banquet.

ANDREW PIERCE REACHES 3,000 RUSHING YARD MILESTONE, MORE AHEAD?

Only three players in the illustrious history of University of Delaware football had reached the coveted 3,000-yard rushing mark for a career entering the 2012 season.

Add Delaware junior **Andrew Pierce** to that prestigious list

The Bridgeton, N.J. native entered the 2012 season with 2,934 rushing yards for his career and packed 86 yards on to that total in the season-opener vs. West Chester last Thursday to up the number to 3,020.

He joined a list that includes Daryl Brown (4,587 in 1991-94), Omar Cuff (4,364 in 2004-07), and Chuck Hall (3,157 in 1968-70).

Pierce, who owns 15 career 100-yard rushing efforts, is the first of that group to achieve the milestone as a junior. He now needs 135 yards to tie Hall for No. 3 all-time.

One of the nation's most productive runners, Pierce ranks among the active NCAA FCS career leaders in the following categories:

NIHJA WHITE ALSO NEARING DELAWARE RECEIVING MARKS IN 2012

Delaware senior wide receiver **Nihja White**, a pre-season first team All-Colonial Athletic Association selection after earning second team laurels a year ago, is nearing several impressive milestones this season as well.

White, who caught seven passes for 77 yards in the season opener vs. West Chester, enters the Delaware State game having 138 passes for 1,740 yards and 12 touchdowns in 36 career games.

He has caught at least one pass in 34 straight games over three seasons, a mark that ranks No. 3 all-time in UD history and trails only record holder **Eddie Conti** (38 in 1996-98) and Mark Duncan (35 in 2007-09). White has caught at least one pass in every game he has played since being shutout vs. Delaware State in 2009.

White ranks No. 8 all-time at Delaware in receptions, 11th in receiving yardage, and 11th in touchdowns and is one of only three players in UD history to record 50 or more catches in a season (Aaron Love in 2005-08; David Boler in 2002-04). He could become first-ever in UD annals to accomplish the feat three times.

He also needs 55 receptions to match UD school record of 193 by Love and needs 260 receiving yards to become only seventh player in UD history to reach 2,000 yards.

White's progress on those miletones will have to wait at least one week. The senior will not play this week vs. Delaware State due to a knee injury and is questionable for next week vs. Bucknell.

ROB JONES REACHES RECEIVING MILESTONE

In addition to Nihja White's receiving milestone, fellow senior wideout **Rob Jones** has also reached an impressive plateau.

Jones, a fourth-year regular, enjoyed an outstanding opener vs. West Chester as he caught six passes for a game-

high 101 yards and two touchdowns, including a career-long 63-yard bomb from **Trent Hurley** in the fourth quarter that put the game away.

The Floridian has now collected 80 passes for 1,047 yards and eighth touchdowns for his career as a Blue Hen. He became just the 27th player in UD history to reach the 1,000-yard receiving mark. He also needs just 20 receptions to become the 15th UD player to reach 100 career receptions.

BANER IN SEARCH OF PERFECTION

Junior **Sean Baner**, a first team All-Colonial Athletic Association selection from Southampton, Pa. (William Tennent HS), is one of the nation's top placekickers.

As a sophomore in 2011, he earned All-CAA honors when he booted 15 of 20 field goals and was the only league kicker to be true on all of his extra point attempts - 29 total.

Baner is looking to extend those numbers this season and had a good start vs. West Chester when he made all five extra point attempts and split the uprights on both field goal attempts from 22 and 37 yards.

He enters the Delaware State game a perfect 34 for 34 all-time in extra point attempts at Delaware, a streak that ranks No. 8 all-time at Delaware. The all-time mark is 53 by All-American Jon Striefsky in 2007.

On field goals, Baner has now converted seven straight field goals since last season - the fourth longest streak in UD history - and has kicked at least one field goal in three straight games. The Delaware record for consecutive field goals made is 15 by Striefsky in 2007.

