#### **About our study**

- The 2013 study represents the tenth year Ponemon Institute has conducted its
   *Privacy Trust Study for Retail Banking.* This annual survey-based research series
   asks consumers to indicate how secure and confident they feel when sharing their
   personal information with their primary banking institutions.
- This year's national survey included a scientific sample of 5,559 adult-aged retail banking consumers representing all geographic regions within the United States.
- Our survey-based research asked consumers questions about their bank's privacy commitments. It asked questions concerning:
  - Disclosure quality of privacy policies and other related notice
  - Customer outreach activities for privacy and data security
  - Online experience with special focus on privacy and data security
  - Response (if any) to data breach incidents
  - Perceptions about advertising, promotions and marketing
  - Overall perceptions about the bank's services, especially customer contact experience



## Sample response


This year's final sample includes 5,559 consumers of retail banking consumers. Last year's sample involved a comparable sample of 5,571 individuals.






#### 2013 Top rated banks
