



Obama's Legacy Is on the Line

With three pivotal issues, president will be tested this week

Washington

President Barack Obama's secondterm agenda will be robustly tested this week, with gun control and immigration in the spotlight on Capitol Hill and the White House releasing his long-delayed budget blueprint. In a taste of what lies ahead, Democratic gun legislation arrived on the Senate floor Monday — facing an aggressive Republican effort to block it.

In an era of deep partisanship, Obama knows he won't get everything he wants on the three big issues as he seeks to capitalize on the national support that brought him re-election. But the scope of his victories or defeats on these issues will at least in part define his legacy and determine how much political capital he retains for his final years in office.

"This is his best chance to set up the next 3½ years where he's the pace car," said Sara Taylor Fagen,

"I think it would be very tough to put another item on the agenda on his own terms."

who served as political director for President George W. Bush.

But much of what happens during this pivotal period is out of the president's direct control. Members of Congress will largely determine whether his proposals to deal with gun ownership, revamp broken immigration laws and reduce the federal budget deficit gain traction.

Lawmakers, back in Washington after a two-week recess, are expect-

ed to take significant steps on some of the issues this week. A bipartisan group of senators could unveil highly anticipated immigration legislation by the end of the week. And Democrats brought a gun-control bill to the Senate floor Monday afternoon amid a threat from conservative Republicans to use delaying tactics to prevent formal debate from even beginning.

Obama himself flew to Connecticut for a new gun-control speech, and he was bringing relatives of Newtown, Conn., shooting victims back to D.C. on Air Force One to lobby members of Congress.

In the midst of all that, Obama will release his 2014 budget, which already is drawing opposition from both parties ahead of its Wednesday publication.

Obama's advisers know the window for broad legislative victories is narrower for a second-term president. Political posturing is already underway for the 2014 midterm elections, which will consume Congress next year. And once those votes for a new Congress are cast, Washington's attention turns to the race to succeed Obama. Julie PACE (AP)





Pit Collapse Kills 2 Cousins in N.C.

Police: Dirt fell in on kids as they played, trapping them in hole

Stanley, N.C.

Rescuers on Monday recovered the bodies of two young cousins buried when a wall of dirt fell on them while they were playing in a hole at a home construction site in North Carolina.

The bodies of 6-year-old Chloe Jade Arwood and 7-year-old James Levi Caldwell were pulled from a 24-foot-deep pit in the town of Stanley, outside of Charlotte.

"We've been working a horrific scene here," Lincoln County Emergency Services spokesman Dion Burleson said. Authorities also confiscated a marijuana plant and firearms from the property Monday.

Crews had been searching for the children since Sunday afternoon, when the girl's father, Jordan Arwood, called 911 to report the collapse. Officials were on the scene within minutes but couldn't get to the children.

The father had been digging with a backhoe earlier in the day, Sheriff David Carpenter said. He would not say what was being built or whether Arwood was doing it alone or had professional help. He added that authorities didn't know of any permits that had been issued.

Burleson described the pit as 20 feet by 20 feet with a sloped entrance leading down to the 24-foot bottom. The children were at the bottom of the pit retrieving a child-sized pickax when the walls fell in on them, Carpenter said.

Carpenter later said deputies had not yet interviewed the family living in the home but planned to follow up on neighbors' reports that Arwood was excavating the pit to build some sort of a bunker.

"They were so distraught we hope to be able to talk to them today and come up with some information," Carpenter said Monday. "It's a very large hole. ... We're going to find out exactly what his intentions were." MITCH WEISS (AP)

White Noise Plagues Hospitals

Tuning out excessive monitor 'beeps' can be fatal, report says

Chicago

Constantly beeping alarms from devices that monitor the vital signs of the critically ill have "desensitized" hospital workers who sometimes ignore the noise, leading to at least two dozen deaths a year on average, a hospital accrediting group said Monday.

And these cases are probably vastly underreported, said the Joint Commission in an alert to hospitals calling attention to the problem.

The beeping devices include

Number of Deaths

The Joint Commission's estimate of possible deaths related to the problem is considerably lower than the reports it found in a U.S. Food and Drug Administration database. The FDA lists more than 500 deaths potentially linked with hospital alarms between January 2005 and June 2010. The commission's database reports 80 deaths and 13 severe injuries between January 2009 and June 2012. Hospitals voluntarily report these to the commission, which determine whether there was a connection to the device, said Dr. Ana McKee, the commission's executive vice president and chief medical officer. (AP)

those that measure blood pressure and heart rate among other things. Some beep when there's an emergency, and some beep when they're not working. That can lead to noise fatigue, and the delay in treating a patient can endanger lives, the accreditation commission says.