Baner is 17 of 22 all-time in field goal attempts and ranks No. 9 all-time at UD for field goals made.

PAUL WORRILOW REACHING DELAWARE TACKLE MILESTONE

Blue Hen players are also nearing milestones on the defensive side of the ball as well.

Delaware senior linebacker **Paul Worrilow**, a two-time All-CAA selection, enters the Delaware State game with 282 career tackles over four seasons.

He needs just 18 stops to reach the 300-career tackle mark reached by just 15 other players, most recently by former teammate Andrew Harrison (307) last year.

Only four other active NCAA FCS players have as many career tackles as Worrilow - Matt Evans of New Hampshire (344), Jordan Riley of Butler (320), Aaron Archie of Indiana State (311), and Jacolby Washington of Indiana State (291).

In addition to his tackle totals, Worrilow has also registered 25 tackles for loss in his career, a mark that ranks No. 13 among NCAA FCS players.

WORRILOW, PIERCE NAMED 2012 BLUE HEN TEAM CAPTAINS

The announcement of senior linebacker **Paul Worrilow** and junior running back **Andrew Pierce** as team captains for the 2012 season came as little surprise to those familiar with the Blue Hen football program.

Both have proved themselves for several years as team leaders not only on gameday, but on the practice field, in the weight room, and in community service.

In fact, Pierce is one of 20 players on the Watch List for the Walter Payton Award, which is presented to the top offensive player in NCAA Division I FCS at the close of the season. Delaware will have just two captains this fall for the first time since 2005.

DELAWARE WELL REPRESENTED IN THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

An all-time high of nine former University of Delaware football student-athletes were battling for roster spots in the National Football League this summer.

The group includes veterans in defensive back Mike Adams (Denver), quarterback Joe Flacco (Baltimore), defensive end Ronald Talley (Arizona), defensive back Anthony Walters (Chicago), quarterback Pat Devlin (Miami), and tight end Josh Baker (New York Jets) as well as rookie OL Gino Gradkowski (Baltimore) and Shea Allard (Green Bay) and first-year defensive tackle Matt Hardison (New York Jets).

Gradkowski was a fourth round draft pick by Baltimore in the April NFL Draft while Allard and Hardison signed rookie contracts during the summer.

Talley, Allard, and Hardison were recently released by their teams. Baker was put on the injured reserve list after suffering a knee injury in pre-season.

That has usually been the case for the Blue Hens of late. Delaware was a dominant team early on during the 2010 season, outscoring opponent 94-34 in the first quarter and 242-80 in the first half. The Hens scored first in 12 of the team's 15 agmes.

Delaware had won 12 straight games when scoring first before the NCAA championship game loss to Eastern Washington in January, 2011.

Still the Hens have won 22 of their last 24 games since 2009 when getting on the board first. Delaware teams are 60-14 (.811) when they score first in head coach **K.C. Keeler's** 11 seasons at the helm.

Last season, Delaware was 5-0 when scoring first and outscored opponents 191-118 in the first half.

At home last season, the Hens outscored opponents 59-31 in the opening stanza and 114-41 in the first half.

BLUE HENS ON TELEVISION FIVE TIMES DUR-ING 2012 SEASON; WILL MAKE DEBUT ON NBC SPORTS NETWORK

The University of Delaware football squad will get plenty of national and regional exposure on television this fall as the Blue Hens will appear nationally on the NBC Sports Network three times and regionally on Comcast SportsNet twice.

This week's game vs. Delaware State will kickoff NBC Sports Network's contract with the Colonial Athletic Association and will be the first college football game aired on the network this fall.

Delaware will also appear on NBC Sports Network Oct. 27 at Old Dominion and Nov. 2 at home vs. Towson.

The Hens will appear on Comcast SportsNet Regional on Sept. 22 at William & Mary and Oct. 6 at home vs. Maine.

