OBAMA OPENS LEAD IN NH

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DURHAM, NH –President Barack Obama has opened a lead over Mitt Romney in New Hampshire. Independent voters who had been supporting Romney have swung to Obama in recent weeks. A slim majority of voters predict that the Obama/Biden ticket will ultimately win the election.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and thirty-eight (638) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between September 27 and September 30, 2012. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.9 percent. Included is a subsample of 600 likely general election voters (margin of sampling error +/- 4.0%).

2012 Presidential Election

With one month remaining before the November 6 election, Barack Obama has opened up a statistically significant lead over Mitt Romney in the battleground state of New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 52% of likely New Hampshire voters plan to vote for Obama, 37% say they will support Romney, 3% prefer some other candidate, and 9% say they are undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward, Obama's lead increases to 54% to 39% for Romney, with 3% preferring another candidate and 4% remain undecided.

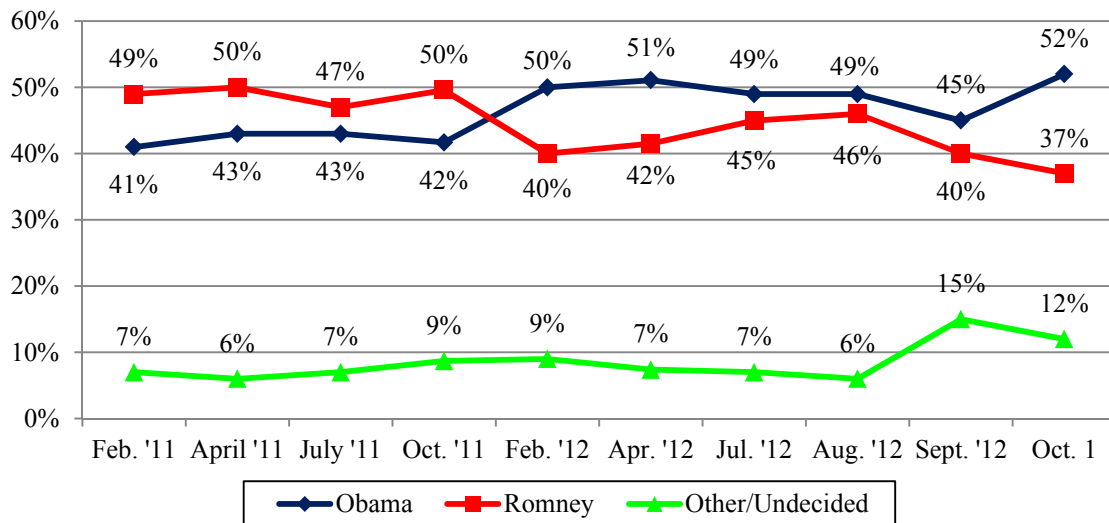
There is a gender gap that continues to favor Obama -- women prefer Obama over Romney by 27 percentage points, double the 14% lead he held among women in early September. Romney's lead among men has disappeared --46% of men say they will vote for Obama while 43% say they will vote for Romney.

The Republicans edge in motivation has disappeared. Among those who say they are extremely interested in the election, Obama leads by 52% to 40%. Throughout 2012, Romney had held a slim advantage among voters who were most interested in the election.

Most likely New Hampshire voters believe Obama will win reelection. When asked who they think is more likely to win the 2012 presidential election, 63% think Obama will win reelection, 21% think Romney will win, and 16% are unsure of the outcome. Earlier in September, 51% of New Hampshire likely voters believed Obama would win reelection.

