SHOT CLOCK SNIPPETS...

- Charlotte guard **Derrio Green's** 34-point effort in the 49ers' 72-58 win at Massachusetts on Jan. 30 marked his league-leading second 30-point performance of the season. Green also boasts three performances of 20 or more points against top 20 teams this season.
- The A-10 boast three teams in the top 16 of the RPI and six in the top 44 entering play on Jan. 31.
- Sophomore **Kenny Frease** recorded his first career double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds in Xavier's 86-50 home win over Duquesne on Jan. 28.
- Charlotte's total of six road victories is triple its number of road wins (two) from all of last season.
- Freshman **Aaric Murray** of La Salle is the lone player nationally averaging at least 2.5 blocks per game and 1.0 three-point FG per game. The last player nationally to reach those numbers was Eddie Griffin of Seton Hall in 2000-01 (4.4 bpg., 1.3 3P FG/game).
- For his career, junior **Damian Saunders** of Duquesne has more blocks (186), steals (171) and assists (170) than turnovers (162). Saunders leads the nation with 15 double doubles.
- Junior **Marquis Jones'** three-pointer with 3.4 seconds remaining on Jan. 26 gave Rhode Island a 65-64 win at Dayton and snapped the Flyers' 30-game home-winning streak, which was the third-longest active streak nationally.
- Temple is tied for second nationally with six road victories in non-conference action, while GW and Rhode Island rank seventh nationally with five non-league road wins apiece.
- Prior to this season, 47 different A-10 teams opened league play at 4-0. Of those 47 teams, 44 advanced to postseason play, with 30 of the 44 earning NCAA berths. Temple and Xavier this season are the 48th and 49th different teams to begin A-10 play with at least four consecutive victories.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Derrio Green - Charlotte
Sophomore, Guard, 6-0, 160 lbs.
Panama City, Fla./Gulf Coast C.C.

Green averaged 30 points on 18-of-34 shooting as Charlotte earned wins over Temple (74-64) and Massachusetts (72-58)...made 12 field goals from beyond the arc and added seven assists and four steals...scored 26 points versus Temple on Jan. 27 and poured in a career-high 34 points at UMass on 8-of-16 shooting from three-point range on Jan. 30...marked his league-leading second 30-point performance of the season...named the A-10 Player of the Week for the second time.

ROOKIES OF THE WEEK

Chris Gaston - Fordham
Freshman, Forward, 6-7, 210 lbs.

Palisades Park, N.J./St. Anthony's HS
Gaston scored 21 points and grabbed 15 rebounds on Jan. 27 in Fordham's 80-73 loss to La Salle in the Rams' lone contest on the week...marked his 13th double-digit rebounding performance and 12th double-double of the season...tabbed the A-10 Rookie of the Week for the third time.

Aaric Murray - La Salle
Freshman, Center, 6-10, 247 lbs.

Philadelphia, Pa./Glen Mills HS
Murray earns his third A-10 Rookie of the Week honor after averaging 17.5 points, 5.5 rebounds and two blocks...scored a season-high 24 points on Jan. 27 in La Salle's 80-73 victory at Fordham...scored 11 points and added four boards and a pair of steals in the Explorers' 64-52 loss at Temple on Jan. 30.

WEEKLY HONOR ROLL: Charlotte freshman forward **Chris Braswell** averaged 11 points and seven rebounds in the 49ers' wins over Temple and Massachusetts...senior guard **London Warren** of Dayton averaged 11.5 points and 3.5 steals over two games...George Washington freshman guard **Lasan Kromah** averaged 13 points on 11-of-17 shooting in two contests...senior guard **Ricky Harris** of Massachusetts averaged 24 points and three assists over two games...senior guard **Keith Cothran** of Rhode Island averaged 15.5 points and six rebounds in wins over Dayton and George Washington, while junior forward **Delroy James** averaged 15 points and six boards...Richmond junior forward **Justin Harper** scored 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting as the Spiders turned aside Saint Louis, 62-36, in their lone contest of the week...senior guard **Garrett Williamson** scored 16 points and dished out 10 assists on Jan. 27 in Saint Joseph's 87-80 loss to UMass...Xavier senior forward **Jason Love** scored 17 points on 8-of-9 from the field in the Musketeers' 86-50 win over Duquesne on Jan. 28.

