NO. 12 ARKANSAS SET FOR SECOND SEC ROAD TRIP

- ▶ Arkansas travels to Auburn, Ala., for its second conference road trip. The Razorbacks are 4·1 following a 24·17 win over Texas A&M in the Southwest Classic at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas. Auburn is 6·0 and 3·0 in the SEC after defeating Kentucky 37·34 in Lexington. The first matchup in the series featuring two ranked teams kicks off from Jordan-Hare Stadium at 2:30 p.m. for a CBS audience.
- ▶ Auburn has graced Arkansas' schedule fewer times than any other SEC Western Division counterpart. Saturday's game marks just the 20th meeting between the two teams. The Razorbacks have won two straight in the series, including a 25-22 final the last time they were in Auburn, and three of the last four. In last season's meeting in Fayetteville, Arkansas jumped out to a quick advantage that turned into a 44-23 victory over the 17th-ranked Tigers, who entered the game 5-0.
- ▶ The top two offenses in the SEC meet Saturday when Arkansas faces Auburn. Arkansas leads the league and ranks No. 3 nationally in passing offense (354.0), while Auburn is first in the SEC and No. 8 in the nation in rushing offense (276.0). Auburn leads the league and is No 10 in the nation in total offense (483.0), while Arkansas is second in the SEC and No. 19 in the nation in total offense (462.8). Arkansas quarterback Ryan Mallett is tops in the SEC in total offense (344.8, No. 3 nationally) and passing (349.6, No. 10 nationally). Auburn quarterback Cam Newton is second in the SEC in total offense (301.7, No. 12 nationally) and leads the league in rushing (112.0, No. 17 nationally).
- Arkansas has won eight of its last 10 games dating back to last season. Alabama, Auburn and LSU are the only other schools in the SEC to win at least eight of their last 10.
- ▶ UA is off to its best start under Coach Bobby Petrino and is 4-1 for the first time since 2006.
- ▶ Arkansas is 169-58-3 (.741) all-time when ranked in the top 15 and 13-8-1 (.614) when ranked 12th.

CONSISTENT INSIDE THE CRITICAL ZONE

▶ Arkansas is 15-of-17 (.882) in the Critical Zone (inside the 20-yard line) so far this season, which is tied for third in the SEC and tied for 23rd in the NCAA. In 2009, the Razorbacks were 47-of-49 (.959) in the Critical Zone, which tied for first in the nation. Under Coach Petrino, Arkansas has been flawless in the Critical Zone in 19 games.

THE TEAM

- ▶ The Razorbacks have scored a touchdown on the opening drive in three straight games. They took the first possession vs. Texas A&M 80 yards in eight plays, used just two plays and 50 seconds to cover 74 yards vs. Alabama and used six plays and 2:33 to go 79 yards at Georgia.
- ▶ Arkansas has only allowed five rushing touchdowns in the last 22 quarters.
- ▶ Arkansas has outscored its opponents 88-20 in the second and third quarters this season (47-7 in the second and 41-13 in the third).
- ▶ The Razorbacks have trailed for just 8:48 this season.
- ▶ Arkansas has held its 2010 opponents to 25-of-75 (.333) on third-down conversions, ranking third in the SEC and 24th in the NCAA.
- ▶ Arkansas' leaders in each of the following departments returned to the 2010 squad: passing, rushing, receiving, total offense, scoring, all-purpose yards, tackles, sacks, interceptions, pass break ups, quarterback hurries, forced fumbles, fumble recoveries, kickoff returns, punting, field goals, punting and blocked punts.
- ▶ Arkansas returned 57 lettermen from the 2009 team, which leads the SEC and is the fifth-highest total in the NCAA:

- ▶ Arkansas set or matched 26 individual or team records in 2009. As a team, the Razorbacks set passing records for yards in a game (447 vs. Missouri State), passing yards in a season (3,842), passing yard avg./ game (295.5), passing touchdowns in a season (32) and passing first downs in a season (147).
- ▶ Arkansas has thrown for 300 or more yards in 14 of 30 games under Petrino. Prior to his arrival, Arkansas had thrown for 300 or more yards 16 times in school history.

