Aberdeen Drive

Aberdeen Drive was part of a Scenerama Estate Pty Ltd Subdivision in 1989. Aberdeen is a town in Scotland. From the LMCC street name list.

Agincourt Crescent

Agincourt Crescent was an R W Sheargold Pty Ltd development, 1994. Agincourt was a famous medieval battle.

Albert Street

Albert Street was surveyed by Bannister & Hunter and developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd 1962. Named after Albert Frederick Toll, the founder of A.F. Toll Pty Ltd, who had been a landowner in Valentine.

Allambee Place

Allambee is an Aboriginal word meaning 'wait a while, recline' (Source: "Aboriginal Words of Australia" by AH & AW Reed). Part of A R Minter & E P Simpsons land grant subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916. The shopping centre is here.

Andrew Road

Andrew Road was surveyed by Bannister & Hunter and developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd 1962. Named after Andrew, a member of the Toll family. A.F. Toll Pty Ltd had been landowners here.

Angaphora Way

Angaphora Way was a McCloy Group development in 2002. Angaphora are a species of eucalypt.

Arbutus Street

Arbutus Street was a McCloy Group development in 2001. Arbutus is a family of exotic trees called strawberry trees. There is also a native arbutus shrub.

Arundel Place

Arundel Place was developed by R W Sheargold Pty Ltd in 1992. Arundel Castle in the UK is a famous landmark.

Baron Close

Baron Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1991.

Berringar Road

Berringar is an Aboriginal word meaning 'sunset' (Source: "Aboriginal Words of Australia" by AH & AW Reed) part of the Valentine Estate and subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916.

Buckingham Street

Buckingham Street was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1989. Buckingham Palace is a famous London landmark.

Camelot Close

Camelot Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1994. The court of legendary King Arthur was at Camelot.

Captains Cove

Captains Cove was a McCloy Group development in 2002. A maritime street name.

Cavalier Crescent

Cavalier Crescent was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1993. A cavalier was a 17th century royalist.

Cedrus Close

Cedrus Close was named by McCloy Developments Pty Ltd, 2001. Cedrus are a family of exotic cedar trees.

Christopher Avenue

Christopher Avenue was surveyed by Bannister & Hunter and developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd 1961. Named after Christopher, a member of the Toll family. A.F. Toll Pty Ltd had been landowners here.

Cockatoo Court

Cockatoo Court was a McCloy Developments Pty Ltd subdivision, 1996.

Connaught Road

Connaught Road was an R W Sheargold development, 1992. Connaught was a medieval Irish kingdom; a town of that name remains today.

Croudace Bay Road

Croudace Bay road was named after the early settlers, the Croudace family. Croudace Bay Road is Part of Main Road 527. This was an early Government Road connecting settlements.

Crusade Close

Crusade Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1991. A crusade was a medieval Christian military expedition.

Dillwynia Close

Dillwynia Close was named by McCloy Developments Pty Ltd, 2001. Dillwynia is a native shrub, commonly called the 'eggs and bacon' plant.

Dilkera Avenue

Dilkera is an Aboriginal word meaning 'edge or shore' (Source: "Aboriginal Words of Australia" by AH & AW Reed) part of the Valentine Estate and subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916.

Edinburgh Close

Edinburgh close was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1977. Edinburgh is a town in Scotland. From the LMMC street name list.

Excalibur Parade

Excalibur Parade was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1993. Excalibur was the legendary sword of King Arthur.

Frederick Street

Frederick Street was surveyed by Bannister & Hunter and developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd 1962. Named after Frederick, a member of the Toll family. A.F. Toll Pty Ltd had been landowners here.

Galahad Street

Galahad Street was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1990. Galahad was a knight from King Arthur's legendary round table.

Gentry Close

Gentry Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1994.

Grosvenor Place

Grosvenor Place was a Scenerama Estate Pty Ltd subdivision, 1989. Grosvenor Place is a London landmark.

Halberd Close

Halberd Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1997. A halberd was a medieval weapon.

