ORLANDO, Fla. - Richmond entered the 1968 Tangerine Bowl as decided underdog to 17th-ranked Ohio University, one of three major unbeaten and untied football teams in the nation. But, as the Bobcats would soon learn, sometimes the worst bite is that of an upset-minded Spider.

Quarterback Buster O'Brien threw for a school-record 447 yards on 38-of-58 passing, split end Walker Gillette reeled in 20 passes for 242 yards and safety Jimmy Altis grabbed one interception and recovered two fumbles in leading Richmond to a 49-42 win at Orlando, Fla.

"It is the biggest thing I have ever been associated with," Spider head coach Frank Jones said. "I know it is the biggest athletic victory for the University of Richmond."

Ohio took the early lead when quarterback Cleve Brown fired a 48-yard touchdown strike to Todd Snyder, the first of three scores for the fleet receiver. Richmond knotted the score on O'Brien's scoring pass to Jim Livesay. Minutes later, O'Brien scored on a 31-yard touchdown run, putting the Spiders in front for good.

"I've played football a long time, but this is the greatest," O'Brien said after the game. "It's something we've been working on since spring practice."

ORLANDO, Fla. - By beating William & Mary 21-19, the Spiders won the Southern Conference Championship and an automatic bid to the Tangerine Bowl, where Richmond met the undefeated and highly-ranked University of Toledo Rockets. The Rockets brought a 34-game winning streak into the contest. Barty Smith represented the Spiders' offense on the day with 10 carries for 51 yards. Richmond was overwhelmed by the tenacious Rocket defense which allowed Spider quarterback Ken Nichols just two completions and forced two interceptions and one fumble in a 28-3 defeat.

Richmond grabbed the lead with a 27-yard field goal by Keith Clark midway through the first quarter. Toledo took the lead for good early in the second quarter when All-America defensive end Mel Long recovered Nichols' fumble in the end zone. The Rockets scored once more before halftime and twice in the fourth quarter to win their 35th consecutive game. Toledo out-gained the Spiders on offense 395 to 138 in total yards.

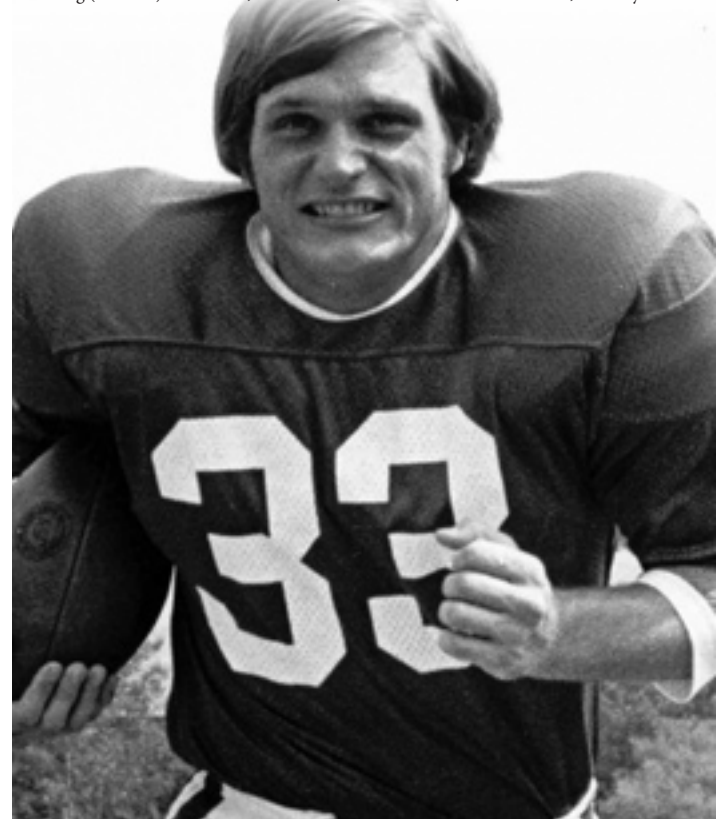

Boston U's Paul Lewis scored two touchdowns while rushing for 156 yards, and Bill Brooks scored three fourth-quarter touchdowns and totaled 112 yards receiving.

Boston got on the board first with an 11-yard run by Lewis with 6:05 remaining in the opening quarter. Lewis was the key to the drive, rushing four times for 65 yards. Richmond answered with its own touchdown at the 41-second mark. Bob Bleier hooked up with Grooms for a 21-yard scoring pass. The big play was a 56-yard pass to Leland Melvin.