The commission said hospital leaders need to address the problem and train staffers in safe alarm management.

"With the proliferation of technology, alarms and a lack of standardization," it's more challenging for doctors and nurses to respond adequately, said Dr. Ana McKee, the commission's executive vice president and chief medical officer, LINDSEY TANNER (AP)

An Ironclad Legacy

Love her or loathe her, one thing is beyond dispute: Margaret Thatcher transformed Britain.

The Iron Lady, who ruled Britain for 11 years, imposed her will on a fractious, rundown nation — breaking the unions, triumphing in a far-off war over the Falklands Islands in 1982 and selling off state industries at a record pace. She left behind a leaner government and more prosperous nation by the time a political mutiny ousted her.

Thatcher's spokesman, Tim Bell, said the former prime minister, 87, died from a stroke Monday morning at the Ritz hotel in London.

For admirers, Thatcher was a savior who rescued Britain from ruin and laid the groundwork for an extraordinary economic renaissance. For critics, she was a tyrant who ushered in an era of greed that kicked the weak out onto the streets and let the rich become filthy rich.

"Let us not kid ourselves. She

The Rise and Fall of Thatcher

Margaret Hilda Roberts was born on Oct. 13, 1925. She was said to have learned the values of thrift, discipline and industry as the daughter of a grocer and Methodist lay preacher. Her personality was shaped in part by World War II: Her hometown was an early target for Luftwaffe bombs, and her belief in standing up to aggressors was rooted in Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain's attempt to appease Adolf Hitler. She married Denis Thatcher in 1951 and won election to Parliament in 1959. She joined the Cabinet as education secretary in 1970 and was elected prime minister in 1979. She may have become overconfident after winning a third term in 1987, imposing a controversial "community charge" tax to move Britain away from a property tax. It led to riots in 1990 that helped persuade her party to oust her. In 1992, she was appointed in the House of Lords. She suffered from dementia in her final years. (AP)

Car Bomb Kills 15 in Damascus

Damascus, Syria

A suicide bomber detonated a car packed with explosives in a busy residential and financial district of central Damascus on Monday, killing at least 15 people, setting cars and buildings on fire and sending plumes of black smoke rising in the capital, Syrian state-run media said.

The blast near Sabaa Bahrat Square was described by staterun Syrian TV as a terrorist suicide bombing. The Syrian central bank, a mosque, a school, the Finance Ministry and a state-run investment agency are nearby.

The explosion also wounded 146 people, according to the state-run SANA news agency.

Prime Minister Wael al-Halqi, visiting the scene, said the blast targeted the Syrian economy.



Brash N. Korea to Freeze Factory

Seoul, S. Korea

North Korea said Monday it will suspend operations at a factory complex it has jointly run with South Korea, pulling out more than 53,000 North Korean workers and moving closer to severing its last economic link with its rival as tensions escalate.



100 Stuck for an Hour on Red Line

Metro: Brake problem caused riders to be delayed early Sunday

Washington

About 100 passengers were stuck aboard a Red Line train for more than an hour early Sunday, Metro officials said.

The incident began after a train had a brake problem outside the Tenleytown-AU stop at around 12:20 a.m. and the train operator could not fix it. A rescue train was sent to move the broken train, but customers had to sit on the train for 80 minutes before they were

led off through the rescue train, Metro officials said.

Dan Stessel, a Metro spokesman, said Metro Transit police and rail supervisors boarded the train to make sure passengers were OK. He said there were fewer than 100 passengers on board the train.

The incident came after the transit agency had another issue Saturday. A train derailed on the Red Line just as it was leaving the Brentwood rail yard. No one was reported injured, officials said.

Metro officials were quick to point out that the incidents happened at a busy time for Metro with the spring tourist season in full swing. Metro said it carried 503,400

"If you were on that train you had every right to be frustrated and expect more from us," Stessel said Monday morning of Sunday's incident. "It was an unfortunate delay, and we are very sorry for it. But that said, the rest of the day went very smoothly."

Metro has received harsh criticism for not better communicating with passengers in crisis when trains have become stranded. In January, hundreds of passengers got off a stranded train in a tunnel near Anacostia after the train lost power.

Pot Bill Gets Green Light

Md. governor likely to sign medical marijuana measure

Annapolis, Md.

The Maryland General Assembly on Monday approved allowing medical marijuana programs at research centers.