CRAWLING ON ITS OPPONENTS: Richmond registered 13 steals and did not allow a three-point field goal in its 62-36 win over Saint Louis on Jan. 30, the fewest points allowed by an A-10 team this season. UR senior **Ryan Butler** now ranks third in program history with 152 career steals, while guards **Kevin Anderson** and **David Gonzalvez** share fourth place with 148 apiece.

THE GRADUATE: Temple senior co-captain **Luis Guzman**, a marketing major, earned his Bachelor of Business Administration in three-and-a-half years. It was conferred upon him at the Fox School of Business' Undergraduate Graduation Ceremony on Jan. 29.

MARKED MAN: In its 21 games this season, Dayton has held the leading scorer of its opponent below his scoring average 16 times. For the season, the Flyers have limited their opponents to 40.4 percent shooting from the field and have kept 16 of their opponents below their season scoring average.

IS JURASSIC PARK NEXT?: UMass head coach **Derek Kellogg** took the team to the Philadelphia Museum of Art on Jan. 27 prior to the team's contest at Saint Joseph's to run up the steps made famous in the inspirational scene of the movie "Rocky." That evening, the Minutemen earned their first road win of the season with an 87-80 victory.

POINT PRESENCE: Rhode Island junior point guard **Marquis Jones'** three-pointer with 3.4 seconds remaining on Jan. 26 gave URI a 65-64 win at Dayton and snapped the Flyers' 30-game home-winning streak, which was the third-longest active streak nationally. Jones has dished out 25 assists and committed just seven turnovers thru the Rams' first seven games in A-10 play. For the season, he boasts 90 assists and 30 turnovers.

HOME SUPREMACY: Three-time defending A-10 champion Xavier boasts a 28-game home-winning streak in A-10 action after turning aside Duquesne on Jan. 28, 86-50. Temple holds the record with 34 consecutive home wins in Conference play (Dec. 10, 1987 - Feb. 19, 1991).

DOUBLE TALK: Duquesne's **Damian Saunders** notched his 15th double-double of the season and 22nd of his career with 21 points and 11 rebounds in the Dukes' 75-67 loss at Rhode Island on Jan. 20. The junior forward's 15 double-doubles are the most by a Duquesne player in a season since Bruce Atkins had 16 in 1981-82. Saunders has pulled down at least 15 rebounds eight times this season, while his career high for rebounds entering the year was 14 boards.

AWESOME AUSSIE: After arriving in St. Louis from Australia in early January upon gaining eligibility by the NCAA, freshman forward **Cody Ellis** is averaging 11.8 points and 7.2 rebounds over six games in leading SLU to three victories. His 14-point, 11-rebound performance at Duquesne on Jan. 13 marked the first time a SLU freshman notched a double-double by his second game since Matt Baniak (20 points and 12 rebounds) against East Carolina on Nov. 18, 1997. Ellis scored a game-high 20 points on Jan. 27 in the Billikens' 67-62 (OT) loss at George Washington.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Dayton earned its 500th win in the 40-year history of the University of Dayton Arena on Dec. 29 in a 74-60 victory over Boston University. Xavier has a record of 131-17 (.885) all-time at Cintas Center, its on-campus home arena, and boasts a 20-game home winning streak after downing Duquesne on Jan. 28, 86-50. The Musketeers' 20-game home-winning streak marks their longest since the building opened for the 2000-01 season.

GLASS CLEANER: Temple junior forward **Lavoy Allen** pulled down 10 rebounds in the Owls' 64-52 win over La Salle on Jan. 30, his 31st performance with double-digit rebounds since the start of the 2008-09 season. Allen (10.7 ppg., 10.0 rpg.) seeks to become the first TU player to average a double-double since Ollie Johnson in 1970-71. Johnson is also last Owl to average double figures in rebounds.

ELITE TERRITORY: Senior guard **Ricky Harris** scored 25 points in Massachusetts' 72-58 loss to Charlotte on Jan. 30 and ranks seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,704 points. On Nov. 18, Harris scored 26 points to move past both Julius Erving (1,370) and Marcus Camby (1,387) and boasts 245 three-point field goals for his career.

