Exodus Saints look to win their seventh straight when they host the Fico Finance Giants at TSB Bank Arena where the last time the Saints lost a game there was on the 19th March 2009, when the Giants won 98-93. Since that loss the Saints have won 10 in a row at TSB Bank Arena and are still unbeaten at home this season. Giants will be quietly confident though beating the Saints in the last four times and six of the last nine games played against each other. The two teams met back in Round Two when the Giants won 92-86. Giants will be facing a different backcourt from that game of Lindsay Tait and Eric Devendorf who average a combined 46 points per game since playing with each other. This game will be very important when it comes to the possibility of hosting a home semifinal. Giants currently have a head to head advantage of six points, but if they win on Friday then they will be odds on favourites to nab a top two position. Both teams were in a similar position last year, both finishing with 12 wins and four losses, Nelson getting the home semi because they swept the series against the Saints. The matchup between Phill Jones and Eric Devendorf will be the one to keep an eye on. Both players are in the top ten in scoring averaging over twenty points per game. Giants have won six of their last seven games, but have had mixed results on the road with three wins and three losses. Rebounding will be pivotal, Mika Vukona has grabbed ten or more rebounds in five of the last six games he has played.

Harbour Heat has been very cold of late losing four of their last five games, after starting the season winning seven in a row. It will not be easy for the Heat who will be hosting a full strength Bay Hawks team who had Paul Henare return from his ankle injury last week. Henare played twenty minutes in his return and brought his usual court leadership to the Hawks side. Coach Shawn Dennis will have plenty of guards to throw in against the Heat side, including two former Heat guards Jarrod Kenny and Nat Connell. Heat can still make a late run at making a top two position, but if they lose against the Hawks then their chances will drop dramatically with three of last five games on the road. Hawks big man Jon Rogers swatted five shots last week and will looking to repeat that performance when he goes head to head against Rick Rickert who has been very consistent for his side averaging nearly 18 points and 10 rebounds a game. In seven of their eight wins the Heat has scored over ninety points, but in the four losses they are only averaging 77.5 points. After scoring a season low 54 points in the loss in Nelson the Hawks offense has picked up averaging 90 points in the last three games. The Hawks has arguably the best bench in the league and it shows in scoring where they lead the league at 23.5 points per game which is eight points more than the Heat.

Both teams will be very hungry for a win especially the Manawatu Jets who will need to win both their games down south if they hope to come close to making the playoffs. This is the first time the two teams have met. Sharks has had great crowds at home, but have struggled winning only 2 from 5 games. Sharks suffered their biggest loss at home last week against the Pistons losing by 25. Third quarters have been a problem of late losing it against the Pistons by 16 and then 15 against the Saints the previous week. Offense has also been lacking for the Sharks only averaging a tad over 70 points in the last two games and is overall third to last in scoring at 78.9. But their offense may kick start against the Jets who give up the most points in the league at 104 a game. Rene Rougeau leads his team in rebounds, steals and blocks, but his shooting has been a struggle of late with 8/35 from the field and 0/7 from the three point line in the last two games. His fellow import Mike Helms hasn't shot the ball well in the losses with 11/31, but Helms is a very dangerous scorer that could get hot very quickly if the Jets do not play defense. Another import who has had shooting woes is Richard Jeter who has shot 29% in the last two losses. Jets did not play last week so should be fully fresh for their double header. The matchup between Helms and Jets Darryl Hudson will be exciting, both athletic guards and can easily put up thirty in a hurry.

Cougars had to work for their win over the Taranaki Mountain Airs trailing by one with a little over a minute remaining, Tim Behrendorff and Jeremy Kench stepped up big to win their third game out of their last four. Nelson also played the Airs winning thanks to a dominant fourth quarter which put them back to second place. Behrendorff had a season high 30 points in the Round Seven loss in Nelson. In that game the Cougars fought back after trailing at the half by 15, to win the third by 33-22. Giants regained their composure to win by 11, but the Cougars showed a lot of fight after playing a game the previous night. Behrendorff's opposition Tony Rampton also had a season high 24 points in that Cougars game. Still uncertainty on whether the Cougars leading scorer Paora Winitana will be playing. Winitana has missed the last five games for the Cougars and the last time he played was against the Giants when he scored 20 points.

They are yet to score over 85 points in a game yet. Offense for the Jets has not been a problem averaging nearly 97 points in their last four games. It is defense giving up 104 a game. Jets Darryl Hudson is averaging 32 points per game since joining the Jets, while Nuggets John Barber has been up and down in his first three games averaging only 11 points. Barber has brought other things apart from scoring to his team leading the Nuggets in rebounds, steals and blocks. Both teams will really be eager to get off the bagel and not join the 1998 Northland Suns and the 2009 Taranaki Dynamos, who are the only teams in the National League to ever go winless in a season. Taranaki Mountain Airs will be desperate for win currently on a five game losing streak. It will be a tough ask when they host the Waikato Pistons who have won six in a row and made the double header in the Deep South look like child's play beating the Southland Sharks by 25 and the OceanaGold Nuggets by 33. Airs trip down south didn't go as well losing to the Christchurch Cougars by three and the Nelson Giants by twenty. Airs were only down three going into the fourth in Nelson and were leading by one with a minute left against the Cougars, so finishing the game will be crucial if they wish to stay in the race for a playoff spot. Shooting guard Jack Leasure averaged 18.5 points on the road trip, but shot under 40% from the field. Pistons Thomas Abercrombie has been on a tear of late winning his third player of the week in Round 11. Abercrombie won his first player of the week this season in Round Two against the Taranaki Mountain Airs when he had the stat line of 37 points, 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 5 blocks. In that same game Jeremiah Trueman had one of his best games in an Airs uniform with 23 points and 9 rebounds. Trueman grabbed a career high 16 rebounds in the loss against the Giants. The boards will be a battle, both teams in the top three in the league in second effort points. Pistons have had recent dominance over the Airs winning six of the last seven games played against each other and 11 of the last 14.

Thomas Abercrombie (Waikato Pistons)

22 points (9/16 FG), 12 rebounds, 7 assists, 3 blocks, 3 steals in the 95-62 win over the OceanaGold Nuggets.

Waikato Pistons Thomas Abercrombie earns his third player of the week honors for his performance against the OceanaGold Nuggets.

Abercrombie was three assists shy of getting a triple double, also blocking three shots and grabbing three steals. The Pistons small forward also goes to the top of the overall rankings knocking off former leader and former team mate Eric Devendorf who had a pretty good game himself with 36 points and three steals in the Exodus Saints 103-91 win over the 0800 Easy LPG Bay Hawks.

Another Piston who is creeping up the overall rankings is Alex Pledger who is leading the league in rebounds 12.7. Pledger is only one of two current players averaging over 10 rebounds a game (Dillon Boucher 10.1). Against the Nuggets Pledger had a double double of 20 points and 18 rebounds, which is his eigth double double this season.

Other notable performances were from Bay Hawks Josh Pace who was outstanding in the fourth quarter against the Saints scoring 17 of his 30 points in the guarter. Airs Aaron Bailey-Nowell had a big game in the loss against the Cougars with 17 points and 17 rebounds.
