Grand Award Winners to be Named at Annual Gala Featuring the Biggest Names in News and Entertainment

February 20, 2008 (McLean, VA) – American Women in Radio and Television (AWRT) is pleased to announce the 2008 winners of the annual Gracie Awards. National award winners will be presented at a black-tie Gala, hosted by E! News anchor and managing editor **Giuliana Rancic**, in the Broadway Ballroom of the New York Marriott Marquis on Wednesday, May 28, 2008. Local market, public and student award winners will be announced later this week.

The Gracies recognize exemplary programming created for women, by women and about women in all facets of electronic media, as well as individuals who have made contributions to the industry. The awards program also encourages the realistic and multifaceted portrayal of women in entertainment, commercials, news, features and other programs

Each year, the Gracies Gala attracts the best and brightest in radio, television, cable and new media.