Richmond took the lead for good on its next possession. Grooms scored again on a six-yard run at 8:43 of the second quarter. The drive was 12 plays for 65 yards. The Spiders scored again on their third consecutive drive when Bayer ran it in from nine yards out. This score resulted from a Spider reception by Don Miller. The drive accumulated 44 yards on six plays at the 5:24 mark of the second quarter. The Spiders survived a late comeback effort by the Terriers to advance to the second round.

The most critical aspect of the game was the Spiders missing three first-half field goal attempts.

Richmond opened the scoring by converting a 25-yard field goal by Brendan Toibin with :53 remaining in the opening period. Rhode Island answered quickly on its next possession. Bob Donfield caught a two-yard pass from Ehrhardt at the 11:28 mark of the second quarter. Ehrhardt was the key, completing all eight attempts for 57 of the 58 yards the drive consumed.

The Spiders came back to take a 10-7 lead by scoring on a 12-yard pass from Bob Bleier to Leland Melvin with 4:15 left in the first half. Once again, the Rams came right back. This time Ehrhardt threw a two-yard touchdown pass to Dameon Reilly with 1:07 left in the half. The drive went 70 yards on nine plays to make the halftime score 14-10 Rhode Island.

The Rams held a 23-10 lead heading into the fourth quarter when the Spiders tightened the game at 23-17. David Bayer scored from one yard out to cap a 10-yard play, 68-yard drive. Richmond could not muster another scoring drive. The game ended with the Rams advancing to the semifinals.

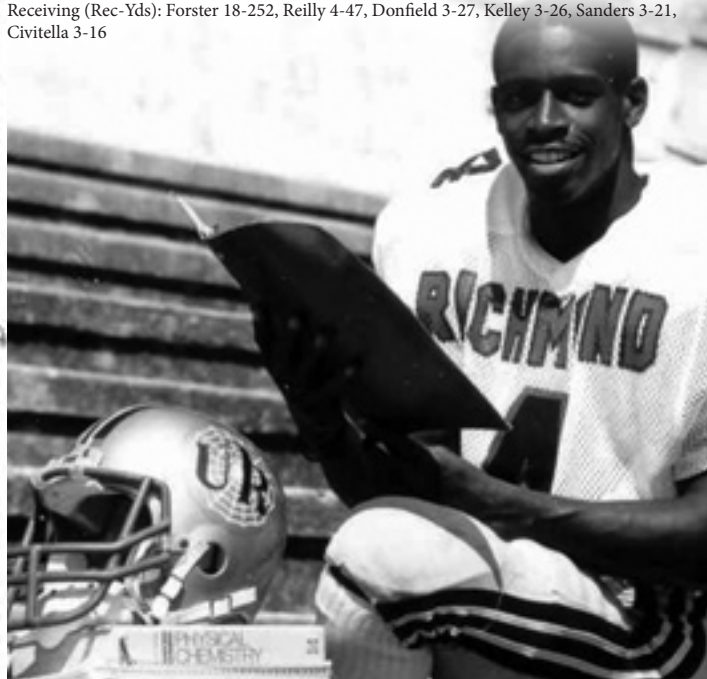

The Spiders jumped out to an early 14-0 advantage after a pair of 70-yard scoring drives. Tailback Jasper Pendergrass put the Spiders on the board first, barreling to a 19-yard touchdown run in the first quarter. Quarterback Jimmie Miles extended Richmond's advantage, finding the end zone on a four-yard run in the early stages of the second quarter. Miles was one of the Spiders' most effective offensive weapons on the day, rushing for 80 yards on 24 carries.

Lehigh narrowed the Spiders' advantage to 14-7 after fullback Jeff Snyder scored from six yards out. The two teams went to halftime tied at 14-14 when Mountain Hawks quarterback Phil Stambaugh connected with Rick Moore on a 45-yard scoring play at the 5:32 mark.

A 25-yard scoring run by Lehigh running back Ronald Jean gave the Mountain Hawks a 21-14 lead to open the fourth quarter. Richmond responded with a Jeff Falkowski 38-yard field goal with 1:53 showing on the clock. The Spiders took a 23-21 lead after Pendergrass burst to paydirt with 1:18 remaining in the game.

After Richmond's PAT failed, Lehigh continued to employ a short passing game that had been effective all day to march into Spiders' territory. The Mountain Hawks converted a crucial fourth and three play on Richmond's 45-yard line. Two plays later, Lehigh kicker Jaron Taaffe connected on a 30-yard game-winning field goal with three seconds to go.

