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# STRATEGIC FOCUS AREAS

### **DISCOVERY**

The Library will be a place of discovery. Whether it's learning a new skill, obtaining new information, enjoying a new story, or finding a network of vital new resources, discovery has traditionally been the first step on the way to a better future.

### COLLABORATION

The Library will expand and strengthen cooperative working partnerships with outside organizations, including government agencies, businesses, educational and cultural institutions, and nonprofit organizations.

### **TECHNOLOGY**

The Library will be a place to explore and use new technologies. We will provide information and training on current technology to afford all residents access and connection to 21st century digital literacy. Our website will continue offering an expanding portal for downloads, live reference, links to government, and access to library services, databases, blogs, and updates.

### **CREATION**

The Library will be a place where citizens can create content, such as videos, music, art, multimedia presentations, promotional materials for their businesses, and more. This focus area includes plug-in stations for patrons to use their own equipment or ours.

### **SPACES**

The Library will be a place for community, with dedicated areas for teens, children and adults of all ages, and flexible spaces used for multiple purposes. Co-located services will be available in more places throughout our community.

### **AWARENESS**

The Library will find new and creative ways to increase awareness of the wide range of services and programs that makes the Pasco County Library Cooperative an essential quality of life resource available to every Pasco resident and visitor.

# WE ARE FOCUSED

# We are transitioning to meet the changing needs of our community.

If tables and stacks are the only images that come to mind when you think of libraries, you haven't visited a Pasco County library lately.

Our branches and website are one-stop community outlets for access to technology, government, and a world of learning. We have a national reputation for innovation. We've won awards for our youth programs. We've led the way on online access to government services. We've helped people start their own businesses. We've changed lives by connecting people with quality information and community resources.

With our history of innovation, Pasco's Libraries are well positioned to address the challenges and turbulence that we are all experiencing:

- New technologies, devices, and formats are being introduced at a dizzying speed.
- E-readers and tablets are changing the way we read and access books, magazines, and other media.
- Today's students are not just consuming content but creating multimedia presentations and digital research reports in a social learning environment.
- The most sought-after workers are technologically literate, mentally agile, and self-directed.
- The way we apply for jobs and government services has changed dramatically.
- Our communities are becoming more diverse.

# FOCUS ON DISCOVERY

# Inspire the excitement, wonder, and joy of discovering new information, experiences, stories, resources, and skills

We will focus on discovery by:

- Integrating new technologies and tools into the discovery process, such as educational kiosks, roaming reference staff equipped with tablets, and multimedia technology resources
- Compiling instructional videos with early learning activity ideas and distributing them to parents through the Library's YouTube channel
- Creating vibrant online learning communities on issues and topics of interest to residents
- Aggregating information on local community "hot topics" and providing forums, both onsite and online, for residents to discuss these issues
- Developing a "technology petting zoo" in each branch so that people can explore new devices and technologies in a welcoming setting
- Offering fresh, creative approaches, resources, and programs to help people of all ages become self-directed lifelong learners

## FOCUS ON COLLABORATION

# Foster thriving partnerships that benefit individuals, neighborhoods, local businesses, and the community

"We recently had a patron come in who wanted to start a business. He wanted help. We printed all the forms he needed. He also wanted to take some business courses and learn how to use accounting software, so we referred him to classes held locally through the SBA and found him information on loans and stimulus funds for small businesses. We will focus on collaboration by:

- Increasing bonds with local, state, and federal agencies to enhance library e-government services
- Strengthening existing cooperative relationships with local economic development agencies, chambers of commerce, workforce development organizations, and other engines of entrepreneurship and growth
- Nurturing partnerships and sharing resources with local schools and colleges, homeschoolers, and learners of all ages
- Conducting grant-funded joint projects with community-based organizations
- Participating in local history and archive digitization projects
- Using Pasco TV to record, archive, and broadcast library programs



# FOCUS ON TECHNOLOGY

# Stimulate a culture of innovation and exploration

We will focus on technology by:

- Updating all branches with current software, including operating systems and multimedia tools
- Equipping branches with tablets for use by "roaming reference librarians" and patrons
- Creating a cluster of dedicated children's computers in each branch
- Developing a "technology petting zoo" in each branch so people can explore new devices and technologies in a welcoming setting
- Using technology to build online learning experiences for residents, such as "Technology With Your Toddler" workshops with a list of suggested mobile apps for early learning
- Providing accessibility to technologies at the library for those with special needs

 Expanding the library's virtual portal to a world of learning and resources, including e-government, Interlibrary Loan, and local historical materials When government agencies at all levels began shifting more and more services to online access, the Library responded by developing "e-government" programs and services using dedicated laptops in branches and rural areas to provide countywide access to government information and services. Last year Acting Library Director Nancy Fredericks was named by Library Journal as a "Tech Leader Mover & Shaker" for leading her team's development of GetHelpFlorida.org, an easy-to-use gateway to Florida and federal e-government resources.



