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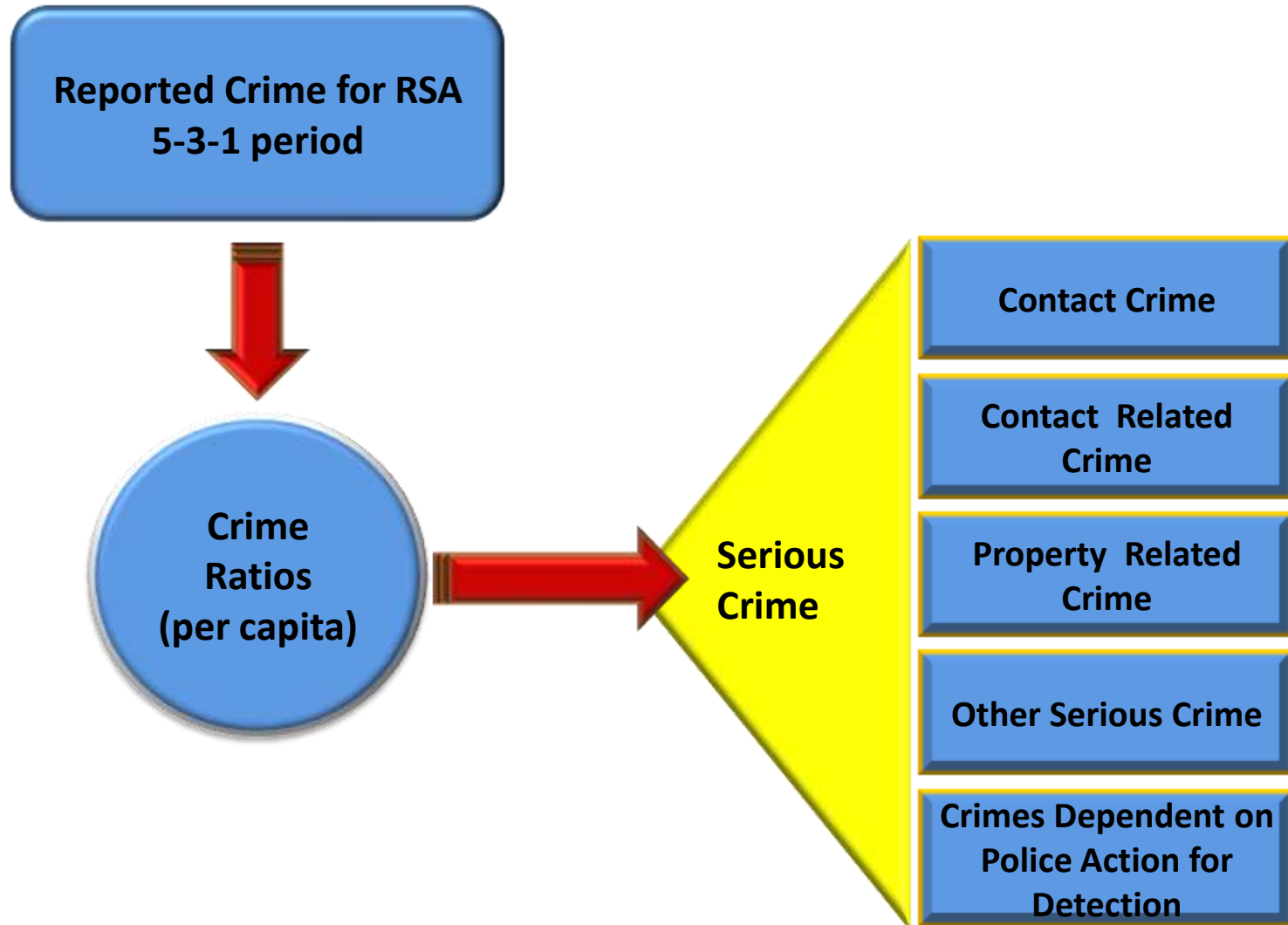

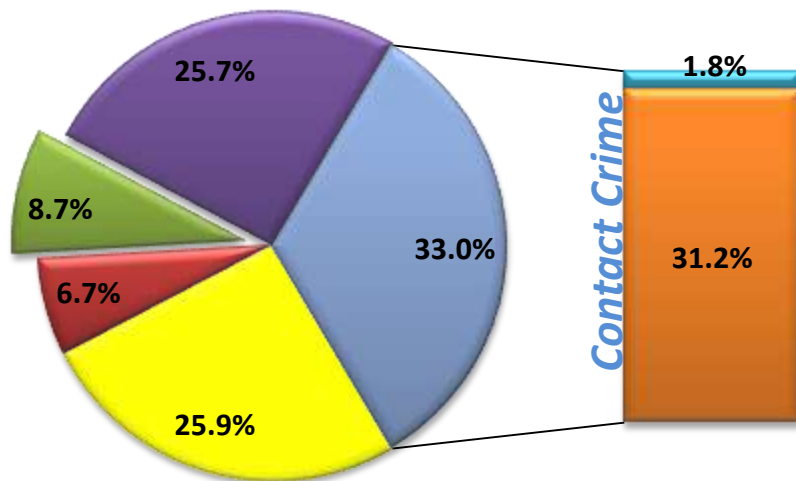

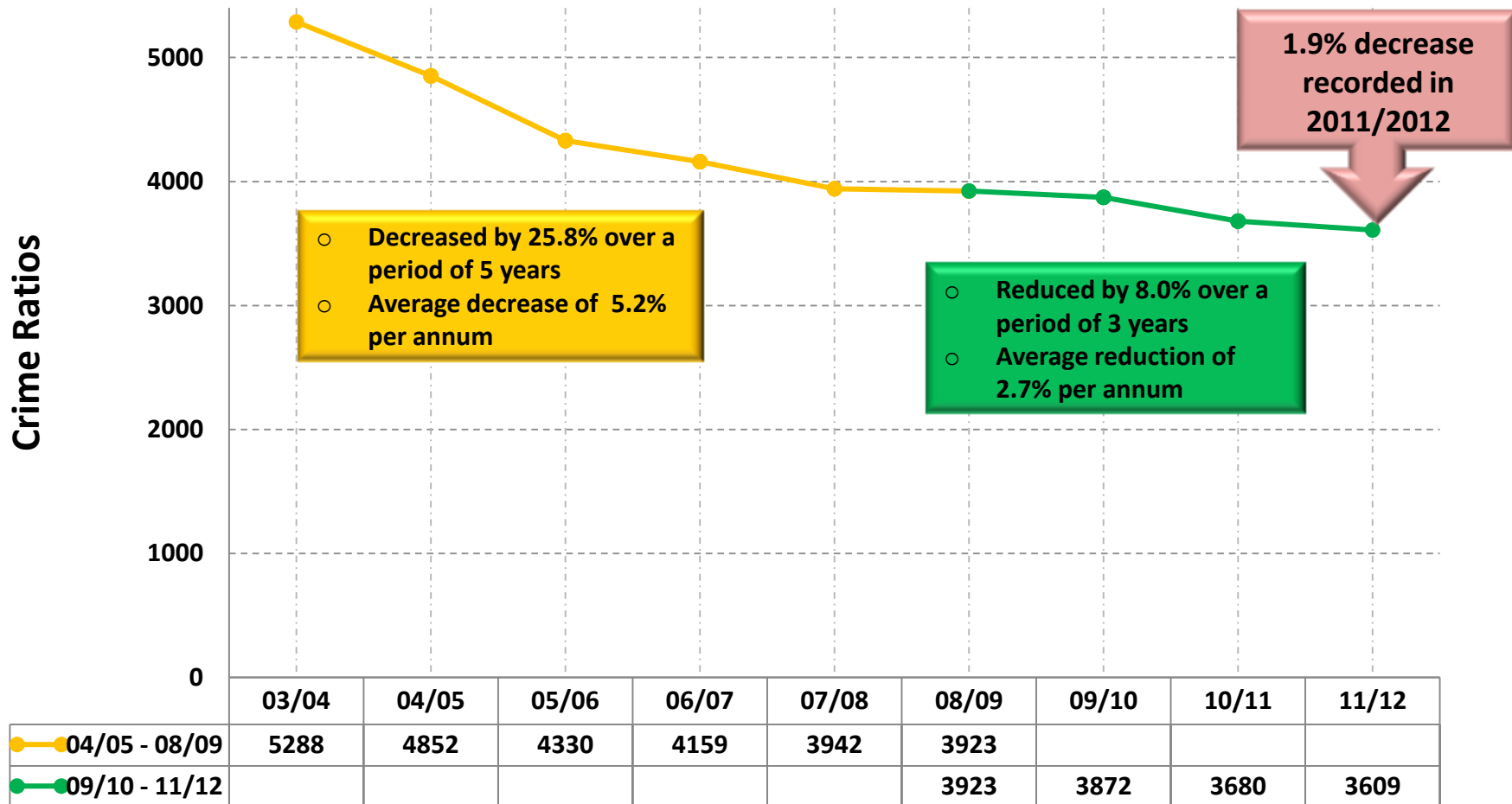

Serious Crime: Perspective

- **FACTORS IMPACTING ON IDENTIFIED PROVINCIAL CRIME OUTLIERS**
 - **Geographic Displacement of Crime to:**
 - ***Neighbouring Provinces:***
 - GP and KZN criminals arrested in North West, Northern Cape , Free State and Mpumalanga
 - GP Trio Crime suspects: Also wanted in other provinces
 - ***Smaller Provinces (from big cities):***
 - GP Trio Crime reduction of 31.3% (09/10-11/12 FY)
 - Historically, smaller provinces did not experience increasing levels of certain crimes like Trio Crimes :
 - » Northern Cape , Free State , Limpopo , Mpumalanga and North West
 - ***Townships:***
 - Particular reference to Business Robberies and lack of security measures
 - Disparities in Infrastructure: equitable distribution of access to policing services

Serious Crime: Perspective

- **FACTORS IMPACTING ON IDENTIFIED PROVINCIAL CRIME OUTLIERS**
 - **Diversification of crime activities:**
 - Criminals with same *Modus Operandi* and profile for e.g. ATM bombers and CIT robbers engage in other Trio Crimes
 - Gangsters involved in a range of criminal activities
 - **Gang Violence**
 - Resultant strain on conventional policing resources with particular reference to the Western Cape
 - Crime analysis revealed 13.1% of murders and 22.2% of attempted murders in Western Cape during 2011/12 were gang related.

Serious Crime Perspective

- **StatsSA Victims of Crime Survey (VOCS) [2010] revealed :**
 - Crimes most feared by % of households :
 - House Robbery (50,4%)
 - Housebreaking/Burglary (50.2%)
 - Street Robbery (39.7%)
 - Murder (34.1)
 - Sexual Offences including Rape (27.0%)

