2011-12 Rice Basketball Storylines

▶ With its top four scorers from a year ago returning and the addition of another stellar recruiting class, Rice is in position to have a break-out season. Team co-MVPs **Arsalan Kazemi** and **Tamir Jackson** both return for their junior seasons. In addition to Kazemi's 15.2 points per game and Jackson's 13.9, **Connor Frizzelle** also returns after averaging doublefigure scoring a year ago. Frizzelle averaged 10.7 points an outing. The Owls also return starting forward **Lucas Kuipers** who averaged 7.6 points per game.

► En route to being named Second-Team All-Conference USA, **Arsalan Kazemi** was the only player in the league to average a double-double at 15.2 points and 11.0 rebounds per game. Kazemi finished the year ranked seventh nationally in rebounding and with 18 double-doubles during the season tied for 11th nationally according to the final NCAA Division I statistics.

► Going further inside his numbers, **Arsalan Kazemi** scored a majority of his points last season one at a time. Kazemi was 195-of-271 at the free throw line (72 percent). Kazemi logged the nation's second-best defensive rebounding

rate (30.8 percent of opponent misses during his minutes) and 15th-best offensive rebounding rate (15.2 percent).

► For the first time in Rice history, the Owls could have three players reach the 1,000-point plateau in the same season. **Connor Frizzelle, Tamir Jackson** and **Arsalan Kazemi** could potentially score their 1,000th point this season. Frizzelle heads into his senior season having scored 912 career points. Jackson and Kazemi begin their junior seasons with 778 and 797 points, respectively.

► **Connor Frizzelle** established a Rice season record for free throw percentage as a junior, connecting on 90.1 percent of his shots at the line (82-of-91). Frizzelle broke the previous record of 88.9 percent (72-of-81) set by current Rice women's head coach Greg Williams during the 1966-67 season.

► **Tamir Jackson** has led Rice in scoring during conference play each of the past two seasons. Jackson averaged 11.1 points in Conference USA games. He had a 14.3 scoring average during C-USA play last year as a sophomore.

• **Tamir Jackson** has played and started all 63 games during his career.

▶ Heading into his senior season, **Lucas Kuipers** has averaged right at eight points a game during his career. Kuipers played in all 32 games last year as a junior, starting 31. The only game in which he came off the bench was Rice's Senior Night. Off the bench, he scored 14 points in a game that was part of a late-season stretch in which he scored in double figures four straight games. Kuipers averaged 12.8 points over the last six games of the 2010-11 season.

▶ Beyond recruiting Kazemi, Rice head coach **Ben Braun** has always had a reputation as being an international recruiter. The Owls' 2011-12 roster includes student-athletes from four continents. Rice signed 7-2 center **Omar Oraby** (Cairo, Egypt) a year ago. The Owls' latest recruiting class includes three international athletes, point guard **Dylan Ennis** from Brampton, Ontario; **Jarelle Reischel** from Frankfurt, Germany and **Ahmad Ibrahim** who grew up in Beirut, Lebanon. Rice is the only team in the league to have at least one student-athlete named to the Conference USA All-Academic Basketball Team each of the past five seasons. **Connor Frizzelle** and **Lucas Kuipers** return for their senior seasons after both were repeat honorees on the team in 2011. Frizzelle highlighted the 2011 squad as a unanimous selection and was also named to the 2011 CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-District VI Team. Kuipers was the 2010 Conference USA Scholar Athlete for men's basketball.

At the conclusion of each of the past three seasons, a Rice basketball student-athlete has been the recipient of the Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year award. Determined by the league's Faculty Athletics Representatives, the C-USA Scholar Athlete of the Year awards are presented to the top student-athlete in each conference-sponsored sport. The award is based on academic achievement (grade point average), athletic achievement and service. Former Owl player Aleks Perka began the Rice dominance of the annual award when he was named the 2009 recipient. Returning for their senior seasons are the last two recipients of the Conference USA award – Lucas Kuipers (2010) and Connor Frizzelle (2011).

One of the winningest active Division I coaches, Ben Braun has more than 30 years of head coaching experience and has had unequaled success everywhere he has been. He begins his fourth season at Rice with a 584-452 overall record (.564).

► As a result of his success, not only at California, but during previous head coaching stops at Eastern Michigan and Siena Heights, **Ben Braun** heads into his fourth season at Rice ranked 13th among all active Division I coaches with his 584 career victories. He ranks in the Top 50 on the NCAA's list of all-time winningest Division I men's basketball coaches by victories (No. 45).

• **Ben Braun** will coach against one of his former assistants when the Owls travel to Texas A&M on Dec. 22. Texas A&M first-year head coach Billy Kennedy was a member of Braun's first staff at Cal (1996-97).

▶ While major renovations to Tudor Fieldhouse were made just three years ago, Rice continues to make improvements to its 5,208 seat arena. This past summer Rice had a new playing court installed in Tudor Fieldhouse.

▶ Rice opens the 2011-12 season by playing its first four games at home and later in the year has a stretch in which it plays five of six in Tudor Fieldhouse. The Owls open their season Nov. 12 against the University of New Orleans.

▶ Rice does not leave the state of Texas during nonconference play (15 games). The Owls' nonconference schedule includes the 2011 South Padre Island Invitational. The tournament held during the week of Thanksgiving will include two games played on the Rice campus (against Maryland-Eastern Shore and Florida A&M). The Owls will take on Northern Iowa and Iowa State in the South Padre Island Convention Center Nov. 25-26.

• With games at crosstown rival Houston as well as a nonconference game at HBU, Rice will play a total of 19 games in Houston proper.







Head Coach Alma Mater | Wisconsin, 1975 Ben Braun

In three seasons at the helm of the Rice University basketball program, Ben Braun has positioned the Owls for the future.

Starting with the Owls' 2008 signing class, which ESPN.com ranked No. 3 among NCAA Division I mid-major programs, Braun's staff has assembled three straight highly-touted recruiting classes.