The Senate gave the measure a final bipartisan 42-4 vote. Ten of the Senate's 12 Republicans joined 32 Democrats, while two Democrats and two Republicans voted against it, sending it to Gov. Martin O'Malley, who indicated he is likely to sign the bill.

"I'd like to read it first, but I probably would," O'Malley said.

The Democratic governor noted that his decision would hinge on whether the bill includes provisions enabling the governor to suspend the program if the federal government decides to prosecute

it. The provisions were included in the bill earlier this session, after Maryland Department of Health and Men-

tal Hygiene Joshua Sharfstein said he would support the bill with the amendments.

"As states start pushing the envelope on this thing, the federal government has to recognize that some of these cancer patients — some of these people that are very sick — you know, they're not doing this because they want to," said Sen. David Brinkley, a Frederick County Republican.

Delegate Dan Morhaim, a Baltimore County Democrat and emergency room physician, has been pushing to get the bill through for years. He emphasized that the program would be carefully supervised by academic medical centers.

While state analysts have projected that programs would not be up and running until 2016, Morhaim said he thinks there will be "much quicker movement than people may have anticipated.'

Sen. E.J. Pipkin, R-Cecil, said he voted against the bill because he believes a comprehensive proposal on the legalization of marijuana for a variety of purposes should be put before voters, instead of creating piecemeal legislation.

The measure would create a commission within the state health department to oversee programs.

Teen Fatally Shot in Southeast

Washington

His mother wanted to get him out of Woodland Terrace, to send the 16-year-old south to North Carolina to live with his brother who is in college.

But Darius Cannon had a girlfriend, and on Saturday, the Anacostia High School student walked three blocks to her house. He was shot and killed on his way home at about 12:30 Sunday morning, his abdomen pierced by a single bullet in the 2700 block of Langston Place, just off Alabama Avenue. Cannon — the youngest of 14 children — was the first juvenile under the age of 18, with the exception of infants, to be killed in D.C. in at least 16 months. There were none in all of 2012, which concluded with the fewest number of killings in the city in a half century. By comparison, six teenaged students were killed in neighboring Prince George's County in a sixmonth span that ended in February.

D.C. police said they know of no suspects in Cannon's death, though privately they say they are looking at gang members, possibly linked "I wanted to get him out of here ... I didn't move fast enough."



Advocates for Homeless Win Suit

Washington

Legal advocates are hoping that a recent federal judge's decision in a 25-year-old lawsuit against the federal government could lead to thousands more unused federal buildings being converted into service centers for the homeless.

A March 21 decision by the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia found that many government agencies have been inaccurately reporting their number of unused federal properties in violation of Title V of the McKinney-Vento Act, which requires federal agencies to list unused, surplus or underutilized properties in the Federal Register and reach out to homeless services provid-

ers that can apply to lease them at no charge.

One of the greatest costs to running homeless services is real estate, and the law is meant to allow nonprofits to gain access to buildings they may not be able to afford on the open market.

"We expect we're going to ... have access to buildings that were unbeknownst to us before," said Tristia Bauman, an attorney at the National Law Center for Homelessness and Poverty, a D.C. legal nonprofit that filed the lawsuit.

Nearly 500 properties in 30 states and D.C. have been obtained through Title V and now house homeless services, including the largest shelter in the District.

As more channel surfers turn to Web browsers, can broadcasters lure viewers back to traditional TV?





A Remote Possibility

Los Angeles

Some people have had it with TV. They've had enough of the 100-plus channel universe. They don't like timing their lives around network show schedules. They're tired of \$100-plus monthly bills.

A growing number of them have stopped paying for cable and satellite TV service and don't even use an antenna to get free signals over the air. These people are watching shows and movies on the Internet, sometimes via cellphone. Last month, the Nielsen Co. started labeling people in this group "Zero TV" households, because they fall outside the traditional definition of a TV home. There are 5 million of these residences in the U.S., up from 2 million in 2007.

Winning back the Zero TV crowd will be one of the issues broadcasters discuss at their national meeting, the NAB Show,

this week in Las Vegas.

While show creators and networks make money from this group's viewing habits through deals with online video providers and from advertising on their own websites and apps, broadcasters only get paid when they relay such programming in traditional ways. Unless broadcasters can adapt to modern platforms, their revenue from Zero TV viewers will be zero.

"Getting broadcast programing on all the gizmos and gadgets — like tablets, the backseats of cars and laptops — is hugely important," says Dennis Wharton, a spokesman for the National Association of Broadcasters.

