DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Monument Avenue is a broad, residential boulevard which extends for some five miles from inner Richmond westward into Henrico County. However, what is generally considered to be the "historic," or the most characteristic, section of the street begins at the termination of West Franklin Street at Stuart Circle and extends westward for some fourteen blocks to Roseneath Road. It is within this section that all of the monuments are located. Furthermore, this section is distinguished by a uniform planting of rows of trees along the sides and in the median, and by the distinctive asphalt paving blocks in the traffic lanes, although the paving blocks in the section from the Boulevard to Roseneath Road have been covered over by sheet asphalt.

The first or easternmost monument, the equestrian statue of J. E. B. Stuart, is located at the beginning of the avenue in Stuart Circle. One long block to the west is the Lee statue, located in a broad traffic circle known as Lee Circle. Four more blocks to the west stands the monumental Davis memorial, distinguished by its tall central column and Doric colonnade. The equestrian statue of Stonewall Jackson is located at the important intersection of the Boulevard and Monument Avenue, three blocks west of the Davis Monument. Three blocks west of the Jackson statue is the unusual memorial to Matthew Fontaine Maury, featuring a large bronze globe and a seated figure of Maury.

The one hundred thirty-foot wide boulevard throughout this section is lined with architecturally varied but harmonious structures, representing almost the entire range of early-twentieth century residential architectural styles. The most prominent structures include several Georgian townhouses by William Lawrence Bottomley and Duncan Lee, and the huge Jacobethan Revival townhouse of the Branch family, designed by John Russell Pope. The street's most characteristic structures are the Georgian Revival and Second Renaissance Revival townhouses and terrace rows. Also featured are several fine late Gothic Revival churches.

Monument Avenue is unified by the unusually high quality of design, workmanship, and materials of all its parts - from the houses, churches and monuments to the curbs and street furniture. The street is unusual, too, for being one of the few grand residential boulevards in America to survive virtually unaltered, having almost no architecturally or scenically discordant intrusions.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The earliest proposal for creating a broad avenue in Richmond to honor Confederate heroes appears on an 1888 plat which shows the division of the Allen estate, located west of the present intersection of Franklin Street and Lombardy Street. On this plat was drawn a proposed continuation of Franklin Street through a point in William Allen's meadow, which had been selected a year earlier to be the site for a monument to General Robert E. Lee, to what is now Allison Street. This continuation of Franklin Street was shown on the plat much as it now exists, a divided boulevard with generally the present lot division and a traffic circle surrounding the site of the Lee Monument. The plat, which actually identified the new boulevard as Monument Avenue, was signed and sealed by Fitzhugh Lee, son of the General and President of the Lee Monument Association.

The unveiling in 1890 of Jean Antoine Mercie's great equestrian statue of Lee revealed the first major element on this unique memorial street, but from the period immediately following the war, it had been the intention of Richmond citizens to erect the statues of the three Virginians who defended the city (two of whom were killed in the defense) to make of Monument Avenue a permanent memorial that would serve as a link with the past. An addition to this plan was made in 1904 when the United Daughters of the Confederacy selected a site several blocks west of the Lee statue for a memorial to President Jefferson Davis. The site of the Davis Monument was chosen because it was the former location of the Star Fort (shown clearly on many old maps), the innermost and major protection of the city from the west during the four years of the siege. The existence of these defenses is commemorated by a cannon located just east of the Davis Monument.

By 1906 that portion of the avenue from Lombardy Street to Allison Street was identified in the city directories as Monument Avenue, and on August 17, 1906, the City Council adopted a resolution to widen to 130 feet the remaining portion of Franklin Street from Allison Street west to the Boulevard and to rename that section Monument Avenue. Richmond sculptor Edward Virginus Valentine's impressive memorial to Jefferson Davis was unveiled in 1907 as was Fred Moynihan's equestrian statue of General J.E.B. Stuart located at the beginning of the avenue. Frederick Sievers' statue of Stonewall Jackson was unveiled in 1919, and the memorial to Matthew Fontaine Maury, also by Sievers, was unveiled in 1929.

Almost as soon as Monument Avenue's traffic lanes began to be paved with their distinctive asphalt paving blocks, the avenue came to be one of

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The Monument Avenue Historic District was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1969. The district boundaries include all properties facing Monument Avenue from its commencement at Stuart Circle to its intersection with Roseneath Road fourteen blocks to the west. The district also includes the 1200 block of West Franklin Street which extends east of Stuart Circle. Although the broad landscaped avenue with its display of monumental sculpture and significant early-twentieth-century architecture is the primary focus of the nomination, properties to the rear of those facing Monument Avenue were considered an integral element of the urban landscape and were, therefore, also included within the district boundaries. These properties are located on the south side of West Grace Street and the north side of Park Avenue; both streets extending parallel to Monument Avenue for most of its length.

