No. Unit Schednia No. (Date and place of action must be stated) (Christian names most be stated) to be left black) No.2 A.F.C., led by Captain COLE, left the aerodrome at 5.45 on the 7th October, 1918, and No.2 General Captain carried out a most successful low-flying raid Squadron Adrian upon the railway lines and stations to the East Trever of LILIE. The success of the attack was largely COLE, H.C. Australian due to the cool and determined leadership of Flying Brigadier Capt. A.T. COLE, and I attribute the lack of Corps. casualties in the raiding party (only 1 Officer CROSS being slightly wounded) to the methodical manner in which Captain COLE collected and re-organised the machines after the raid, leading them back to the lines in formation at a low altitude. Captain COIE himself attacked a Goods train from 100 ft., and secured a direct hit with one of his bombs on the engine. Later he attacked a Pullman train full of enemy troops, dropping DISTINGUISHED his bomb from 200 ft; he then attacked the troops who were pouring out of the train with machine gun fire, causing a very large number of casualties While circling round noting the progress and results of the raid, he observed a large farm with the courtyard full of transport, horses and troops. Diving, he dropped his final bomb which burst in the centre of the yard. While October 1918. FORWARDED 8th maiting for the other machines to complete their work, he fired at and silenced a number of Flaming Onion and A.A. batteries, machine gun posts, etc. Captain COLE has been serving with No.2 A.F.C. in the Field since 25.5.18. and during that period has destroyed 4 hostile machines.