QUARTERBACKS (SEE PAGE 10 FOR RYAN MALLETT RECORDS)

- ▶ Ryan Mallett has set or tied 34 school or stadium records at Arkansas (25 school, nine stadium). A complete list is available on page 10, but the records include: touchdown passes in a game (5) and in a season (30), pass completions in a season (225), passing yards in a game (408) and in a season (3,624), total offense in a game (412) and in a season (3,595), consecutive pass attempts without an interception (141), completion percentage in a game (13-19 att./.875; 20+ att./.875), 400-yard passing games in a season (2) and in a career (3).
- ▶ Ryan Mallett leads the SEC and ranks second in the NCAA with 349.6 passing yards per game. His SEC-leading total of 47 completions of 15 yards or more is second in the nation, while his SEC-high 16 completions of 25 yards or more is tied for fourth in the country. He also leads the SEC and ranks third nationally with 344.8 yards of total offense per game. His 13 passing touchdowns top the SEC and are tied for 13th in the NCAA. He also ranks third in the SEC and seventh in the NCAA with his 14.33 yards-per-completion average. Mallett's 170.30 passer efficiency ranking is third in the SEC and seventh in the nation, while his .693 completion percentage is third in the conference and 10th in the NCAA.
- ▶ Ryan Mallett is the SEC's active career leader in total offense (5,319), TD responsibility (47), passing yards (5,372) and passing TDs (43). His passing TD total also ranks fourth all-time at Arkansas, while his passing yardage places him fifth and his total offense ranks sixth.

- ▶ Ryan Mallett has thrown a passing touchdown in 17 of 18 games as a Razorback and in 19 of his 21 collegiate starts. He has thrown for at least three touchdowns in nine of his last 17 starts. He has thrown for multiple touchdowns in 10 of 18 starts as a Razorback and 11 of 21 collegiate starts.
- ▶ In his 21 collegiate starts, Mallett has thrown for 200 or more yards 19 times (17 as a Razorback, including in 15 straight games), 300 or more yards 10 times (all as a Razorback, including in five straight games) and 400 or more yards three times (vs. UGA and Troy, 2009; vs. ULM, 2010).
- ▶ Ryan Mallett has had a completion of 25 or more yards in every game of his Razorback career. He has also completed a pass of 50 or more yards in 11 of 17 games at Arkansas, including nine of his last 13 outings.
- ▶ Ryan Mallett owns a 15-6 collegiate record as a starting quarterback. During the 2007 season at Michigan, he was 3-0 with victories against Notre Dame, Penn State and Minnesota. He is 12-6 at Arkansas with victories over Missouri State, Texas A&M (twice), Auburn, Eastern Michigan, South Carolina, Troy, Mississippi State, East Carolina, Tennessee Tech, ULM and Georgia.
- ▶ On Jan. 8, 2010, Ryan Mallett announced his intentions to return to college football for his junior season. Mallett set or matched 16 different school records during his sophomore season completing 225-of-403 passes for 3,624 yards and 30 touchdowns with just seven interceptions. He led the SEC in total offense (276.5), touchdown passes (30) and passing yards per game (276.5) in his first year in the league. He is the only quarterback from a BCS conference returning this year that finished in the top 10 nationally in pass efficiency in 2009 (152.5).
- ▶ Ryan Mallett's completion percentage in the season opener against Tennessee Tech of 87.5 ranked as the second-highest single-game total in SEC history (min. 20 comp.). It was also the highest by any quarterback in the nation on the opening weekend of college football. Mallett's 85-yard touchdown pass to Joe Adams was the second-longest in the NCAA during the first weekend of the season and the fifth-longest in Razorback history.