While the grand houses and apartment buildings lining Monument Avenue represent the homes of Richmond's elite from about 1900 to 1940, rowhouses along West Grace Street and Park Avenue represent the smaller and less architecturally distinguished homes of Richmond's majority middle-class residents of the same period. All three streets provide a well preserved collection of early-twentieth-century residential and ecclesiastical architecture within a planned urban landscape that is unsurpassed in Virginia for its quality of design.

The boundaries of the district are, for the most part, easily defended; however, two boundaries at either end of the district require adjustment to conform to current National Register standards. The existing eastern district boundary extends from the lot at 1121 West Grace Street south to the intersection of Birch Street and Park Avenue. As the boundary is now drawn it cuts through buildings and lots at 1201 and 1206 West Franklin Street and 1500 West Avenue. The proposed adjustment to the boundary straightens it to include the entire buildings and lots mentioned above as well as the five 1923 Colonial Revival brick rowhouses at 1111 through 1119 West Grace Street. The adjusted boundary will then coincide with part of the boundary of the already listed Fan Area Historic District to the east.

Another boundary adjustment is required at the southwestern corner of the district. Monument Avenue, West Grace Street, and Park Avenue are intersected by side streets along their routes to form a fairly regular grid pattern typical of urban design for the period. At the intersection of Monument and North Belmont avenues, however, a strong diagonal element is interjected within the regular plan. The 3100 through 3300 blocks of West Franklin Street extend to the southwest and form a visually

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important backdrop that continues the architectural fabric that is seen on Monument Avenue. The impressive monument dedicated to Matthew Fontaine Maury acts as a focal point at this intersection from which sweeping vistas are provided down West Franklin Street and Monument Avenue.

Unfortunately, a portion of the district's existing southern boundary, extending from the intersection of Park and North Belmont avenues to Roseneath Road, ignores the integrity of the three blocks of West Franklin Street that extend in a diagonal southwestern direction from Monument Avenue. In fact the existing boundary cuts through portions of lots and houses facing both sides of West Franklin Street and the north side of the 3100 block of Park Avenue. To correct this delineation error, a southern boundary is proposed to extend along an alley at the rear of the properties located on the south side of the 3100-3300 blocks of West Franklin Street to its intersection with Roseneath Road and to remove from the district the portions of lots located in the 3100 block of Park Avenue.

Most of the buildings that line the 3100-3300 blocks of West Franklin Street are brick rowhouses that were built during the 1920s. A few rowhouses and detached houses, however, predate 1920. Richmond city directories for the period indicate that the earliest constructed dwelling on this section of West Franklin Street is the brick rowhouse at 3127. Built in 1908, it is typical of turn-of-the-century rowhouses in the area with its projecting bay window, stone window lintels, and false mansard tile roof. Other early dwellings include those located at 3135 (built in 1911), 3101 and 3109 (both built in 1917), and 3221 and 3223 (both built in 1918) West Franklin Street. Most of these examples display Colonial Revival features such as modillion cornices, multi-paned windows, and columned porches.

During the 1920s groups of several brick rowhouses and detached houses exhibiting Craftsman, Colonial Revival, and Tudor Revival decorative details filled in the remaining vacant lots on the street. Many of these dwellings feature tile or slate false mansard roofs, projecting gables, gable or hipped dormers, bracketed eaves or modillion cornices, and small or full-length front porches with columns. Small apartment buildings and duplexes were also constructed during this period. Examples include the Norwood Apartments at 3215 (built in 1926), the Chalfonte Apartments at 3129 (built in 1929), and the duplexes at 3212 through 3224 West Franklin Street.

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By 1930 three Tudor Revival brick houses had been constructed at the end of the 3300 block of West Franklin Street. Only six additional dwellings were built along the 3100-3300 blocks of the street after that date. Residences continued to be built along West Franklin Street west of Roseneath Road after 1930; however, the Great Depression considerably hampered the rate of development in that area.

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VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

Beginning at a point (A) located at the northeast corner of the lot at 1111 West Grace Street; thence proceeding approximately 8,330 feet west along the south side of West Grace Street to a point (B) located at the southwest corner of the intersection of West Grace Street and Roseneath Road; thence proceeding approximately 1,200 feet south along the west side of Roseneath Road to a point (C) located at the northwest corner of the intersection of Roseneath Road and an alley between West Franklin Street and Park Avenue; thence proceeding along the north side of the alley approximately 1,560 feet east to a point (D) located on the east side of North Belmont Avenue; thence proceeding approximately 170 feet south along the east side of North Belmont Avenue to a point (E) located at the northeast corner of the intersection of North Belmont and Park avenues; thence proceeding approximately 6,650 feet east to a point (F) located at the northwest corner of the intersection of Park Avenue and Birch Street; thence proceeding approximately 1,000 feet north along the west side of Birch Street and continuing due north between the properties at 1108 and 1206 West Franklin Street and between the properties at 1111 and 1109 West Grace Street to the point of origin.

BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION

The original boundaries of the Monument Avenue Historic District include all properties facing Monument Avenue between Stuart Circle and Roseneath Road, properties in the 1200 block of West Franklin Street, properties on the south side of West Grace Street from 1121 to Roseneath Road, properties on the north side of Park Avenue from Birch Street to North Belmont Avenue, and the 3100 and part of the 3200 blocks of West Franklin Street.

The adjusted boundary at the eastern end of the district now includes the additional properties at 1111-1119 West Grace Street, 1205 and 1206 West Franklin Street, and 1500 West Avenue (see Sketch Map). All of these added properties contribute to the historic character of the district and should have been included in the original nomination. The new boundary coincides with the current boundary of the Fan Area Historic District (listed on the National Register in 1985).

The original boundary at the southwestern corner of the district extends in a straight line from the intersection of Park and North Belmont avenues to the intersection of Wythe Avenue and Roseneath Road. This boundary cuts through buildings and lots with no regard for

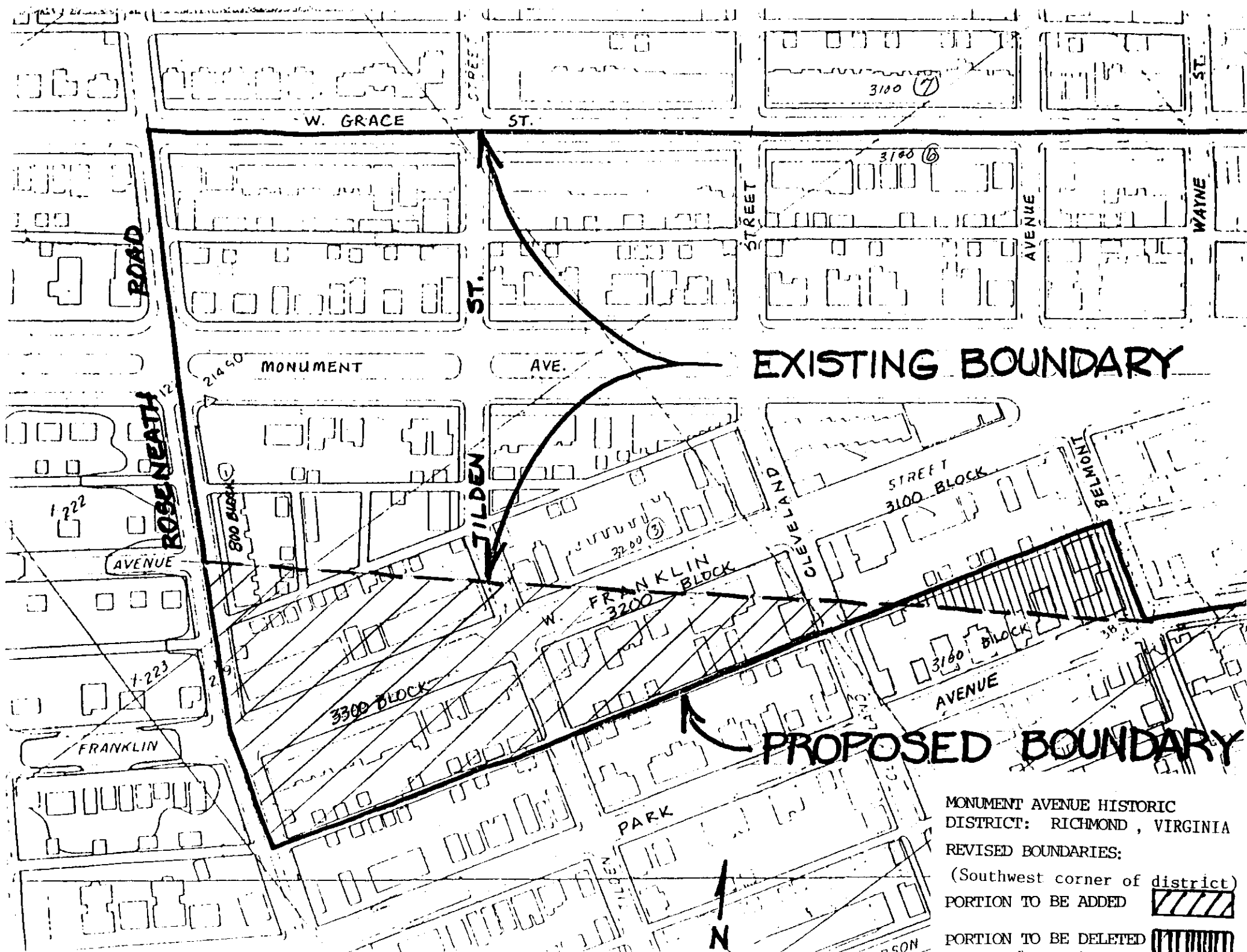
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their individual and collective integrity. The adjusted boundary begins at the intersection of Park and North Belmont avenues and extends north to an alley between Park Avenue and West Franklin Street and then extends west along the alley to its intersection with Roseneath Road (see Sketch Map). The new boundary includes the entire 3100 through 3300 blocks of West Franklin Street which contribute to the historic character of the district and provide visual continuity between Monument Avenue and West Franklin Street.