DELAWARE IN SEASON OPENERS

Delaware has now put together a record of 8-3 in season openers under head coach **K.C. Keeler**, including the 41-21 victory over West Chester last Thursday night at Delaware Stadium. The Hens are 14-4 in season openers since 1995.

DELAWARE TOUGH IN HOME OPENERS

Following the win over West Chester last weekend, Delaware is now 49-11 (.817) in home openers since Delaware Stadium opened in 1952 with the Blue Hens having won eighth straight and 21 of their last 23 home debuts in these friendly confines.

Delaware is 10-1 in home openers under K.C. Keeler with the lone loss a 24-21 setback to New Hampshire in 2004.

HELLO AND GOOD BYE

Old Dominion and Georgia State will be playing their final season in the CAA this fall but the league announced earlier this summer that Stony Brook University, out of the Big South Conference, and the University at Albany, out of the Northeast Conference, will join the CAA for football only in 2013.

Both Albany and Stony Brook advanced to the NCAA Tournament a year ago and faced each other in the opening round with Stony Brook prevailing 31-28.

After the news that Stony Brook and Albany will be joining the CAA, Rhode Island recently announced that it will remain in the CAA after earlier stating it would join the Northeast Conference following the 2012 season.

BEEN AROUND THE BLOCK A FEW TIMES

Few college teams in the country can boast the vast coaching experience of Delaware's offensive and defensive coordinators.

Blue Hen defensive leader **Nick Rapone** and four-year offensive head man **Jim Hofher** have combined for an incredible 62 years of college coaching experience - each with 31 campaigns under their belts - including 26 years as coordinators.

Hofher served as head coach at his alma mater, Cornell, in 1990-97 and at Buffalo in 2001-05. Together they have coached over 622 games on the college level.

Rapone, whose 2010 defensive led the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game, earned an impressive honor in 2010 when he was selected NCAA Division I FCS Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com.

In addition to Hofher and Rapone, Delaware also has long-time veteran coaches in defensive assistant Frank Law (37 years), offensive line coach Gregg Perry (31), linebacker coach Brad Sherrod (17), and defensive line coach Phil Petitte (16).

Add the service of Keeler and his assistants and the group has coached an amazing 222 combined seasons of college football.

YET ANOTHER WINNING RECORD

The Blue Hens have posted a winning record eight times in 10 seasons under head coach **K.C. Keeler**, failing to reach the .500 mark just twice when the team went 5-6 in 2006 and 4-8 in 2008.

But the Hens have more than made up for those two down years, advancing to the NCAA Tournament four times under Keeler, winning the national title in 2003 and finishing as national runner-up in both 2007 and 2010.

Along the way, the Hens have also captured three conference titles, earning the Lambert Cup Trophy three times, and the ECAC Team of the Year three times.

Delaware has not suffered back-to-back losing seasons since 1938-39, a milestone that few college teams in the nation at any level - and none in the CAA - can match. The Hens have reached 12 wins seven times in school history, most recently in 2010.

Delaware posted a 7-0 start for the ninth time in school history in 2010 and for the second time under Keeler. The Hens started out 9-0 on the way to the 2003 national championship campaian.

A BLUE HEN IN THE WHITE HOUSE...AND AT DELAWARE STADIUM

When U.S. President **Barack Obama** and running mate, former Delaware Senator **Joe Biden**, won the 2008 presidential election, it was big news. And even bigger news for the citizens of Delaware and those affiliated with UD.

A 1965 graduate of the University of Delaware with degrees in history and political science, Biden played on the Blue Hen freshman football team in 1961 under head coach Scotty Duncan. Biden, a member of the UD Wall of Fame and an ardent Delaware football fan, considered himself "a half-baked halfback" during his brief UD football career.

Biden made his first visit to Delaware Stadium as Vice-President on Saturday, Oct. 9, 2009 as he attended the Maine game and sat with UD President **Patrick Harker** and current New Jersey Governor **Chris Christie** (also a UD graduate) throughout the entire contest.