RICHMOND, Va. - Sophomore Doug Kirchner nailed a 24-yard field goal that tied the game with 2:47 left and junior cornerback Jason Hill returned an interception 44 yards for a touchdown with 1:22 remaining to give the Spiders a 10-3 victory over the Youngstown State Penguins in the first round of the NCAA I-AA Playoffs at UR Stadium.

On a cold, wet afternoon, the teams played a scoreless first half. Freshman Jake Stewart missed a pair of field goals for the Penguins that could have put them on the scoreboard first. He missed a 37-yarder early in the first quarter and a 41-yard attempt on the final play of the second period. Youngstown State moved to the Richmond seven on its first possession of the third quarter, with 58 yards coming on a pass from junior quarterback Jeff Ryan to junior wideout Sean Guerriero. That aerial set up a 24-yard field goal by Stewart that put the Penguins on top 3-0.

Later in the third period, the Spiders moved to the Youngstown State 21, but Kirchner missed a 38-yard field goal. Richmond put together its most impressive drive of the afternoon in the fourth quarter. The Spiders moved 71 yards in 18 plays in 9:24, advancing to the Youngstown State seven, where Kirchner hit a 24-yard field goal with 2:47 remaining to tie the game at 3-3. On the ensuing possession, the Penguins picked up a first down and moved to their own 37, where Ryan was picked off by Hill at the Youngstown State 44. Hill took the ball down the sideline to the end zone to put Richmond in front 10-3 with 1:22 left.

Senior cornerback Harold Hill, older brother of Jason, intercepted Ryan with 0:41 remaining to secure the win for the Spiders. Richmond's defense held the Penguins to 94 yards rushing, 95 yards passing, 189 yards of total offense and eight first downs.

HAMPTON, Va. - David Freeman and Tim Hightower each scored a pair of rushing touchdowns and A-10 Defensive Rookie of the Year Sherman Logan registered three sacks as Richmond defeated third-seeded Hampton, 38-10, on Saturday evening in the opening round of the 2005 NCAA I-AA playoffs.

The win marked the first for the Spiders in the I-AA playoffs since, 2000, when it defeated Youngstown State, 10-3. Hampton (11-1) entered the game as the lone unbeaten team in I-AA and boasted a 12-game home winning streak, the third longest in the nation.

After holding Hampton to three-and-out on the opening possession of the game, Richmond junior Ryan Mace's muffed punt was recovered by Jahiri Jones of HU at the Spiders' 29-yard line. On the ensuing play, however, UR senior defensive back Joe Mallory intercepted his second pass of the season inside the five-yard line to keep Hampton off the scoreboard.

When Pirates' placekicker Andrew Paterini missed a 20-yard field goal, Richmond drove 80 yards on 10 plays, capped off by a one-yard scoring run by senior quarterback Stacy Tutt, his 11th of the season, to give the Spiders' a 7-0 lead with 2:58 to play in the opening quarter. Nine of the 10 plays on the drive for Richmond were runs, totaling 69 yards.

Hampton then went 69 yards on nine plays and opened the second quarter with a 44-yard field goal by Paterini to climb within 7-3 at the 14:48 mark.

After a Chris Radford punt, Hampton drove down the Spiders' seven-yard line before Antwan Smith hit Onrea Jones on a slant pass to give the Pirates a 10-7 lead with 7:58 to go in the opening half. Richmond answered right back, however, going 62 yards in 12 plays with senior Joseph Fore's 22-yard field goal at the 2:48 mark tying the score at 10-10.

After Richmond was forced to punt on its opening series of the third quarter, junior Ryan Mace returned a Hampton punt 25 yards to the Spiders' 49-yard line at the 7:52 mark. It marked Mace's longest return of the season. Richmond capitalized on the return by going 51 yards in five plays, with Hightower going in untouched from three yards out to put the Spiders ahead, 17-10, with 6:11 to play in the third quarter. The drive featured several nifty runs by UR senior quarterback Stacy Tutt, who used an assortment of scrambles and designed bootlegs to move Richmond down the field.

The Spiders then followed up Tutt's touchdown by recovering an onside kick, their second successful attempt in as many weeks, to take over possession at the Hampton 37 yard line. UR capitalized just 1:32 later as Freeman barreled in on a two-yard run with 4:39 remaining in the third quarter to give the Spiders a 24-10 advantage.