This past season, the staff's work on the recruiting trail as well as on the practice court certainly became apparent.

With a 14-18 record, Rice posted the most victories since the 2006-07 season and the team's 5-11 conference mark doubled the program's total conference wins from the past three combined sea-

sons. Along the way, the Owls beat LSU and TCU in back-to-back games, swept cross-town rival Houston for the first time since 1993 and posted its first series win over a Memphis team which would advance to the NCAA Tournament.

The Owls won a first-round game at the Conference USA Championship for the second time in three seasons under Braun.

For the 2011-12 season, Rice will return its top four scorers from a year ago.

Arsalan Kazemi and Tamir Jackson were members of the 2008 recruiting class. Kazemi is coming off a sophomore season in which he was named Second Team All-Conference USA while Jackson has started all 63 games of his career and with a 12.9 scoring average and 209 assists in two seasons, is on the verge of becoming one of the Owls' all-time leading playmakers.

In addition to Kazemi and Jackson, Connor Frizzelle enters his senior year already having scored 900 career points while fellow senior Lucas Kuipers started all but one game last year.

In 2011, Frizzelle and Kuipers also highlighted the Owls' success in the classroom as both were named to the Conference USA All-Academic Team. Dating back to his 12 seasons as the head coach at the University of California, Braun has now had student-athletes earn conference all-academic honors a total of 20 times. Rice has had at least one C-USA All-Academic selection each of the past five years which is unequaled by any other conference basketball opponent.

Rice student-athletes were named the Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year for men's basketball each of the last three sea-

sons. Kuipers won the award last year while Frizzelle was this year's recipient. Aleks Perka began the Owls' three-year run of C-USA Scholar Athlete of the Year selectees in 2009.

In three seasons at Rice, Braun has had a total of 11 studentathletes named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll a total of 17 times.

Rice Basketball received Conference USA's 2011 Sport Academic Award which is annually recognizes the team with the highest grade point average for each conference-sponsored sport.

The Owls announced another stellar recruiting class ahead of the 2011-12 season. Joining the Owls this year is combo guard Julian DeBose, point guard Dylan Ennis and forwards Seth Gearhart, Ahmad Ibrahim and Jarelle Reischel.

Success on the Court

One of the winningest active Division I coaches, Braun has more than 30 years of head coaching experience and has had unequaled success everywhere he has been. He begins his fourth season at Rice with a 584-452 overall record (.564).

During his 12-year tenure at Cal, Braun directed the Bears to five NCAA Tournament berths and three trips to the NIT. He led the 1998 Bears to a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16 and to an NIT championship in 1999.

In his final season at Cal, Braun coached the Bears to the second round of the NIT before losing to eventual champion Ohio State.

While at the University of California, two of his players earned

Pac-10 Player of the Year honors – Ed Gray in 1997 and Sean Lampley in 2001 – while Leon Powe was the 2004 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. Overall, Braun's players received All-Pac-10 status nine times, Pac-10 All-Freshman notice on seven occasions and Pac-10 All-Academic accolades 15 times.

As a result of his success, not only at Cal, but during previous head coaching stops at Eastern Michigan and Siena Heights, Braun heads into his fourth season at Rice ranked 13th among all active Division I coaches with his 584 career victories. He ranks in the Top 50 on the NCAA's list of all-time winningest Division I men's basketball coaches by victories (No. 45).

Braun was 219-154 in his 12 seasons at Cal.

The 1997 Pac-10 Coach of the Year and a finalist for the 2003 Naismith National Coach of the Year, Braun has posted a 584-452 career record. He finished his Cal career second only to Nibs Price (1925-54, 449-294) in both longevity and wins and his Cal winning percentage of .587 was the best at the school since Hall of Famer Pete Newell guided the Bears to a 119-44 mark from 1955-60.

Generally regarded as one of college basketball's top teachers and strategists, Braun brought his energetic style of coaching to Cal in September, 1996. During his initial season, Braun took a team that was predicted to finish in the conference's lower half, molded it into one that tied for second in the league and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 with tournament victories over Princeton and Villanova. In addition, the 23-9 overall mark gave Braun a school record for most wins by a Bear coach in his first year with the program.

In 1998-99, Braun's club became the first Cal team ever to beat

three Top 10 schools in the same season with victories over North Carolina, UCLA and Arizona during the course of the year. Then, after earning a bid to the NIT, the Bears went on a 5-0 run to capture the title - Cal's first postseason tournament championship since the Bears won the 1959 NCAA crown. Cal finished the 1998-99 campaign with a 22-11 record.

A year later, Braun took a freshman-dominated squad back to the postseason as the Bears reached the quarterfinals of the NIT. On Jan. 15, 2000, he picked up his 400th career victory with a 71-65 win at Oregon State. In 2000-01, the Bears returned to the NCAA Tournament and finished with a 20-11 record. Lampley - Braun's first recruit at Cal - became the school's all-time leading scorer late in his senior campaign with 1,776 points.

The Bears again won 23 games and tied for second in the Pac-10 race in 2001-02. Cal reached the semifinals of the conference tournament by defeating UCLA in the opening round and earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA playoffs, where the Bears toppled Penn before falling to Pittsburgh.

In 2003, Cal reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament behind All-Pac-10 forwards Joe Shipp and Amit Tamir. Shipp ended his career holding third place on the Bears' all-time scoring list, while teammate Brian Wethers finished in the No. 15 position.

Behind tournament MVP Leon Powe, Cal defeated USC and Oregon to reach the Pac-10 Tournament final for the first time ever in 2006. The Bears then earned a No. 7 regional seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished the year with a 20-11 mark. On Nov. 21, 2005, Cal defeated Long Beach State, 88-69, to give Braun his 500th

career win.

Braun's 2007 Cal team fought off injuries to a pair of key post players to reach the semifinals of the Pac-10 Tournament for the fourth time in six years. The Bears upset top-seed and fourth-ranked UCLA, 76-69, in overtime in the quarterfinals, and freshman Ryan Anderson was voted to the all-tournament team.