Although Wharton says more than 130 TV stations in the U.S. are broadcasting live TV signals to mobile devices, few people have the tools to receive them.

For the first time, TV ratings giant Nielsen took a close look at this category of viewer in its quarterly video report released in March, and the study suggests that the Zero TV group may have

Who Are They?

The TV industry has a host of buzzwords to describe non-traditionalist viewers:

"Cord-cutters"

People who stop paying for TV completely and make do with online video and sometimes an antenna.

"Cord-shavers"

Those who reduce the number of channels they subscribe to, or the number of rooms pay-TV is in, to save money.

"Cord-nevers"

Young people who move out on their own and never set up a landline phone connection or a TV subscription. They usually make do with an Internet connection, a computer, a cellphone and possibly a TV set that is not hooked up the traditional way. (AP)

left traditional TV for good. While three-quarters have a physical TV set, only 18 percent are interested in a traditional TV subscription.

Part of Nielsen's new monitoring is meant to help determine whether Zero TVers — who tend to be younger, single and without children — will change their behavior over time, says Dounia Turrill, Nielsen's senior vice president of insights.

For most of the past 10 years, Cynthia Phelps, 43, has done without traditional TV, and she says nothing will bring her back.

She watches programs online for free and gets together with friends to watch older TV shows on DVD occasionally.

"I feel absolutely no social pres-

sure to keep up with the Joneses in that respect," she says.

It's less about saving money than choice: She says she'd rather spend her time productively.

And then there's James Weitze, 31, a truck driver who satisfies his video fix with an iPhone and Netflix.

He's not opposed to TV per se, and misses some ESPN sports programs, but he's so divorced from traditional TV, it could be hard to go back. It's become easier for him to navigate his smartphone than to figure out how to use a TV and remote control.

"I try to go over to my grandma's place and teach her how to do it," he says. "I can't even figure it out myself." RYAN NAKASHIMA (AP)



Oates provided updates on Laich and Erat before Sunday's game. Laich is scheduled to see renowned groin specialist Michael Brunt, who performed sports hernia surgeries on both Ward and Mike Green last season, Tuesday in Washington. Laich will miss Tuesday's game against the Canadiens.

"They can't quite get a handle on what it is," Oates said. "He just doesn't feel good."

As for Erat, Oates said the 31-year-old "felt way better than he anticipated" and shouldn't miss considerable time.

Either way, the Capitals, winners of four straight and eight of their past 10 games, feel as if they can counteract their recent injury woes simply by sticking to the system.

UConn's Auriemma Looks for 8th Title

Upstart Louisville trying to hand coach 1st NCAA final loss

Geno Auriemma has never lost an NCAA championship game.

Of course, his UConn Huskies haven't had to face a team like upstart Louisville, which is making an unprecedented run through the women's tournament. A victory tonight in New Orleans over the Cardinals would be UConn's eighth title, matching them with Tennessee for the most ever in women's basketball.



Auriemma didn't want to think about the outcome.

"Talking about things that haven't happened yet is never a good idea," Auriemma said.

History is on the Hall of Fame coach's side: UConn is 7-0 in title games, including a victory in the 2009 game against Louisville and the 2004 game that was also played in New Orleans. That game was the college finale of Diana Taurasi, who finished with three straight championships.

This trip to the Big Easy could be the beginning of a new dynasty for the Huskies led by Breanna Stewart. The heralded freshman has been on one of the most remarkable runs of any first-year player in the history of the NCAA tournament. She had a season-high 29 points in the semifinal victory over Notre Dame and was honored as the most outstanding player of the Bridgeport Regional.

Auriemma said he couldn't remember a player having a better game in such a setting.

Stewart already has scored 82 points in the NCAA tournament in just four games. The Syracuse, N.Y., native sat out the opening-

Different Stances On NL Having DH

Nats' Johnson prefers pitchers to continue to hit in his league

Nationals

Jordan Zimmermann was looking to recreate fellow starter Gio Gonzalez's success, though not with his pitching prowess.

In a 3-0 win over the Miami Marlins last week, Gonzalez hit a home run. Zimmermann wanted to answer with a solid swing of his own. Unfortunately for Zimmermann, he struck out twice during Washington's 6-1 win that night.







"I tried to hit a home run to match Gio," Zimmermann said.

The day could come when neither pitcher gets a chance at the plate. Now-daily interleague play has reignited the debate over whether the National League should institute the designated-hitter rule, which the American League adopted in 1973.

