The District has continued to deliver services to the people within the legal framework which created it. The continued positive growth path of the District is powered by people centred Government policies and programmes. The President of the Republic of Uganda His Excellency Yoweri Kaguta Museveni is very supportive in the development effort of the District. The President has fulfilled most of the pledges he made to the people of Budaka in 2011. A complete road unit comprising of a grader, two tipper Lorries were received in the District. We are expecting a road supervision pick up truck. One of the tipper trucks was for Budaka Town Council. The construction of a multi-purpose science laboratory in Ngoma SSS as a presidential pledge is to be completed before the Golden jubilee independence celebrations. We are thankful to the President for appointing Hon Sarah

Kataike Ndoboli, Woman MP for Budaka district as State Minister for Health in charge of General duties as part of fulfilled pledges of 2011. Others include Health system strengthening project for Budaka HCIV where a pickup truck and one motorcycle were received.

PRDP

The programme was launched in the District with major strategic interventions in education, Health, rural water supply, feeder road rehabilitation and maintenance. Additional interventions are in agriculture, land management, environment and local government. The programme funded the construction of Sapiri CHIII with all its accessories, constructed maternities/general wards in Kaderuna, Katira and Kerekerene health facilities. Other maternities/general wards were built in Lyama, Naboa and Namusita under PHC development. The investments were intended to improve on maternal health at 50 years of independence. Under education PRDP constructed/completed 48 classrooms in 21 primary schools, constructed 3 staff houses in Mugiti, Lupada and Kerekerene ps. The programme supplied 2,151 three-seater desks to 67 primary schools. In the water sector, 20 new boreholes were constructed in 20 villages. In the road sector 41.3km have been rehabilitated and maintained.

NUSAF2

The District under NUSAF2 generated 516 community projects for funding; 255 have so far been approved and 184 attracted funding from OPM. The projects attracted Ush 2,649,854,061 against an allocation of Ush 3,825,839,480 and were distributed as follows: Household Income Support were 146; Public Works Projects were 9 and Community Infrastructure Rehabilitation were 29. The projects were to benefit the potential poorest community groups of women, Youths, Elderly people, People With Disabilities (PWDs), People affected and infected with HIV/AIDs among others. The project interventions are in the areas of livestock, small scale agricultural processing plants (Maize mills) and sewing machines. So far, a total of 3,556 animals were procured and supplied to communities including 1,422 heifers, 86 bleeding bulls, 34 oxen, 1,571 goats, 113 pigs and 330 poultry. In the water sector, 6 boreholes were drilled, 4 springs protected and 1 borehole rehabilitated. Construction of staff houses in schools and health facilities are in ongoing at different construction level.

NAADS PHASE II

NAADS Phase II which started in July 2010 is aimed at improving on the registered successes and mitigating the challenges that were faced in NAADS phase I.

In Budaka the following have been done in the NAADS phase II programme: The thirteen (13) Sub-county NAADS Coordinators have been recruited, appointed an assigned; recruitment of professional Agricultural Advisory Services Providers has been done in all the Sub-counties; funds Mobilization and formation of village development fora and village farmer fora was carried out in 243 village development fora and farmer fora executives have been put in place; Selection of food security host farmers was done where 3,500 food security host farmers have been selected in the whole district; Community procurement committees have been selected in all 243 villages; Identification of food security enterprises which includes Ground nuts, Beans, Cassava, Maize, Banana and Sorghum was carried out. The community procurement committees have been trained on the procurement processes. They are busy identifying sources of inputs and

negotiating the prices for onward transmission of the subject matter specialists and Sub-county chiefs for necessary action.

LGMSD

The District has implemented projects under LGMSD especially in strengthening state authority by constructing sub-county structures in Kameruka, Kaderuna and Naboa. The District Planning Unit block was constructed under LGMSD programme. Other structures include renovation of District Health Office, DSC building, construction of 4-stance pit latrines in Budaka HCIV, Naboa HCIII, Kamonkoli HCIII, Katira HCIII and Kameruka HCIII. The District established a seed multiplication centre and hatchery at the District headquarters with a fence as its components. Other technologies developed under LGMSD include fish fry multiplication centre at Kadatumi, goat multiplication centre and one day old chick multiplication hatchery at DATIC Iki-Iki
