# CHAIRMAN'S VIEW

WELCOME TO THE DECEMBER EDITION OF OWNER MAGAZINE

## **INTEGRITY IS THE CURRENT BIG ISSUE IN AUSTRALIAN RACING, FOLLOWING RECENT MAJOR SCANDALS INVOLVING JOCKEY MISCONDUCT AND BREACHES OF HORSE TREATMENT RULES BY TRAINERS.**

Refreshingly and contrary to some of the hysterical and out of date coverage in the press, Racing Victoria(RVL) under new CEO Bernard Saundry appears to be taking the opportunity to fix integrity shortfalls rather than burying its head in the sand or being in denial as previously.

RVL and the Principal Racing Authorities in the other states now appear to be taking a much needed aggressive stance to stamp out what is a potentially existential threat to the reputation and financial health of Racing.

Thoroughbred Racing is a multi-billion dollar industry employing thousands of people and impacting on other areas such as tourism. It is underpinned by gambling revenue, primarily through TABs. Unless there is confidence that Racing is clean, this revenue will be undermined as will participation in racehorse ownership and racecourse attendance.

I have had a number of non-racing people making comments and jokes to me about the integrity of Racing. This perception can only be turned around by clearly communicated "shock and awe" reforms and heavy punishment of offending persons.

### **There are a number of obvious remedies that will help allay and overcome current integrity concerns :**

1. There need to be tough minimum penalties for integrity offences. For example, betting by Damien Oliver against his own horse should have carried a minimum penalty of 3 years suspension plus a fine of \$20,000.

Fixing of races, as alleged in the "Smoking Aces" affair, should carry a minimum penalty of 10 years plus a \$100,000 fine.

Stomach tubing of horses on race day should carry a minimum penalty of 3 years suspension, with possession of such equipment in those circumstances being prima facie evidence of tubing or an intention to tube.

Raceday treatment by a trainer should carry a minimum suspension of 12 months.

2. Appeals to VCAT by trainers and jockeys should be abolished. Apart from VCAT tribunal members having no specialist racing knowledge, this draws out the process and has been used as an unnecessary delaying tactic. If jockeys or trainers want to appeal, let them go to the Supreme Court for breach of Administrative law or otherwise.

3. If a jockey is suspended by a decision of the Racing Appeals Board for a serious offence he should stand down from riding if there is an appeal until that appeal is resolved.

4. Subject to reasonable restrictions, Stewards need to be able to have timely and reasonable access to information which is pertinent to breaches of the rules of Racing obtained by police in criminal investigations during those investigations and also more importantly the right to use that information as admissible evidence in Racing hearings and appeals.

5. Subject to reasonable restrictions, Stewards should also be able to instigate a court action for warrants for telephone interception to aid investigations.

TROA is not alone in suggesting such remedies, some of which were addressed in a recent RVL press release (extracted separately in this Magazine).

These reforms need to be driven through by RVL and the Australian Racing Board, as well as the Victorian Racing Minister and other relevant ministers.

Stronger deterrents and enforcement should have the immediate desired effect and these changes need to be pushed through as soon as possible and the current matters being investigated dealt with strongly.

# ONCE IN A GREEN MOON

## Son of Montjeu leads home a clean sweep for Irish-breds

**THE LATE COOLMORE STUD CHAMPION MONTJEU (SADLER'S WELLS – FLORIPEDES, BY TOP VILLE) BECAME THE 117TH INDIVIDUAL STALLION TO SIRE A MELBOURNE CUP WINNER WHEN GREEN MOON (MONTJEU – GREEN NOON, BY GREEN TUNE) LED HOME THE DOMINANT IRISH-BRED CONTINGENT AT FLEMINGTON.**

The Lloyd Williams-owned Green Moon claimed the lion's share of the Melbourne Cup prizemoney but the Irish breeding industry was another major winner when it provided the first seven runners home in Australia's great race.