Twice during his final season at Cal, the Bears defeated nationally-ranked opponents, including a 69-64 upset on the road of ninth-ranked Washington State. Sophomore Ryan Anderson was an all Pac-10 selection.

Braun already has 34 years of experience as a head coach, including 11 highly-successful years at Eastern Michigan, where he guided the Eagles to four postseason berths, including three NCAA appearances. During his tenure there, Braun accumulated a record of 185-132, averaging almost 18 wins per season, and was named Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year three times. In addition, Braun coached at Siena Heights College for eight years and took the NAIA school to a 148-103 record and five postseason tournaments.

Braun's players proved to be successful both on the court and in the classroom, with Golden Bears earning Pac-10 All-Academic recognition 15 times under his direction. In 2001, three players – Morgan Lingle, Dennis Gates and Ryan Forehan-Kelly – were firstteam selections, while Donte Smith was an honorable mention pick which gave Cal more than twice as many all-academic members as any other school in the conference. The Bears had at least one allacademic pick in each of Braun's last eight years heading the program.

Early in His Career

Braun began his career as an assistant coach at Park High School in Racine, Wis. Within two years, he accepted the head coaching job at Siena Heights. After an 8-21 debut season in 1977-78, his teams posted a 140-82 record over the next seven years, including four 20-win campaigns. His squads qualified for National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) postseason tournaments five times. During his time at Siena Heights, he not only coached, but also taught English at the school. In the summer of 1999, Braun was inducted into the first class of the Siena Heights Athletic Hall of Fame.

Braun accepted the position of associate head coach at Eastern Michigan prior to the start of the 1985-86 season, but midway through the year, on Jan. 15, 1986, he was elevated to interim head coach. Success came quickly and within two years he had the Eagles in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history.

In 1989, Braun served as head coach of the U.S. men's basketball team at the Maccabiah Games. He took an internationally-inexperienced squad to the championship round before bowing to the host Israeli team in the final.

During his career, Braun has coached 17 players who were drafted or went on to play in the NBA. Among the players on that list are Powe, who won an NBA World Championship with the Boston Celtics in 2008, Sean Marks of the New Orleans Hornets and the Orlando Magic's Ryan Anderson. Braun also coached Tony Gonzalez who has gone on to an All-Pro career in the NFL playing for the Kansas City Chiefs and now the Atlanta Falcons. While at Eastern Michigan, he coached both Grant Long and Earl Boykins.

Braun is on a short list of NCAA coaches who have had a large number of former assistants advance professionally to become Division I head coaches. Akron's Keith Dambrot, Texas A&M's Billy Kennedy, San Jose State's George Nessman and Cleveland State's Gary Waters were all, at one point during their careers, a member of Braun-led coaching staffs. Current Arizona assistant Joe Pasternack is the former head coach at New Orleans and a former member of a Braun-led coaching staff as is former Eastern Michigan coach Charles E. Ramsey.

A native of Chicago, Braun graduated from New Trier High School, where he starred in both basketball and baseball. He went on to play one year of basketball at the University of Wisconsin-La-Crosse before he transferred to the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He earned a teaching degree in English in June of 1975 with a minor in African-American Studies. Five years later, he earned his master's degree in guidance and counseling from Siena Heights.

Braun and wife Jessica have a son, Julius (3).

Associate Head Coach Alma Mater | San Francisco State, 1982 Louis Reynaud

As the Associate Head Coach for Rice Basketball, Louis Reynaud begins his fourth season as one of the country's most respected and accomplished assistant coaches.

During his tenure at Rice, Reynaud has helped build the foundation for a rise to the top of Conference USA. In his first season, the program made immediate strides as the Owls more than tripled their total victories from the previous season.

Reynaud helped Rise sign a recruiting class that both ESPN. com and Rivals.com recognized as one of the Top 10 among midmajor universities. And that recruiting success has continued. Last year the Owls posted a 14-18 record, marking the most wins by a Rice team since the 2006-07 season and the team doubled its total conference wins from the previous three combined seasons. Along the way, the Owls beat LSU and TCU in back-to-back games, swept cross-town rival Houston for the first time since 1993 and posted their first series win over a Memphis team which would advance to the NCAA Tournament.

Over the last three seasons, Rice has had 11 student-athletes named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll a total of 17 times. Rice student-athletes were named the Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year for men's basketball in both 2009 (Aleks Perka) and 2010 (Lucas Kuipers).

Reynaud joined the Rice staff from the University of California where he worked for 11 seasons on Ben Braun's staff including the last six seasons as Associate Head Coach. In his 11 seasons at Cal, the Golden Bears advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times as well as appeared in three NIT Tournaments, winning the 1999 NIT Championship.

Reynaud helped develop nine future professional players at Cal including current NBA standouts Leon Powe (Cleveland Cavaliers), Francisco Elson (Milwaukee Bucks) and Ryan Anderson (New Jersey Nets).

Prior to joining the University of California staff, Reynaud compiled an 84-31 record as the head basketball coach at De La Salle High School. He led the school to league titles in 1994 and 1996 and was twice named the Bay Valley Athletic League Coach of the Year.

Reynaud's 1996 team captured the Division I NorCal championship and finished second in the state, earning a No. 1 ranking in the Bay Area for the first time in school history.

Reynaud's first head coaching position was at St. Patrick-St. Vincent High School in Vallejo, Calif., from 1990-93. In three seasons the school was 69-39, posted three, 20-win seasons and captured one Sac-Joaquin Sectional title. From 1986-90, Reynaud served as assistant varsity basketball coach at De La Salle High School. In addition to his coaching experience, Reynaud served as Dean of Students at both St. Patrick-St. Vincent and De La Salle High Schools.

In 1997, Reynaud was selected as head coach of the West Squad at the Magic Johnson Round Ball Classic for high school All-Americans and he directed the prestigious ABCD summer camp for five years.

