Massachusetts Statewide Survey  
Data collected September 20 between 8:00-8:30pm**

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**Executive Summary**

- Voters who watched the debate thought Senator Brown won (50%-40%)
  - Democrats were twice as likely to think Warren won (62% to 27%)
  - Republicans were five times as likely to think Brown won (83% to 13%)
  - Independents were twice as likely to think Brown won (61% to 29%)
  - Females were split in who won the debate (43% to 43%)
  - Men thought Brown was the clear winner (57% to 37%)
  - Every age category thought Brown won the debate except those over 60 (Warren 47%-39%)
- In the Ballot Test, Brown holds a 1 point lead (48% to 47%) with 5% undecided
  - Democrats continue to somewhat support Brown with 23%
  - Republicans have rallied around Brown with 88% support
  - Independents continue to heavily support Brown +23 points (58%-35%)
  - Women are supporting Warren +5 (49% to 44%)
  - Men continue to break for Brown 52% to 44%

- Elizabeth Warren has a 51% favorable rating and a 42% unfavorable (+9)
  - Democrats hold a 76% to 19% ratio
  - Republicans have a 12% to 82% ratio
  - Amongst Independents Warren has a 50% unfavorable rating and a 41% favorable rating
  - Women have a +18 favorable impression (55% to 37%)
  - Males have a +1 favorable impression (48% to 47%)
- Senator Brown has a 58% favorable and a 34% unfavorable rating (+24)
  - Democrats holds a 36% favorable impression (56% unfavorable) (-20 points)
  - Republicans have a 91% favorable impression (+85)
  - Independents have a 67% favorable and a 24% unfavorable (+43)
  - Women hold a +15 favorable impression (52% to 37%)
  - Men hold a 2:1 favorable to unfavorable ratio (64% to 32%)
- The most important issue is Jobs at 38% followed by the deficit (23%) and Healthcare (20%)
  - All party affiliations said jobs were most important
  - Democrats said Healthcare was the 2<sup>nd</sup> most important issue at 26%
  - Independents and Republicans had the deficit as the 2<sup>nd</sup> most important issue (30% and 31%)
  - Women thought jobs were important (31%) but had healthcare and deficit at 24%
  - Men thought jobs was the number one issue (45%) while the deficit was more important than healthcare +7 (22% to 15%)

### **Methodology (Caller ID)**

All respondents interviewed in this study were part of a fully representative sample of registered voters in the state using a probability sampling method including both landline (n=667) and mobile devices (n=201) for a total sample of N=868 registered “likely” voters. The Margin of Error for the sample is +/- 3.25% with a confidence level of 95%.

The survey was administered using an Automated Telephone Interviewing (ATI) system. The ATI system allows data to be entered directly into a computerized database through the numbers on interviewee’s phone, providing a highly reliable system of data collection.

A random sample of registered voters statewide was purchased from Aristotle Voter Lists, a leading supplier of voter lists to the survey research industry.

A screening question was asked to all participants regarding how likely there were to vote in the November 6, 2012 General Election. Only those who answered “very likely” were included into the sample.

The survey was conducted by Kimball Political Consulting on September 20, 2012 between 8:00 and 8:30.

There was a response rate of 23% for this survey.

### **Data Analysis**

The results presented in this report include univariate and bivariate analysis of the data. Frequency distributions for each item included on the questionnaire are shown in the tables. In all cases, cross-tabulation results are also shown. This type of bivariate analysis examines differences between sub-groups of the overall population.

The purpose of these statistical tests is to determine whether or not the observed difference between sub-groups in the sample is due to sampling error or whether it is due to a real difference in the population. When the results are statistically significant, it strongly suggests that the observed difference between sub-groups found in the sample is due to a real difference in the population, and not due to sampling error.

Survey data was not weighted based on political, gender and geographical demographics of the district because the sample itself properly reflected the parameters of Massachusetts in the following demographics.

### **Survey Instrument**

Hello, we are conducting a short public opinion survey regarding the U.S. Senate election for on November 6. This brief survey consists of 9 questions and will take only a few minutes to complete.

#### **Screening Question 1:**

How likely are you to vote in the General election for President on November 6? Press 1 on your keypad for very likely, press 2 for somewhat likely, press 3 if you are “50-50” or press 4 if you are not likely?

#### **Question 2: Did you get a chance to watch or listen to the Brown-Warren debate tonight on either WBZ TV or WBZ radio?**

Press 1 if you watched or listened to the debate (go to question 3)

Press 2 if you did not watch or listen to the debate (go to question 4)

#### **Question 3: Who do you think won the debate?**

Press 1 for Senator Scott Brown

Press 2 for Elizabeth Warren

Press 3 if you think it was tie

Press 4 if you are undecided

#### **Question 4:**

Great, I am going to read you a list of individuals running for office. For each, please tell me if your opinion of them is generally favorable or generally unfavorable. If you are undecided or if you have never heard of someone, just tell me that. First take Elizabeth Warren

Is your opinion of *Elizabeth* Warren generally favorable or generally unfavorable?

Press 1 for favorable, press 2 for unfavorable, press 3 if you are undecided and Press 4 if you’ve never heard of this public figure.

Next, Is your opinion of Scott Brown generally favorable or generally unfavorable?

Press 1 for favorable, press 2 for unfavorable, press 3 if you are undecided and Press 4 if you’ve never heard of this public figure.

**Question 5:** If the election for U.S. Senate were held tomorrow and the candidates were, Republican *Scott Brown* and Democrat Elizabeth Warren for who would you vote for at this time?

Press 1 on your keyboard for Scott Brown

Press 2 for Elizabeth Warren,

Press 3 if you are undecided

#### **Question 6: I am now going to read you a list of 5 issues, please choose what is your most important issue?**

Press 1 for The Deficit

Press 2 for Healthcare

Press 3 for Jobs

Press 4 for Cost of Education

Press 5 for Equal Pay for Women

Press 6 for other

Press 7 to repeat the answer choices

**Question 7: What is your party affiliation?**

Press 1 for Democrat

Press 2 for Republican

Press 3 for Independent

Press 4 if you are not a registered voter

**Question 8: What is Gender?**

Press 1 for Female