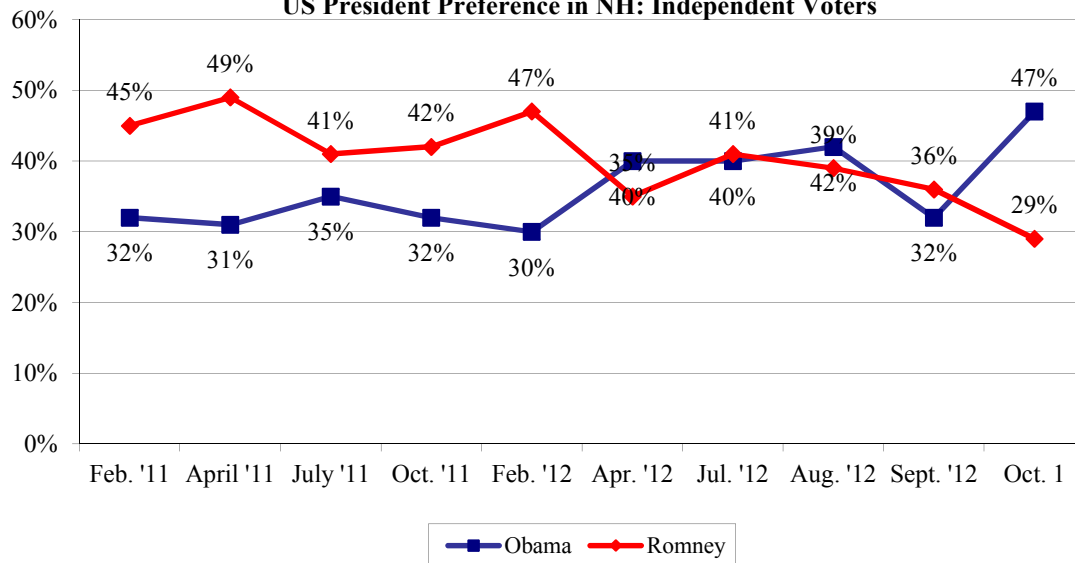

(Likely 2012 General Election Voters)**



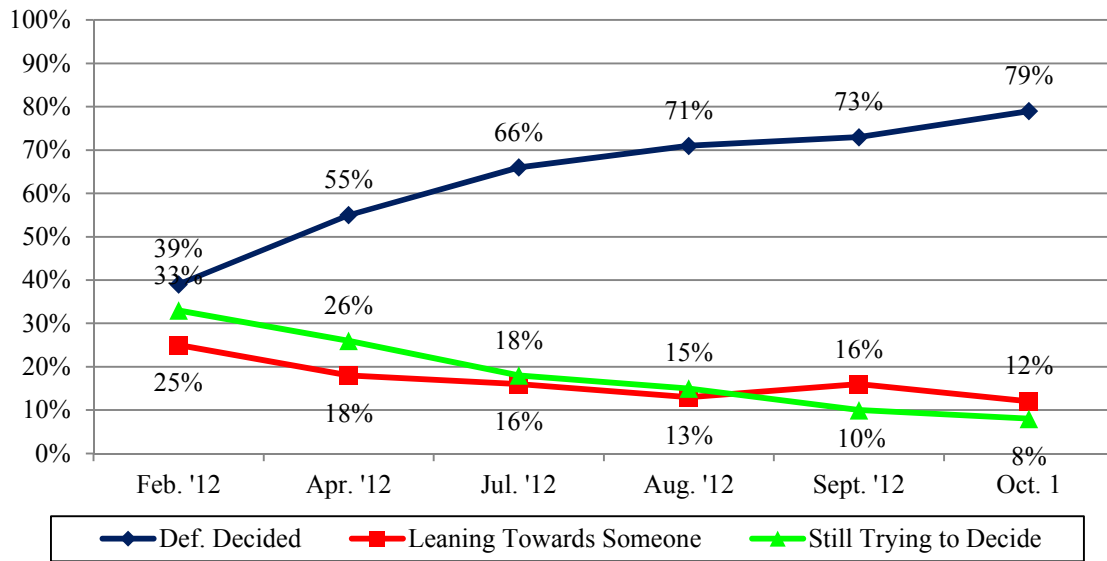
Obama currently has the support of 94% of New Hampshire Democrats but Romney has the support of only 80% of Republicans, down from 90% in August. Independents are now breaking to Obama by 47% to 29%.

Currently, 79% of likely New Hampshire voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for in November, 12% are leaning towards a candidate, and 8% are still trying to decide.

