What Sacramento Residents and Businesses Need to Know About Interstate 5 Repairs


Repair work on the "boat section" of Interstate 5 (I-5) is scheduled to start on Friday, May 30.

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will be demolishing and replacing existing pavement, installing a state-of-the-art drainage system, new de-watering wells and monitoring equipment.

The project will affect I-5 between R Street and Richards Boulevard.

Impact to City Streets

While local access will be maintained, City streets will be impacted when freeway lanes and ramps are closed to through traffic in each direction on I-5. The maps on the back page depict the streets most likely to have impacts of increased traffic volumes. Please note that during special events with attendance over 10,000 people, there will not be any ramp or lane closures.

Traffic Control Measures

City engineers are working closely with Caltrans on traffic measures to address the increased volume of traffic on various streets. These plans will include traffic tools such as traffic monitoring via new cameras, flagging by law enforcement, signs, striping changes and traffic signal retiming.

Residents and businesses can stay informed on the project's schedule by visiting the project's Web site at www.fixl-5.com. to register for email construction and traffic alerts. Use the links on the Web site to check live traffic camera conditions, suggested alternate route information, and current lane and/or ramp closures.

Special Outreach Efforts

Caltrans and the City of Sacramento will keep the public updated. In addition to Caltrans' public outreach, an extensive secondary program is being sponsored by Caltrans and implemented by the City to assure that businesses and residents are informed about the project and its impacts.



This outreach work will include close communication with local business groups and neighborhood associations to keep them advised on the project.

Northbound I-5 Closure

Thursday, June 26th 8 pm to Thursday, July 3rd, 5 am

All Lanes Open For 6 Days

Southbound I-5 Closure

Tuesday, July 8th, 8 pm to Tuesday, July 15th, 5 am
