#### **Preview**

2010 will be the 18<sup>th</sup> year the Fico Finance Nelson Giants has made the playoffs and their seventh year in a row. Hopefully for the Zerofees Southland Sharks they will have similar success twenty years down the track, but right now in their inaugural season they have an opportunity to get their very first playoff win. Both teams will be very familiar with one another having played each other last Friday at Trafalgar Centre, Giants victorious 83-71. But the Giants have had mixed form in the latter stages of the competition losing two of their last three home games where they were previously unbeaten. Sharks have played their last four games on the road with a two win two loss record, winning four of their last six games. Both teams average an identical 81.8 points per game, but the Giants are the best in the league at three point percentage (39.3) compared to the Sharks who sit at the bottom (29.7). In his 31<sup>st</sup> playoff apperance Giants legend Phill Jones will be playing his 300<sup>th</sup> career game. Jones is the Giants leading scorer at 20.8 points a game which is the ninth time he has averaged twenty or more in a season. Sharks leading scorer is Mike Helms who plays the same position as Jones and is eighth in the league in scoring at 22.3. Helms is averaging 25.2 points in his last five games. One player who will want to redeem himself against the Giants is Rene Rougeau who leads the league in steals (3.8). The three time player of the week was held to a season low three points in the loss to Giants, which can't be repeated if they wish to win. Experience is grossly in favour of the Giants who have players with over 100 NBL games compared to the Sharks who have only two players. It also shows in playoff games where the total playoff games played by the Sharks is 17 compared to Giants 74.

## **Preview**

Harbour Heat will play the Bay Hawks for the second ever time in a playoff game. The first time they met in the playoff was in 2007 when the Hawks upset the Heat 85-76 in the semi final which was played at the North Shore Events Centre. There are only two players left from the 07 Hawks team that play for them this season (Everard Bartlett & Paul Henare) while one from the Heat remain (Darryl Cartwright), Hawks player's Nat Connell and Jarrod Kenny ironically played for the Heat in that game. Connell top scored with 16 while Bartlett top scored for the Hawks with 18. Hawks will be disappointed they lost in overtime to the McDonalds Manawatu Jets last week, which moved them from third to fifth which cost them a home quarter final. Harbour Heat who looked all but certain to finish where the Hawks are now play at home in where they have a six win three loss record. One of those losses at home was to the Bay Hawks who beat them in a high scoring 102-97 game. The game was a scoring duel from guards Josh Pace and Corey Webster who both had season highs of 38 and 40 points respectively. Another player to join the 300 club was Dillon Boucher who has missed the Heats last three games because of an ankle injury. The Heat desperately need the experience of Boucher who has played 29 career playoff games compared to the rest of the team who have played a combined 25. Hawks who are playing in their sixth consecutive year in the playoffs have a wealth of experience with seven players in their roster playing over 100 career NBL games. Both teams are evenly matched in team averages in points, rebounds and field goal percentage.

## **300 CLUB**

#### **Dillon Boucher & Phill Jones**

2010 will be memorable to two very special players who have given so much to the National Basketball League and their country.

Dillon Boucher played his 300<sup>th</sup> game on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May 2010 against a former team of his the Waikato Pistons. The 8 time NBL champion began his career back in 1994 for the Auckland Stars and has accumulated over 2500 points, 1500 rebounds and 700 steals.

His NBL awards include 2003 Kiwi Most Valuable Player, three time All Star five selection and 2003 Most Valuable NZ Forward.

Boucher's has also had major successes in the Australian League where he won a championship with the Brisbane Bullets in 2007 and was recently named 2010 ANBL Defensive Player of the Year for his season with the New Zealand Breakers.

Phill Jones will be bringing up his 300<sup>th</sup> game in when he plays the Southland Sharks on Tuesday nights quarter final.

Jones began his career for the Nelson Giants back in 1993 and has played all of his 16 season with them apart from 1999 when he played for the Otago Nuggets.

The Reefton Kid has scored over 5,500 points with a career average of just under 19 points per game. During that span Jones has shot the ball at nearly 40% from beyond the arc, also adding over 1000 rebounds, 700 assists and nearly 500 steals.

Jones won championships with the Giants (1994,1998), is a six time Best New Zealand Guard Winner, Two time most outstanding guard, Four time NZ MVP and won last year's Most Valuable Player.

It is hard to forget that both Jones and Boucher were key members in the Tall Blacks side that came fourth in the 2002 World Championships in Indianapolis and have had the opportunity to represent their country in the 2004 Athens Olympic Games.
