Pro Career Highlights: In 2005-06, played briefly with Braunschweig in Germany, appearing in three games and averaging 4.0 points and 1.3 rebounds. Moved on to play for KR Reykjavik in the Iceland Express League, averaging 15.1 points, 5.1 rebounds, and 3.4 assists in seven games. Participated in NBA summer league with the Utah Jazz in the summer of 2005.

College Highlights: Ranks seventh in North Carolina history in career three-point field goals made (183). Started 59 of 129 career games. Scored in double figures 34 times.

Senior (2004-05): Averaged 5.1 points and 1.4 rebounds in 16.3 minutes a contest. Played in all 37 games and started seven times. Scored in double figures five times. Registered season-high 13 ponits vs. Cleveland State. Sank three threes in scoring 12 points at Tennessee. Posted ten points in 13 minutes vs. BYU. Shot 4 -for-8 from beyond the three-point arc in scoring 12 points at North Carolina State. Contributed five points, including two free throws within the final minute, vs. Villanova in the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament.

Junior (2003-04): Averaged 9.9 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 2.7 assists. Ranked $12^{\text {th }}$ in the ACC in three-point field goal percentage (.373). Started 27 of 30 games. Scored in double figures 17 times, with a season-high 20 points at Wake Forest. Recorded 15 points and six assists vs. Old Dominion in the season opener. Tallied 19 points, six rebounds, and four assists vs. UNC-Wilmington. Scored 11 points and dished out a career-high seven assists vs. Connecticut. Led team with 16 points vs. Kentucky. Registered 13 points and a season-high seven rebounds vs. Maryland.

Sophomore (2002-03): Averaged 6.3 points and 1.9 rebounds. Scored in double figures five times. Sank 5-for-7 from three-point range in scoring 15 points vs. Davidson. Led team with 12 points at Maryland. Posted 19 points vs. Maryland in the ACC Tournament semifinals. Registered a season-high 20 points vs. Wyoming in the first round of the post-season NIT.

Freshman (2001-02): Averaged 6.2 points and 2.0 assists. Scored in double figures seven times. Posted season-high 17 points vs. Clemson. Recorded a team-high 15 points vs. Davidson in his first collegiate start. Hit all five field goal attempts, including two threepointers, in scoring 13 points vs. Florida State. Posted ten points vs. Georgia Tech and scored 13 points in the rematch. Hit five threes on his way to 17 points vs. Ohio University.

Personal: Majored in communications. Father, Eddie, played at Louisville from 1963-66. Favorite NBA team is the Los Angeles Lakers.