Australian owners and stables had also secured the second, third and fourth Melbourne Cup placegetters Fiorente (Monsun – Desert Bloom, by Pilsudski), Jakkalberry (Storming Home – Claba di San Jore, by Barathea) and Kelinni (Refuse To Bend – Orinoco, by Darshaan). The Luca Cumani-trained Mount Athos (Montjeu – Ionian Sea, by Slip Anchor) was the first international-owned runner home in fifth spot.

Williams bought Green Moon from his breeders, the Goldsmith family, who raced the entire with trainer Harry Dunlop until Macedon Lodge secured him in late 2010. Green Moon won at Listed level for Dunlop but measured up to the best Australian stayers when second in the Group 1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) in 2011, shortly after breaking his southern hemisphere maiden in the Group 3 Newcastle Gold Cup (2400m).

Green Moon had a light autumn before going into the Melbourne Cup at the fifth run of a campaign that featured a win in the Group 1 Turnbull Stakes (2000m) in early October but a disappointing midfield effort as a \$5 favourite in the Cox Plate at his final lead-up run.

However, Macedon Lodge decided to press on to the Melbourne Cup with the six-year-old where he justified the stable's faith to score decisively at his first attempt at two miles.

"I'm just so proud for all our team at the farm (Macedon Lodge) because everyone just puts in so much time and effort, of course led by dad (Lloyd) and it's another Melbourne Cup triumph for Team Williams," Macedon Lodge spokesman Nick Williams said. "We put a lot of money in and a heck of a lot of effort and to get this result today is terrific.

"This is what we bought him for and this has been the plan. The Cox Plate didn't go absolutely to plan and he got an unfortunate bump coming out of the straight the first time and had no luck in the run."

Green Moon became the third Irish-bred

Melbourne Cup winner after Backwood (Bachelor's Double – Lady Of Grace, by St Frusquin) and Vintage Crop (Rousillon – Overplay, by Bustino) while Montjeu became the 17th Irish-bred stallion to sire a Melbourne Cup winner and sixth in the past 10 years.

### DERBY UPSET

Hotel Grand (Grand Lodge) became a stakes-winning sire nine months after his early demise when Fiveandahalfstar (3 g Hotel Grand – Cryptic Miss, by Snippets) simply outstayed his opposition to claim the \$1.5 million Victoria Derby at Flemington.

Fiveandahalfstar's performance was bereft of any flair, the gelding raced handy to the pace set by Jimando (Commands – Finko by Caerleon) before giving his all to defy the Fastnet Rock (Danehill – Piccadilly Circus, by Royal Academy) challenge of the runner-up Super Cool (Fastnet Rock – Queen Mother, by Kingmambo) and the fourth horse home, the Peter Gelagotis-trained Hvasstan (Fastnet Rock – Snow Hero, by True Hero) and the fifth runner Electric Fusion (Fastnet Rock – Silken Song, by Unbridled's Song).

The unlucky Rawnaq (Redoute's Choice – Winning Belle, by Zabeel) flew home late to break up the Fastnet Rock contingent with his third after suffering interference at a vital

stage, which left his jockey Michael Walker most unhappy and the culprit, Nash Rawiller, with a 10-meeting suspension.

Rawnaq's bad luck was of no concern to Fiveandahalfstar's trainer Anthony Cummings, who also bred the staying prospect. Cummings went to the trouble of sending Fiveandahalfstar through the sales ring as part of the Princes Farm draft at the 2011 Inglis Classic Yearling Sale but now has a million-dollar earner on his hands after his charge's brave effort landed him a \$900,000 winner's cheque.

"He has got a fairly bold running style, much like his old man Hotel Grand who was like that," Cummings, who also trained Hotel Grand to win the Group 1 Randwick Guineas (1600m) and Spring Champion Stakes (2000m) in his nine-start career

"We probably never really saw the best of Hotel Grand but he was a really quality racehorse and one of the best I've trained and it's nice to get one of his sons to come here and do the job.

"I bought Hotel Grand's mum for \$33,000 at Easter (Yearling Sale) and she finished up being broodmare of the year with Hotel Grand being a dual Group 1 winner.

"I bought this guy's mother (Cryptic Miss) at a sale up in Scone and she won a maiden up at 2100m and broke down in winning it so it's nice to put it all together and get a Group 1 winner out of it."