As a high school player, Reynaud was a standout at Archbishop Riordan High School in San Francisco and played for the late Lyle Newcomer at Skyline College in San Bruno, Calif.

Reynaud received his bachelor's degree from San Francisco State in 1982 and a master's degree in health/physical education from Saint Mary's College in 1995. Reynaud has one daughter, Lauren (21).



Assistant Coach Alma Mater | Indiana, 2005 Mike Roberts

Mike Roberts is in his fourth season as an assistant coach on the Rice University staff. He previously was a member of Ben Braun's staff at the University of California the previous two years.

At Rice, Roberts has played a role in the Owls building a foundation for the future. As a member of the coaching staff, he helped the Owls sign an initial recruiting class that both ESPN.com and Rivals.com recognized as one of the Top 10 among mid-major universities. That recruiting success has continued during his tenure.

During Roberts' first season on South Main, Rice more than tripled its win total from the previous year.

Last year the Owls posted a 14-18 record, marking the most wins by a Rice team since the 2006-07 season and the team doubled its total conference wins from the previous three combined seasons. Along the way, the Owls beat LSU and TCU in back-to-back games, swept cross-town rival Houston for the first time since 1993 and posted their first series win over a Memphis team which would advance to the NCAA Tournament.

Academically over the last three seasons, Rice has had 11 student-athletes named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll a total of 17 times. Rice has also had five selections to the Conference USA All-Academic Team over the past three years.

At Cal, Roberts served as the video coordinator for the 2006-07 season before assuming an assistant coach position for the 2007-08 season.

As an assistant coach on the Cal staff, Roberts was responsible for overseeing the team's academic program and recruiting as well as scouting and game preparation in addition to on-floor coaching. As video coordinator, Roberts was involved in game preparation, self scouting, game film breakdown and other administrative duties.

Prior to his two seasons in Berkeley, Roberts played at Indiana, graduating in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in history with a certificate in management, then served one season as a graduate assistant coach at Texas Tech. The Terre Haute, Ind., native helped the Hoosiers to three NCAA Tournaments, including a national runner-up finish in 2002, as well as one NIT appearance. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree and recipient of a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, he served as a team captain as a senior in 2004-05.

At Texas Tech, Roberts aided the coaching staff in practices, supervised academic progress of the student-athletes and was an analyst for Texas Tech radio and television broadcasts. He also participated in the 2006 ESPN production "Knight School," in which the Texas Tech coaching staff evaluated 16 walk-ons who vied for one spot on the Red Raiders' roster.

In addition to receiving his bachelor's degree from Indiana in 2005, Roberts received a master's degree in interdisciplinary studies from Texas Tech in 2006.

Roberts and his wife, Janet, have a son, Paxton (two).



Assistant Goach Alma Mater | Rutgers, 2005 Marco Morcos

Marco Morcos begins his second season as an assistant coach and fourth as a member of the Rice basketball staff.

After two years in an administrative role, Morcos was named an assistant coach prior to the 2010-11 season. With the announcement, the former high school coach returned to a familiar setting of working with student-athletes on the court and has now taken on a more extended role in recruiting.

The Owls posted a 14-18 record last year during Morcos' first season as an assistant coach. Last year's win total was the most by a Rice team since the 2006-07 season and the Owls doubled their total conference wins from the previous three combined seasons. Along the way, Rice beat LSU and TCU in back-to-back games, swept cross-town rival Houston for the first time since 1993 and posted its first series win over a Memphis team which would advance to the NCAA Tournament.

Morcos was elevated to assistant coach after serving the previous two years as the Director of Basketball Operations. He served in a similar position at UAB during the 2007-08 season. He was part of a Blazer team which posted a 23-11 record and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament.

Prior to making the move to collegiate basketball, Morcos was a successful high school and AAU coach.

He was the head coach at LEAP Academy University Charter School in Camden, N.J., for three years (2004-07). LEAP compiled a 102-20 record during Morcos' three seasons. Beyond wins and losses, Morcos' teams had a 100 percent graduation rate from the college preparatory school and maintained better than a 3.0 team grade point average.

In just his second year, Morcos' team was 27-6 and earned the No. 1 seed to the NJSIAA South Jersey playoffs. LeAP would capture the South Jersey Sectional as well as win the Central Jersey Championship. The team went on to finish as runners-up at the New Jersey state championship in 2006. Morcos' successful second year marked the fastest a coach had led a team to a state championship in New Jersey Scholastic history (two years).

Morcos' 2007 team posted a 25-7 record and was ranked No. 7 in South Jersey in the final regional rankings by the Courier-Post.

Additionally, Morcos was the head coach at Rise Academy where he led the team to a 31-8 record.

Morcos previously ran a nationally-competitive AAU program and was responsible for developing over 100 Division I and Division II players during his coaching career. He also coached at the Rise Basketball Northeast Regional All-Star Game.

His coaching experience also includes working as a counselor at the prestigious Reebok All-American Camp (RAAC).

Morcos saw action in 33 games during a two-year playing career for Rutgers-Camden.

A native of Egypt, Morcos has a son, Jeremiah (9).



Video Goordinator Alma Mater | Central Michigan, 1999 Mark Vick

Mark Vick is in his fourth year as the video coordinator for the Rice basketball program. He joined the Rice staff after a four-year stint in a similar position at Oakland University.

Vick's responsibilities at Rice include creating comprehensive breakdowns of video and cutups for opponent scouting, assisting in the development of scouting reports as well as coordinating film exchange. Internally, he oversees filming and logging games, practices and individual workouts. He also has extensive responsibilities in coordinating the Ben Braun Basketball Camps.

In addition to his video responsibilities while at Oakland University, Vick was the camp operations director of the program's basketball camps which grew to nearly 500 campers during his tenure. He also served as an administrative assistant, with a wide-range of responsibilities including game management, supervising and coordinating managerial staff, assisting with team travel and developing and leading community service activities.