RUNNING BACKS

- ▶ The Razorbacks' backfield has shared the wealth so far in 2010. Four different running backs have reached the end zone this season, and two different running backs have led the team in rushing in a game.
- ▶ Knile Davis leads Arkansas with 203 rushing yards this season. His career-high 82 yards vs. Texas A&M included a career-long 45-yard rush in the first quarter. Davis also led the Razorbacks with a then-career-high rushing total of 67 yards vs. Tennessee Tech.
- ▶ Broderick Green paced the UA rushing attack for three games this season, leading the Razorbacks in rushing vs. ULM, at Georgia and vs. Alabama. He currently ranks second on the team with 192 yards this season.
- ▶ Arkansas returned 75 percent of its rushing production from 2009. UA returned 11 of the 13 players that touched the ball on the ground. In addition, four of the top five rushers returned for the Razorbacks.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- ▶ The Razorbacks opened all five games in 2010 with the following starting lineup: Ray Dominguez (RT), Alvin Bailey (RG), Travis Swanson (C), Wade Grayson (LG), DeMarcus Love (LT). Bailey and Swanson each earned their first collegiate start vs. Tennessee Tech after redshirting the 2009 season as true freshmen.
- ▶ DeMarcus Love, who was named to the preseason Outland and Lombardi Award watch lists, has the longest active starts streak on the team. He has been among the first 11 players on offense for 21 straight games. Love is tied with linebacker Jerry Franklin for the team lead in career starts with 28.

RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

▶ Arkansas has had a 100-yard receiver in four of five games in 2010. Joe Adams topped the century mark vs. Tennessee Tech and at Georgia, while Greg Childs earned the distinction vs. ULM and Jarius Wright pulled it off vs. Alabama. The Razorbacks are one of just two teams in the SEC to have three different

100-yard receivers and the only school to have all three happen in three separate games.

- ▶ Joe Adams leads the SEC and ranks second in the NCAA with his 19.43 yards-per-catch average. He also ranks second in the SEC and 28th in the nation with 81.6 receiving yards per game.
- ▶ Joe Adams and Greg Childs are tied for fourth in the SEC and tied for 30th in the NCAA with three touchdown grabs this season. Childs also ranks second in the SEC in catches per game (5.60) and is fourth in the conference with 72.6 receiving yards per game.
- ▶ Tight end D.J. Williams is the NCAA's active leader in career receptions by a tight end (120) and receiving yards by a tight end (1,487), in addition to being the Razorbacks' active leader in games played (43). His career receptions total ranks seventh on Arkansas' all-time list and is the most by a non-wide receiver in program history.
- ▶ Joe Adams has made at least one catch in each of his 27 career games. He has made multiple grabs in 20 of those games. The 27-game streak currently ranks as the longest in the SEC and is the 16th longest nationally.
- ▶ Joe Adams has touched the ball 32 times in 2010 for an average of 16.5 yards per touch. He leads the team with 105.8 all-purpose yards per game, courtesy of a team-high 408 yards on 21 receptions and added 91 yards on eight punt returns and 26 yards on two kickoff returns.
- Arkansas is the only school in the SEC with multiple players in the top seven for receptions per game (Childs, 2nd, 5.6; Williams, 6th, 4.4; Adams, 7th, 4.2). UA is the only school with three players in the top 10 in receiving yards per game (Adams, 2nd, 81.6; Childs, 4th, 72.6; Williams 10th, 51.8).
- ▶ Cobi Hamilton became the fourth different Razorback to lead the team in receiving yards with his season-high 98-yard effort vs. Texas A&M.
- ▶ Chris Gragg, Ronnie Wingo Jr., and Greg Childs each caught a TD pass at Georgia. Childs' catch, which came with 15 seconds left, was the game-winning score and moved him into ninth place alone on Arkansas' all-time touchdown receptions list. Gragg's score was the first of his career, while Wingo Jr., made the third scoring catch during his time at UA.
- Greg Childs set new career highs for single-game receptions and receiving yards and tied his career high for touchdown catches against ULM. The Warren, Ark., native secured 12 grabs, which was one off the program record and tied for third-highest single-game total in school history, for 146 yards and two scores. The 100-yard game was the fourth of his career, which leads all active UA receivers, and the second in his last four games.
- ▶ Greg Childs led the nation last year with 402 yards against top 25 opponents.
- ▶ Each of the top five receivers from the 2009 squad returned, along with each of the starting wide receivers and the starting tight end from last season. Players who accounted for 30 of the 32 receiving touchdowns in 2009 returned to the team.
- ▶ All five Arkansas players that had a 100-yard receiving game for the Razorbacks last season returned to the squad (Joe Adams, Jarius Wright, Greg Childs, Cobi Hamilton and D.J. Williams). The five combined for nine different 100-yard performances a year ago. Arkansas was the only team in the league with five different players to have a 100-yard receiving game last year. The Razorbacks were the only team in the league with three players who had two-or-more 100-yard receiving games in 2009 (Childs, Wright and Adams).
- ▶ Jarius Wright has averaged 40.1 yards per touchdown reception in his career. One of the Razorbacks' homerun threats, Wright has caught seven TDs for distances of 70, 48, 46, 41, 31 (twice), nine and five yards.