### NECHITA DAZZLES IN COOLMORE STUD STAKES

Coolmore Stud got more than its fair share of bang for its sponsorship buck when two daughters of the operation's Australian champion sire Fastnet Rock (Danehill – Piccadilly Circus, by Royal Academy) ran the quinella in the \$1 million event.



Coolmore Stud has sponsored the Group 1 sprint for three-year-olds since 2007, a year after the race known as the Ascot Vale Stakes earned top-flight status.

Nechita's (Fastnet Rock – Artistique, by Peintre Celebre) brilliant acceleration from just off the pace was the difference between her and the runner-up Jolie Bay (Fastnet Rock – Legally Bay, by Snippets)

with the Patinack Farm-owned filly, which cost the organisation \$130,000 at the 2011 Gold Coast Magic Millions sale, prevailing by three-quarters of a length, stopping the clock at 1:0859 - faster than the older horses ran later in the day in the Yellowglen Linlithgow.

"She is by far the fastest horse I've ever had anything to do with," Patinack Farm head trainer John Thompson said. "She just has a scintillating turn of foot off a hot speed.

"I've always thought she is a top line sprinter. She is a good horse going forward and I'm sure she has got plenty more of them (Group 1 wins) in store.

"Hopefully in time when she gets a bit stronger we can ride her quieter and she can get further but she is definitely a top notch sprinter."

Nechita became the second of Fastnet Rock's progeny to have won a Group 1 event down the Flemington 'Straight Six' course after Wanted (Fastnet Rock – Fragmentation, by Snippets) won the 2010 Newmarket Handicap.

### ALCOPOP GETS HOME IN MACKINNON STAKES

Resurgent eight-year-old Alcopop (Jeune – Iota Of Luck, by Blevic) showed he is arguably racing better than ever with his win in the Group 1 Mackinnon Stakes (2000m) at Flemington.

The Cox Plate winner Ocean Park started as a short-priced favourite, however, his recent exertions to win four consecutive Group 1 events left him a touch flat and unable to reproduce his brilliant acceleration in the final sector of the Mackinnon Stakes, which consigned him to third behind Alcopop and Glass Harmonium (Verglas – Spring Symphony, by Darshaan).

Alcopop relished the strong gallop Glass Harmonium set, powering home to record his and trainer Jake Stephens's maiden Group 1 success by a neck.

The gelding's victory was a training triumph for Stephens, who managed to cajole Alcopop back to the form that led him to start as the favourite in the 2010 Melbourne Cup after a string of terrific staying performances.

"The year off because of the injury has helped his lungs recover in that time and I think that has been the difference," Stephens said. "He has freshened well, he's been at his best all week. The horse is just a champion and he has made me as a trainer."

Alcopop became the fifth Group 1 winner sired by Jeune, who died in 2006.

### OAKS BECOMES DEAR FOR CLARRY AND DEMI


Dear Demi (Dehere – Shirley, by Zabeel) denied Cambridge Stud legend Zabeel (Sir Tristram – Lady Giselle, by Nureyev) the highlight of siring his first Group 1 VRC Oaks (2500m) winner but the stallion still played a big part in the result.

Zabeel's Group 2 Wakeful Stakes (2000m) winner Zydeco (Zabeel – All Time High, by Flying Spur) started as a warm favourite after her strong win at Flemington four days earlier but was no match for the

## Darley-homebred streaks home in Patinack Classic

more experienced Dear Demi in the latest edition of the Victorian staying feature.

Dear Demi had little luck when fourth in the Wakeful Stakes after the filly was knocked over in the straight during the Group 1 Thousand Guineas (1600m) at her previous outing with her last-start defeat almost costing jockey Jim Cassidy the ride on the daughter of Dehere (Deputy Minister) after flamboyant owner John Singleton sacked him in favour of Nash Rawiller, who subsequently earned himself a suspension.

Cassidy stuck to the script to ensure there would be no repeat of his dismal Wakeful Stakes ride, positioning the filly at the back of the field in a solidly-run Oaks before improving on Zydeco's back from the 800 metres.