He made another visit to Delaware Stadium in 2010 when he attended Delaware's 16-3 NCAA quarterfinal win over New Hampshire on Dec. 10. He also attended the Hens' 2010 national championship game in Frisco, Tex. with Christie and Delaware Gov. Jack Markell.

Biden met with head coach **K.C. Keeler** and members of the team on Sept. 19, 2008 when Biden's plane was parked on the same tarmac as the Delaware charter at New Castle County (Del.) prior to its trip to Furman.

Biden later made an appearance at the Blue Hens' game vs. Maine at Delaware Stadium on Oct. 11, 2008.

VERY PRESIDENTIAL...

No less than five members of the University of Delaware football team have the same surnames as former U.S. Presidents, including the Hens' top two running backs - Andrew Pierce and Dave Hayes.

Other Blue Hens with presidential surnames are **Leon Jackson, Bobby Kennedy**, and **Michael Johnson**.

NEWARK, Del. -- QB Trent Hurley threw for 310 yards in his Blue Hen debut and WR Michael Johnson scored twice as 15th-ranked Delaware opened the 2012 season with a 41-21 victory.

Facing the NCAA Division II Rams for the final time in this longtime rivalry, the Blue Hens (1-0) put up 487 total yards on offense and took advantage of four turnovers to down West Chester for the 19th straight time. The rivalry, which began in 1941 for these two schools just 25 miles apart, ends with Delaware holding a 47-6-1 advantage in the series. The series ends as both teams look to face opponents from their own divisions to help their post-season playoff chances in the future.

Hurley, a first-year transfer from Bowling Green who earned the starting nod after a pre-season battle with incumbent starters Tim Donnelly and Trevor Sasek, hit on 24 of 35 passes for 310 yards and three touchdowns, including a 19-yard strike to Johnson and two scoring passes to Rob Jones. Hurley became the first Delaware signal-caller to surpass the 300-yard mark in his Delaware debut.

Johnson also ran for a 19-yard touchdown, backup running back David Hayes scored on a threeyard run in the final minutes, and Sean Baner converted two field goals to lead the attack as the Hens won their eighth straight opener and improved to 10-1 in opening games under Keeler.

Jones caught six passes for 101 yards, including a nine-yard bullet from Hurley in the final minute of the first half and a 63-yard bomb down the left side early in the final stanza, and surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for his career. Delaware junior Andrew Pierce ran 22 times for 86 yards and became just the fourth player in UD history and the first junior to reach the 3,000-yard mark.

Delaware's defense, despite allowing 410 total yards to West Chester, including a career-high 209-yard rushing effort from running back Rondell White, did come up with some big plays when it needed them, recovering two fumbles and intercepting two passes. Three of those turnovers set up Blue Hen scoring drives.

The Rams (0-1) narrowed Delaware's lead to 24-14 on a 10-yard pass from Sean McCartney to LaRonn Lee early in the third quarter, but that was as close as they would get as the Hens answered with a 22-yard field goal by Baner - his seventh straight conversion dating back to last season - and Jones' 63-yard touchdown haul to pull away.

The Blue Hens jumped out to a 14-0 first quarter lead on Johnson's two touchdowns and then built the lead to 24-7 at the half on Jones' TD and Baner's field goal. Tim Breaker helped the Hens gain possession before each drive with a forced fumble and an interception.

Lee's nine-yard scoring catch from McCartney, which capped an 80-yard drive, pulled the Rams to within 24-14 with 10:43 left in the third quarter. However, West Chester could never get closer as Baner nailed a 22-yard field goal and Hurley hit Jones in stride past the WCU secondary for the 63-yard bomb. Jones' catch came on the first play from scrimmage after Delaware safety Jake Giusti intercepted a pass. The two scores came just 59 seconds apart.

White ran his way through the UD defense all night, carrying 28 times for 209 yards, including jaunts of 49 and 52 yards. His 209 yards tied for the second highest ever against Delaware and was also the highest total ever by a Blue Hen opponent in the 60-year history of Delaware Stadium.