Vick's prior basketball experience includes experience as both a head coach and assistant coach at the high school level. He also has a wealth of knowledge of the game with 15 years experience working collegiate basketball camps.

Prior to joining the Oakland basketball staff, Vick coached a season each at Smoky Mountain High School and Cherokee High School in North Carolina. He also spent time coaching a number of youth teams in the western North Carolina region.

Vick has served as a coach at summer camps held at Central Michigan University, University of Dayton, Michigan State University, University of Wisconsin and Western Carolina University.

He has also conducted the Mark Vick Championship Basketball Camps in his hometown of Houghton Lake, Mich.

Vick graduated from Central Michigan in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in health fitness and promotion in preventive rehabilitation. As an undergraduate, he was a student manager for CMU's basketball team. He went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Florida State in 2002.



Basketball Trainer Alma Mater | Cal State-Sacramento, 1976 Dean Miller

Dean Miller, M.S., A.T.C, enters his third year as a member of the Rice University athletic training staff. Among his responsibilities is coordinating the sports medicine needs of the men's basketball program.

Miller joined the Rice University staff from Diablo Valley College where he served as an assistant basketball coach and was responsible for strength and conditioning as well as nutrition for the team. Since the late 1970s, Miller has also been involved in athletic training for a variety of motorsports teams and drivers. He has been a part of 18 motorsports world championships. During Miller's tenure at Diablo Valley College (1997-2009), the Vikings won eight conference championships and had 16 studentathletes go on to play for NCAA Division I programs.

Miller first became involved in motorsports in 1978 when he served as athletic trainer and sports medicine consultant for Kenny Roberts, the first American to win the 500cc Road Racing World Championship (1978, 1979 & 1980). He served in the same capacity for Kenny Roberts, Jr., and Team Suzuki's World Grand Prix racing team from 1999-2007. The junior Roberts won the 500cc World Championship in 2000.

Miller's involvement in athletic training and sports medicine has also included serving as a consultant to teams and drivers involved in Grand Prix and AMA superbike motorcycle racing as well as Indy Car racing.

Prior to joining the staff at Diablo Valley College, Miller was on staff at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. (1977-87 and 1989-97). During his tenure at De La Salle, he was the head athletic trainer, a part-time instructor and also served as an assistant basketball coach.

Miller is a 1976 graduate of California State University, Sacramento and received his M.S. in Physical Education Athletic Training from the University of Arizona in 1977. He has been a certified member of the National Athletic Trainers Association since 1977.

Miller also serves as Member Emeritus of the Board of Directors for Riders for Health Charity in Northampton, England, and is a member of the Sports Advisory Board for Advocare Nutrition.



Assoc. Director, Strength & Conditioning Alma Mater | Louisiana Tech, 2007 Scott McLafferty

Scott McLafferty is in his fifth season on South Main and enters his third year as the Associate Director of Strength and Conditioning for the Rice athletic program.

During his tenure at Rice, McLafferty has received additional responsibilities. He originally came to Rice as a strength and conditioning coordinator. He was promoted to associate director after his second year on campus. As associate director, McLafferty has daily responsibilities working with the Rice football team. He also has oversight of the Owl basketball team's strength and conditioning training and oversees the strength training for the Rice baseball team's pitching staff.

The Stillwater, Okla., native came to Rice from Louisiana Tech where he worked with the football, soccer and softball programs his first season before assuming duties as the men's basketball strength and conditioning coach his last two years.

McLafferty also served as a student assistant at Oklahoma State. McLafferty is a 2007 graduate of Louisiana Tech.

Over the summer of 2011, McLafferty married the former Sarah Berger.



Director of Basketball Operations Alma Mater | Rice, 2010 Gaelyn Rose

Gaelyn Rose enters her second season as the Rice University basketball program's Director of Basketball Operations. This year marks her fifth year as a member of the Rice Basketball family.

In her current position as Director of Basketball Operations, Rose's responsibilities include coordinating team travel, assisting in the coordination of the Ben Braun Basketball Camps as well as serving as a liaison between other athletic department offices including marketing, facilities and development. She also serves as the program's liaison with Conference USA. Rose graduated from Rice University in 2010 after working three years as a student manager for the basketball program. In her role as a student manager, she was responsible for assisting with practice and game set up as well as serving as a liaison with facilities and marketing. Her responsibilities increased over her tenure to include overseeing the student-manager program as well as responsibilities with team travel.



2010-11 Rice Season Review

Storylines

• Rice posted a 14-18 record, marking the team's most wins since the 2006-07 season.

► The Owls were 5-11 in Conference USA play. The five C-USA victories equaled the program's conference wins from the previous three seasons combined.

► Rice advanced to the quarterfinals of the Conference USA Championship for the second time in three years. The Owls' run included a 58-57 victory over SMU which came down to the game's final possession.

► Sophomore forward **Arsalan Kazemi** was the lone player in Conference USA to average a double-double en route to garnering Second-Team All-Conference USA recognition.

► The Owls four-leading scorers from the 2010-11 season were all underclassmen. Kazemi (15.2), **Tamir Jackson** (13.9) and **Connor Frizzelle** (10.7) all averaged double-figure scoring.

• **Lucas Kuipers** averaging 7.6 points to rank fourth on the team in scoring to go along with a 3.4 rebounding average, third on the squad.

• The men's basketball team was one of eight athletic

programs at Rice to receive Conference USA's Sport Academic Award for having the highest grade point average in the league. Members of the Rice basketball team combined to have a 3.026 grade point average last year.

► **Connor Frizzelle** was named the Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year for the sport of men's basketball, becoming the third Rice student-athlete in a row to receive the award.

► Frizzelle was joined on the Academic All-Conference USA squad by teammate **Lucas Kuipers**, the 2010 Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year for men's basketball.

Kazemi's Numbers

► Arsalan Kazemi averaged 15.2 points and 11.0 rebounds during the 2010-11 season, finishing the year ranked seventh nationally in rebounding, and with 18 double-doubles during the season, tied for 11th nationally according to the final NCAA Division I statistics.