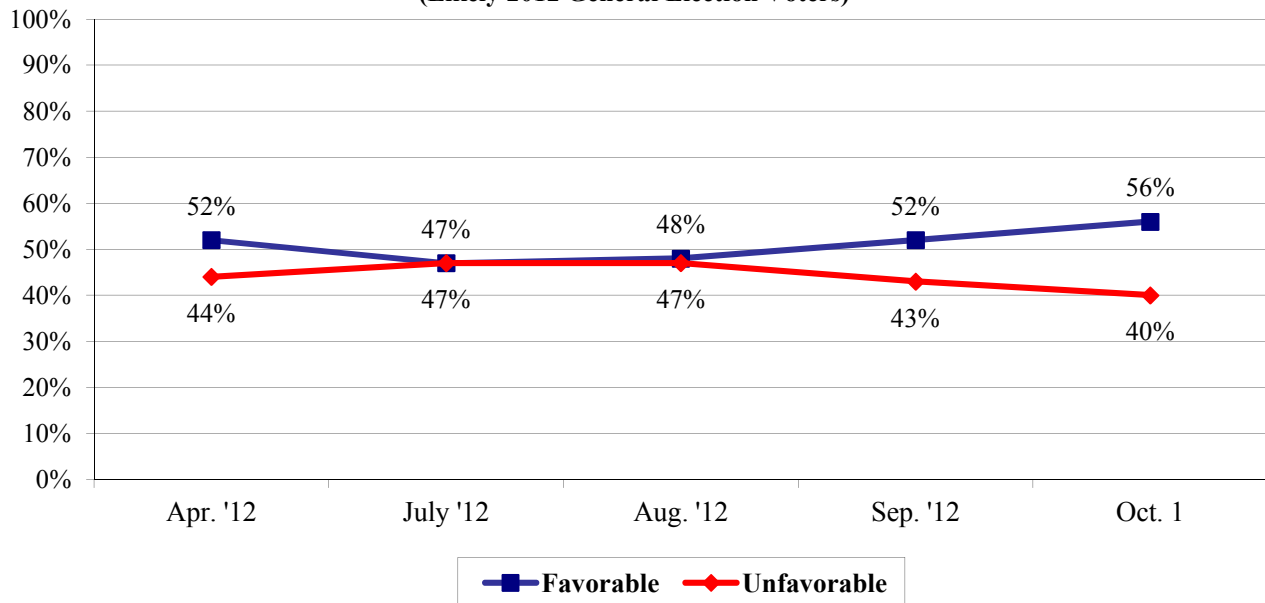
**Decided Presidential Vote
(Likely 2012 General Election Voters)**



