WILLIAMS, GUTHRIE, CRUTCHER NAMED ALL-BIG TEN

Illinois had a strong showing in the 2004-05 Big Ten Conference women's basketball all-conference teams with three individuals earning accolades. Senior **Angelina Williams** earned first team All-Big Ten honors from the media and was a second team selection by the coaches. Williams was Illinois' first first-team selection (media or coaches) since Iveta Marcauskaitė in 2002.

It was Williams' third straight year as a member of an all-conference team. She was a second team selection by the coaches and a third team pick by the media in 2002-03 as a sophomore. As a junior in 2003-04, she was a third team media pick and an honorable mention coaches pick.

Illini senior **Tiffanie Guthrie** and freshman **Danyel Crutcher** also earned recognition from the conference. Guthrie was an Honorable Mention selection by both the coaches and media, while Crutcher was named to the coaches All-Freshman team. The media does not select an All-Freshman team. Crutcher was Illinois' first All-Freshman team selection since Angelina Williams in 2002.

ANGEL HAS ALL-AMERICAN YEAR

Senior Angelina Williams had a career-year, one that ranks among the best in UI history. Here are some highlights:

#4 on scoring chart: Williams finished her career as the fourth best scorer in Illinois histo-

ry. After scoring 32 points in two Big Ten Tournament games and 16 in the Illini's WNIT game, she surpassed the 1,600 point barrier and finished with 1,639 career points.

• Clutch 'Angel': Williams hit two clutch shots in 2004-05 in the final seconds to give the Illini a win or tie. On Dec. 4 at No. 21 Louisiana Tech, Williams hit a three-pointer with 2.5 seconds left to send the game into OT, where the Illini eventually won 71-65. Then, in the Big Ten opener at Michigan, she hit an eight-foot baseline jumper with 7.5 seconds left to give Illinois a 65-63 win.

• Williams Among Big Ten Leaders: Williams finished the Big Ten season ranked among the top-15 in the conference in eight categories: scoring (3rd), steals (5th), FT pct. (6th), blocked shots (t-8th), assists (14th), FG pct. (15th), 3FG pct. (15th) and 3FG made (15th).

• Double-Trouble: Williams had the longest double digit scoring streak in the conference – 18 games – until a three-point performance (on only three shots) vs. IPFW on Feb. 22. She hit double-figures in 26 of 30 games this season.

• More 'Angel' tid-bits: Williams was the Illini's top scorer 18 times in 2004-05 and scored at least 20 points 13 times – tied for the most in the Big Ten.

• She can play 'D' too: Williams collected her 100th career blocked shot at Wisconsin on Feb. 10 and finished with 112 for her career, which is fourth all-time at Illinois. She is also sixth on

the career steals list with 201. She finished the conference slate ranked fifth in the Big Ten in steals (.225) and tied for eighth in blocked shots (1.19).

GUTHRIE 10TH ON SCORING LIST

After scoring 35 points in two Big Ten Tournament games and 16 more in the season finale at Indiana State, senior Tiffanie Guthrie upped her career scoring total to 1,382 and moved into 10th place on the Illinois career scoring list. Earlier in the season, Guthrie had a conference-long streak of 19 straight games of scoring in double-figures, but it ended Feb. 10 at Wisconsin.

WIGLEY STEPS UP

Wigley scored double figures in six consecutive games and seven of the last eight to end the season. In those eight games, she averaged 12.1 points and 6.9 rebounds while shooting .488 from the field (40-82) and .739 from the line (17-23). During that eight-game span, she recorded three double-doubles - the first three of her career - with 14 points and 10 reb. vs. PSU on 2/13, 11 points and 10 reb. vs. IPFW on 2/22 and 10 points and a career-high 11 reb. vs. MSU on 3/4.

ILLINOIS & RANKED FOES

When Illinois topped No. 21/20 La Tech, 71-65 in OT on Dec. 4, it marked the 11th straight season in which the Illini have beaten a ranked opponent. The Illini also beat No. 16/17 UCLA on Dec. 19. During the 11-year streak, UI has knocked off a ranked team 25 times. Illinois finished 2004-05 2-7 against ranked foes.

STREAK BUSTERS

Illinois' win at Louisiana Tech on Dec. 4 ended a couple of impressive streaks for the Lady Techsters. La. Tech had won 161 consecutive home games against unranked teams and 30 consecutive home games overall - the second longest streak in the nation. The win by the Illini also helped bump La. Tech out of the next AP Top-25 poll, ending a streak of 220 consecutive weeks in the poll. From a winning percentage standpoint, La Tech is the toughest place to play in women's basketball. The Techsters are 413-25 (.943) all-time in Ruston.

OTHER SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Getting Defensive:** The Illini held eight opponents to less than 30% shooting from the field, including five of the last nine.



Illinois' average of 59.9 points allowed is the second best in school history, behind only the 1976-77 team that allowed 50.3 points per game.

- Bouncing Back:** The Illini were 8-4 in games following a loss in 2004-05. They had only one three game losing streak and dropped two straight just two other times.

- Illini Win in West Lafayette:** Illinois' road victory over Purdue on Feb. 3 ended a string of 12 straight losses to the Boilermakers and was the first win in West Lafayette for a UI team since Jan. 22, 1984 - a span of 18 games.

- Number 9-0-0:** Illinois' win over Central Michigan on Dec. 28th was the 900th game of Head Coach Theresa Grentz's Hall of Fame Career. She is 636-284 (.691) all-time.

- Shooting Stars:** UI shot .500 or better in

eight games last year, something it accomplished only four times in 2003-04. The team's .608 shooting percentage vs. No. 16 UCLA marked the first time a UI team shot .600+ since 3/14/02 vs. W. Kentucky (.600).

- Stealing the Opener:** Illinois set a school record with 25 steals, six by Maggie Acuna, in the season opening win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

DID YOU KNOW?

Giving up just 1,797 points during the season, (59.9 per game), the 2004-05 Illini had the best defensive year since 1976-77, the first year of basketball at Illinois.


