I. Background of the Institution

Sarva Vidyalaya Kelvani Mandal has been established in the year 1919, by a Philanthropist "Pujya Chhaganbha". The basic principle preached by him "Kar Bhala Hoga Bhala" has been the driving force for the growth of the education activities managed by the trust. Having started with just 6 students then, today the trust manages and runs various schools and colleges both at Kadi and Gandhinagar with more than 46000 students being educated. Of these 46000 students, around 5800 students both boys and girls stay in the hostels being managed by the trust. The trust is being nourished and managed by its alumni who occupy respectable positions in the society. Many of its alumni have settled abroad and they shower in donations to benefit the existing as well as prospective students for providing them with better facilities for study as well as stay.

About the University:

Kadi Sarva Vishwavidyalaya is a University established vide Gujarat State Government Act 21 of 2007 in May 2007.

The University has been established by Sarva Vidyalaya Kelavani Mandal, a trust with more than 85 years of philanthropic existence to achieve the following objectives:

To provide need based education and develop courses of contemporary relevance.

To be a University of excellence by providing research based activities which would foster higher economic growth.

To provide education to all irrespective of caste, creed, religion etc.

A Nursing college also has been commenced as a constituent college of the University from the current academic year 2008-09 with an intake of 50 seats and has been approved by Indian Nursing Council and State Nursing Council.

IV. Observations of the Committee

The Committee visited the Kadi Sarva Vishvavidyalaya on 13-14th October, 2008 and had interactions with the Management, Vice Chancellor, Administrative Staff, Faculty, Students and non-teaching staff. It visited the Central facilities including Library, Computer centre, constituent institutions of the University including various departments, laboratories, library, classrooms, auditorium, office, examination centres, faculty rooms, hostels etc. Also, the Committee physically verified various documents including financial status of the University, Income- expenditure details, corpus fund, land documents, minutes of statutory bodies of the University, etc. Based on above, the Committee makes the following observations:-

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

- 1. The University is functioning as per Gujrat Kadi Sarva Visvavidyalaya Act No 21, 2007 approved by Govt. of Gujarat on 16th May, 2007.
- 2. The University is functioning as per the Motto: "DO GOOD AS THIS WILL COME BACK TO YOU".
- 3. The University has good infrastructure facilities particularly in terms of buildings, space, land area, labs, library, equipment, qualified staff etc.
- 4. The University has ambience which is highly prone to promoting the cause of education and is conducive to promote learning.
- 5. Board of Governors, Academic Council, The Authorities of the University and officers of the University are highly inclined to promoting the cause of university.
- 6. The University has adequate resources.
- 7. Admissions are based on norms prescribed by the State Government.
- 8. There is no management quota.
- 9. There is good demand for courses offered by the University.
- 10. Adequate hostel facility is there for both boys and girls.
- 11. The results of past 2-3 years are very impressive.
- 12. Placements are good.
- 13. Several members of staff have published papers in national and international journals.
- 14. Some of the staff members have written books and got them published.
- 15. They have been sanctioned research projects in some of the departments (Pharmacy-Rs.10.00 lakh from AICTE under MODROBS).
- 16. The University provides transport facility to students coming from Ahmedabad at very reasonable cost.
- 17. University's bodies viz: Finance Committee, Governing Body etc. are well constituted as per university Act and meet regularly.
- 18. Constituent institutions of the University are accredited by NAAC-B++grade.
- 19. The courses of various institutions of the university are also accredited by NBA.

The observations of the Committee in respect of each of the constituent/affiliated institutions of the University are as under:-

College Of Nursing

- College has been established from current year only i.e. 2008.
- Infrastructure facilities in terms of Building, Staff, labs, computers and hostel are adequate.
- The college at present has 8 faculty members which includes tutors and demonstrator.
- The Committee was informed that the college is going appoint more faculty in near future for subsequent years.
- The college has signed an MoU with Civil Hospital, Ahmedabad, where the students of this college be facilitated with free internship.
- The college has its own vehicle to facilitate community projects.

Education

- 1. The Institution is running two programmes, one in English medium and another in Gujarati, with intake of 100 students in each.
- 2. It has M.Phil programme in Education with intake of 40 students. 17 students are registered for Ph.D.
- 3. It has faculty strength of 20, out of which 6 are Ph.Ds. and 9 are pursuing their Ph.D.
- 4. It has started M.Ed. from current year.
- 5. College has adequate facilities in terms of lab, computers, labs, building and staff and is running the programmes satisfactorily.
- 6. College have good number of Books and journals.

College of Pharmacy

- 1. The college was established in 1995 and in year 2007 it has become constituent part of Kadi Sarva Vishvavidyala.
- 2. It is offering B.Pharma, M.Pharma besides M.Phil and Ph.D Courses.
- 3. It has faculty strength of 29, out of which 8 are Ph.D.
- 4. Intake of students in B.Pharma is 65. At M.Pharma level, the college offers specialisation in four subjects with enrolment of 10 students in each specialisation.
- 5. Faculty has good number of publications to their credit and presented papers in State, National and international level conferences and Seminars.

MBA

- 1. Adequate infrastructure facilities are available in terms of labs, computers, equipment, library etc.
- 2. The Institute has well qualified and adequate staff.

- 3. The Institute is having Institute Industry interface programmes.
- 4. Institute has placement cell which is functioning satisfactorily.

MCA

- 1. The Institute has good infrastructure in terms of lab, computers, library, building, staff etc.
- 2. Good internet facility is available.

V. Suggestions of the Committee

- 1. University intends to start some P.G. courses such as M.Sc.-geometics, embedded systems, Nano science etc. It should create facilities in terms of staff, equipment, books and journals before starting such courses.
- 2. The MoU being proposed to be entered with industry should be specific and geared to the requirements of existing courses and the courses they are planning to start in near future.
- 3. Transport facilities being provided to the students should be made available to more students.
- 4. Student's involvement should be there in managing Hostel activities such as setting up of Menu etc.
- 5. Sports facilities needs to be strengthened in terms of play ground for outdoor and indoor games with adequate support from qualified Physical Education staff/Instrtuctors/ coaches.
- 6. NSS, and NCC and Red Cross activities should be incorporated.
- 7. Subject based associations should be encouraged to enable the students to participate and enhance their creativity levels.
- 8. Placements Cells should be there for all the departments.
- 9. University should go for University Instrumentation Centre.
- 10. University should make available staff quarters for both teaching and non teaching staff and also have a guest house.
- 11. University should make endeavour to establish Printing Press, Health Centre and Multimedia Centre.
- 12. State of the art type of central computer facilities should be provided.
- 13. Drinking water facilities in campus should be improved.
- 14. University should have a Bank Counter and a Post Office within the Campus.

VI. Specific Recommendation of the Committee

The Committee observed that the Kadi Sarva Vishwavidyalaya, Gandhinagar, Gujarat fulfils the minimum criteria in terms of programmes, faculty, infrastructural

facilities, financial viability as laid down by the UGC and other concerned statutory bodies, viz., AICTE, Indian Nursing Council and NCTE. In view of above the Committee unanimously recommends that the Kadi Sarva Visvavidyalaya, Gandhinagar, Gujarat, be regularised and recognised by UGC as State Private University under its Act.