Chicago Cubs president Theo Epstein recently told USA Today the AL has a "big advantage" over NL teams during interleague play and the World Series. He said he hopes the NL jumps on board with a DH.

Despite the offensive advantages a designated hitter brings, Nationals manager Davey Johnson is opposed to it.

"Baseball is a game of strategy," Johnson said. "With the pitcher in the lineup, it's also self-policing. I like the offense you can throw out there with the DH, but it's more challenging to manage."

The Nats host the Chicago White Sox this week, with the AL club having to adapt to NL rules. This means pitchers will hit with Johnson expecting White Sox designated hitter Adam Dunn to play first base.

Nationals pitcher Dan Haren is in his sixth season with an NL club, but he's played the other half of his career in the AL.

"I prefer the National League game," Haren said. "I think there's more strategy. With pitching around the pitcher, substitutions, double switches — I just think it keeps everyone on their toes, all 25 guys, really. I favor that."

Haren acknowledged there could be 15 players with jobs on the line if the reverse happened and the AL eliminated the designated hitter. Even so, Haren prefers having pitchers hit.

"It keeps you in the game," he said. "You always have to be aware of when you're coming up to bat with what the situation calls for, whether it be a bunt or something else." JASON BUTT (FOR EXPRESS)

This Mother Knows Best

Jillian Michaels doesn't believe in doing things halfway. That's true not just for exercise — she's best known as the toughest trainer on NBC's "The Biggest Loser" — but also for motherhood. Last year, her partner, Heidi Rhoades, gave birth to a son the same month the couple adopted a 2-year-old girl from Haiti. So, naturally, Michaels can't quit at only one speaking engagement. Instead, she's taken on a 35-city "Maximize Your Life" tour, which arrives at D.C.'s Warner Theater at 8 p.m. April 24 (\$58-\$170, Jillianmichaels.com).

It sounds like you're going to train the whole world on this tour.

I'm going to try. My goal with this is a selfish one. I enjoy that direct connection. With 35 stops, I can see 70,000 people. When you think about how many books you can sell and how many people see a TV show, it doesn't compare. But this way I cut out the middleman. No one is editing me. I'm the one putting them through exercises and taking them on a journey.

The name of the tour is "Maximize Your Life," not "Minimize Your Weight," so what's the focus here?

You're of course going to understand the science of weight loss. But it doesn't take me long to convey that. To me, health is about having a healthier life. This is an entry point for them to attack inhibitions, empower them to redefine how they see themselves, unleash their potential. People say, "You just need to think positive." That's not true. are skills people need to use. It's learning recovery behaviors that are affirming and not destructive, how to build a road map to success. It's learning how to get feedback, correct what's broken, create self

awareness, enhance willpower. There's a lot to know. Action without information is a wrecking ball in your life.

What's your life going to be like with your family on a two-month bus tour? And how are you going to exercise?

Two small children on a tour bus for hours and hours at a time — I feel like Chevy Chase in a remake. It's going to be the ultimate road trip. And the way I train doesn't require any equipment.

I can do it nearly anywhere with a 6-by-6 open space. I'll bring my road bike, so I can go for a ride.

Are there any exercises you always do in a workout?

It's more about techniques. It's free weights and body weight based, with a lot of combination lifts. I do high-intensity cardio intervals to condition my body as effectively as possible. Really, it's just maintenance for me. I'm lucky to be in maintenance mode. Could I lose weight under these conditions? Yes, but it'd be hard.


You've said motherhood has made it tougher to exercise, but is anything about it making it easier — like, you can lift them instead of weights?

Motherhood has made nothing easier. Lifting them has thrown my hips off and messed up my shoulder. Easier is not a word I'd ever use. But it's the best thing I've accomplished.



Moves: BodyShred takes familiar exercises and adds a twist. So you're not just doing jumping jacks, you're also squatting to touch the ground between reps. You're in Warrior III while doing lateral raises. You're doing burpees with the extra step of hopping your legs from side to side.

Victor Quintanilla, 27, who's struggling with a weight-loss plateau, appreciated the chance to try something new, such as "dancing crab" (in a crab-walk position, kick your legs up and down). It's a fun one, Haire agreed, noting that it works the legs, core and triceps.



For a light bite, try the simple seaweed salad, with sesame oil and a hint of heat (\$5), or the dainty smoked sockeye salmon tea sandwich with sliced cucumber and an avocado aioli on wholewheat bread (\$7).

The best way to finish a meal? Sign up for a soak (\$19-\$23).



