1. The Command History for the period 1 January 1994 to 31 December 1994 is submitted in accordance with reference (a).

2. Command composition and organization.

a. USS ASHEVILLE (SSN 758) was commissioned on 28 September 1991. Its mission includes surveillance, regional sea denial, precision strike, battle group support and ground warfare support.

b. USS ASHEVILLE is currently assigned to Submarine Squadron Eleven, homeported in San Diego, California. ASHEVILLE is administratively responsible to the Commander, Submarine Squadron Eleven in San Diego, California and Commander Submarine Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet.

c. Commander Terrell L. Tribble is the Commanding Officer.

26 February 1994 to 28 February 1994	In port Pearl Harbor.
28 February 1994 to 11 March 1994	Transit to Yokosuka with CARL VINSON Battle Group.
11 March 1994 to 14 March 1994	In port Yokosuka. Notably, ASHEVILLE was part of the first nuclear Battle Group to enter Yokosuka in ten years along with USS CARL VINSON and USS ARKANSAS.
14 March 1994 to 19 March 1994	Participated in PASSEX against JMSDF submarine HAMASHIO. CARL VINSON Battle Group conducted an ENCOUNTEREX against the returning INDEPENDENCE Battle Group. Transited to Hong Kong, conducting intelligence and surveillance operations in support of the Battle Group.
19 March 1994 to 23 March 1994	In port Hong Kong. Anchored alongside USS CAMDEN.
23 March 1994 to 30 March 1994	Transit to Singapore. Conducted ASW exercises with the Royal Singaporean Navy in support of exercise MERGATE.
30 March 1994 to 4 April 1994	In port Singapore.
4 April 1994 to 25 April 1994	Departed Singapore and transited through the Straits of Malacca surfaced, escorted by USS REUBEN JAMES. Submerged and transited to the Arabian Gulf, conducting exercises and operations in support of the CARL VINSON Battle Group

and transiting through the Strait of Hormuz submerged. In the Arabian Gulf, ASHEVILLE participated in exercise RED REEF V with the Royal Saudi Arabian Navy, providing training services for the Saudis in Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW). ASHEVILLE distinguishes itself in demonstrating the ability for an SSN to transit through the entire Arabian Gulf while continuously submerged at periscope depth.

27 April 1994 toConducted operations in the vicinity of18 May 1994the Arabian Gulf.

In port Bahrain.

18 May 1994 toIn port Bahrain for mid-deployment4 June 1994upkeep.

4 June 1994 to 15 June 1994 Transited through the Strait of Hormuz into the Gulf of Oman to participate in exercise Keynote. ASHEVILLE, along with USS PAUL F. FOSTER, was part of a Maritime Action Group headed by HMS EXETER. Anti-Diesel tactics were tested against HMS UNICORN. Both U.S. and British tactics were used by ASHEVILLE. This was the first time a U.S. submarine was used to test the validity of tactics developed by Great Britain.

15 June 1994 to In port Dubai, U.A.E.

19 June 1994 to 5 July 1994 Before departing the Arabian Gulf, ASHEVILLE was the first SSN to be assigned by COMUSNAVCENT as the ready strike platform. Transited through the Strait of Hormuz and then transited to Perth, Australia to catch up with the Battle Group.

Enroute, ASHEVILLE provided CAST services for Royal Australian Navy P-3s. 4 August 1994 to In port Pearl Harbor. 8 August 1994 8 August 1994 to Transit to San Diego. 15 August 1994 15 August 1994 to In port for a well deserved post 19 September 1994 deployment standown period. Following standown, ASHEVILLE conducted an upkeep. 19 September 1994 to Underway for sea trials and services provided in Southern California for USS 23 September 1994 DRUM Tactical Weapons Proficiency. 23 September 1994 to In port San Diego. 3 October 1994 3 October 1994 to Underway for Battle Group exercises in support of COMCARGRU THREE and transited 8 October 1994 to San Francisco for Fleet Week 1994. 8 October 1994 to In port Alameda for Fleet Week. ASHEVILLE provided tours to over 1,000 12 October 1994 guests during her stay. 12 October 1994 to Transit to San Diego. Twenty Tiger Cruise participants, friends and family 14 October 1994 of the crew, were embarked to learn about submarining. 14 October 1994 to In port San Diego for IMA upkeep. 22 November 1994 22 November 1994 to Underway for sea trials following IMA 23 November 1994 upkeep. 23 November 1994 to In port San Diego. 2 December 1994 2 December 1994 to Underway in SOCAL providing services for USS LA JOLLA'S TWP. ASHEVILLE 17 December 1994 successfully conducted her own TWP and

provided support for aviation community ASW exercises. Prior to returning to port, ASHEVILLE conducted Battle Group exercises with the ABRAHAM LINCOLN Battle Group. On 17 December, ASHEVILLE conducted two dependents cruises for friends and family.

17 December 1994 to In port for Holiday standown. 31 December 1994

4. Narrative.

a. 1994 was a banner year for USS ASHEVILLE. ASHEVILLE set the standard for other SSNs to follow in Battle Group operations. Significant accomplishments included the first deployment of the new TAC-III computer and the first deployment on an SSN of JTIDS LINK 16, the Navy's new tactical data link. ASHEVILLE provided outstanding support to the CARL VINSON Battle Group, distinguishing itself during numerous multi-national exercises and Battle Group exercises. ASHEVILLE distinguished itself in the Arabian Gulf as the first submarine to serve as COMUSNAVCENT ready strike platform.

b. ASHEVILLE has 18 officers and 126 enlisted personnel. Major objectives of the command during the past year have been:

(1) Operational evaluation of the first submarine force installations of the TAC III and JTIDS LINK 16.

(2) Successful deployment in support of the USS CARL VINSON Battle Group.

(3) Continued emphasis on strike warfare.

(4) Demonstrate submarine ability to conduct extended shallow water operations in the Arabian Gulf.

(5) Successful completion of a nationally tasked surveillance mission.