Dear Demi surged home over the top of Zydeco to score emphatically, giving Zabeel his second VRC Oaks success as a damsire after Samantha Miss (Redoute's Choice – Milliyet, by Zabeel) took out the event in 2008.

"She was so strong today," winning trainer Clarry Conners said. "We set her for the race six months ago and this is her seventh run (this campaign) but she is a better horse than what I thought she would be.

"It's her seventh start this prep(aration) and she just keeps getting better.

"She has raced in all the big races and she's had no luck in her last four starts but she keeps trying, she's got a heart as big as anything."

Dear Demi became the second Oaks winner trained by Conners in 2012. The Warwick Farm horseman prepared a filly bred on the same Dehere / Zabeel cross – Invest – to win the Group 1 Australasian Oaks (2000m) at Morphettville.

### TRAILS MAKES CONNECTIONS HAPPY IN EMIRATES

Happy Trails (Good Journey – Madame Flurry, by Perugino) broke through for his maiden success at the top level when he won the Group 1 Emirates Stakes (1600m) at Flemington.

The chestnut narrowly defeated Fawkner (Reset – Dane Belltar, by Danewin) while holding off the challenge of Secret Admirer (Dubawi – Secret Illusion, by Secret Savings).

The Emirates Stakes victory capped a spring in which Happy Trails finally emerged as a high-quality performer. The gelding won the Group 3 Spring Stakes (1200m) and Group 2 Dato Tan Chin Nam Stakes (1600m) with his only unplaced efforts coming over 2000 metres in the Turnbull Stakes as well as the Cox Plate (2040m).

However, his trainer Paul Beshara said the \$11,000 Adelaide Magic Millions purchase had little luck in the Cox Plate before producing

his best form over his favourite 1600-metre distance. "This horse is a really honest horse and he just gives you 150 percent, that's all he does," Beshara said. "He's always there but today is his day and he deserves it.

Beshara said he would spell Happy Trails before setting the five-year-old for the Group 1 Doncaster Mile (1600m) during the Sydney autumn carnival.

### MENTAL LEAVES AUSTRALIA A GROUP 1 WINNER

Lonhro (Octagonal – Shadea, by Straight Strike) four-year-old Mental (Lonhro – Intrigues, by Night Shift) earned a Group 1 success at his final Australian appearance in the Patinack Farm Classic (1200m).

Mental is one of the six horses in the latest batch of Australian thoroughbreds called up from Darley to Sheikh Mohammed's northern hemisphere operation, Godolphin.

Mental produced a terrific first-up performance when a fast-finishing second to Sea Siren (Fastnet Rock – Express A Smile, by Success Express) in the Group 1 Manikato Stakes (1200m) at Moonee Valley before defeating the mare in the Patinack Farm Classic.

Mental sat behind Sea Siren before over-running the triple Group 1 winner late in the race to record his maiden Group 1 victory, becoming the fifth individual winner at the highest level for Lonhro.

Mental's trainer Peter Snowden said the gelding would head to Godolphin next month as one of the best credentialed horses he has sent to race as part of the royal blue army.

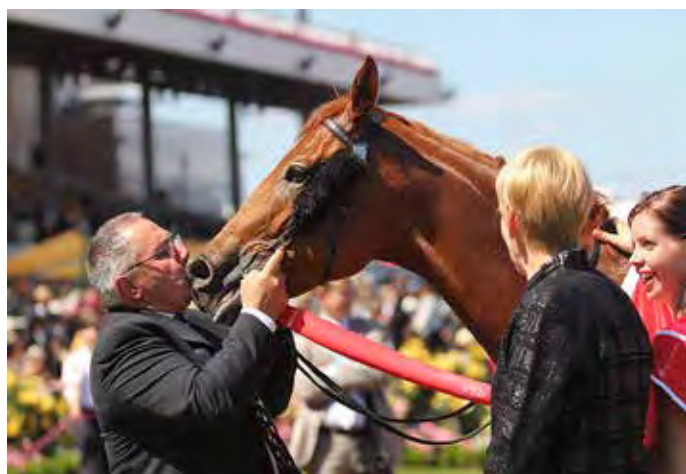


"He'll leave our shores on the 17th of December," Snowden said. "He probably wouldn't have to improve much more to be competitive over there. He is probably the best horse we've sent there and he's going there in the best form. He is still on the way up which is the best thing about him, he still hasn't reached his peak.

