A replacement name for *Archaeophylax* Leschen and Rhode (Coleoptera: Ulodidae)

Leschen and Rhode (2002) proposed the genus Archaeophylax for the ulodid beetle A. worthyi, described from a single fossil specimen from Waikato, New Zealand. The name Archaeophylax is preoccupied by Archaeophylax Kimmins in Mosely and Kimmins, 1953: 27, a genus of the Trichoptera (Limnephilidae) with the type species A. ochreus Mosely in Mosely and Kimmins, 1953: 27, from Australia. Due to this homonymy, the replacement name Waitomophylax, new name is proposed and the combination for the type species of the genus is Waitomophylax worthyi (Leschen and Rhode, 2002), new combination.