2010 SCHEDULE NOTES

- ▶ The slate includes matchups with seven teams that reached bowl games in the 2009 season. Four won their bowl matchup. Georgia, UA's Sept. 18 opponent, won over Texas A&M in the AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowl. The Aggies play Arkansas Oct. 9 in Arlington, Texas. Alabama won the BCS national championship and faced the Razorbacks in Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium Sept. 25.
- ▶ Arkansas' schedule includes games against teams that have won two of the last three national championships (LSU 2007, Alabama 2009).
- ▶ Arkansas continued its rivalry with former Southwest Conference foe Texas A&M on Oct. 9 when the teams met in the Southwest Classic held at Arlington, Texas, in Cowboys Stadium. Arkansas earned a 24-17 victory to move to 2-0 in the Southwest Classic. The Razorbacks lead the all-time series, 40-24-3.
- Vanderbilt returns to the SEC schedule as the Razorbacks meet the Commodores for the first time since 2006 and the first time in Fayetteville since 2005.
- ▶ Last season, UA's schedule ranked as one of the toughest in the nation. According to the NCAA, the 2009 slate ranked as the fourth-toughest in the nation. Arkansas faced six ranked opponents in 2009 (AP or USA Today). Three of the opponents on the 2010 schedule ended last season ranked inside the Top 25 (AP or USA TODAY).
- ▶ After having a bye weekend the second week of the season in 2009 which caused the Razorbacks to play 11 straight weeks, the bye this year falls in week five of the season. UA played three of its first four games in the state of Arkansas before last week's game against Texas A&M in Arlington following the bye.
- ▶ Arkansas road games in 2009 included trips to Alabama, Florida, Ole Miss and LSU. This season, the Razorbacks traveled to Georgia, with trips to Auburn, South Carolina and Mississippi State upcoming. The Georgia game was the first for the Razorbacks in Athens since 2005.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- ▶ The Razorbacks opened vs. Texas A&M with the following front four: Damario Ambrose (DE), DeQuinta Jones (DT), Byran Jones (NG) and Jake Bequette (DE). Bequette has 24 starts in his career, which leads all defensive linemen on the team, while Byran Jones got his first start as a Razorback.
- ▶ Arkansas ranks second in the SEC and fourth in the NCAA in sacks, averaging 3.40 per game in 2010. Defensive end Jake Bequette leads the team and is fourth in the SEC with 4.0 this season, while fellow DE Tenarius Wright's 3.0 sacks are tied for eighth in the conference.
- ▶ DeQuinta Jones leads the team's defensive linemen in tackles with 18.
- ▶ Jake Bequette and DeQuinta Jones are tied for the team lead with two QB hurries.

LINEBACKERS

- Anthony Leon led the team with eight tackles vs. Texas A&M, which kept the linebacking corps' streak of leading the team in tackles every game this season active. Leon and Jerico Nelson tied for the team lead with four solo tackles.
- ▶ Jerry Franklin currently leads Arkansas with 37 tackles this season and is aiming to become just the second Razorback since 1960 to lead the team in tackles for three straight seasons. His 29 career starts also lead the UA defense.
- ▶ Anthony Leon leads the team and is tied for fourth in the SEC and tied for 25th in the NCAA with 8.0 tackles for a loss. He also is third on the team with 2.5 sacks in 2010.
- ▶ Ross Rasner is tied for second on the team with 5.0 tackles for a loss and his 2.0 sacks are tied for fourth among the Razorbacks.
- ▶ Ross Rasner led the team in tackles for a loss against ULM with 3.0. Jerico Nelson added 2.0 and Jerry Franklin contributed 1.0. The three linebackers accounted for 6.0 of Arkansas' 9 tackles for a loss against the Warhawks.
- ▶ Anthony Leon recorded four tackles for loss, including two sacks, against Tennessee Tech and led the team with eight total tackles in his debut at LB. His four tackles for a loss was the highest for a Razorback since Jamaal Anderson had four against Wisconsin on Jan. 1, 2007.