CONFERENCE CORNER: Entering play on Jan. 31, the A-10 has been ranked in the top 7 of the conference RPI (collegeRPI.com) the entire season and its 121-71 (.630) overall non-league record is on pace to be the fifth-highest winning percentage in non-conference action in A-10 history. 45 of the league's 121 victories have come on the road or on neutral courts and the A-10 is also the top-rated conference in Strength of Schedule according to RealTime RPI.

NEWS FROM AROUND THE ATLANTIC 10

RARE AIR: Sophomore **Jordan Crawford** of Xavier leads the A-10 in scoring at 19.0 ppg. thru the Musketeers' first 20 contests. XU has not had its leading scorer average 17 or more points since National Player of the Year David West averaged 20.1 ppg. as a senior in 2002-03.

EXPLORING NEW HEIGHTS: Rodney Green of La Salle notched his 26th career 20-point outing and ninth of the season on Jan. 23 with a career-high 32 points in the Explorers' 84-82 loss to Charlotte.

START ME UP: Dayton senior **Kurt Huelsman** has started every game in his career, a span of 121 consecutive starts. Tops in program history, it marks the longest active streak in the Atlantic 10 and eighth-best nationally. Nate Green holds the all-time program record with 133 games played.

GUARDING THE ARC: Through its first seven games in Atlantic 10 play, Xavier has held opponents to just 20 percent shooting (26-for-130) from three-point range.

BLOCK PARTY: Richmond sophomore forward **Darrius Garrett** blocked an A-10 record 14 shots as the Spiders edged Massachusetts in overtime on Jan. 13, 70-63. The previous league record of 12 blocks was set by Duquesne's Shawn James versus Oakland during the 2007-08 campaign.

LEADING THE WAY: Forward **Chris Gaston** of Fordham leads all freshmen nationally in both scoring (17.5 ppg.) and rebounding (10.7 rpg.).

TIGHTENING THEIR BELTS: Under head coach **Rick Majerus**, Saint Louis has held 35 of its 83 opponents to less than 60 points, which includes the Billikens' 75-48 win over Fordham on Jan. 20.

WORKING OVERTIME: A school record five of Duquesne's 20 games have gone to overtime - including back-to-back A-10 losses at Dayton and versus Saint Louis. The previous school record for overtime games in a season was four, done three times (1993-94 last). Duquesne has also played three double-overtime games this season, breaking the school mark for multiple overtime games set in 1938-39.

DUNPHY WITH A "D": Temple recorded a 64-52 win over La Salle on Jan. 30 and has now held 18 of its 22 opponents this season under their scoring averages, including 12 to 56 points or less. Off to their best start (18-4) since the 1993-94 season, the Owls are yielding just 56.9 ppg. and 27.3 percent (104-of-381) shooting from beyond the arc.

THROWING OFF THE LEARNING CURVE: Massachusetts' **Terrell Vinson** scored 20 points and grabbed 11 rebounds on Dec. 11 in the Minutemen's 81-58 win over Grambling State to become the program's first freshman since Rashawn Freeman in 2004 to register a double-double. The freshman forward's basket with 0.7 remaining on Dec. 19 lifted UMass past Memphis, 73-72. Vinson is averaging 9.4 ppg., while classmate Freddie Riley (9.9 ppg.) leads the Minutemen with 43 three-pointers.

T'S A CONNECTICUT THING: Senior guard **Keith Cothran** and former URI standout Tyson Wheeler - both natives of Connecticut - are the only Rhody players to compile at least 1,000 points, 250 rebounds, 200 assists, and 170 steals in their careers.

WEIRD COINCIDENCE?: Dayton sophomore forward **Chris Johnson** scored 26 points and grabbed 20 rebounds on Jan. 9 as the Flyers edged visiting Duquesne in overtime, 78-72. It marked the first time a UD player registered a "20-20" performance since Ryan Perryman scored 26 points and grabbed 20 rebounds against Duquesne on Feb. 25, 1998. Johnson is the third Division I player this season to score at least 25 points and pull down 20 rebounds.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES: GW earned its 12th win of the season on Jan. 27 as a result of its 67-62 (OT) win over Saint Louis. The Colonials amassed 10 wins all of last season. GW also boasts six road victories this season. The Colonials amassed three road victories all of last season and their 4-0 start on the road in 2009-10 was the program's best since a 6-0 mark in 1947-48. After winning 11 games in 2008-09, Charlotte secured its 16th victory this season with a 72-58 win at UMass on Jan. 30. The 49ers also boast six road wins, up from two a year ago.