► Going further inside his numbers, Kazemi scored a majority of his points one at a time. He was 195-of-271 at the free throw line (72 percent). From the field, he connected on 146-of-278 shots.

► Kazemi logged the nation's second-best defensive rebounding rate (30.8 percent of opponent misses during his minutes) and the 15th-best offensive rebounding rate (15.2 percent).

► Kazemi's 195 free throws and 271 free throw attempts each ranks second on the Rice season charts. His 351 rebounds also ranks second all-time at Rice.

▶ Prior to the start of league play, Kazemi was recognized as the Conference USA Player of the Week on consecutive Mondays. The back-to-back accolades marked just the 14th time in league history a player had won the weekly award for consecutive weeks.

► Kazemi averaged 21.7 points and 12.3 rebounds in three games played at the 2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic then averaged 19.5 points and 12.5 rebounds in back-to-back home victories over LSU and TCU.

► Kazemi, the first Iranian-born athlete to play NCAA Division I basketball, was the co-recipient of the 2011 Most Courageous Award presented by the United States Basketball Writers Association.

Double Double-Doubles

► Rice was one of three schools in the nation where both a male and female student-athlete averaged a double-double for the year.

► In addition to Arsalan Kazemi's numbers, Rice freshman forward Jessica Kuster averaged 14.1 points and 10.6 rebounds to help lead the women's team.

► Morehead State's Kenneth Faried and Ashar Harris as well as Ohio State's Jared Sullinger and Jantel Lavender also averaged double-doubles during the 2010-11 season.

Knocking Down FTs at Record Pace

► Connor Frizzelle broke the Rice University record for free throw percentage previously held by current Owl women's coach **Greg Williams** during the 2010-11 season. Frizzelle made 90.1 percent of his free throw attempts (82-of-91). Williams had held the record for better than 40 years. He made 88.9 percent of his shots (72-of-81) during the 1966-67 season.

► Frizzelle played a significant role in the Owls' early conference victories.

► He scored a career-high 25 points in the Owls' 71-61 road win at Tulane. He was 7-for-13 from the field and made a season-high five, three-pointers.

► Against Houston in Tudor Fieldhouse, Frizzelle pulled up and knocked down a three-pointer that tied the game at the end of regulation. He scored a game-high 18 points in the win.

▶ With 27 seconds to play at UCF, he knocked down a pair of free throws after a technical foul was called on the Knights to give Rice a three-point lead. He scored 15 points and grabbed four rebounds in the victory.

Finishing Strong

► Tamir Jackson finished the 2010-11 season scoring in double figures in the Owls' final 14 games to raise his season scoring average for the year to 13.9 points per game.

► Jackson averaged 14.3 points an outing in Conference USA play to lead the Owls.

▶ In late February, Jackson registered three straight, 20-point games. Along with a 22-point effort against SMU and 21 points on the road at Marshall, Jackson finished with 20 points in the Owls' home-court win over Memphis.

Playing for the Moment

► When **Cory Pflieger** was introduced as a starter prior to the season opener against St. Thomas, the announcement was the culmination to an arduous, year-long comeback

from knee surgery which sidelined him for the 2009-10 season.

▶ Pflieger's playing time agains the Celts marked his first intercollegiate action in 610 days. Not counting an exhibition game earlier in the week, Pflieger had not competed in a Rice basketball game since playing in the quarterfinals of the Conference USA Tournament on March 12, 2009.

► An overtime win against Houston in late January was one of those moments that so can make a comeback worthwhile. Pflieger drained a three-pointer late in regulation to pull the Owls to within a point and then made the indbounds pass to set up Connor Frizzelle for the game-tying three at the end of regulation. Pflieger also sank a three-pointer in overtime that was part of an 8-0 run that broke a 60-60 tie.

▶ Pflieger finished his career with 170 three-point baskets which ranks fifth all-time at Rice.

Career Game Max

▶ Suleiman Braimoh became the all-time leader in games played as a Rice Owls. Braimoh played in 124 games during his career at Rice, seeing action in 30+ games each of his four seasons.

• Cory Pflieger wrapped up his career by playing in all 32 games as a senior. He played in 123 games for the Owls.

A Little Thievery

► Rice had 217 steals during the 2010-11 season which ranks fifth all-time.

► The Owls have combined for better than 400 steals over the past two seasons. The 2009-10 team had 229 steals (third all-time at Rice).

Cougar Sweep

► The 72-57 win in the final regular-season game played at Houston, coupled with a 79-71 overtime victory against the Cougars earlier in the year, allowed Rice to sweep its cross-town rivals for just second time in program history. Rice also won both games in 1993.

► The Owls posted a combined 9-0 record vs. Houston in Football, Men's Basketball and Baseball.

Close Decisions

▶ Rice lost a total of seven games by four points or less - N 18 at Santa Clar (66-65); N 23 at Norht Texas (68-65); N 27 at Texas (62-59); D 23 vs. Oral Roberts (80-78); J 5 vs. Tulane (85-81); J 12 vs. Southern Miss (81-78 ot); and F 26 vs. East Carolina (71-68).

► The Owls were 2-6 in Conference USA play at home with the six losses decided by an average of just over five points.

► Three of the Owls' victories were decided by a possession. Rice beat Lamar 75-73 and in Las Vegas posted a 66-63 victory over Stetson.

► At the Conference USA Championship, a last-second SMU shot rattled away and **Arsalan Kazemi** came away with the rebound to give the Owls a 58-57 win over the Mustangs in the opening round of the tournament.

Overtime Outcomes

► During the 2011 Conference USA campaign, Rice played three games that went to overtime. The Owls were 1-2 in those contests including the 79-71 victory over Houston. SMU posted a 76-66 overtime win over the Owls and Southern Miss defeated Rice 81-78.

