THORINGTON STREET

Thorington Street is a small hamlet of some 35 houses between Stoke by Nayland and Higham. It lies within the parish of Stoke by Nayland.

It no longer boasts any amenities, both the Post Office and Pub having closed within the last five years. The Street leads down to the River Box, a popular trout stream, and the disused Thorington Mill.

The principal buildings are Thorington Hall, a fine 16C-18C house owned by the National Trust, the early Victorian Thorington House and the former Rose Inn, the 16C core much altered and added to.

On the other side of the river Box lies Weylands farm where Roger Clark still works his land with Suffolk Punch horses and houses a rare pack of Bloodhounds which hunts a trail laid by a human hare.

The principal day to day activity within the hamlet is Orc Farm, a part of Rix Farms Ltd one of whose principal crops are vegetables for Tesco.