Sound Bets



Deep Purple

Prince was the first rock star I ever loved. I was 6, and 1984's "Purple Rain" had just come out. He was like Jimi Hendrix, except alive and my height.

Prince has always been tricky. He had R-rated songs ("Darling Nikki" left me with lots of questions I never, ever



asked). But he had parent-approvable songs, too. My favorite, still, is "Let's Go Crazy." "Are we gonna let the elevator bring us down?/ Oh, no! Let's go!" Whenever I hear that pop gem, I

am uplifted, like I'm in the glam church scene that opens the song.

A couple of Fridays ago, Prince showed up on "Late Night with Jimmy Fallon," along with all-female backing band 3rd Eye Girl. (He's historically had female backing musicians.) They played such a heavy-duty version of "Let's Go Crazy" that it was no longer a pop song at all. It was like Mountain had leaped into their bodies for a dirty, psychedelic dirge, and I loved it.

You can only get these new songs through 3rd Eye Girl's website, not iTunes. The Purple One also refuses to confirm anything about a new record or a song on "The Great Gatsby" soundtrack. Eccentric as ever, he'll just keep dropping songs unannounced until he's playing metal with Ozzy.

Mika worries that melody comes too easily for him. The 29-year-old Lebanese singer can write pop choruses as catchy as anything performed by his heroes Elton John, the Bee Gees, Michael Jackson and Queen. And though Mika has never scored a top-50 pop single in the United States, he's a huge star in Europe, with four top-10 singles in France, five in England and six in Italy.

The tall, slender songwriter is apprehensive nonetheless. Mika (nee Michael Holbrook Penniman Jr.) knows that pop hooks are like sugar — if the doses aren't just right, they can easily go from tasty to cloying. On his latest album, last year's "The Origin of Love," he deliberately tries to balance the sweet with the sour.

"How can you get away with a love song nowadays?" says Mika, who comes to Sixth and I Historic Synagogue in D.C. on Wednesday. "You're saying the same thing as Lionel Richie's 'Hello,' and if you're not careful, it will become the same thing, and that won't work in 2013.

"It's all about tempering melody, about not letting the chords or the lyrics follow the melody too closely," he adds. "You need that tension. It's all about teasing without satisfying too quickly, and when you do satisfy, you want to go back to

the teasing right away."

All three of Mika's albums are filled with tracks that play with that formula: love songs with a confectionary frosting and a tart filling, an infectious first impression and a subversive aftertaste. An especially sophisticated example is his latest album's title track, which pursues the equation of love and an addictive drug to its most disturbing implications. But these ideas are hidden within a pop production so contagious that you're drawn in before you realize what's going on.

"It's a spin on a love song," Mika says, "but it includes as much that's ugly as happy. ... The song talks about my life, [but] it's just a pop song. It's all about a melody, a rhythm that pops out at you before you notice all these other things."

Experimental British singer James Blake expands his sound on the new 'Overgrown'

Album Review

If James Blake didn't convince you of his talent on his debut album, his sophomore release, "Overgrown," should do the trick. And if you've never heard of Blake, now's the time to tune in.

The London-born singer-songwriter-producer returns with an album that shines a light on his 2011 self-titled dubstep debut.

The soulful "Retrograde" is as much fragile as it is powerful. It's the ultimate chill-out tune filled with a feeling that does exactly what the song says: "Ignore everybody else, we're alone now," he sings with a hint of refined auto-tune.

The new material reflects and focuses on Blake's growth in confidence and songwriting, and his approach is audacious. He spent time with rapper Kanye West and

Annette Funicello, 'Mickey Mouse Club' star, dies at age 70

Obituary

Annette Funicello, who became a child star as a perky, cute-as-abutton Mouseketeer on "The Mickey Mouse Club" in the 1950s, then teamed up with Frankie Avalon in a string of '60s fun-in-the-sun movies with such titles as "Beach Blanket Bingo" and "Bikini Beach," died Monday. She was 70.

She died in Bakersfield, Calif., of complications from multiple sclerosis, the Walt Disney Co. said. Avalon said Monday that Funicello never realized how beloved she was.

"She would say, 'Really?'" he said. "She was so bashful about it. She was an amazing girl."

The pretty, dark-haired Funicello was just 13 when she gained fame on TV's "The Mickey Mouse Club," a late-afternoon variety show for kids that combined stories, songs and dance routines and ran from 1955 to 1959.

Her devotion to Walt Disney remained throughout her life.

"He was the dearest, kindest person and truly was like a second father to me," she once said. "He was a kid at heart." FRAZIER MOORE (AP)