► The 2010-11 season marked the first time since the 2005-06 season Rice played multiple overtime games. The 2005-06 season also marks the last time three Rice games went to overtime during league play.

STUDENT-Athletes

▶ Rice Basketball received Conference USA's Sport Academic Award over the summer. The award annually recognizes the team with the highest grade point average for each conference-sponsored sport. Rice had a 3.00 team grade

point average last spring. The Owls' cumulative team grade point average was a 2.950 following the spring semester.

► Rice is the only Conference USA institution to have a player named to the league's all-academic team each of the past five seasons. Sophomores **Connor Frizzelle** and **Lucas Kuipers** were both repeat selections to the Conference USA All-Academic Team.

► A day after scoring a career-high 25 points in a 71-61 road win at Tulane, Frizzelle was named to the CoSIDA/ Capital One Academic All-District VI Team as selected by the membership of the College Sports Information Directors of America.

▶ Nate Schwarze joined Frizzelle and Kuipers on the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court. In order to be named to the Honors Court, student-athletes had to meet a set of standards including being either a junior or senior, have a cumulative 3.20 or higher grade point average at the conclusion of the 2010-11 academic year and have matriculated at least one year at their NCAA or NAIA institution.

► Rice was one of 28 NCAA Division I institutions to have multiple honorees on the NABC Honors Court.

- Rice enjoyed a 31-25 halftime lead, but after Lucas Kuipers opened the second half scoring with a three. North Texas rallied. Tristan Thompson put the Mean Green on his back and scored 10 consecutive points. Thompson's efforts were part of a 12-0 Mean Green run that gave UNT a 40-36 lead.
- Thompson tied the game at 61-61 with a pair of free throws and made the second of two attempts at the 1:37 mark to give the Mean Green the lead for good. Cory Pflieger missed a three-point attempt with just over a minute to play and Kedrick Hogans basket made it a three-point game.
- Shannon Shorter answered a pair of drives to the basket and lavins by Rice's Tamir Jackson with two sets of free throws in the final 18 seconds to help the Mean Green to the win.
- Rice sophomore forward Arsalan Kazemi finished with 11 points and 12 rebounds for his fourth double-double in five games.
- Connor Frizzelle, who had been cleared to play following a nasty fall just two days earlier against Saint Gregory's, started and finished with nine points, four rebounds and a team-high four assists.

- Texas led by as many as seven points in the second half, but Rice was able to close the gap in the final minutes. Tamir Jackson's two free throws with 2:10 to play made it a one possession game, 58-55, and following a missed shot by Texas' Gary Johnson, Arsalan Kazemi was fouled when he came down with a rebound of his own missed shot. His two free throws cut the Longhorns' lead to 58-57 with 56 seconds to play.

- During a 22-4 run that saw the Wildcats go from an 8-8 tie to leading by 18 points, Arizona scored 11, secondchance points. The rally gave Arizona a 30-12 lead with 6:56 to play in the first half. The Wildcats made the most of seven, first-half offensive rebounds scoring 15, second-chance points in the period.
- Arizona outrebounded the Owls 36-25, marking the first time during the season Rice was outrebounded by double figures. After Arsalan Kazemi's six rebounds, no Rice player had more than two rebounds in the game.

- The Owls grabbed their first lead since 2-0 when Connor Frizzelle dropped a jumper to make the score 52-51 with 11:13 to play in the game. A 6-0 Lamar run later in the period gave the Cardinals a 63-60 lead before Cory Pflieger hit one of his four treys and Lucas Kuipers later answered a Brandon Davis three with one of his won to tie the game at 66-66. Rice would not trail again.

- While Rice led most of the game, things suddenly tightened when LSU guard Andre Stringer made three free throws after being fouled while shooting from behind the arc then hit another three-pointer to bring the Tigers to within three points, 68-65 with 29 seconds to go.
- The Owls countered with clutch free throws from Connor Frizzelle who converted four straight to put the Owls up 72-68. Bryan Beasley then helped seal the win when he stole the ball from Stringer and was fouled with nine seconds to play. His two shots at the line provided the final margin of victory. Rice was 9-for-10 at the line in the final minute.
- Arsalan Kazemi registered his fourth straight double-double, scoring 19 points and grabbing 17 rebounds.
- Tamir Jackson celebrated his 21st birthday by contributing 16 points, four assists and a steal.

- Rice turned the ball over on its first four possessions and quickly found itself down 15-0 before Nate Schwarze buried a three-pointer at the 14:05 mark for the Owls' first points. The Owls turned the ball over nine times in the first half and had 16 turnovers for the game.
- After trailing by 14 at halftime, Rice got back into the game in the opening minutes of the second period. Connor Frizzelle and Trey Stanton each knocked down three-pointers while Arsalan Kazemi and Tamir Jackson made free throws to narrow TU's lead to 38-31 with 17:20 to play. But the Golden Hurricane would later go on a 14-0 run to build a 54-33 advantage the Owls could not overcome.
- The game marked the most significant playing time for Omar Oraby. The 7-2 freshman played eight, first-half minutes and went on to score nine points (4-for-10 shooting), grabbed four rebounds and had two steals in 14 minutes of play.
- Arsalan Kazemi did not have a field goal until 5:03 to play in the game. Kazemi, who had just two, first-half points, went on to score the Owls' next three field goals including a break-away dunk that sealed his 11th double-double of the season. Kazemi finished with 14 points and 15 rebounds. He was 4-for-8 from the field and made 6-of-9 free throw attempts.
- Tulsa's Justin Hurtt, Conference USA's leading scorer at better than 21 points per game, was held to two first-half points on 1-for-5 shooting. Hurtt would finish with a game-high 16 points to lead five TU players who scored in double figures.

