What Just Happened

UCLA senior forward Tim Pierce netted two goals within a ten minute span in the first half pacing the sixth-ranked Bruins to a 3-1 win over Fresno State Sunday at Bulldog Stadium. Pierce's team leading ninth and tenth goals of the season came on a five yard boot in the 21st minute and a ten yard kick at the 30:02 mark. Fresno State was only able to muster two shots in the first half and was out-shot 14-7 for the game. With the win, the Bruins swept the season series from the Bulldogs and have now won the last four matches against Fresno State. The Bulldogs cut the lead in half on senior midfielder Kupono Low's second penaltykick goal of the season in the 50th minute. FS junior defender Ernie Vega was ejected in the 73rd minute after picking up his second yellow card of the match, forcing the Bulldogs to play a man down. UCLA would capitalize in the 83rd minute when junior Matt Taylor deflected Pierce's cross to the back of the net.Fresno State senior goalie Jeremy Proud made six stops on the day to move past Kirk Shermer as the school's career saves leader with 319. Low led the Bulldogs with five shots including his team leading fourth goal of the year. The match was played in front of a season high 4,313 fans.

Too Close for Comfort

Fresno State's 3-1 loss to UCLA Sunday marked only the fourth match for the Bulldogs this season that had been decided by more than one goal (FS is 0-4 in those games). The Bulldogs lost, won or tied 16 of their 20 matches by one goal or less this year. The 5-1 loss at Oregon State (October 27) marked the largest goal differential for Fresno State this season. The only other match that was decided by more than one goal was a 2-0 loss against Cal State Northridge. The Bulldog defense was solid this season, posting a 1.39 GAA but averaged less than one goal per match at .81. FS shut out its opponents four times this year and limited the opposition to one goal seven times. The Bulldogs suffered a school record tying eight shutouts while also being held to one goal on seven occasions. Last season, the Bulldogs set the the school mark with eight shutouts, including a 4-2 win on penalty kicks over San Jose State in the MPSF Tournament semifinals.

Among the Ranks

After Sunday's loss to UCLA, the Bulldogs finished the year 0-6-1 against ranked opponents. FS tied No. 1 Stanford 0-0 in double overtime at home for its only non-loss of the season against ranked opposition. It was also the first time this year that the Bulldogs had shutout a ranked foe. Earlier this season, Fresno State dropped heartbreakers to No. 16 Portland 1-0, and at No. 6 UCLA, 2-1. Last year, the Bulldogs tied No. 4 Connecticut, 2-2 in double overtime, in their only match against a ranked opponent last year.

On The Road Again

Fresno State was 0-7-2 this year on the road, marking the second time in school history that the team has gone winless on the road (first time 1975, 0-4). The seven losses is a school record surpassing the previous mark of six set in 1999 and 1988. FS does have a win away from Bulldog Stadium in a neutral site contest against Louisville. The Bulldogs also recorded 2-2 ties against Saint Mary's and Evansville. In their most recent road contests, the Bulldogs were defeated at No. 9 Stanford 2-0, and at No. 6 California, 1-0.

Sorto Earns Pac-10 Player of the Week

Fresno State freshman forward Marvin Sorto was named the Pac-10 Men's Soccer Player of the Week for Oct. 29-Nov. 4. Sorto tallied a goal and an assist on the weekend as the Bulldogs won their first two matches in conference play. Against Oregon State, Sorto scored the game-winner in the sixth minute of the contest as FS defeated the Beavers 1-0. On Sunday, Sorto assisted on the first Bulldog goal by senior Makoto Anderson as Fresno State outlasted Washington 3-2. The three goals were a season high for the Bulldogs. Sorto finished second on the team with eight points on the season (two goals, four assists). This was the first Player of the Week honor for Fresno State since joining the Pac-10 prior to this season.

Home Sweet Home

The Bulldogs finished the season's home schedule at the .500 mark(4-4-2). The 'Dogs recorded victories over Washington (3-2), Oregon State (1-0) in Pac-10 play and notched non-conference wins over Ohio State (1-0) and Cal State Fullerton (2-1). FS recorded a 0-0 tie with No. 1 Stanford and a 1-1 draw against Sacramento State. The two losses were both 1-0 defeats to UC Irvine and No. 15 Portland. The Bulldogs were 2-2-1 in conference play at home this season.

Proud as Can Be

With Fresno State's 1-0 victory over Oregon State Nov. 1, goalkeeper Jeremy Proud tied Chato Elgorriaga (1982-85) for fourth place in Bulldog history with his 20th career shutout.

Ace in the Hole

Fresno State was crowned the 2002 ProRehab Aces Soccer Classic champion. The Bulldogs tied Evansville 2-2 in double overtime and defeated Louisville 1-0. Sophomore midfielder Dan Oka was named Offensive MVP. Oka scored the game-winning goal against the Cardinals. Seniors Derek Lopez, Jeremy Proud and junior Niño Rivas were named to the all-tournament team. Fresno State and South Carolina both went 1-0-1 in the two-day tournament but FS won the tiebreaker with a 3-2 advantage in goals scored.

Goal Rush Fever

Loyola Marymount went 2-0 in the 2002 Goal Rush Classic to capture the tournament title. The Lions defeated Ohio State 2-1, and UC Irvine 3-1. LMU became the second West Coast Conference school ever to win the classic (San Francisco took home the title in 1986). Lions midfielder Andres Murriagui earned Offensive MVP honors after scoring the game-winner in the championship match. Fresno State's Jeremy Proud earned Defensive MVP honors after allowing a tournament-low one goal. Proud became the first Bulldog to earn Defensive MVP honors for the tournament since 1998 when Ricardo Ramirez and Jeff Fluharty shared the award.

New Kids on the Block

Fresno State made its seventh conference move when it joined the Pac-10 this season. The Bulldogs joined the six-team conference comprised of Stanford, UCLA, California, Washington and Oregon State. FS has been a member of the Southern California Intercollegiate Soccer Association (SCISA), the Pacific Soccer Conference (PSC), the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA), the Big West Conference, the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) and most recently the Moutain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF).
