











Breuner Marsh Restoration & Public Access Project

Point Pinole Regional Shoreline Richmond, California

The project will restore coastal habitat and provide for public access in a 150-acre area. Approximately 60 acres of wetlands and 90 acres of coastal prairie will be restored or enhanced. A critical 1.5 mile gap in the San Francisco Bay Trail will be constructed. Public parking, restrooms, trails, picnic facilities and interpretive exhibits will also be developed.

The property was acquired to protect its scenic open space values, restore habitats for endangered species and provide public access to the San Francisco Bay shoreline.

Public meetings are underway and an environmental impact report has been prepared. Restoration is planned to start in 2012 and conclude in 2015. The project will cost \$8,000,000. The Park District has provided \$1,000,000 of its funds and another \$2,000,000 has been committed from the Castro Cove Trustees and the US Fish and Wildlife Service.