"He is just a tougher horse now and he copes with his racing really well. This preparation he has improved out of sight. Straight racing really suited this bloke He could possibly get a mile, but seven furlongs is probably his best trip."

"He is a great horse and it's a pleasure to be a part of his career," Kerrin McEvoy said. "Pete picked this race out because he thought he would be well suited down the straight."

Mental is the second Group 1 winner bred on the Lonhro / Night Shift cross after the combination produced the grand mare Beaded Stakes winners Dysphonia, Parables and Trim are also products of unions between Lonhro and Night Shift mares.



# RESISTANT WINS THE FIRST SUPER VOBIS GOLD RACE

## I'm Too Sexy goes right-handed to win Magic Millions

**Resistant landed his owners the first ever \$20,000 VOBIS Gold bonus when winning the \$80,000 Abbie Fennessy Memorial Plate over 1100m at Caulfield on December 1.**

The Mick Price-trainee started the \$4.40 second favourite behind the odds-on David Hayes-trained favourite I Am Titanium but he made his race experience tell over the debutant.

Racing just off the quarters of I Am Titanium as they approached the turn into the home straight, Craig Newitt asked Resistant for more and the little chestnut found plenty to wear down I Am Titanium in the final 100m and score by a neck, much to the delight of his group of owners, many of whom were on track to welcome their hero back into the winners' circle.

With the VOBIS Gold bonus on top of the first prize money and \$30,000 Super VOBIS bonus already offered on metropolitan two and three-year-old races, Resistant's owners collected \$84,100 in prize money, a little more than the \$80,000 he cost at the Inglis Premier Sale and worth the equivalent of winning a \$140,000 race.

Trainer Mick Price says the VOBIS Gold scheme is a "super" incentive for owners. "It's super, I think the return to the owners is around \$80,000," Price said. "As I said to Luke (Wilkinson) what's the worst that can happen, we train another loser?"

"He's only a little tacker but for him to come to town and win a really good prize money race for some good people it's fantastic."

Wilkinson is Price's racing manager and he explained afterwards that the attractions of the VOBIS Gold scheme were too powerful to ignore. "We were looking to buy the speedier, more precocious types at the Melbourne Sale and we liked this horse as soon as we saw him."

"He is bred and raised by Cathy Hains at her Burnewang North farm so we knew he would have been given the best possible start. Fortunately, thanks to the VOBIS Gold bonus, he has paid for himself already."

"The VOBIS scheme is such a great positive for Victorian racing, it has definitely brought new owners into the game and with the promise of the bigger and better Super VOBIS Gold scheme then owners have never had it so good in Victoria."

"We definitely look to buy horses that are VOBIS qualified and Resistant is further proof of the pudding."

**Victorian filly I'm Too Sexy after her history making win in the \$200,000 Magic Millions Clockwise Classic (1000m) at Ballarat on November 26.**

Sent out as one of the more fancied runners after an impressive clockwise jump out win earlier in the month, I'm Too Sexy cruised home to win the inaugural race by three lengths.

In winning the first clockwise race in Victoria in over 65 years, I'm Too Sexy notched the first win for her sire, the Blue Diamond Stakes winner Reaan.

Trainer Mark Riley said the \$2 million Magic Millions 2YO Classic at the Gold Coast on January 12 was the main mission for the untapped filly.

"We know we have a very good filly," Riley said while basking in the bright sunshine. "Logan McGill got off her one day and said 'you've got a Thousand Guineas filly, put her away, but I said the Magic Millions is there. I think we'll stick to the plan and take her there (to the Gold Coast).'"

"She's got the greatest attitude," Riley added. "She's just a real race-horse."