The properties to the south of the adjusted southwestern corner of the Monument Avenue Historic District are expected to be included in the potentially eligible West of Boulevard Historic District. The area to the west of Roseneath Road contains a large number of noncontributing buildings and was, therefore, excluded from the district. The properties on the north side of West Grace Street and the south side of Park Avenue are excluded from the Monument Avenue Historic District because they are either to be included in the eligible West of Boulevard Historic District or are already included in the Fan Area Historic District.

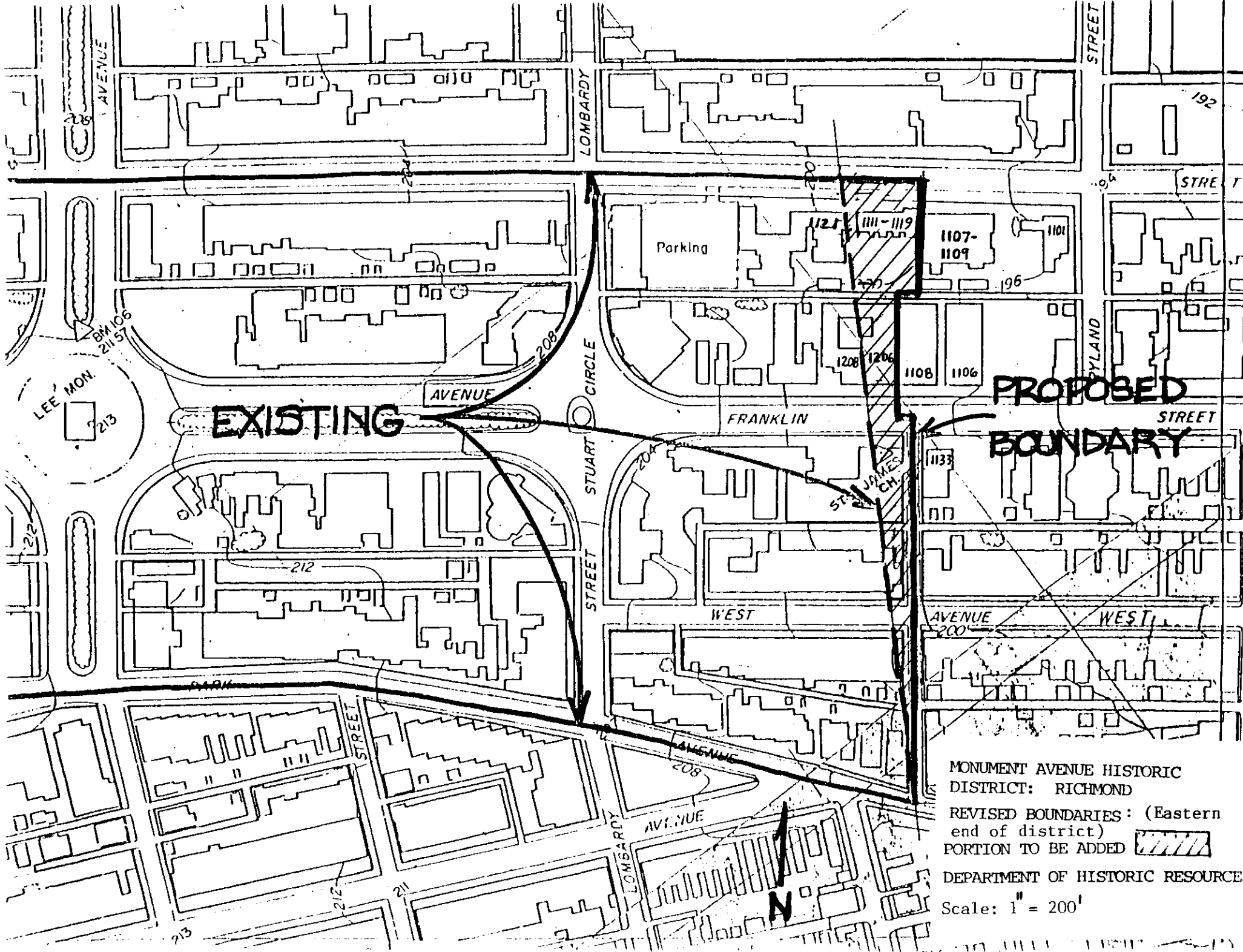