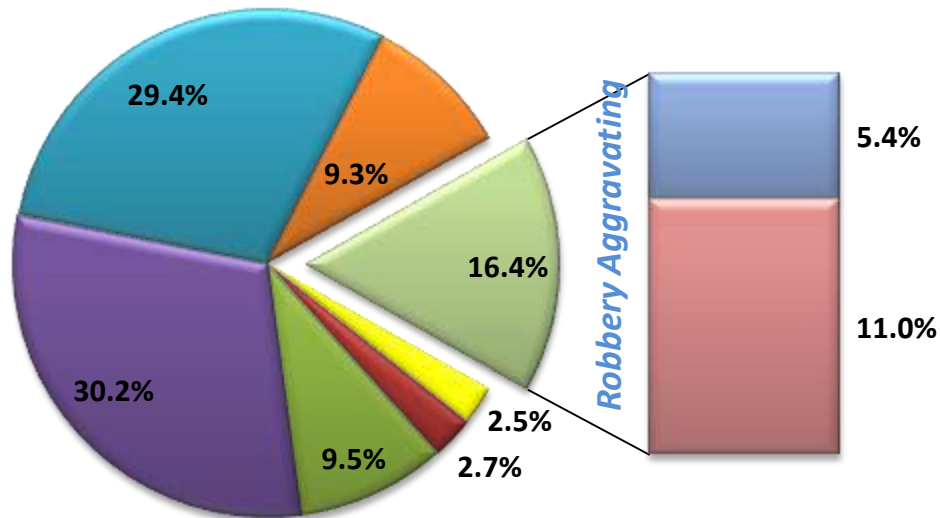

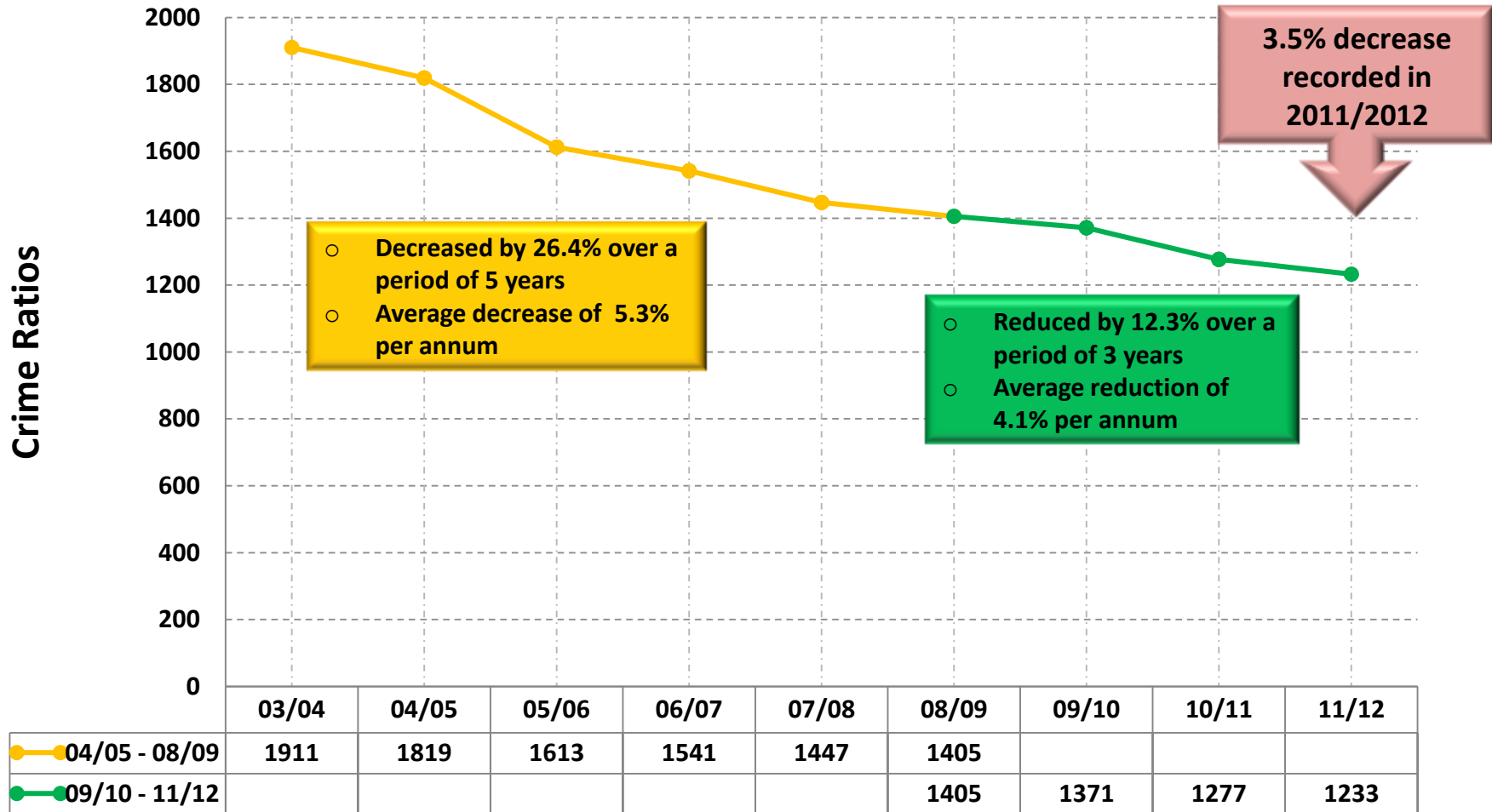

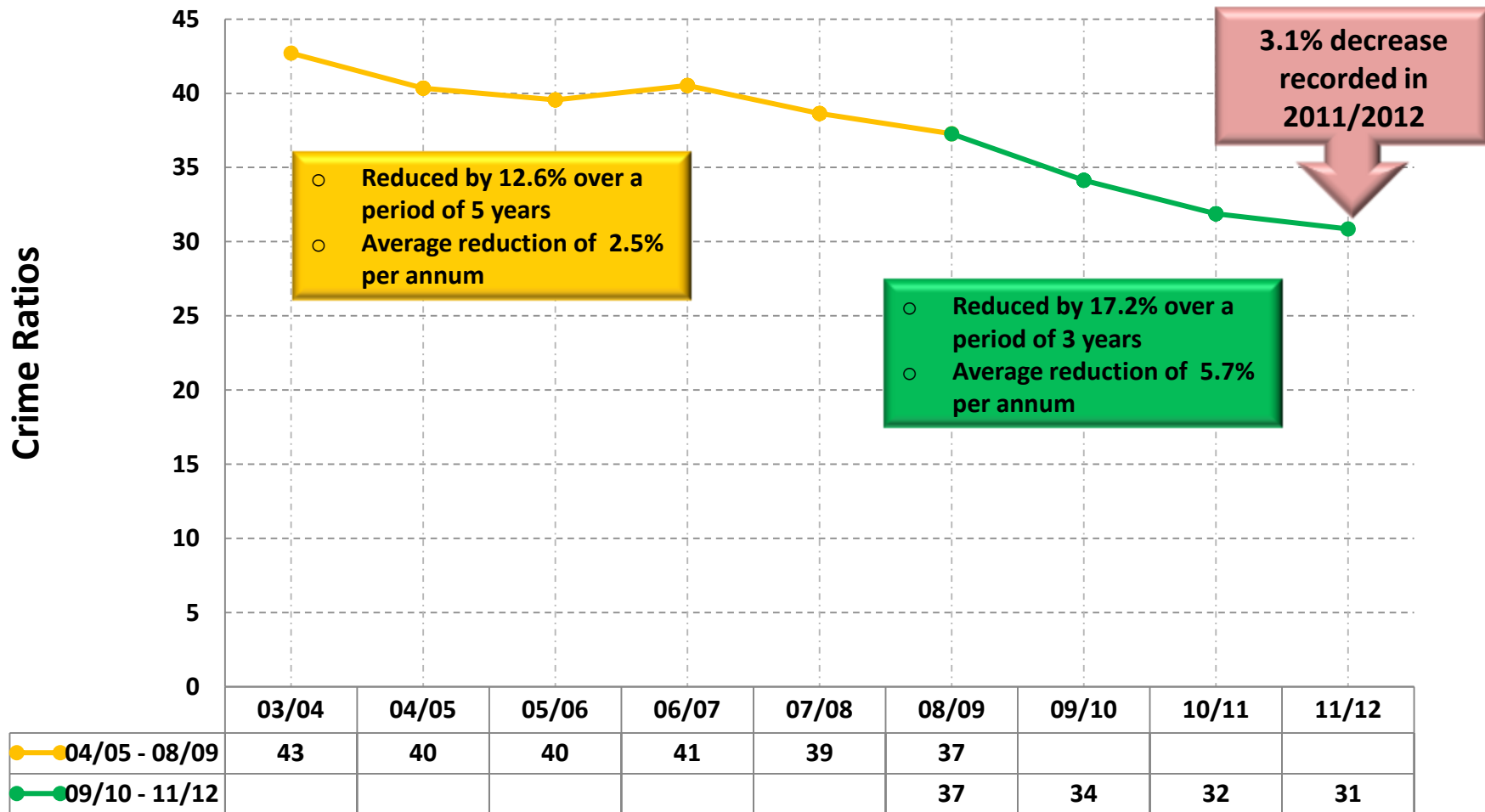

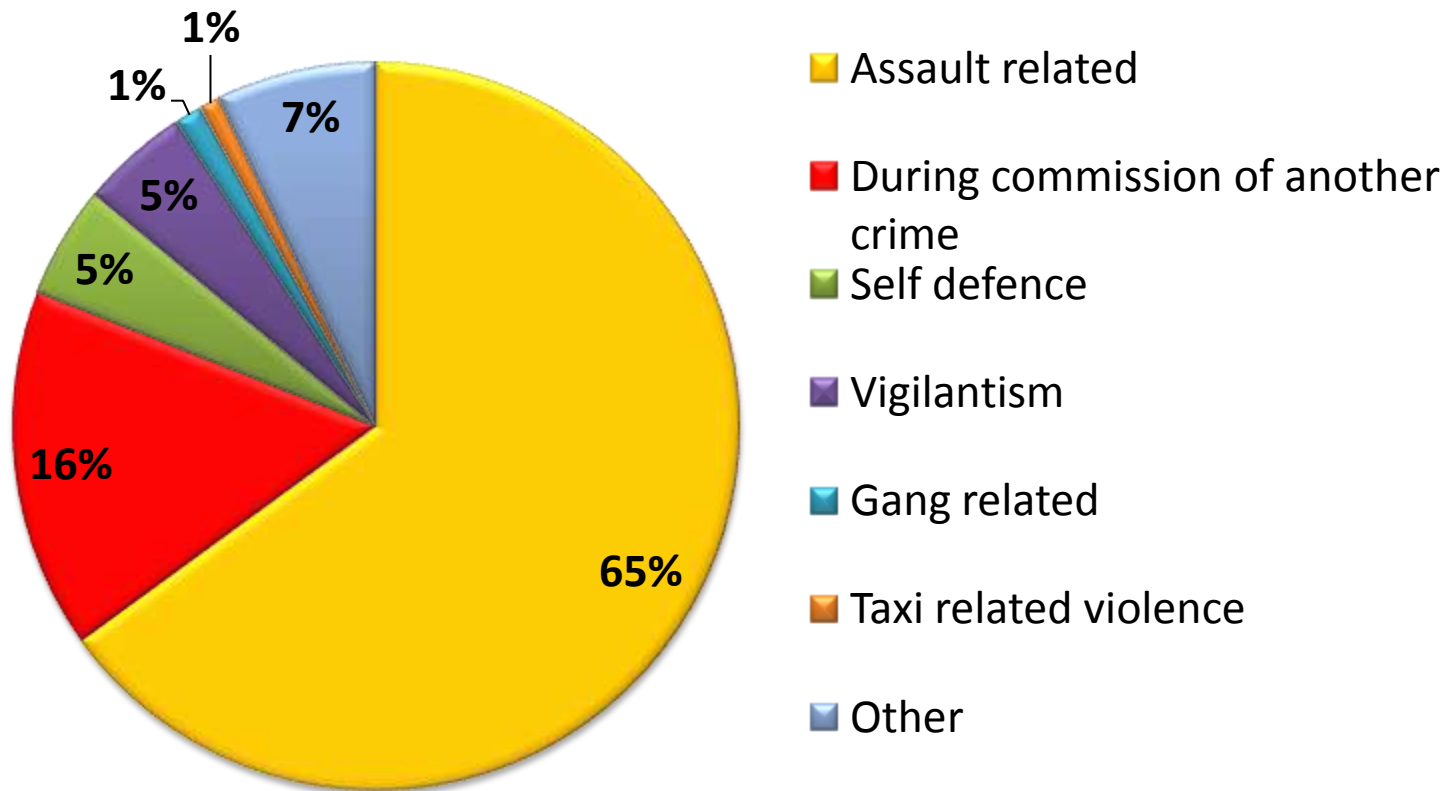

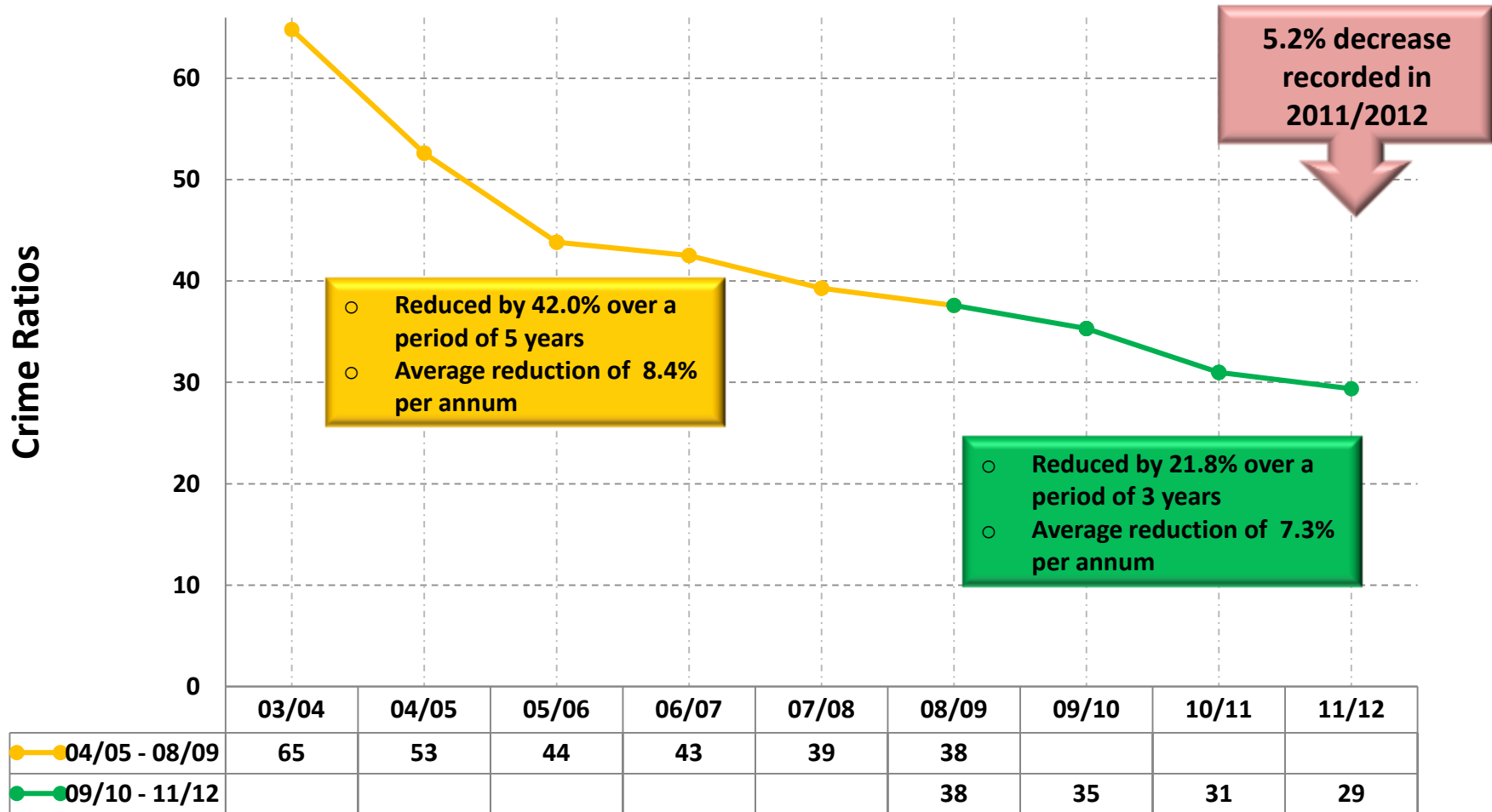

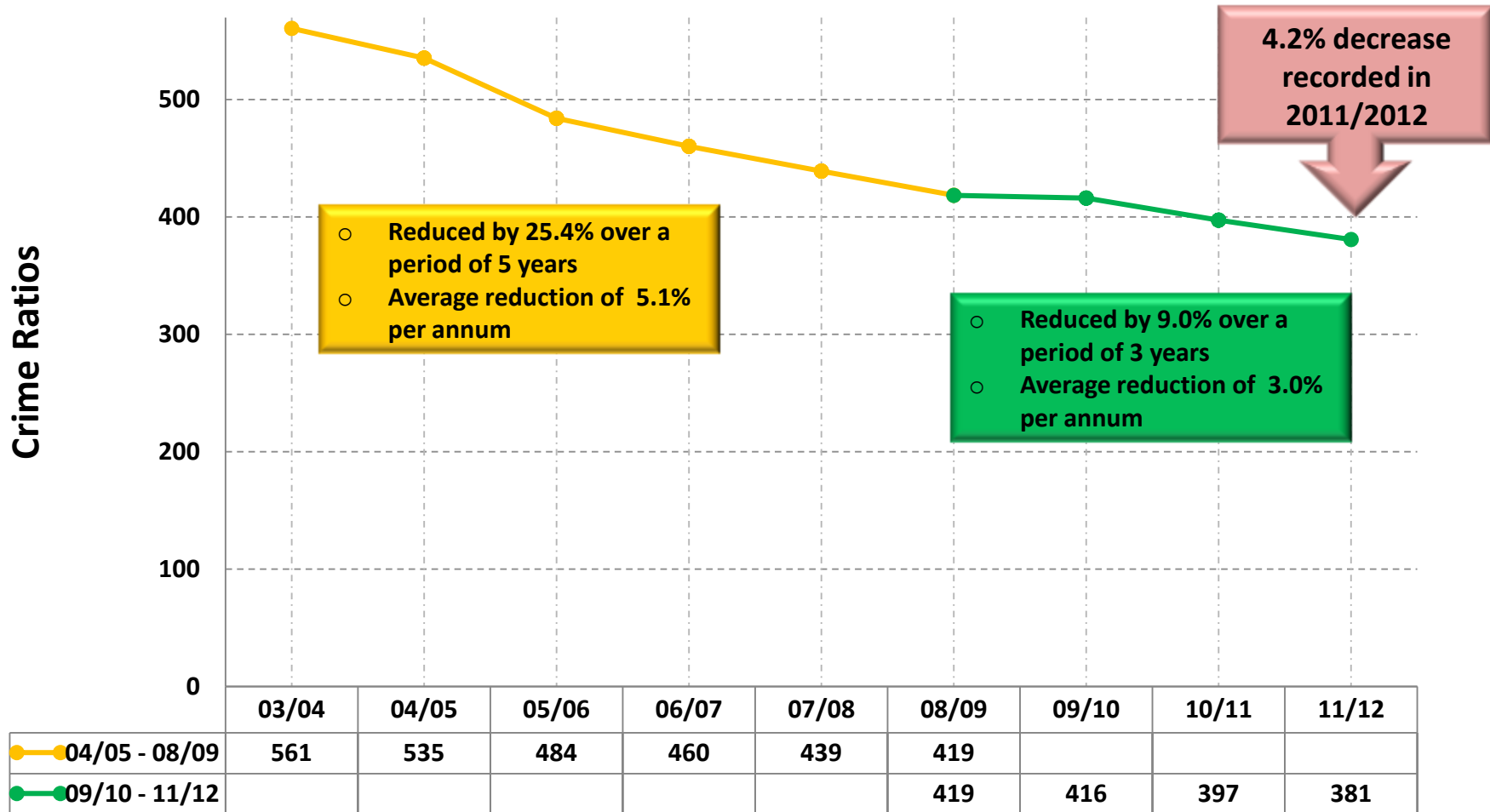

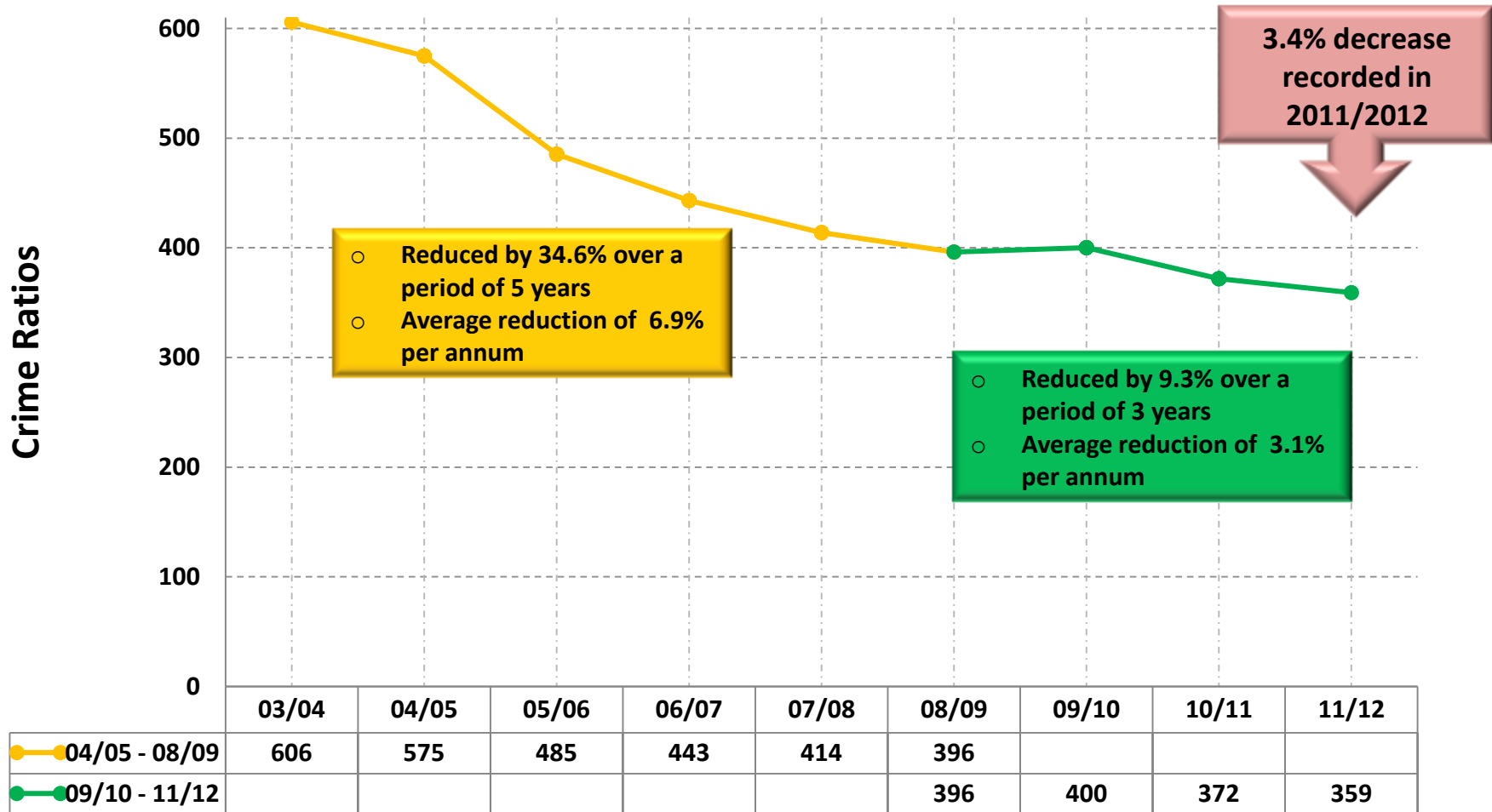

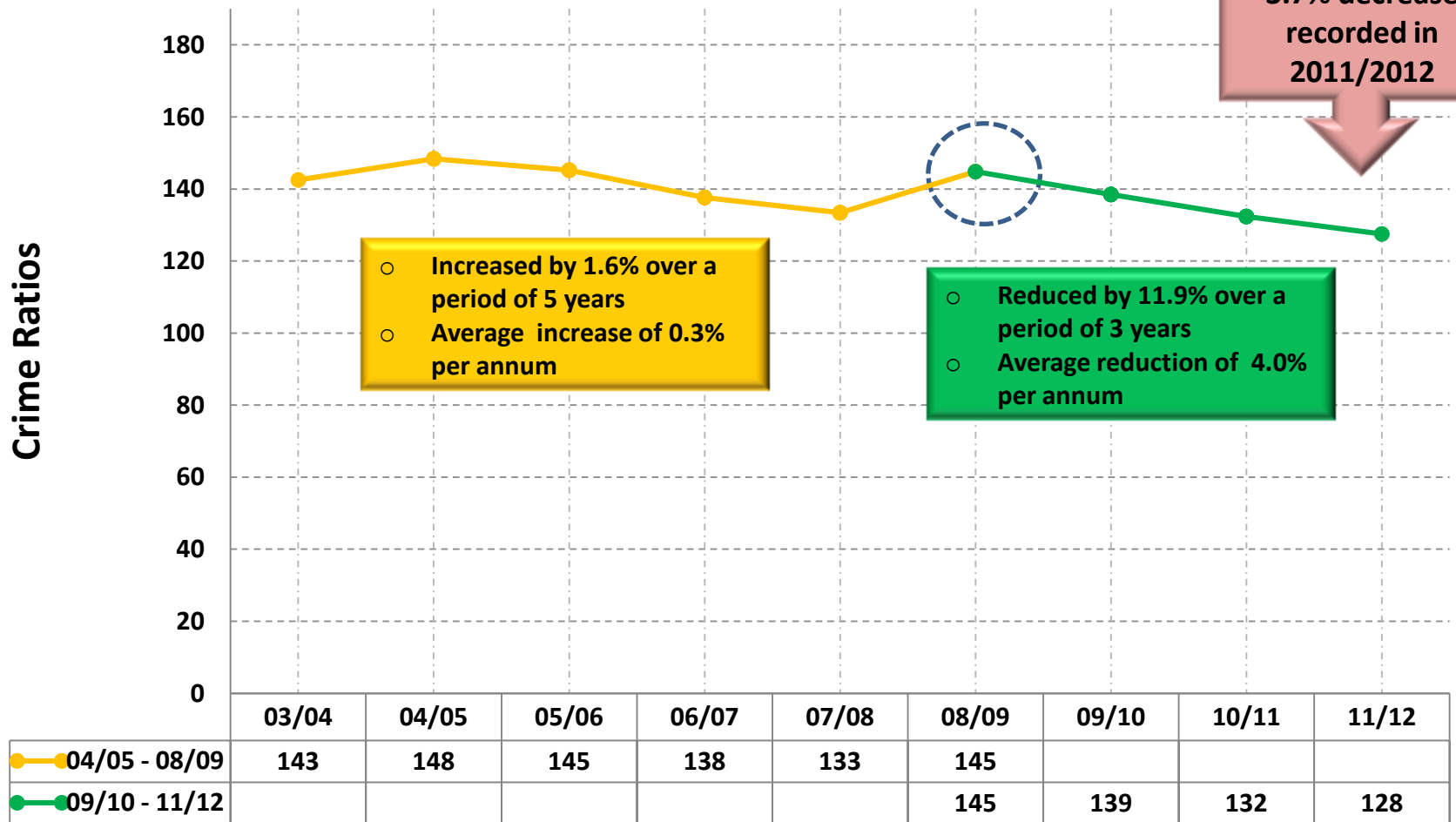

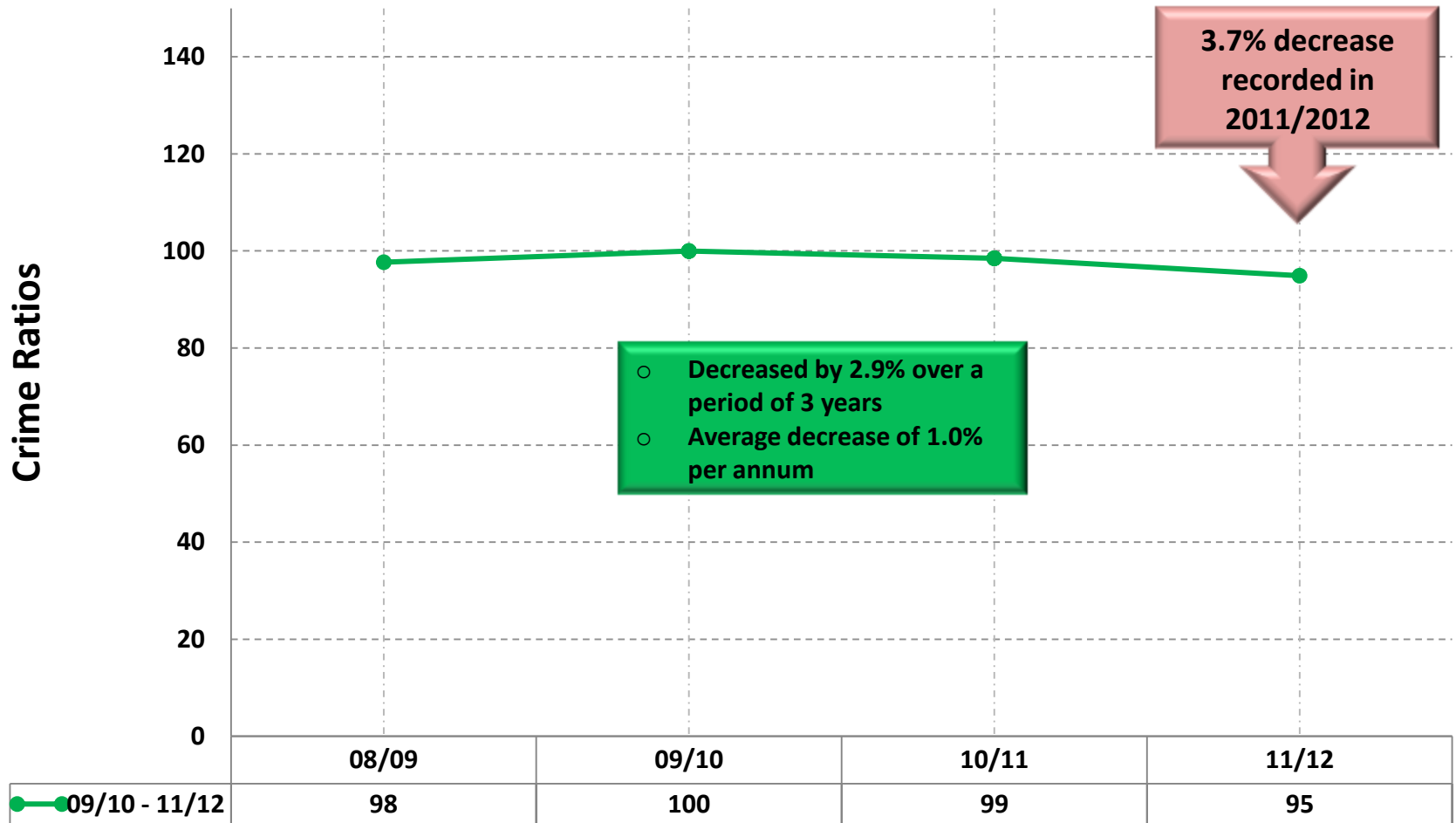

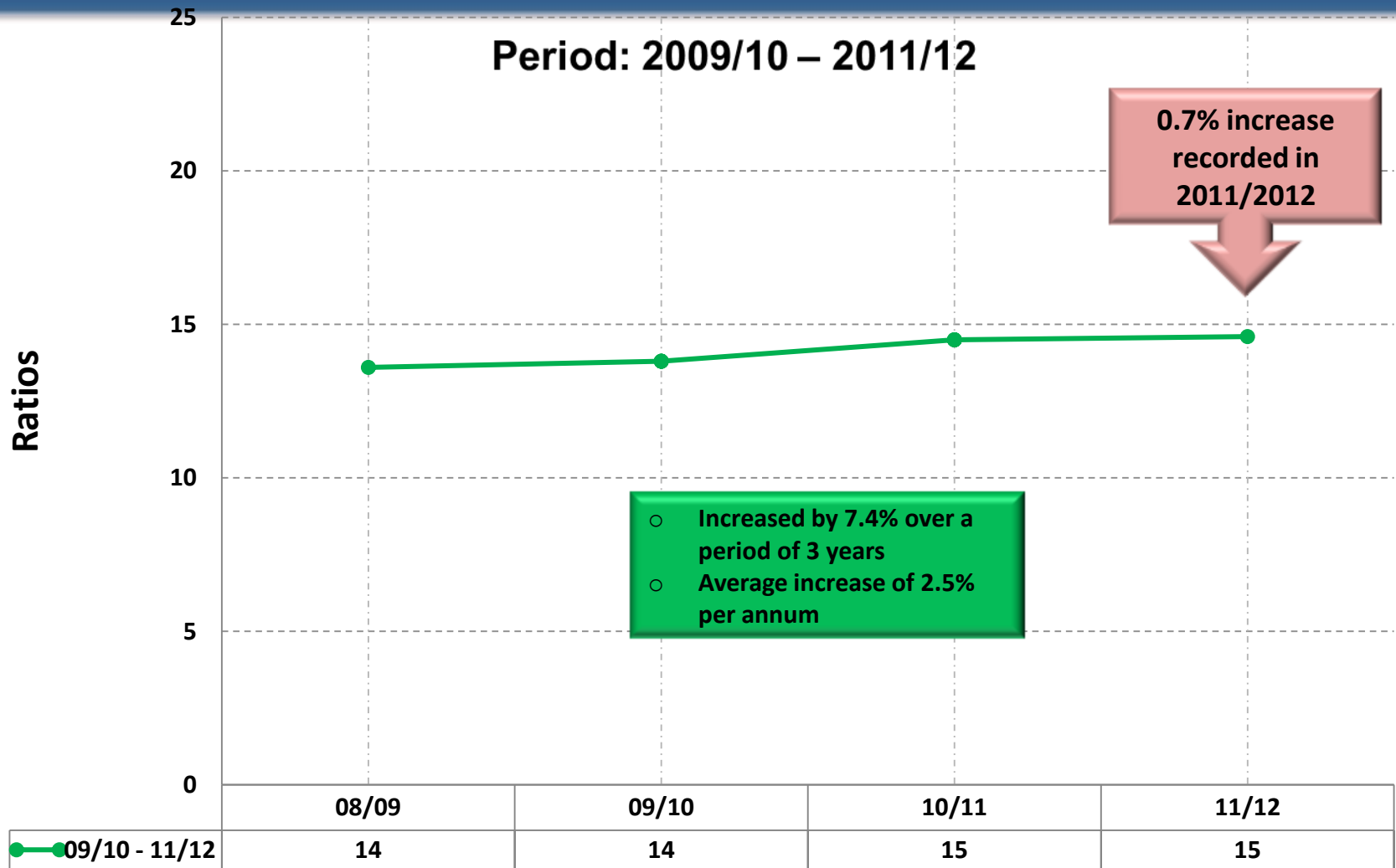