I'm Too Sexy was purchased by part owner Rob Dunnett for \$30,000 from the draft of Summerset Park Stud at March's Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale. Riley said he would wait and see how the filly pulls up before deciding on her path to the \$2 million feature.

The inaugural running of the Magic Millions Clockwise Classic on Ballarat Cup day was declared a stunning success.

"It's been a tremendous day and the race was a great spectacle," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said. "We couldn't be happier."

"Full credit to the team from the Ballarat Turf Club on their hard work in making the race a reality. We are already looking forward to the second running next year!"

Ballarat Turf Club CEO Lachlan McKenzie was equally as thrilled with the history making race. "The race gained so much press in the lead up and really captured the imagination of racegoers," McKenzie said.

"There was a real buzz around the track and it certainly proved a real highlight on a great day's racing."





## TEAM WILLIAMS ACHIEVE CUP SUCCESS Green Moon streaks away with the Melbourne Cup

**LLOYD WILLIAMS HAS Poured HIS HEART AND HIS SOUL INTO RACING. HE HAS ALSO Poured IN A LOT OF HIS MONEY. EARLIER THIS MONTH HE WAS REWARDED WITH A FOURTH WIN IN THE MELBOURNE CUP, THE RACE HE COVETS ABOVE ALL OTHERS, WITH THE IRISH-BRED GREEN MOON.**

Williams has been racing horses for more than four decades and had previously won the Melbourne Cup with Just A Dash (1981), What A Nuisance (1985), Efficient (2007) and now this year with Green Moon.

As he was when Efficient won in 2007, Williams was at home watching on television at Mount Macedon and left the talking and celebrating to his son Nick.

Green Moon lost favour with punters after his sub-par seventh as favourite in the Cox Plate, but the Williams clan remained true.

"The Cox Plate didn't go to plan," Nick Williams said. "He was sore on the Sunday but he had bounced back by the Monday so we knew we had a horse again.

"This is a victory for the whole team we have at Macedon Lodge.

"My phone cut out as I was talking to (my father) but I know he will be over the moon, pardon the pun," Nick Williams said.

Green Moon was purchased privately by Wil-

liams 18 months ago from his owner/breeder Sir James Goldsmith. A promising first preparation hinted at what was to come and then a place finish in last years Caulfield Cup convinced Williams Snr that Green Moon, a son of Montjeu (Ire), had what it takes to win Australia's most famous race.

"The Melbourne Cup is his dream." Nick Williams says of his father. "He is a great strategist in everything he does and this is the race he wants to win."

Nick says the race has changed so much they now needed to look further afield.

"The Melbourne Cup is not the handicap it used to be," he said. "The day of the Australian and New Zealand bred is gone.

"Horses need weight-for-age form and they need to be among the best we can get from overseas."

And while Williams has now won four Melbourne Cups, one will be enough for Green Moon who is to be campaigned at weight-for-age in the future.

"He will probably go down a different path next year," Williams said the day after his fourth victory.

"We're pretty happy here at home," Williams said. "I'm fiercely Australian, fiercely Melburnian."

Ironically, the recently retired 2007 winner Efficient is still stabled at Macedon Lodge was there to look over Green Moon eating grass from the iconic trophy the day after winning it.

"And no one is asking me to send him to stud just yet. I like racing them."

For those hoping to fulfil a dream and win a Melbourne Cup, a word of warning.

"There's a lot more Melbourne Cups to come," says Lloyd Williams. "It's a bit late in life for me to stop now, it's a disease."

# RACING VICTORIA ANNOUNCES INTEGRITY COMMITMENT

**Racing Victoria (RV) announced a series of enhancements towards the end of November aimed at protecting the integrity of Victoria's racing industry. RV currently invests around \$15 million annually into integrity-related services, including the funding of integrity staff costs and expenses, disciplinary board costs, external legal fees, drug testing and providing raceday camera vision for the stewards.**

The RV Compliance Assurance Team, which oversees investigations, stable raids, bet monitoring and out-of-competition testing, will be boosted with an additional two full-time members.