GETTING OUT OF THE GATE EARLY: Prior to this season, 47 different A-10 teams opened league play at 4-0. Of those 47 teams, 44 advanced to postseason play, with 30 of the 44 earning NCAA berths. Temple and Xavier this season are the 48th and 49th different teams to begin A-10 play with at least four consecutive victories.

FOLLOW MY LEAD: **Chris Braswell** (9.0 rpg.) of Charlotte seeks to become the 49ers' freshman since Jarvis Lang (10.6 rpg) in 1990-91 to lead the team in rebounding. The 6-8 forward has grabbed at least 10 rebounds on nine different occasions this season.

WRIGHT STUFF: With junior **Chris Wright** in the lineup, Dayton boasts a record of 38-1 mark at UD Arena.

ADDING TO THE TROPHY CASE: Richmond posted wins over 2009 NCAA participants Mississippi State (63-62) and Missouri (59-52) to capture the South Padre Island Invitational title. Junior guard **Kevin Anderson** was tabbed the MVP of the tourney. Teammate **David Gonzalvez** earned MVP honors of the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Fla., as a result of the Spiders' 56-53 win over #13/#13 Florida on Dec. 19.

FORDHAM MAKES COACHING CHANGE: Fordham Executive Director of Athletics Frank McLaughlin announced on Dec. 4 that head coach **Dereck Whittenburg** had been released from his contract. Assistant coach **Jared Grasso** will take over as interim head coach for the remainder of the season, effective immediately. At 29 years of age, Grasso becomes the youngest head coach in Division I. Previously, IUPUI-Fort Wayne head coach Dane Fife (30) was the youngest, followed by Tennessee-Martin's Jason James (32) and Josh Pastner (32) of Memphis.

SPANNING THE GLOBE: Twenty-one student-athletes from overseas are currently in Atlantic 10 uniforms this season.

In addition, the 22-point setback was the largest home loss for Rick Pitino as head coach of the Cardinals and Louisville's worst home defeat since a 106-72 loss to Charlotte in 2001.

MORE TV TIME FOR THE A-10 IN 2010: The league's television schedule for the 2009-10 season consists of 141 televised contests representing 214 appearances, including the title game of the 2010 Men's Basketball Championship on Mar. 14 at 1:00pm on CBS Sports for the first time in league history. Among the highlights for this season's television schedule: 73 A-10 matchups will air on television this season, an increase of 25 percent from a year ago; a 23 percent increase in the total number of television appearances from last season; greater distribution in A-10 media markets; ESPN will televise 34 men's games on its three networks as part of its college basketball package representing 43 appearances; 10 games will be carried nationally on CBS College Sports Network, including the semifinals of the 2010 A-10 Championship; and 32 league contests will be part of CBS College Sports Network's syndication package, including the quarterfinals of the A-10 Championship.

CHAMPIONSHIP CHATTER: Starting in 2010, a new format will be in place for the Atlantic 10 Men's Basketball Championship. The top 12 teams will qualify for the Championship; however the first round games will be hosted on the campuses of teams seeded #5, #6, #7, and #8 on Tuesday, Mar. 9, 2010. The setting for the Championship then shifts to Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, N.J., as the quarterfinal round commences on Friday, Mar. 12. Semifinal action will take place on Saturday, Mar. 13, with the Championship game held on Sunday, Mar. 14, and televised live nationally at 1:00pm on CBS Sports for the first time in A-10 history.

MULTIPLICITY: For the 15th time in conference history and sixth since 2000, the Atlantic 10 earned multiple at-large berths to the 2009 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship as league champion Temple was joined by Dayton and Xavier in the field of 65. The league received two of just four at-large bids awarded to non-BCS conferences and over the past two years, the A-10 leads all non-BCS conferences with six NCAA berths.

- The league posted 10 victories over BCS teams
- The A-10 climbed to fourth in the conference RPI and No. 1 in Strength of Schedule

A LOOK BACK

Tuesday, January 26