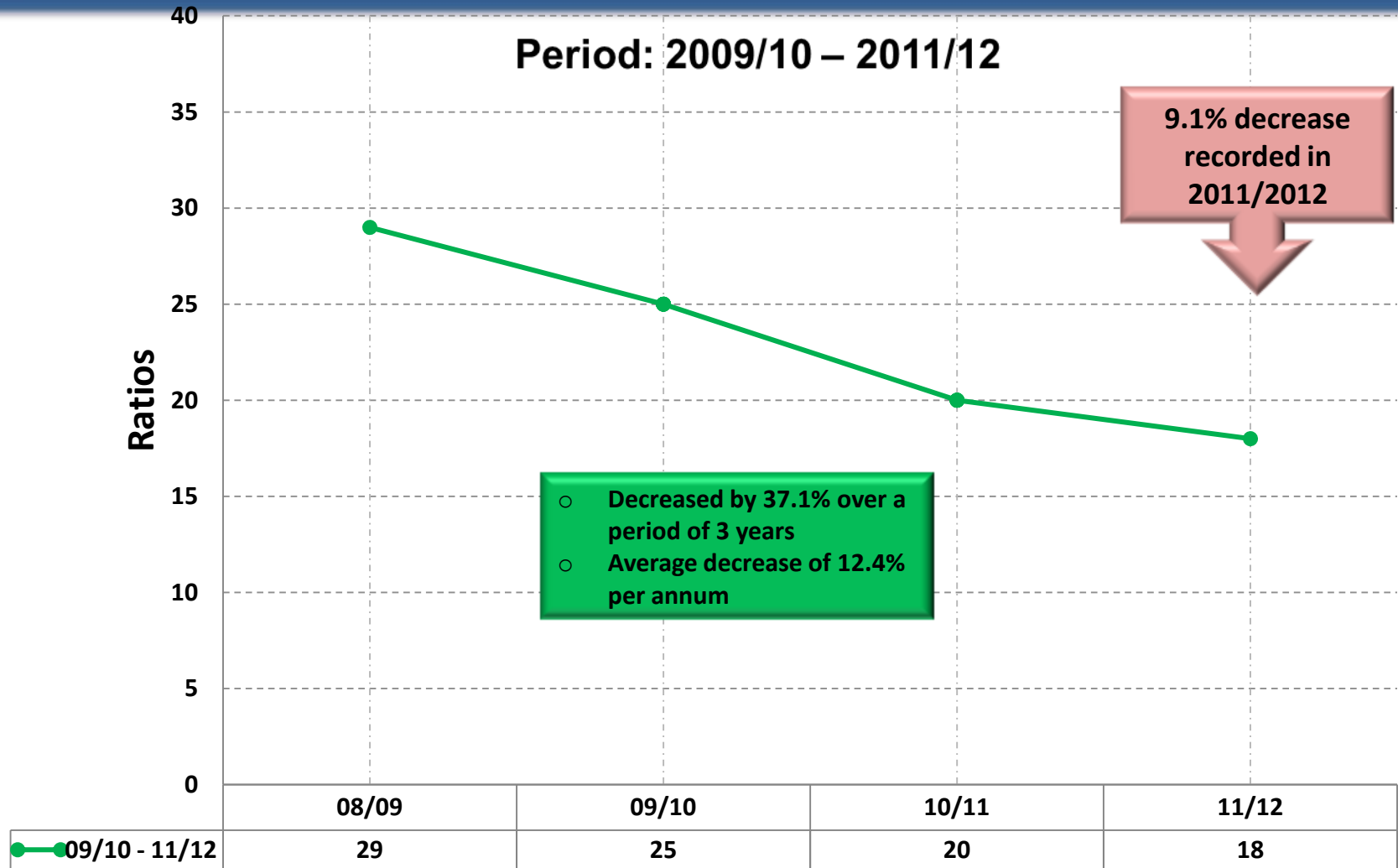

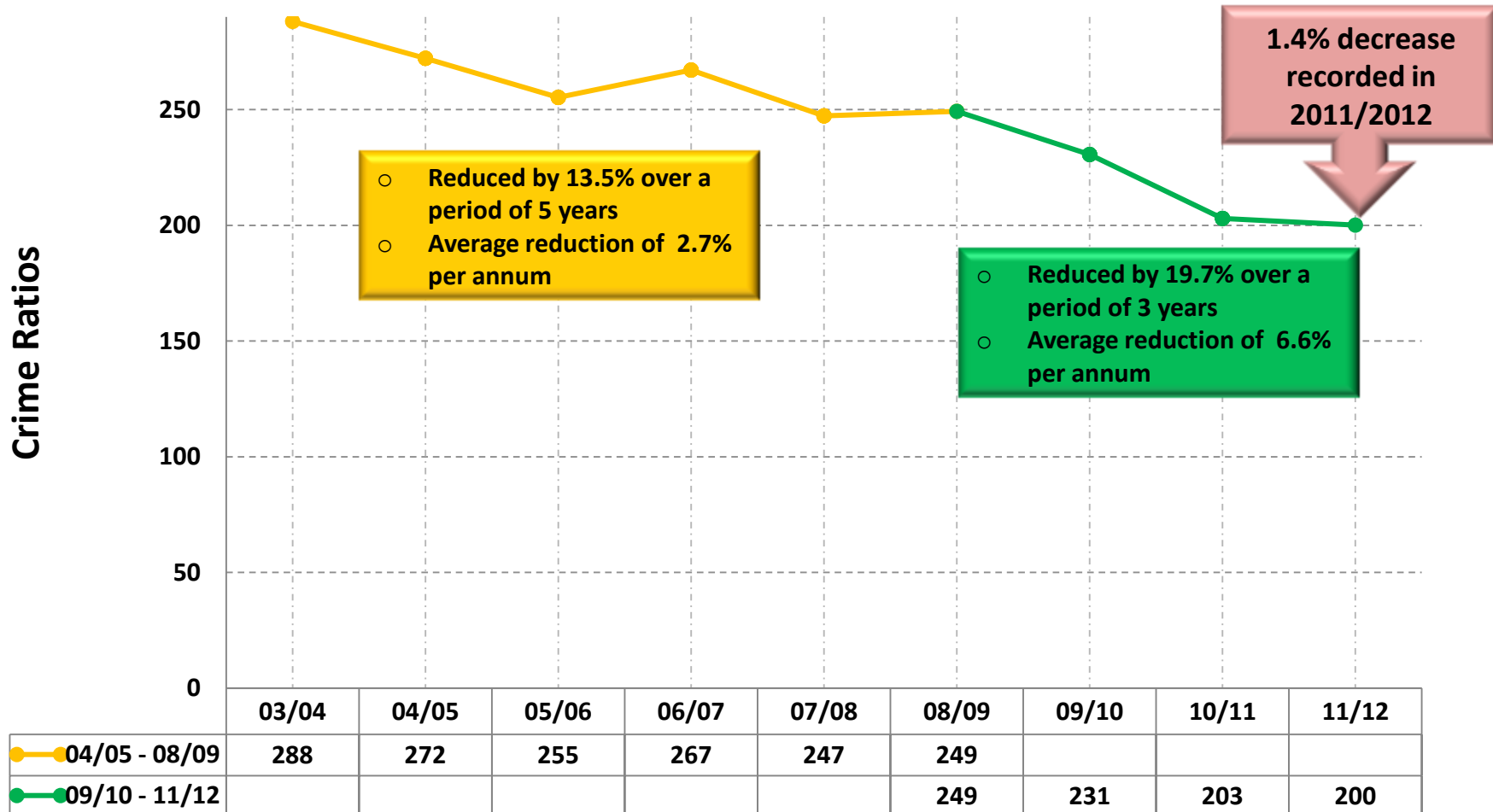

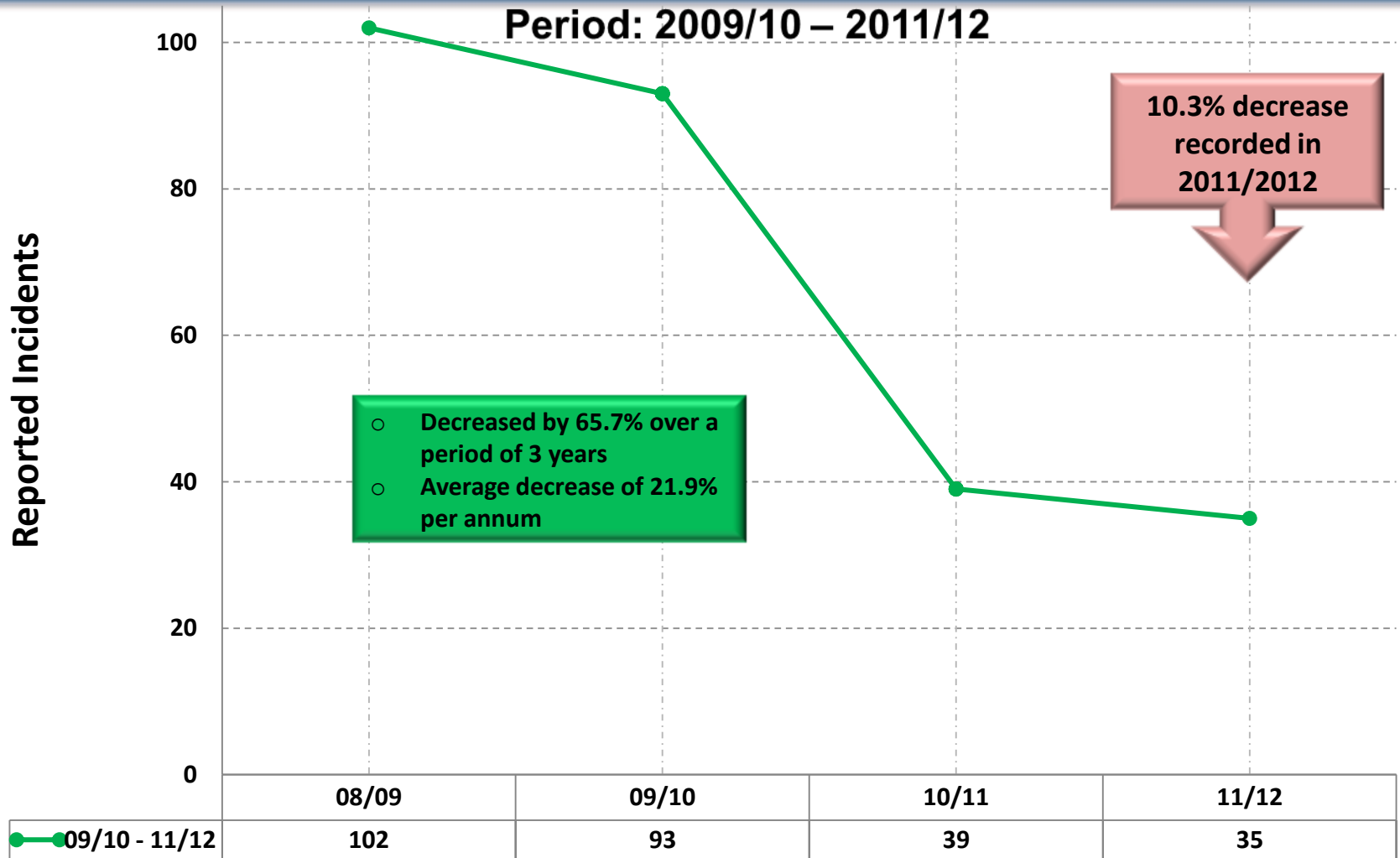

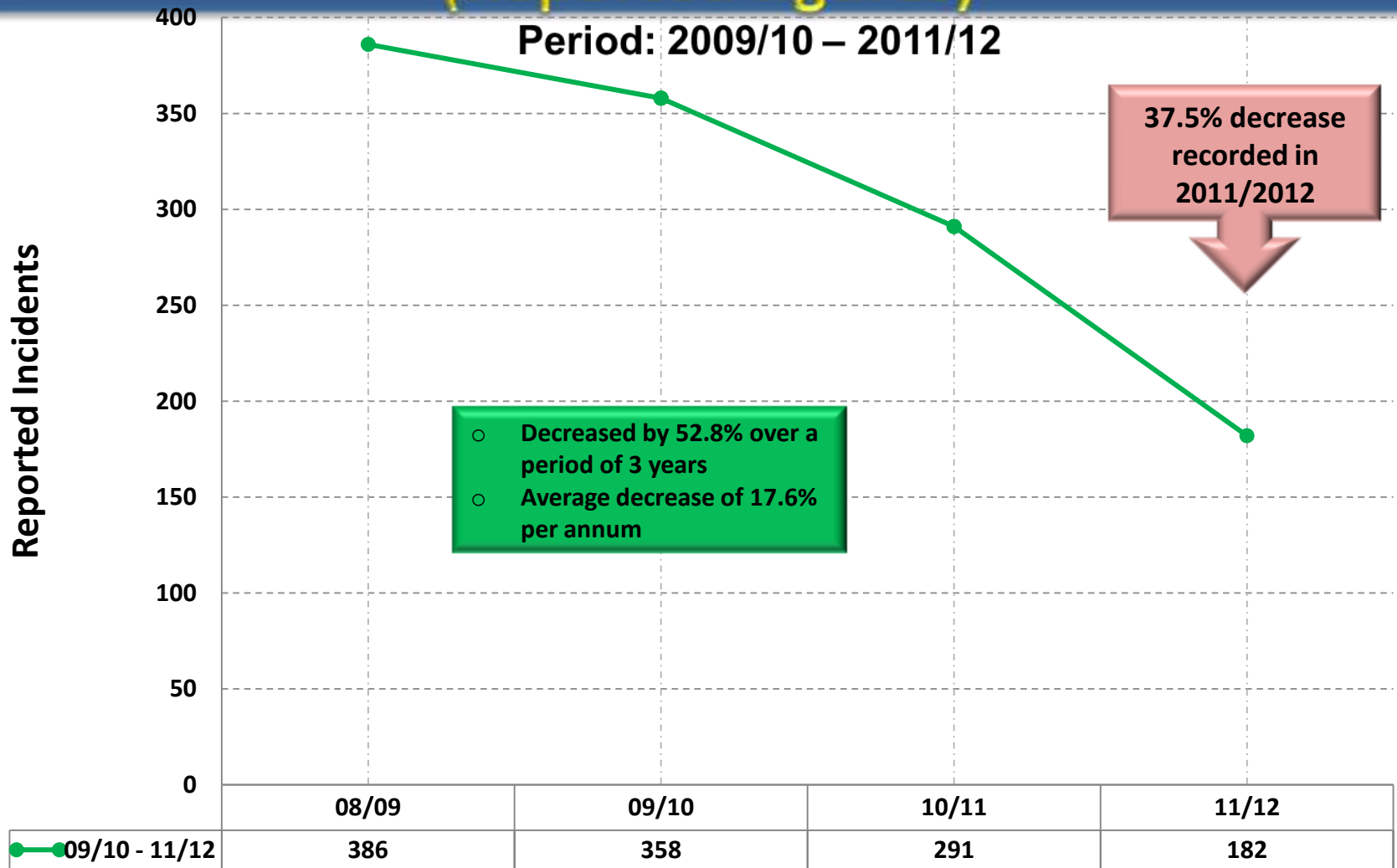

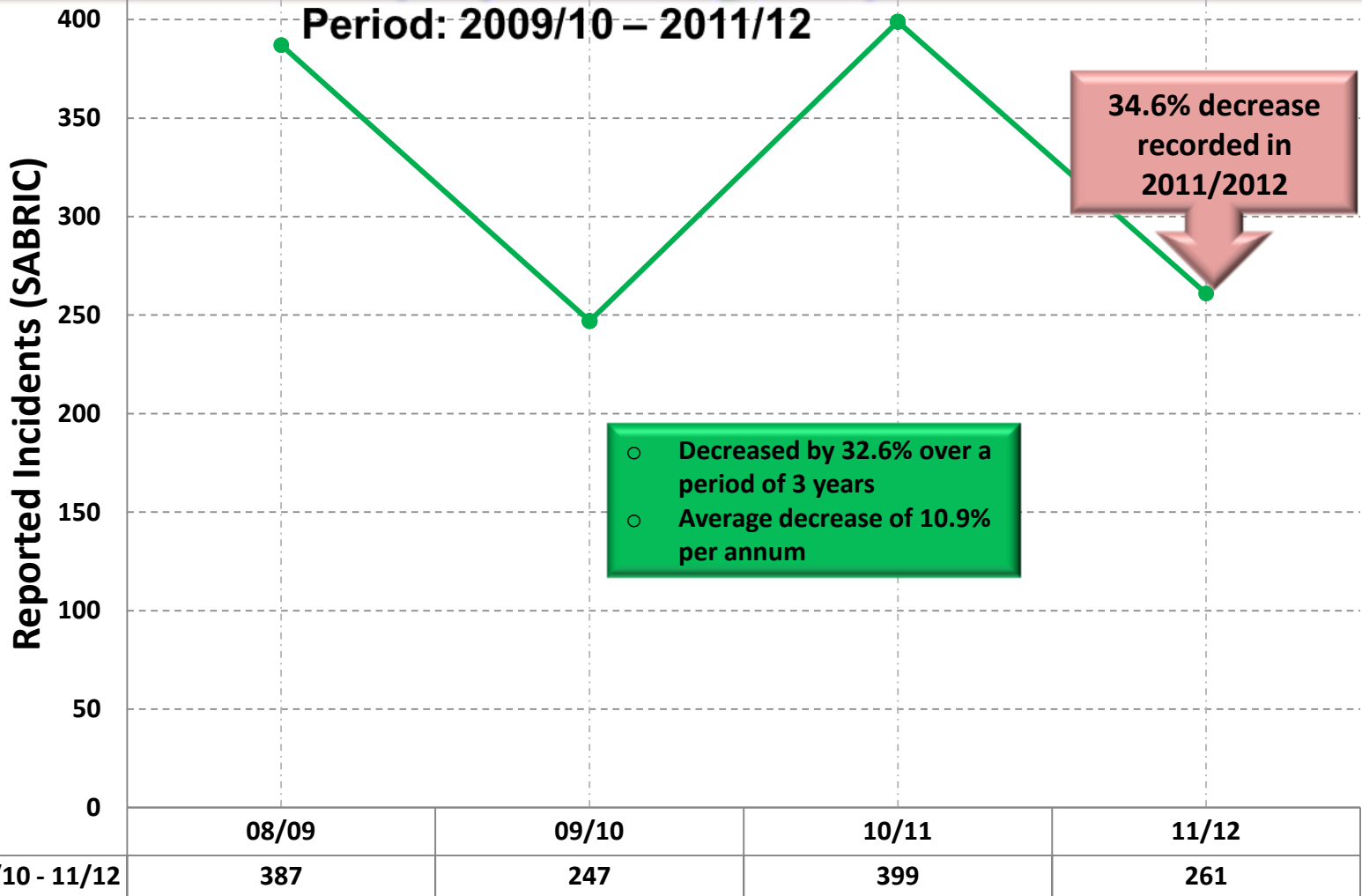

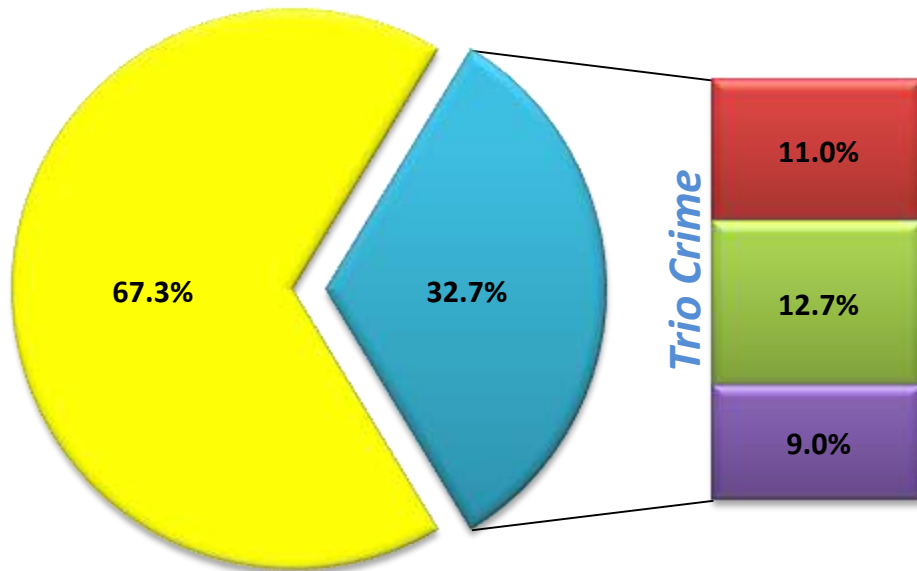

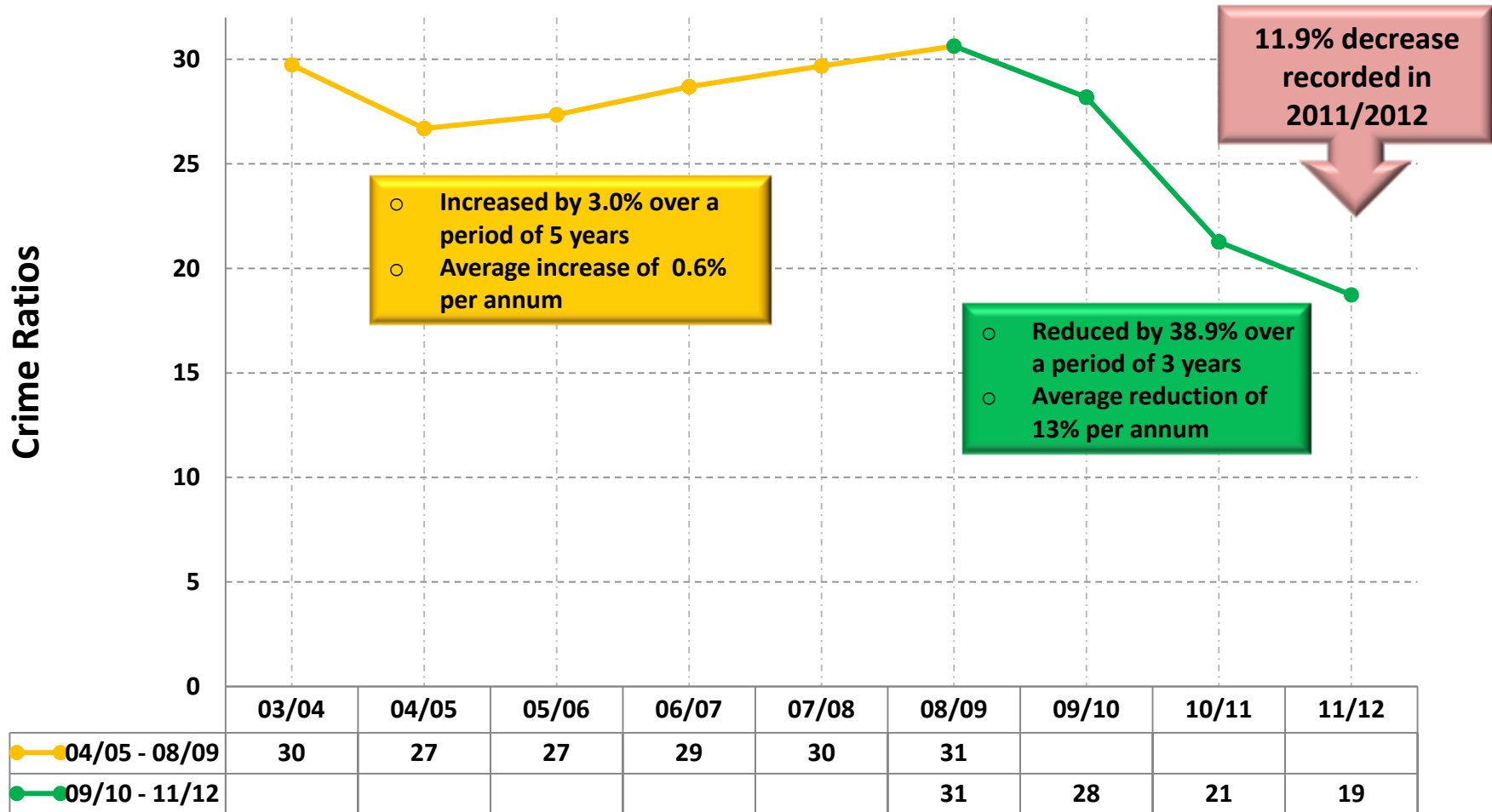

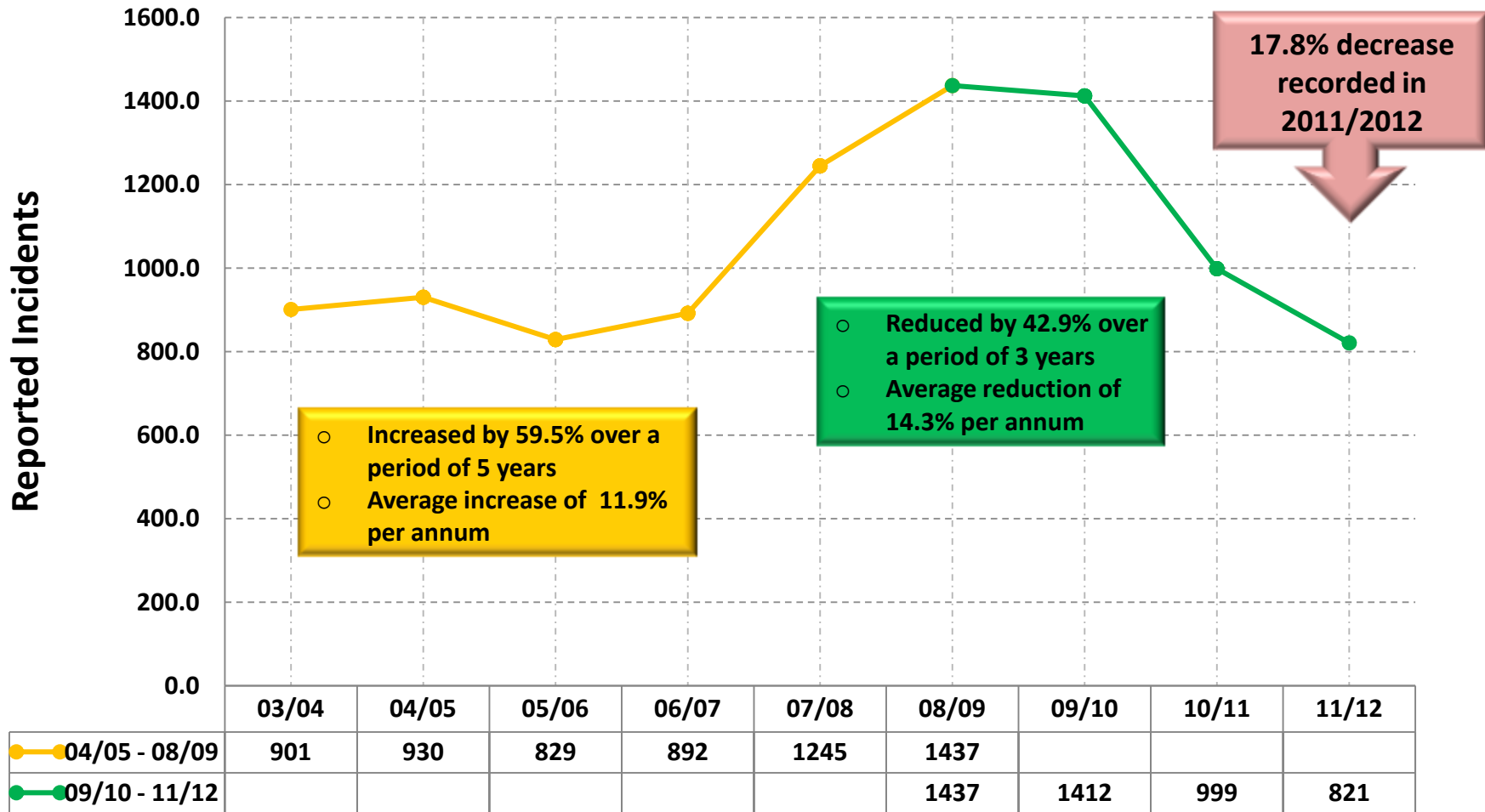

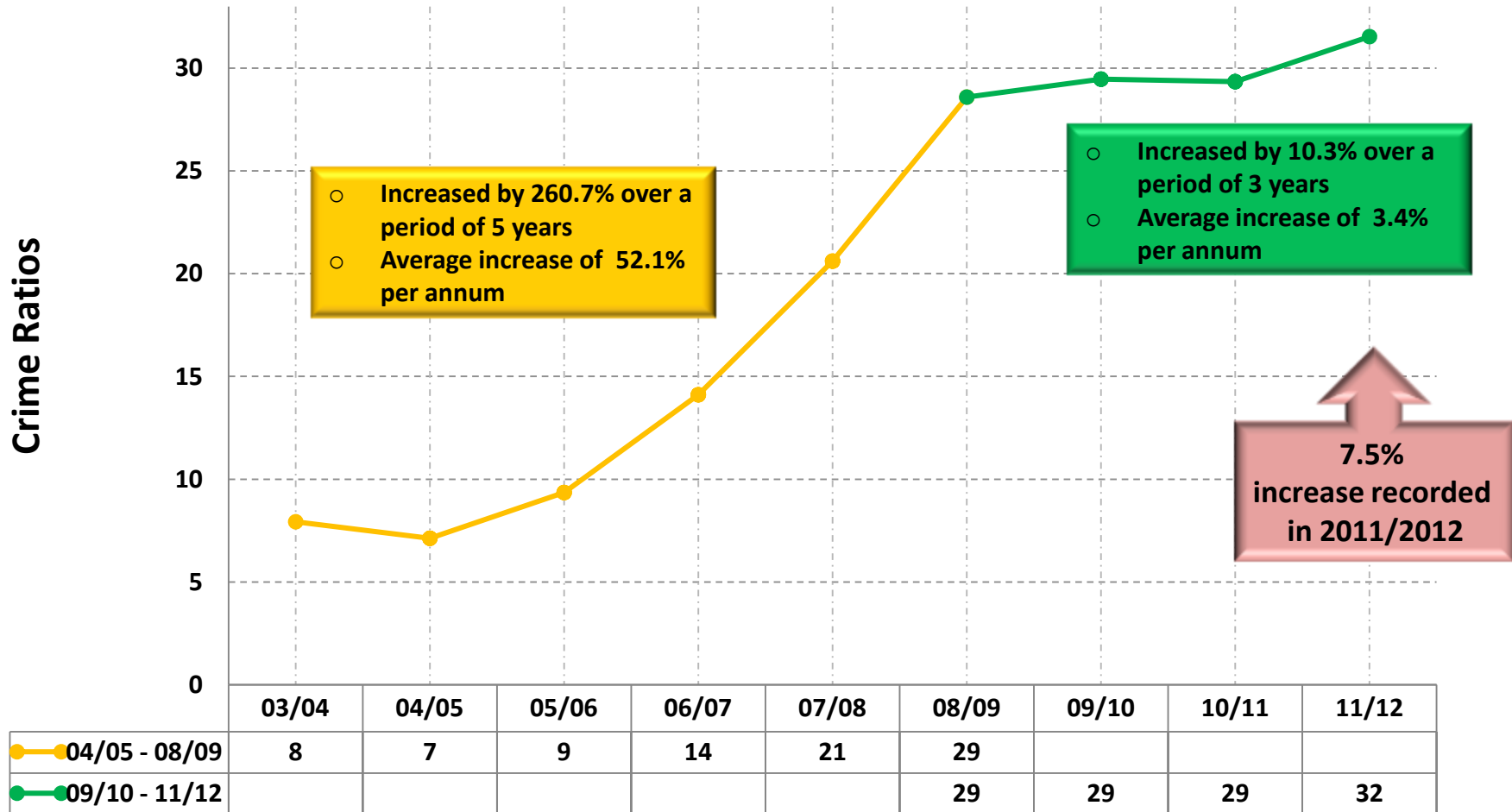

