If there was an opportunity for the Jets to beat the Pistons it would be now with the Pistons without Tony Ronaldson who will be away in Australia this week and also injuries to Mike Homik and Puke Lendon. History has not been favorable for the Jets losing to the Pistons nine of the last ten games (Last time Jets beat the Pistons was in 2006). Pistons will have former Wollongong Hawks big David Gruber who should help on the inside, but it is uncertain how many minutes he will be playing. Jets had a strong first quarter against the Cougars last week winning it 30-21, but a horror second quarter was what let the Jets down only managing to score four points losing the quarter by 23. In the four games this year the Jets have lost by an average margin of 31 points, whereas the Pistons have won all there five games by a margin of nearly 21 points. The one bright spot for the Jets team this season is their bench which is averaging 21.3 points a game compared to the Pistons who are only averaging 11 points. The Jets will need to shoot at least in the high forties to early fifties from the field if they have a chance of victory, currently shooting 38%.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Round Five Jeremy Kench (Christchurch Cougars)

15 points (4/7 FG, 3/4 3pt, 4/4 FT),4 rebounds, 8 assists and 7 steals in the 85-68 win over the Manawatu Jets.

What a difference a week makes for Cougars point guard Jeremy Kench who averaged only 2.5 points in the two previous losses. Kench has bounced back with 15 points and 7 steals against the struggling Jets who are still without a win this season. The Cougars guard is currently second in the league in assists averaging 5.3 per game.

Kench edged Fico Finance Giants Mika Vukona for this week's POW honors. Vukona had a tremendous game against the Harbour Heat with 19 points, 9 rebounds and 5 blocks. His team mate Phill Jones also had a strong game with a double double of 25 points and 11 rebounds. But it would not be enough as the Heat remained unbeaten winning 83-79.

Heat big man Rick Rickert now goes to the top of the overall rankings knocking off Pistons Eric Devendorf for the first time this season. Rickert has been very consistent in the Heat five wins averaging 20 points and 12.4 rebounds per game.

Southland Sharks Mike Rose has been very good in his short term contract with the franchise averaging nearly 23 points per game. Rose guided the Sharks to their second win against the Christchurch Cougars with 24 points and 5 steals in the 85-79 win.

Waikato Pistons Thomas Abercrombie goes to third in the overall rankings behind his team mate Eric Devendorf. The Pistons sophomore is currently in the top 10 in the league in points (8th), rebounds (8th), blocks (2nd) and steals (10th).



Which NBL Player brought up his 3000th point in this year's NBL season?



Answer: Paora Winitana (Christchurch Cougars) brought up his 3000th NBL point against the Southland Sharks in Round Three (March 26th 2010)

Paora Winitana has been a consummate professional throughout his career playing his 13th season in National League, beginning his career 1996 with the North Harbour Vikings. Originally from Hawkes Bay, Winitana finally played for his home town in 2001, eventually winning a championship with them in 2006. In 2009 he joined the new Christchurch Cougars franchise leading them to the semi finals in their first season. Currently in his second season with the Cougars Winitana is averaging 20 points in the first eight games. Winitana has played 216 career games with an average of 14.1 points per game.
