Jack Miller has been racing motorbikes and winning since he was eight years old. He started on dirt, and was the Australian Dirt Bike champion in the 65cc category in 2003. He tasted success early in life, and seems to have developed an appetite for winning.

Jack grew up on a property outside Townsville, Queensland. A tropical city where he made his own fun, riding his motorbike & quadbike, water skiing and lending a hand with fencing and cattle mustering.

His parents and siblings have supported his racing career every step of the way, and now, as he joins the Moto3 Grand Prix category, Jack's mum Sonya will be on the road with him as his Manager, leaving the rest of the family to manage the property, and the successful family business.



As he entered his teenage years, Jack kept winning. He made the move from the dirt to the road, and hasn't looked back. He's broken track records set by other Australian legends of the sport in the process, and the trophy cabinet in his parent's house is laden with silverware.

Now, having just turned 17, Jack is facing his biggest challenge yet. A global challenge. He'll be representing his country, his state, his hometown, his family, his team, and perhaps you, his sponsors, as he races around the globe. 18 rounds in 14 countries. Including a home race at Phillip Island. 2012 is going to be a big year for Jack Miller.

2011 was his breakout year in Europe. A string of strong performances saw him ride out with the championship in the German IDM 125cc category, his results in both Germany and Spain won the attention of Caretta Technology's Forward Racing, an Italian race team who signed Jack to a two-year deal to ride in the Moto3 division. With an age cap at 28, this new 250cc category is designed to sort out the best and brightest up and comers.

Jack has the drive and passion to be the best in the world at what he does. And what he does is ride motorbikes fast, with precision and style that has experts in the world of motorcycling comparing him to former and current Australian MotoGP champions.

Jack is seizing this opportunity with both hands, making the most of time around the smartest and most experienced minds in the business, and taking every chance to train, learn, and plan as he works towards his goals of on track success.