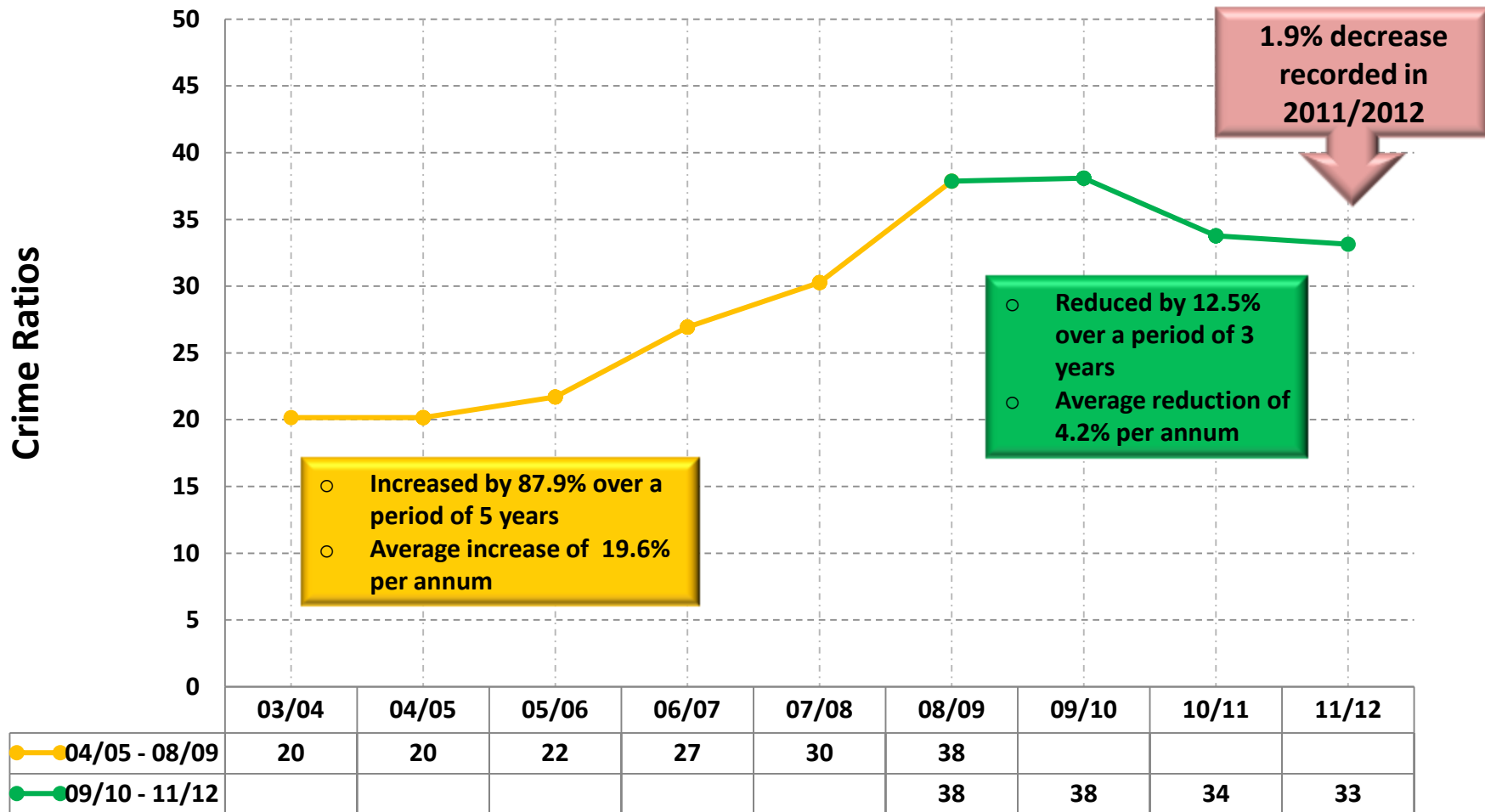

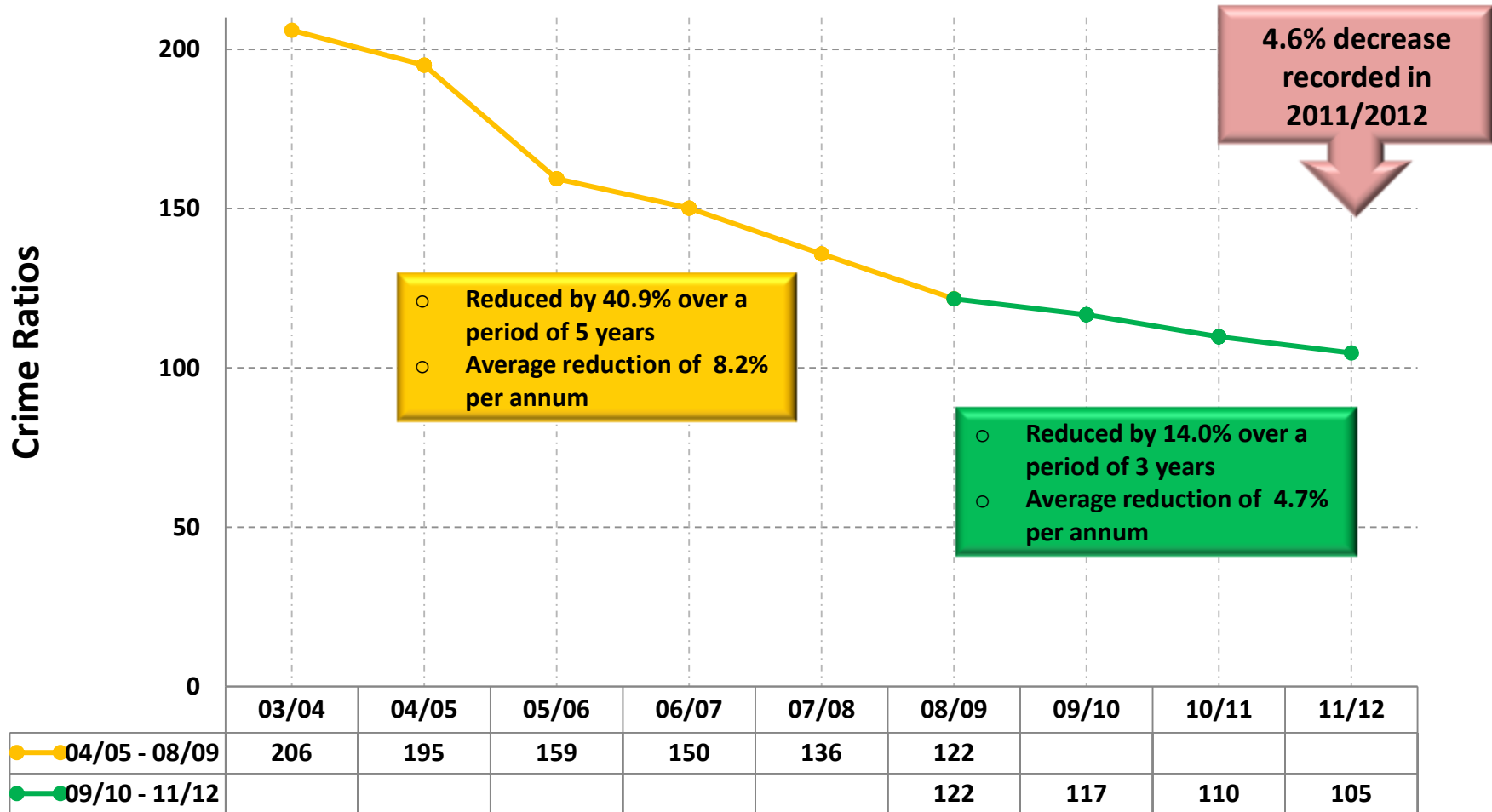

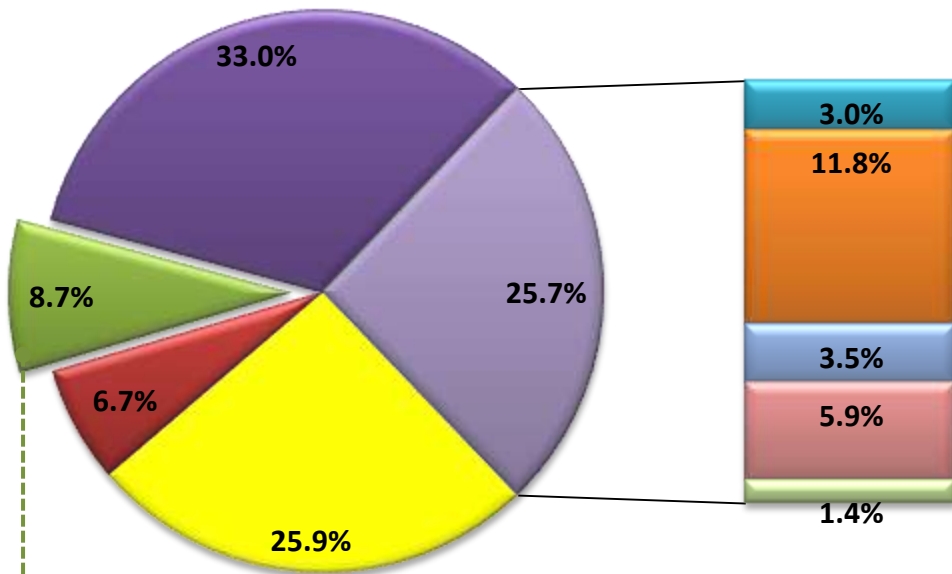

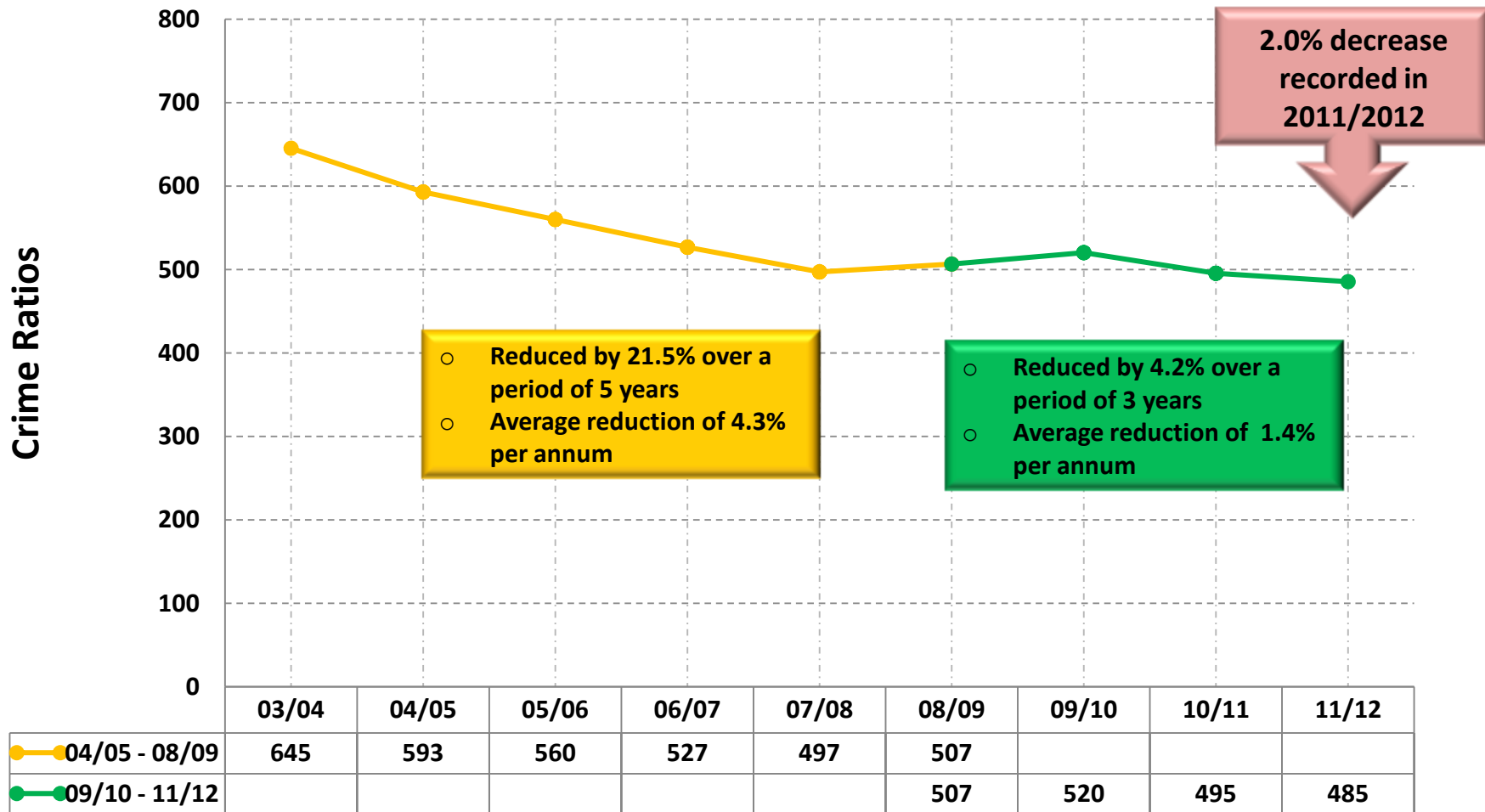

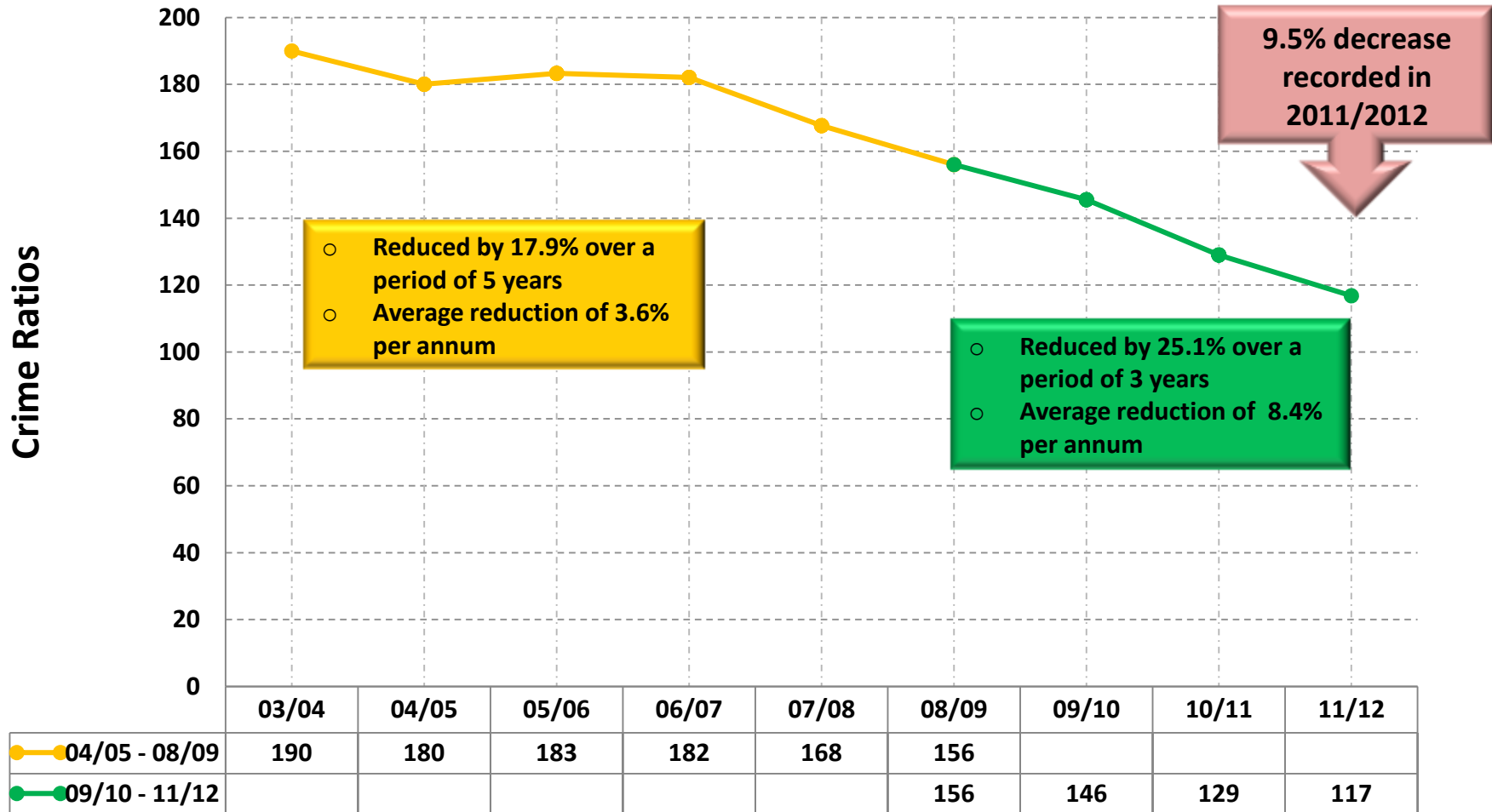

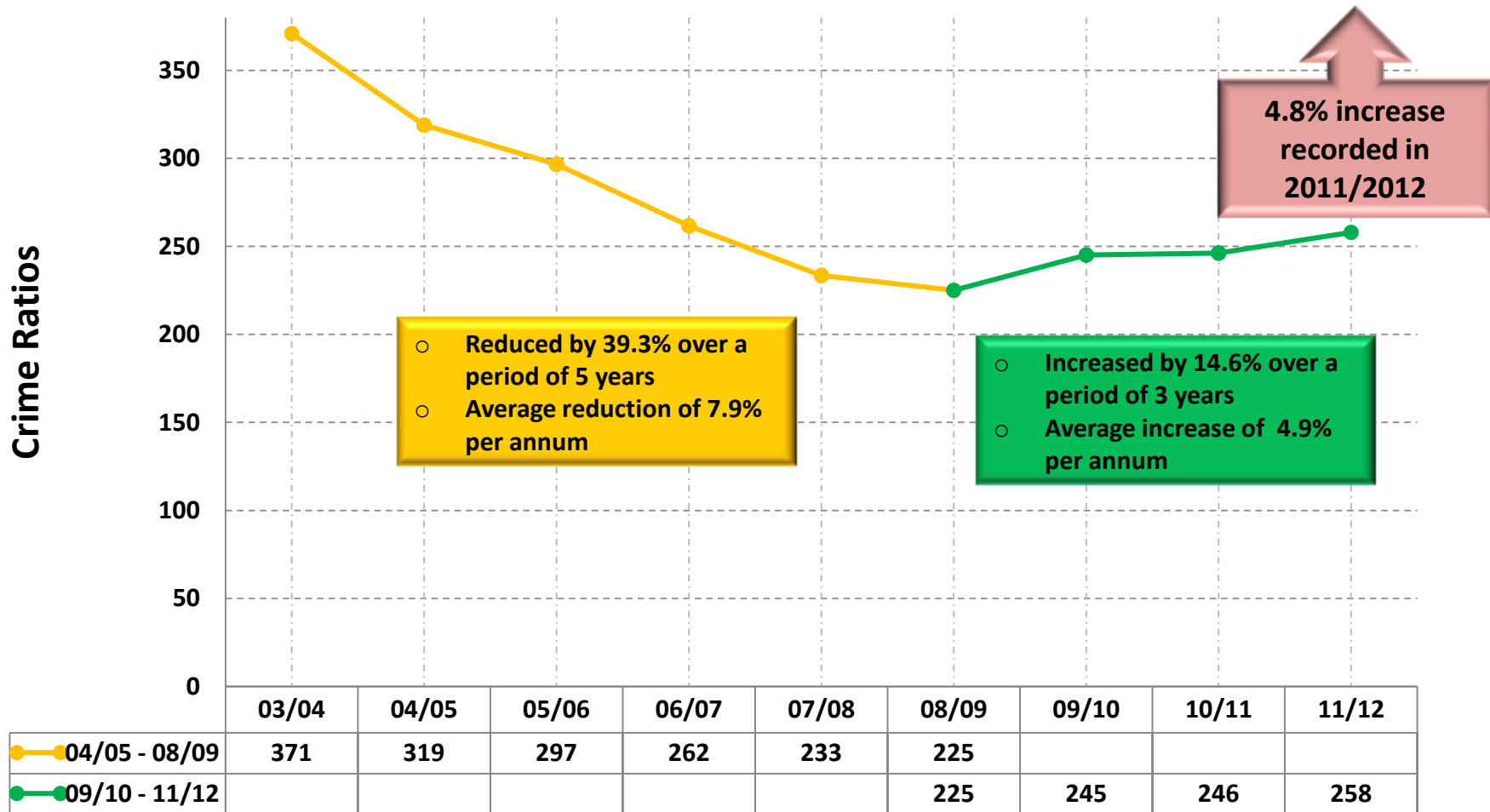

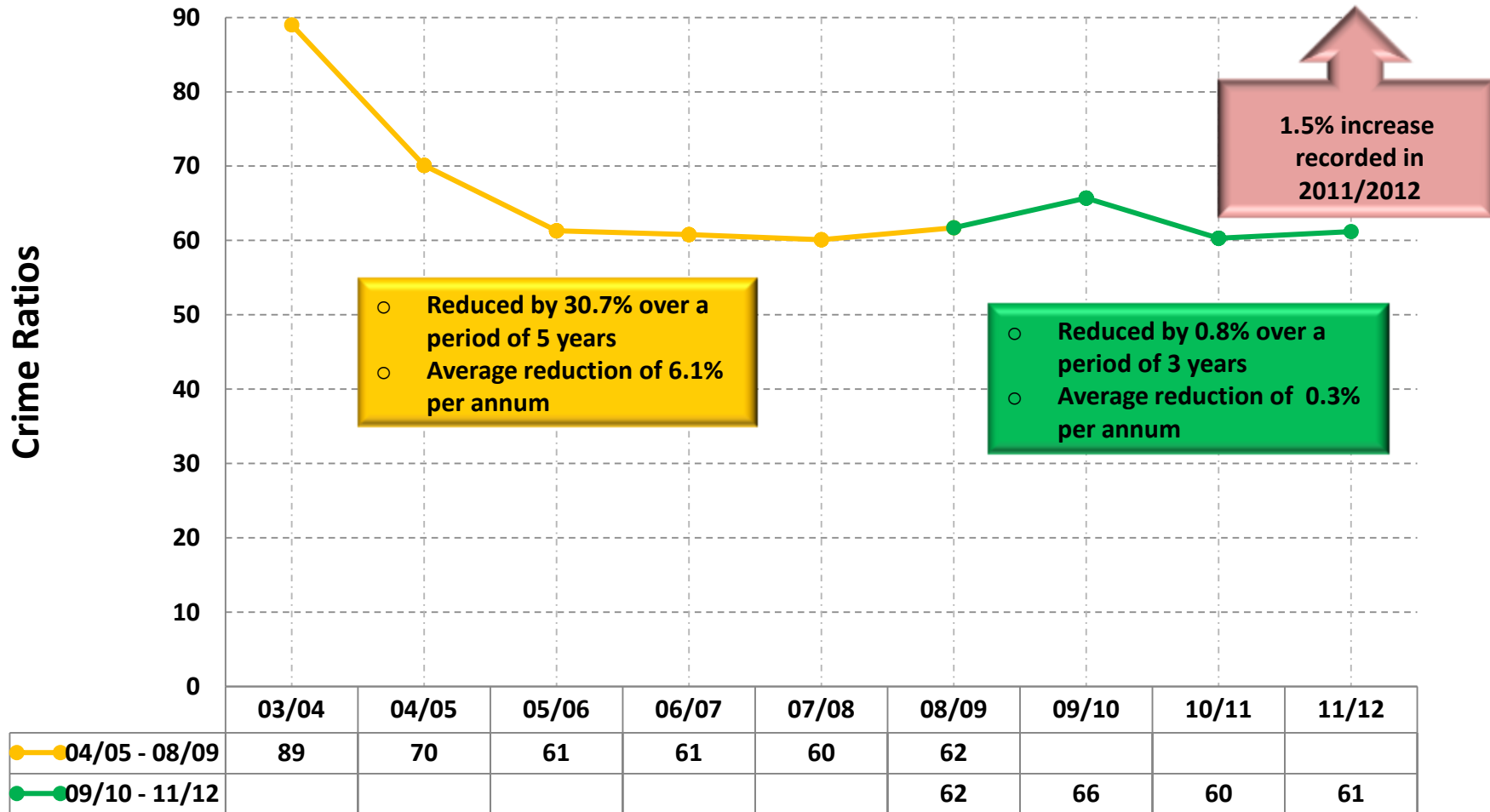

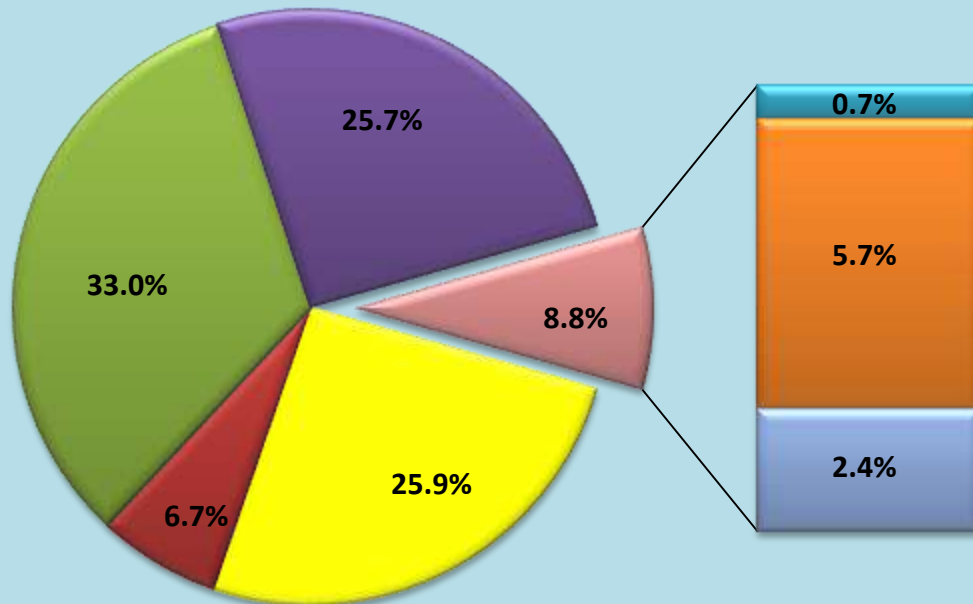

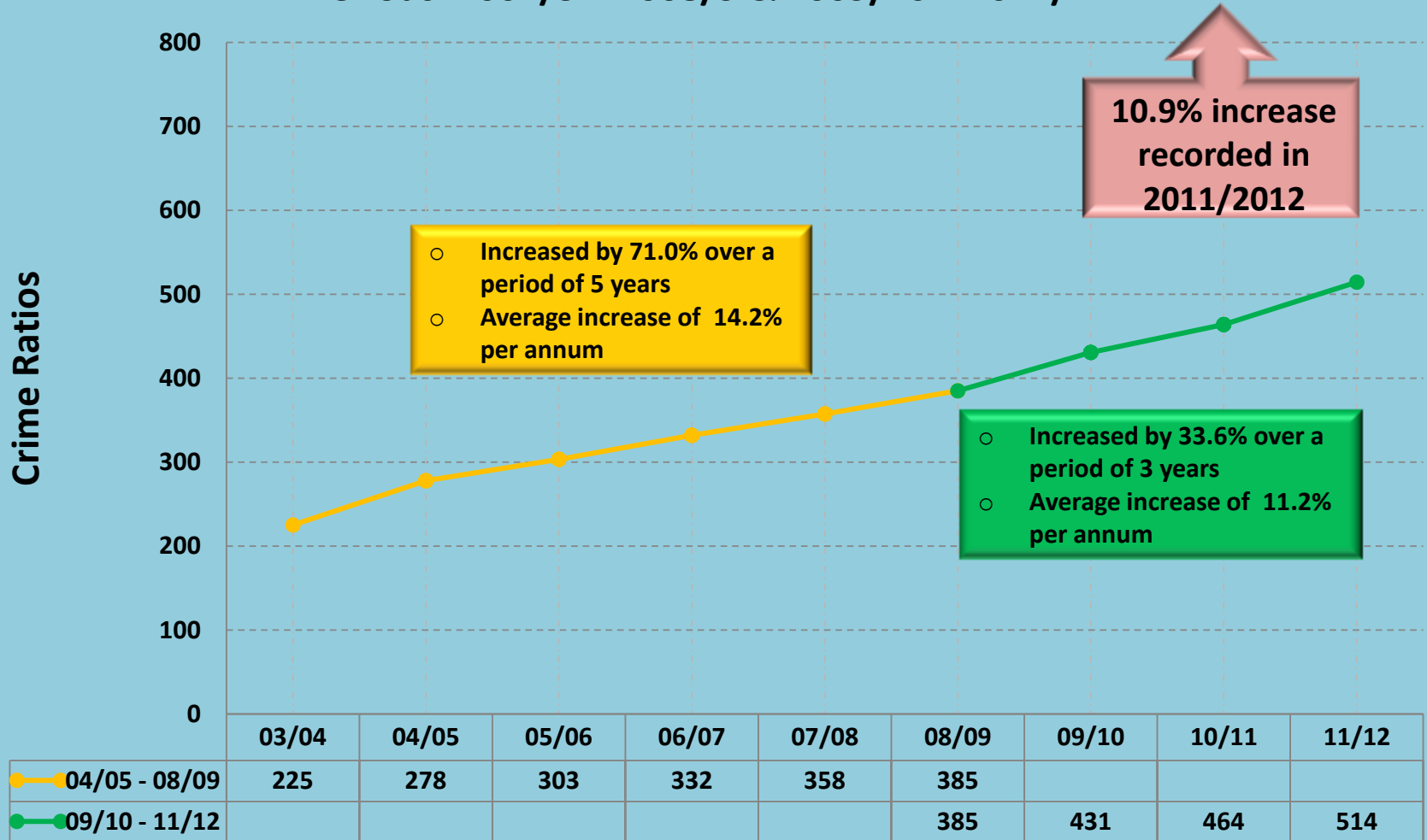

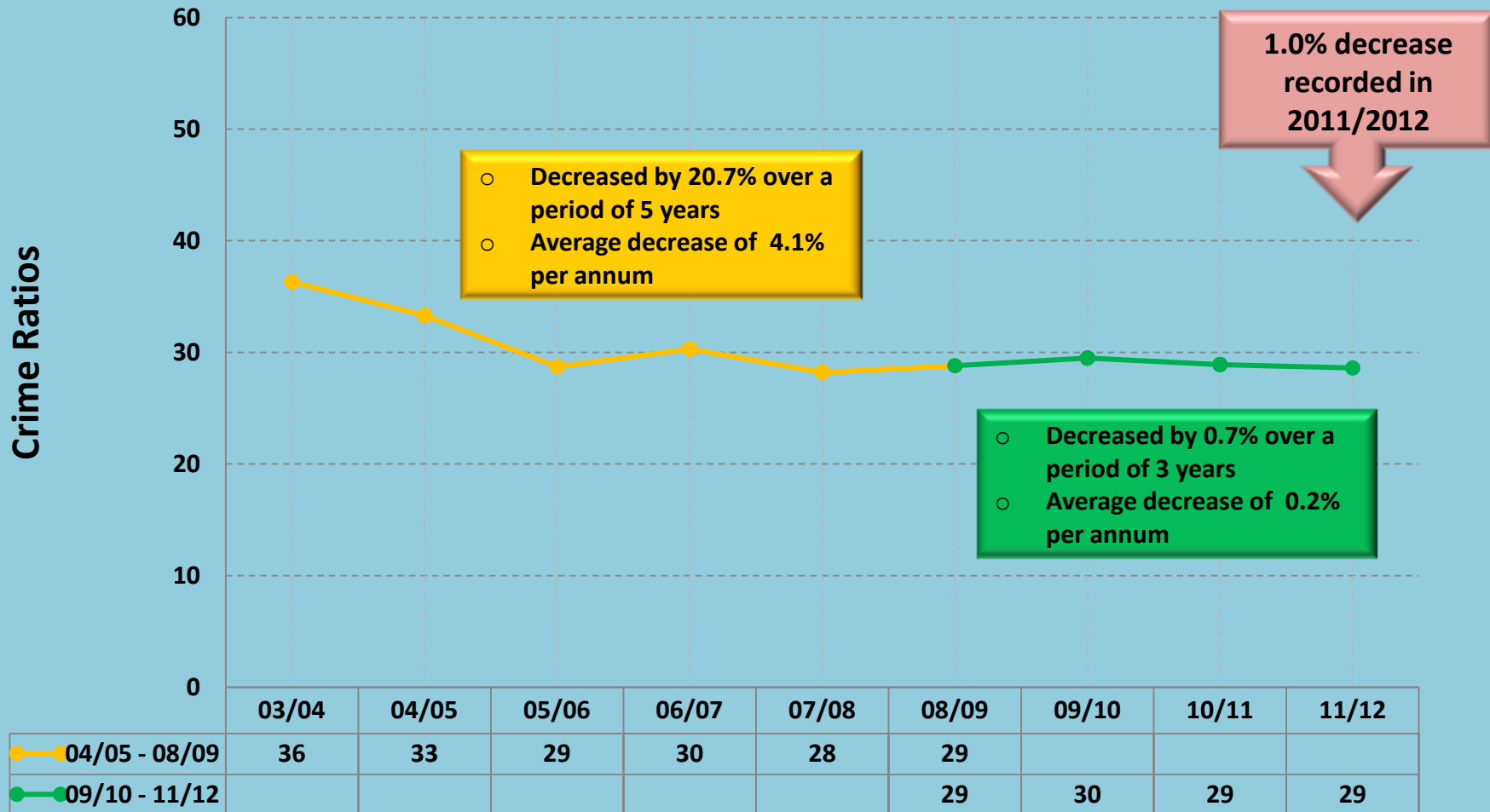

