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# Population Estimates by Ethnic Group, 2001-2009


This bulletin presents a brief analysis of the 2001-2009 population estimates by ethnic group for Wales and for local authorities within Wales. These estimates are consistent with the annual mid-year population estimates. This release provides revised statistics for the years 2002-2007 (previously published estimates for 2001 remain unchanged), first released on 15 January 2010, and includes the years 2008 and 2009 for the first time.

The population estimates by ethnic group are experimental statistics. For information on the methodology, data sources and definitions used to produce these estimates please see the Quality Information section at the end of the bulletin.

#### **Key Results**

The estimates are based on 30 June in the year in question.

- Between 2001 and 2009, the percentage of people in Wales from minority ethnic groups increased from 2.1 per cent to 4.1 per cent.
- The largest minority ethnic group in Wales is Asian or Asian British. In 2009, this group made up 1.8 per cent of Wales' population.
- At a local authority level Cardiff, Newport, the Vale of Glamorgan and Swansea had the highest proportions of people from minority ethnic groups in 2009.



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Table 1 shows the total population estimates for each ethnic group in Wales for mid-years 2001-2009.



- The percentage of the population who were White fell by 2.0 percentage points from 97.9 per cent in 2001 to 95.9 per cent in 2009.
- Each of the broad minority ethnic groups saw a rise of between 0.4 and 0.9 percentage points during the period 2001 2009.

Chart 2: Minority ethnic population of Wales, by local authority, 2009



- Only four local authorities have larger minority ethnic populations than the Wales average.
- The local authorities with the highest minority ethnic populations were Cardiff (11.1 per cent), Newport (6.3 per cent), the Vale of Glamorgan (4.9 per cent) and Swansea (4.7 per cent).
- The local authorities with the lowest minority ethnic populations were the Flintshire (1.9 per cent), Blaenau Gwent (2.0 per cent) and Torfaen (2.1 per cent).

- Almost 93 per cent of the White population in Wales were British.
- Around 30 per cent of the population in Wales with a Mixed ethnic background were White and Asian and slightly more (31.2 per cent) were White and Black Caribbean.
- The largest group in the Asian or Asian British ethnic group was Indian in 2009 around 38 per cent of Asian or Asian British people in Wales were Indian.
- 60 per cent of Black or Black British people in Wales were Black African.

#### **Key Quality Information**

## **Data Source and Methodology**

Population estimates by ethnic group for Wales are produced by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) using a cohort component method. This requires the estimation of the base population, ageing the population on, adding births, subtracting deaths and adjusting for migration.

Usual residents away from home temporarily are included, but visitors are excluded. Students are counted at their term-time address. It should also be noted that the UN definition of an international migrant is used – those changing country of residence for a period of at least 12 months. Short-term migrants (e.g. migrant workers from Eastern European countries) are not counted in the population estimates.

Adjustments are also made for some special population groups - armed forces, prisoners and pupils in boarding schools. These populations have specific age structures, which remain fairly constant over time. Therefore these groups are not aged-on with the rest of the population.

The base population used is the 2001 census count by single year of age, sex and ethnic group. Differences in fertility between ethnic groups and differences in propensities to migrate for each ethnic group are also estimated from the 2001 census. Estimates of international migration combine census information on country of birth and ethnic group with other data (e.g. the International Passenger Survey) on country of birth or nationality of the migrant for the year in question.

Consideration is given to the modelling of the ethnic dimension of mortality, fertility (and the allocation of ethnic group to infants), switching between ethnic group categories, and the various aspects of migration, with particular attention given to the application of specially commissioned census data.

Data is constrained to the Office for National Statistics (ONS) national and local mid-year population estimates.

#### **Revisions and changes**

Population estimates by ethnic group are occasionally revised (e.g. following a Census of Population or a change in methodology). ONS in partnership with other organisations have a long-term programme of work on improving migration and population statistics, and consequently the population estimates by ethnic group from **2002-2007** were revised on May 18<sup>th</sup> 2011.

## **Definition of Ethnic Group**

For the purpose of the estimates:

- Ethnic group is self-assigned
- The classification used is the 16-way classification adopted in the 2001 census
- A person's ethnic group can change over time
- Description of ethnic group can change in different contexts. Reliance on the census data in the
  modelling process has the de facto effect that the estimates will accord with the context of the census
   in particular, this will reflect any effect due to proxy responses by the form-filler on behalf of
  another household member.

# **Status as Experimental Statistics**

Population Estimates by ethnic group are experimental statistics. This means that they have not yet been shown to meet the quality criteria for National Statistics, but are being published to involve users in the development of the methodology and to help build quality at an early stage.