# **FOCUS ON CREATION**

# Provide tools and spaces to support community innovation and individual self-expression

- Equipping branches with updated multimedia tools and software for photo editing, website development, video/audio recording and editing, teleconferencing, resume-writing, and more
- Offering information literacy training for 21st century applications, such as digital scrapbooking, selfpublishing, YouTube and other online channels, podcasting, social networking, blogging, research dashboards, cloud computing, crowdsourcing/ crowdfunding, video resumes, web portfolios, Skype job interviews, and telemedicine
- Designing flexible spaces within each branch that can be used for multiple purposes, such as updating a personal blog or collaborating on a video editing session
- Developing staff fluency in creation tools, mentoring, and facilitation



# **FOCUS ON SPACES**

# Provide local spaces and global portals to foster conversation, discovery, and engagement

We will focus on spaces by:

- Adding or altering locations to ensure that there are dedicated areas for teens, children, community meetings, and other important functions
- Repurposing existing spaces for new uses, which
  may include study rooms for homework and tutoring,
  charging stations and places to "plug in," common
  areas for social learning, and rooms for multimedia
  production and editing.
- Providing community spaces for organizations and gatherings, and for training and exhibits
- Introducing cafes or other alternative use spaces
- Co-locating some library services in hospitals, museums, government buildings, or shopping areas through kiosks, computers, or mobile stations

## FOCUS ON AWARENESS

# Increase awareness of the Library's wide range of resources and programs as an essential and efficient service available to every citizen and visitor of Pasco County

# Pasco Libraries offer award-winning teen programs.

The Library's teen programs are innovative, exemplary, and awardwinning as well. In 2010, Rockus Maximus – a popular annual "Battle of the Bands" event, then in its 13th year – received the American Library Association's prestigious John Cotton Dana Award recognizing excellence in public relations. Several branches have dedicated teen areas, and the Library's Teen Advisory Board is a dynamic, creative force among Pasco's youth.

We will focus on awareness by:

- Participating in community meetings as "information specialists" who will share their expertise and contribute valuable research and knowledge
- Updating county agencies on new resources or programs that might be of value to them and distributing materials to community organizations
- Forming a speakers' bureau with Friends of the Library, the Library Advisory Board, and the Pasco County Library Foundation in order to reach out to schools, community groups, churches, and others
- Reaching out to non-library users, new residents, and newly registered businesses in the county
- Developing library displays and kiosks to place in government offices, schools, hospitals, museums, shopping centers, and other public places
  - Reviewing branch signage, flyers, and displays to

assure that all services are visible to patrons



 Investing more resources (money, time, and personnel) into marketing the Library's services

## LIBRARIES HELP TO GROW

We will help to grow the local economy by:

- Providing accessibility to business-related databases for entrepreneurs, chambers of commerce, and other business organizations to help them locate their customers, suppliers, and other business partners
- Offering trade journals and market research to help our local businesses identify trends in the local business climate
- Partnering with local organizations, such as the Pasco Enterprise Network and SCORE, to offer free seminars and workshops for local entrepreneurs and small business owners
- Providing the tools for local business owners, especially new business owners and entrepreneurs, to create basic marketing brochures, videos, an online presence, and other promotional materials
- Assisting prospective or relocating business owners by providing referrals to local organizations and county agencies that can help them start their business successfully
- Promoting the local organizations, such as the Pasco Economic Development Council, SCORE, and the Chamber of Commerce, that link business owners and decision makers in Pasco County, the State of Florida, and beyond
- Informing the community about important initiatives, such as the Pasco Enterprise Network's microloan program, specifically targeting the needs of local businesses

# THE LOCAL ECONOMY

We will continue supporting our local workforce recovery by:

- Serving as "first responders" for laid-off workers who need concrete help creating resumes, accessing online job postings and applications, and communicating with prospective employers through e-mail and websites
- Closing the gap created by the closing of local government offices by providing our nationally recognized e-government program as a vital link to social services that support and recharge families during trying times
- Partnering with local organizations and agencies, such as Career Central, to provide access to cover letter, resume, and interview improvement classes, as well as techniques and tips for increasing interview success

We will provide 21st century work skills to our local residents by:

- Developing strong digital literacy in local job seekers, workers, and interested residents
- Offering technology training on basic computer skills, web navigation, e-mail, office productivity software, online applications, and web meeting software
- Working with local teens in our technology tutoring program so that they can gain valuable work experience interacting with the public while also earning community service hours
























# Library users continue to borrow books, DVDs and other materials at consistently high levels, despite reduced library hours and a corresponding decrease in library visits.

#### **Library Service Hours**

Pasco's libraries are open 2,757 fewer hours now than in 2008-2009, a 16 percent decrease.