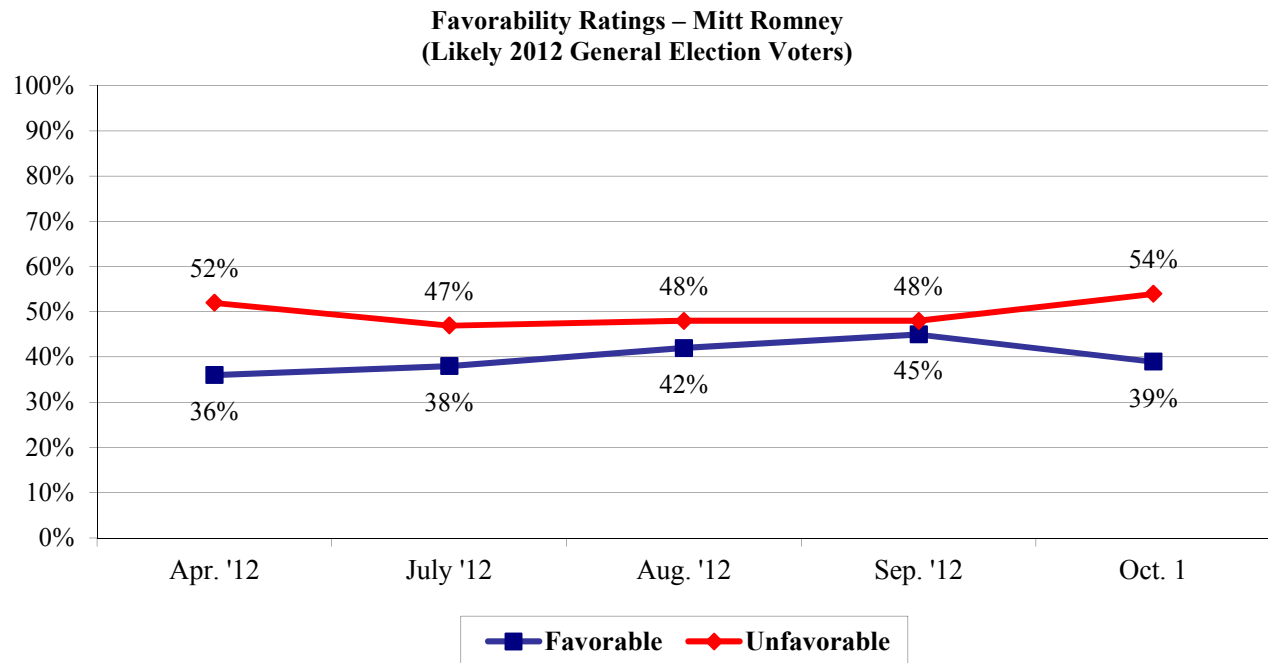
Candidate Favorability Ratings

Obama's favorability ratings among likely voters have improved in the past two months. Obama is currently viewed favorably by 56% of New Hampshire likely voters, 40% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 4% are neutral or don't know enough about him to say. Obama's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is +16%, up from +1% in August. New Hampshire Democrats continue to have a very favorable view of Obama (net favorability rating of +95%), while political independents have a somewhat favorable opinion of him (+17% net). Republicans (-76% net) continue to have a very unfavorable opinion of the President.

Mitt Romney continues to remain less popular than President Obama among New Hampshire voters and has seen his favorability rating drop in recent weeks. Only 39% of New Hampshire likely voters have a favorable opinion of Romney, 54% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 8% are neutral or don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is -15%, down from -5% in August. Romney's net favorability rating has dropped slightly among Republicans – it currently stands at +68%, down from +81% in early September. He is still viewed unfavorably by Independents (-28% net) and Democrats (-81% net).



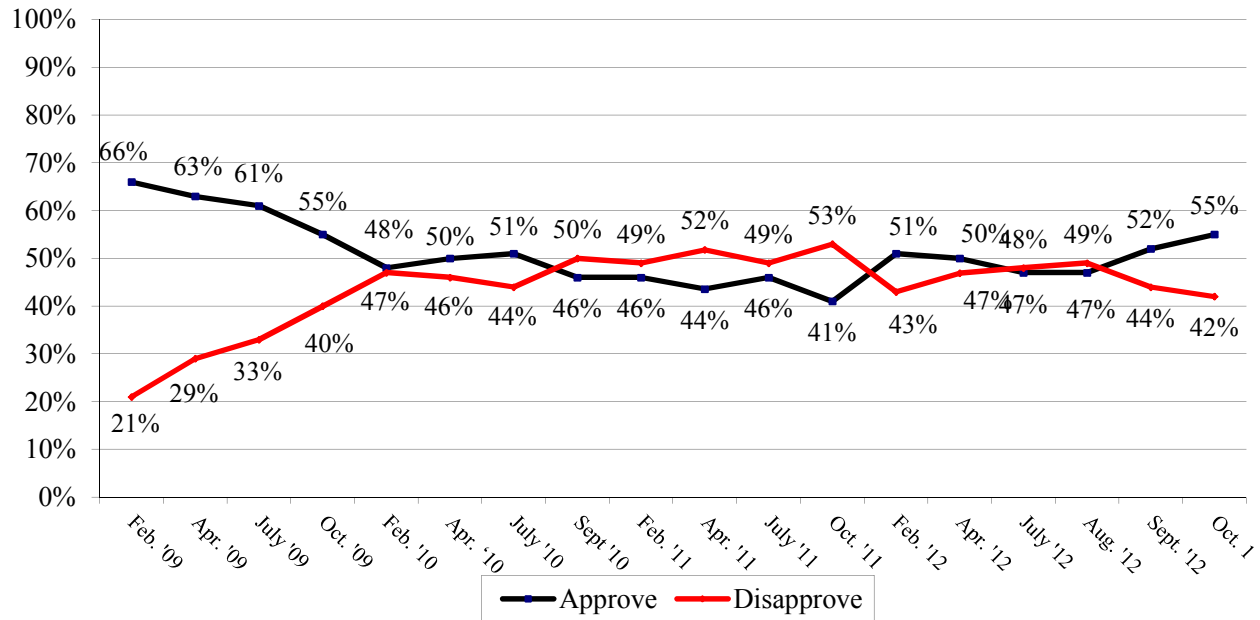
New Hampshire voters' opinions of Vice President Joe Biden have improved in the past several weeks. Currently, 49% of New Hampshire likely voters have a favorable opinion of Biden, 40% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 11% are neutral or don't know enough about him to say. Biden's net favorability rating is +9%, up from -4% earlier in September; +77% among Democrats, +13% among independents, and -72% among Republicans.