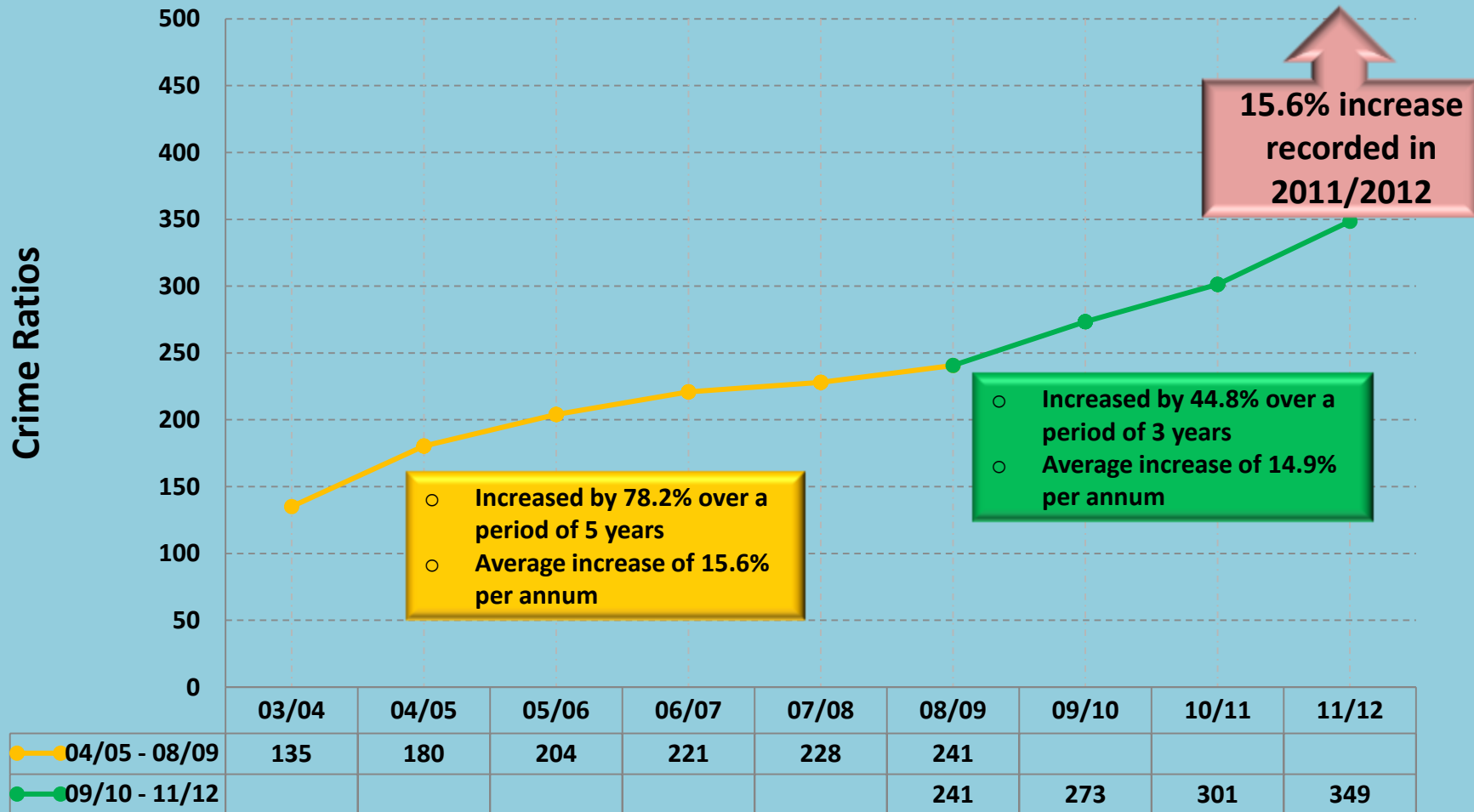

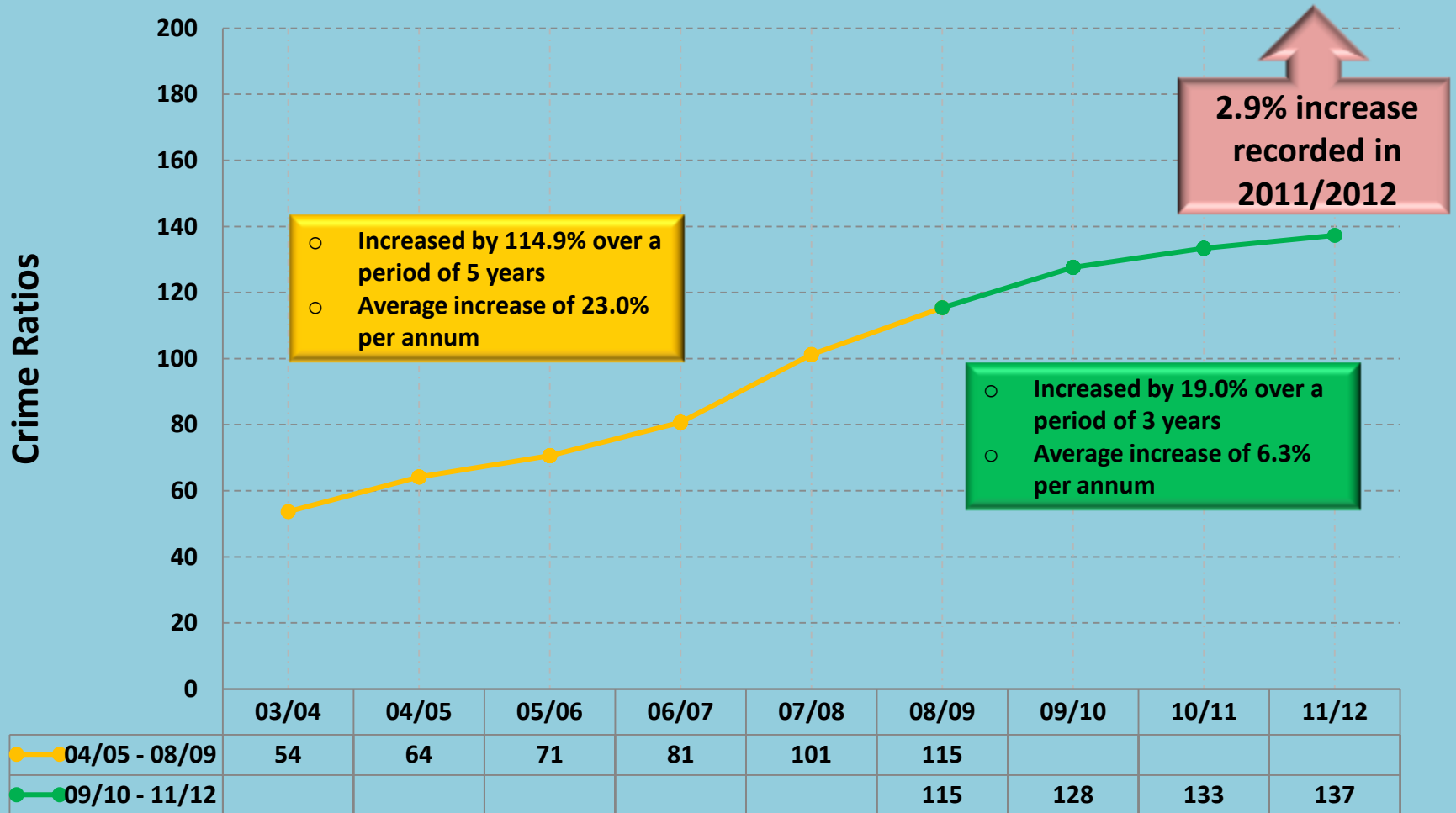

Conclusion

Constant mindfulness of Government's Vision regarding crime that "All people in South Africa **are** and **feel** safe" remains at the top of our agenda.

The downward trend in crime needs to be balanced with the people's feeling of safety as gauged by surveys and research for instance the next Stats SA, 2011 Victims of Crime Survey (to be released at the end of September 2012).

Longitudinal analysis reveals that there is a progressive decline in many crime categories and in some instances we even experience a plateauing phenomena like bank robberies, cash in transit heists and truck hijackings.

We however note that in some areas, there are significant outlying trends that require further analysis and interrogation as well as innovative interventions.

Future improvement of this presentation will include gender based trends and analysis as dealt with in the annual report. Noting some of the new policing dimensions, we continue to analyse evolving trends of public violence and unrest. The SAPS will pay attention to addressing this including incitement, armed protests, illegal gatherings, sedition and other related offences.

Conclusion

The battle to make this country a safer place takes all of us and it starts with me, as a citizen of this nation. The media also has an important role in empowering and creating awareness amongst citizens.

Finally, lets pause and thank each and everyone of our partners including communities through their various structures for their unrelenting and overwhelming support in this battle.