SECONDARY

- ▶ Arkansas opened with the following starters against Texas A&M: Ramon Broadway (CB), Darius Winston (CB), Rudell Crim (S) and Tramain Thomas (S). Crim, a converted cornerback, has started a defense-best 18 straight games, while Winston earned the first start of his career.
- ▶ The Razorback secondary has all five of UA's interceptions this season after accounting for seven in 2009. Rudell Crim and Tramain Thomas are tied for the team lead with two. Crim grabbed the first two interceptions of his career by taking one vs. ULM and another vs. Alabama, while Thomas pushed his career total to five with one at Georgia and one vs. Texas A&M. Andru Stewart added another vs. Alabama for his second as a Razorback. The secondary has at least one interception in five of the last six games.
- ▶ The UA secondary accounted for all four turnovers vs. Texas A&M. Tramain Thomas had the first fumble recovery of his career and an interception, while Rudell Crim and Elton Ford each added a fumble recovery and Greg Gatson recorded the first forced fumble of his career.
- ▶ Rudell Crim and Andru Stewart each made an interception vs. Alabama, marking the first time this season and second time in the last six games the Razorbacks grabbed two interceptions in the same game.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- ▶ Freshman Zach Hocker is a perfect 19-for-19 on PATs and 5-of-6 on field goals. In his first SEC game, Hocker made a 48-yard field goal that was the longest for the Razorbacks since 2000. He then matched that with a 48 yarder against Alabama.
- ▶ Alex Tejada has recorded seven touchbacks so far this season, including four in the season opener vs. Tennessee Tech. Last year, it took nine games and 54 kickoffs for the Razorbacks to record a touchback.
- ▶ Maudrecus Humphrey and Joe Adams have stepped in as UA's kick returner in the absence of Dennis Johnson. In two games, Humphrey returned six kickoffs for 111 yards, with a long of 25 yards vs. Alabama, while Adams returned two kicks for 26 yards with a long of 15 vs. Texas A&M.

EMBRACING ARKANSAS

In his time at Arkansas, Coach Petrino has reached out to the community, faculty and former players through numerous initiatives including the following:

Made a personal \$100,000 commitment to the Razorback Foundation. Petrino's gift is believed to be the largest donation to the Razorback Foundation Annual Fund by a sitting Razorback head coach in school history.

Initiated a kickoff luncheon that has been a preseason highlight each of the last two years. The event was attended by close to 1,000 fans prior to the 2010 season. Coach Petrino was the featured speaker and coaches, football personnel and all players attended. Two players sat at each table with fans. The plan is for the luncheon to continue in future seasons.

Asked to establish a weekly radio show, which is held Wednesday evenings throughout the fall at a local restaurant where fans can attend.


Studied and asked for consideration for a synthetic field surface to be installed at Razorback Stadium. The installation began immediately following our spring game and was completed prior to the 2009 season.

After reading an article discussing city budget issues, Coach Petrino utilized time that was allocated for team meetings during 2009 spring football to send the entire squad to the city library. The group spent part of an afternoon cleaning, stacking books and visiting with children.

Organized a ceremony at halftime that has become a fixture at halftime of the annual Red-White game honoring the senior class from the past season and naming team award winners. He has invited former players back to be a part of it and the following have been on hand: Darren McFadden, Felix Jones, Shawn Andrews, Ken Hamlin, Quinn Grovey and Cedric Cobbs, among others.

Has made appearances at several other Razorback sporting events including men's and women's basketball games and baseball, including the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

One area Coach Petrino focuses on is teaching players life lessons. Leadership classes and an etiquette dinner are two examples of the programs Coach Petrino has had players attend in order to prepare them for life beyond football.