- Connor Frizzelle poured in a career-high 25 points and Arsalan Kazemi snared a career-high 19 rebounds in the Owls' second Conference USA road victory of the year.
- Tulane started the contest strong with an early 13-5 lead, but Rice battled back to outscore the Green Wave 15-6 for its first lead of the game (20-19) on a three-pointer from Bryan Beasley deep in the left corner.
- Rice closed out the first half with a 6-0 run on two free throws by Frizzelle (:45), a jumper from Tamir Jackson with seven seconds on the clock, and then Kazemi stole the inbounds pass and canned a jumper from the right wing with one second left to tie the game at intermission.
- Frizzelle kick started the second half for the Owls with a deep three to ignite a 7-0 run.
- The Owls held a slim, 62-59 lead when Kazemi went coast-to-coast to snap Tulane's press for a driving layup giving the Owls needed breathing room at 64-59. Jackson, who scored 20 points, then converted two free throws and Frizzelle dropped a trey from 23-feet out with the shot clock winding down to give the Owls a 69-59 lead with 49 seconds to play and effectively sealing Tulane's fate.
- The victory over Tulane was the Owls first in eight meetings against the Green Wave and avenged a Tulane 85-81 victory in Tudor Fieldhouse earlier in the year.
- In its win at Rice, Tulane was 12-for-18 from three-point range and made all seven of its attempts from behind the arc in the second half. In New Orleans, Rice held the Green Wave to 21 percent three-point shooting (5-for-23).

Sanders final three-pointer would later put the Blazers out in front by six, 60-54, with 7:25 remaining.
- Sanders' eight three-pointers tied a Rice opponent record.

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- Rice would cut UAB's lead back to one with 3:50 to play and needed a defensive stop to have an opportunity to regain the lead. Sanders would miss a three-point attempt on the Blazers' next possession but Quincy Taylor tracked down a long offensive carom and Soku later scored inside to put the Blazers back up by three.
- Arsalan Kazemi led Rice with 17 points, including an 11-for-11 performance from the free throw line.

- One of the key sequences of the game came with just over 13 minutes to play. Despite 21 turnovers, Tulsa spoiled Rice University's Senior Night, defeating the Owls 67-57. The game marked the final home game for Rice seniors Bryan Beasley, Suleiman Braimoh, Cory Pflieger and Trey Stanton.

- Both teams got off to sluggish starts. Rice shot just 33 percent from the field and were outrebounded 24-15 in the opening period. However, Tulsa turned the ball over eight times in the first nine minutes of the game and the Owls built an early 12-6 lead. But a 14-3 Golden Hurricane run, sparked by a three-pointer by Justin Hurtt and capped by a Scottie Haralson three, put Tulsa up by four, 22-18.
- ▶ Rice shot 31.7 percent from the field and had a season-low six assists in the game.
- With four seniors in the starting lineup, Lucas Kuipers came off the bench for the first time this season and led Rice in scoring with 14 points. It was the first time during the season Kuipers was the Owls' leading scorer.
- With his start, Suleiman Braimoh equaled the school record for most games played in a career with 121. He tied the mark set by Michael Harris and equaled by Morris Almond. Cory Pflieger saw action in his 120th game.

- Rice junior forward Lucas Kuipers sank a trio of three-point baskets in the first five minutes of the game and went on to score a team-high 15 points in the victory. Despite foul trouble limiting him to six, first-half minutes he led Rice in scoring for the second straight game. The peformance was fourth straight-double figure scoring game for Kuipers.
- Rice never trailed after Bryan Beasley knocked down a three-pointer to give the Owls an early 3-2 lead. Rice would make nine, three-pointers in the game, one shy of a season high.
- Rice made eight of its nine three-pointers in the first half. Connor Frizzelle's three-pointer with two seconds left in the first half gave the Owls a 40-27 lead at the break.
- After Houston had cut the Owls' lead to seven points in the second period, Kuipers would take a pass from Cory Pflieger and drive for a layup to stop the Cougar surge and spark a 10-0 Rice run. Tamir Jackson's steal and fast break layup capped the rally that put Rice up 70-53 with 3:19 left to play.
- ▶ With the win, Rice secured the No. 10 seed to the 2011 Buick Conference USA Tournament.
- Coupled with a 79-71 overtime victory over the Cougars earlier in the year, Rice swept both games in the series for only the second time in program history. The Owls also won both games in 1993.

Credential Requests

All requests for single-game, working credentials should be made to the sports information office at least one week in advance of the game to be covered. All requests should come from media

entities' sports editors or directors.

Credential requests can be emailed directly to basketball contact Ron Mears at rmears@rice.edu or can be faxed on company letterhead to Mears' attention at (713) 348-6019.

Rice University follows the guidelines set forth by the NCAA and Conference USA in issuing credentials.

Credentials will be issued based on the following priority schedule:

- . Media agencies which cover Rice and/or its opponent on a regular basis;
- Media agencies which cover Conference USA regularly;
- 3. National media agencies;
- Other daily newspapers with Sunday publication and a minimum circulation of 100,000;
- Other daily newspapers with Sunday publication and a minimum circulation of 50,000;
- 6. Television stations with a full-time sports director;
- 7. Radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting daily talk shows;

- Student publications or departments representing the competing schools only. Student publications of non-competing schools will not be accredited. When available, a maximum of two press row seats and two photo passes are available for visiting student publications;
- 9. Other credential requests considered on the basis of circulation, publication dates and space.

Spouses, dates, minors and non-working media will not be permitted in the press areas. Credentials will be available at the media will call located at the ticket windows adjacent to the lobby entrance to Tudor Fieldhouse. No credentials will be mailed.

Photo credentials will be granted on the same priority schedule as general media credentials.

NBA Scouts

Credentials for NBA scouts should be requested by NBA teams' player personnel/college scouting departments. Credentials should be requested at least one week in advance and will be available at media will call. Every effort will be made to provide scout seating in the media sections of Tudor Fieldhouse. For certain events, scout seating will be in marked seating of the fieldhouse.

Photographers

Photo credentials will be granted on the same game-day priority schedule as general media credentials.

Photo spots in Tudor Fieldhouse are not reserved.

Media Parking