Approval ratings for Romney's running mate, Wisconsin Congressman Paul Ryan, have dropped over the past few weeks. Currently, 34% of New Hampshire likely voters have a favorable opinion of Ryan, 47% have an unfavorable view towards him, and 19% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Ryan's net favorability rating is -13%, down from -2% earlier in September; +63% among Republicans, -16% among independents, and -76% among Democrats.

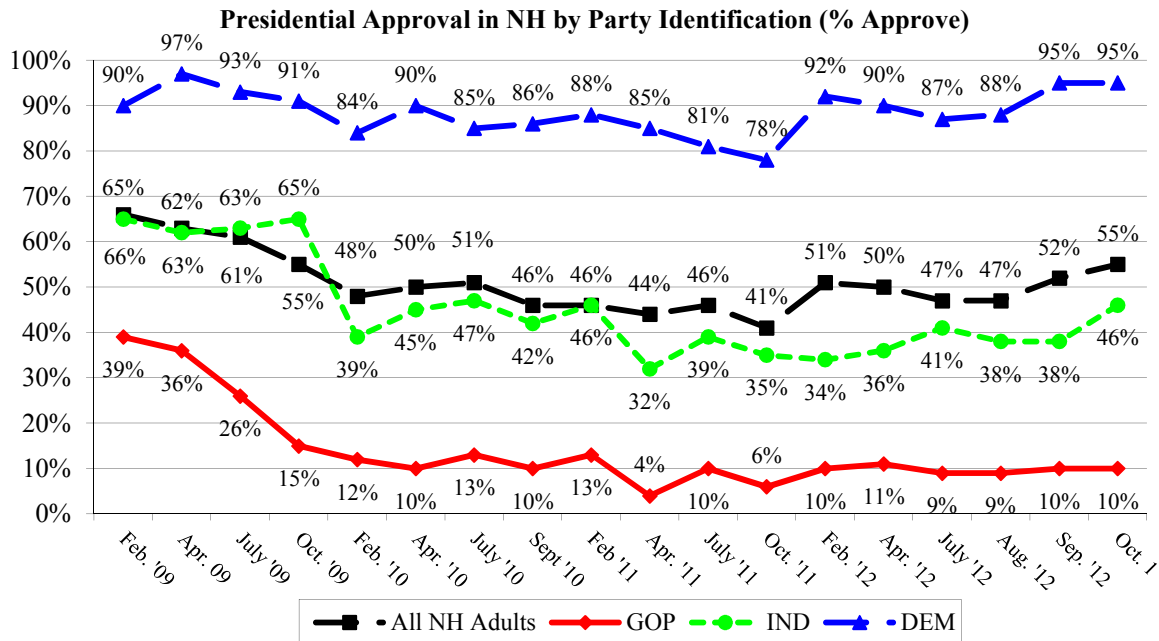
Presidential Approval

President Obama's job approval rating in New Hampshire has risen to its highest level since 2009. Currently, 55% of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Obama is doing as president, 42% disapprove, and 3% are neutral. "Typically, presidents who have job approval ratings higher than 46% get reelected," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. "Obama is now well over that figure and is in good position entering the final month of the campaign."

President Obama's job approval ratings have remained steady among Democrats and Republicans, 95% and 10% approve of President Obama's job performance. But importantly, they have improved among political independents from 38% in mid-September to 46%.



Granite State Poll Methodology

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The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