An eight-yard run by Hightower extended Richmond's lead to 31-10 at the 10:28 mark of the fourth quarter before junior Johnny Campbell's first career interception set up a two-yard scoring run by Freeman with 3:17 remaining in the game. Freeman finished with a game-high 117 yards on 21 carries, while Hightower added 73 yards.

RICHMOND, Va. - Sophomore fullback Jerome Felton rushed for a pair of touchdowns and Richmond quarterback Stacy Tutt's fourth down pass in Furman territory with just over a minute remaining fell incomplete as the Paladins edged UR, 24-20, in the quarterfinals of the NCAA I-AA playoffs.

Felton rushed for a team-high 92 yards on 20 carries while senior quarterback Ingle Martin passed for 249 yards and a touchdown. Eleven of Martin's 17 completions went to junior wideout Justin Stepp, who finished with 143 receiving yards.

Richmond struck quickly on its opening possession as senior quarterback Stacy Tutt found freshman tight end Joe Stewart for his first career scoring reception just 2:02 into the contest to give the Spiders a 7-0 lead. Richmond's 66-yard drive was highlighted by a 42-yard scamper by Tutt before the senior quarterback found Stewart from 18 yards out.

Furman answered right back as Ingle Martin hooked up with senior running back Daric Carter for an 18-yard touchdown pass with 9:39 remaining the opening quarter. Tutt then engineered a 10-play, 60-yard drive that was capped off with the senior signal caller going into the end zone untouched from four yards out to put Richmond ahead, 14-7, at the 4:09 mark of the first quarter.

The Paladins drove into Spiders' territory at the start of the second quarter and had first-and-goal at the Richmond nine-yard line. However, a 17-yard sack by UR junior defensive tackle Johnny Campbell on third down and a missed field goal by Scott Beckler from 38 yard out kept the score at 14-7.

A two-yard run by Felton at the 6:10 mark of the second quarter knotted the score at 14-14 before Beckler's 36-yard field goal with 1:07 remaining in the half gave Furman a 17-14 advantage as the teams headed to the locker room.

On the opening possession of the third quarter, Furman drove deep into UR territory before a fumble by Felton was recovered by Richmond senior defensive tackle Dan Mangiero at its own 26-yard line. However, the Spiders went three-and-out and the Paladins drove 63 yards in four plays, capped off by a one-yard plunge by Felton, to take a 24-14 lead at the 8:19 mark of the third quarter.

Richmond climbed to within 24-20 with 8:20 left in the fourth quarter as Tutt hit senior tight end Ben Teufel with a 10-yard touchdown pass. The Spiders went 79 yards on 13 plays in 8:20 but UR could not convert the extra-point attempt.

Furman gained possession at its own 26-yard line on its opening series of the fourth quarter. Forced to punt after driving into Richmond territory, the Spiders gained possession at their own 15-yard line with 3:47 remaining in the game.

Tutt scrambled to his left but his pass fell incomplete, securing the Paladins' first appearance in the I-AA semifinals since 2001.

BOONE, N.C. -- Appalachian State began the season by stunning Michigan and will end it playing for a record third straight national championship.

The Mountaineers can thank their elusive and versatile quarterback for their latest victory.

Armanti Edwards rushed for 313 yards and four touchdowns and threw for 182 yards and three more scores as Appalachian State advanced to the Football Championship Subdivision title game with a 55-35 win over Richmond.

Edwards, a sophomore, dominated on the ground as the Mountaineers built a 21-point lead. After Richmond rallied to tie, Edwards went to the air to put it away.

His 29-yard TD pass to tight end Nic Cardwell with 10 minutes left made it 49-35. His 13-yard TD pass to Cardwell with 5:27 left iced it.

Edwards' rushing yards were the most by a quarterback in FCS - formerly Division I-AA - history, and 18 shy of the playoff rushing record. He also completed 14 of 16 passes in a nearly flawless performance that ended with the fans tearing down the goal posts, the same way they did when the Mountaineers won at Michigan in September.

Behind Edwards' shiftiness and quick bursts of speed, Appalachian State (12-2) won its fifth straight game and plays Delaware for the title in Chattanooga, Tenn. (ASU went on to beat Delaware, 49-21, and claim its third consecutive national championship.)

Eric Ward threw for 208 yards and three touchdowns and ran for two more scores for Richmond (12-3), which had its eight-game winning streak snapped in its first FCS semifinal appearance.

Spiders career-rushing leader Tim Hightower finished with 97 yards on 22 carries.