"Deterrence and detection are the platforms of our integrity program and the additional stewards will ensure an even greater presence in the field," said RV Chief Executive, Bernard Saundry.

"The Compliance Assurance Team did an outstanding job throughout the Spring Racing Carnival conducting 117 stable raids with five of those resulting in stewards' inquiries. Two of these inquiries have been completed and both have brought about successful prosecutions."

RV also announced its intention to strengthen rules relating to the administration of substances on raceday to assist in ensuring all horses are presented for racing free from prohibited substances.

Under the change, expected to take effect early in the New Year, the current prohibition on the raceday stomach tubing of horses will be extended from 24 hours prior to race time to one clear day before raceday. In addition, it will be an offence to administer alkalinising agents in any way during this prohibition period.

"There is no place for raceday administration in the sport and these rule changes will not only serve as a further deterrent to those wishing to breach or push the limits of the rule, it will increase the window for detection by the Stewards."

Saundry also announced that a review of the introduction of minimum penalties for serious offences has commenced and will be finalised by the Australian Racing Board (ARB) in mid-January 2013.

"We are undertaking an extensive review of the introduction of minimum and maximum penalties which would serve as a further deterrent for those considering breaching the rules," he said.

"Key shareholder groups will be consulted, legal advice sought, the range of penalties reviewed and the impacts on our prosecution process considered. The introduction of harsher penalties definitely has merit and will be given very strong consideration."

In making these announcements, Saundry also released an Integrity Information Paper that provides detail around critical integrity issues being addressed by RV and background on the operational aspects of its Integrity Department.

"Racing Victoria's priority when dealing with breaches of the Rules of Racing has never changed, our focus remains. We want anyone who does anything that compromises the integrity of our sport brought to account and penalised."

## CHANGES TO RACING VICTORIA BOARD

The recent Racing Victoria (RV) Annual General Meeting (AGM) marked the conclusion of Rob Hines' four-and-a-half-year term as RV Chief Executive.

New RV Board member Greg Nichols was appointed for a three-year term replacing the retiring Ross Dobinson, whilst Board members Barbara Saunders, Bryan Gurry and David Moodie were returned for three-year terms.

Duffy announced at the AGM that he will relinquish his Chairmanship of the RV Board in March 2013. The former Federal Attorney General has been RV Chairman since December 2007 when he succeeded Graham Duff. Robert Roulston is the current Vice-Chairman.

The AGM also saw the release of RV's financial reports for 2011-12. RV officially recorded a loss of \$9.4 million for 2011-12, however the reporting period was only 11 months in duration and did not account for significant revenue attained in the 12th month.

"Our reporting period moved from the racing season ending 31 July to the traditional financial year ending 30 June to align with our Joint Venture partner Tabcorp so the reported financial position is not truly reflective of the business' position," Hines explained.

"Had we reported on the traditional period we would have in fact recorded a small surplus for 2011-12 due to significant revenues that were received in July and thus could not be accounted for in this term. As a result of this and the benefits now being enjoyed by the industry's new Joint Venture, we expect to record a surplus in the current financial year."

## SPRING CARNIVAL TURNOVER UP

**Tabcorp Holdings Limited has released its 2012 Spring Racing Carnival turnover figures with total wagering turnover up nearly six percent on 2011.**

Racing Victoria's official Spring Racing Carnival period commenced with the Underwood Stakes meeting at Caulfield on Saturday 22 September and concluded with the Ballarat Cup meeting on Sunday 25 November.

Total NSW and Victorian TAB totalisator and fixed odds turnover on all thoroughbred, harness and greyhound racing across the 65 day period was \$2.103 billion, up 5.9% on the prior corresponding period.

The figure does not include turnover from Tabcorp's Luxbet, fixed odds sport and Trackside products. "Tabcorp's positive Spring Racing Carnival commercial and operational performance shows that our investments in products, customer service and technology are being well received. The racing industry staged quality racing and our customers responded," said Tabcorp Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer, David Attenborough.

"As well as growth on each of the feature Spring Racing Carnival days, we experienced very good turnover growth across the standard weekday racing product, which was up 7.5% on the prior corresponding period."