Hambelton Court

Hambelton Court was a Scenerama Estate Pty Ltd subdivision, 1989. Hambelton is a town in the UK.

Helmsdale Drive

Helmsdale Drive was a Fairfax Land & Investment Pty Ltd project, 1977. Taken from the LMCC town name list, Helmsdale is a town in Scotland.

Jackson Lane

Jackson Lane was an unnamed lane until named by council on 1/5/1998 after J Jackson and R Jackson of Marks Point from a list of the Lake Macquarie WW2 veterans.

Japonica Place

Japonica Close was a McCloy Group development in 2002. Japonica is plant species that include camellia, quince, etc.

Keira Close

Keira Close was built in 1962. An Aboriginal word variously interpreted as 'wild turkey, big lagoon, and high mountain' (Source: "The Australian Museum" by F.D. McCarthy).

Kensington Close

Kensington Close was an R W Sheargold development in 1994. Kensington Palace and Gardens are London landmarks.

Kenton Crescent

Kenton Crescent was a Fairfax Land & Investment Pty Ltd project, 1975. Kenton is a town in the U.K. from a Lake Macquarie Shire street name list.

Keswick Grove

Keswick Grove was a Fairfax Land & Investment Pty Ltd project, 1975. Keswick is a town in the UK.

Krambruk Road

Kambruk is an Aboriginal word meaning 'landing place' (Source: "Aboriginal Words of Australia" by AH & AW Reed) part of the Valentine Estate and subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916.

Laurina Cove

Laurina Cove was a McCloy Developments subdivision, 2001. Laurina is a native tree.

Leichhardt Road

Leichhardt Road was a McCloy Developments subdivision, 1995. Named after the explorer Ludwig Leichhardt. Connected to Ludwig Court.

Lindsay Avenue

Lindsay Avenue was developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd, 1968. They usually chose first names for their subdivisions.

Linnekar Close

Linnekar Close was named after Gary Linekar, an English soccer player. Originally part of Connaught Road. Re-named by LMCC on 23 October 1992.

Lloyd Court

Lloyd Court was developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd, 1968. They usually chose first names for their subdivision.

Ludwig Court

Ludwig Court was a McCloy Developments subdivision, 1995. Named after the explorer Ludwig Leichhardt. Connected to Leichhardt Road.

Lurnea Cove

Lurnea is an Aboriginal word meaning 'resting place' (Source: "Australian Aboriginal Words" by Rex Ingamells) part of the Valentine Estate and subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916. There is a town in NSW named Lurnea.

Marquis Close

Marquis Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1993.

Merlin Close

Merlin Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1991. Merlin was a legendary magician in King Arthur's time.

Michael Crescent

Michael Crescent was a Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd subdivision, 1963.

Minter Street

Minter Street was named after Alexander Robert Minter. He received a land grant in 1869. Minter Street is a companion street with Simpson Street.

Monarch Crescent

Monarch Crescent was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1989.

Moola Avenue

Moola is an Aboriginal word meaning 'shady place' (Source "Australian Aboriginal Words & Place Names" by S.J. Endacott). A Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd subdivision, 1967.

Morinda Court

Morinda Court was a McCloy Developments Pty Ltd subdivision, 2001. Morinda is a native flowering vine.

Mountbatten Place

Mountbatten Place was an R W Sheargold Pty Ltd development, 1993. Lord Mountbatten was a WW2 naval officer and statesman.

Myuna Road

Myuna is an Awabakal word meaning 'clear water' (Source: "Newcastle Herald" 11 May 1993). Subdivided by Henry F Halloran, 1916.

Pandorea Way

Pandorea Way was a McCloy Developments Pty Ltd subdivision, 2001. Pandorea is a native flowering vine.

Paris Crescent

Paris Crescent was developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd, 1962. They usually chose first names for their subdivisions.

Peter Street

Peter Street was surveyed by Bannister & Hunter and developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd 1962. Named after Peter, a member of the Toll family. A.F. Toll Pty Ltd had been landowners here.

Piccadilly Close

Piccadilly Close was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1979. Piccadilly is a London landmark.

Picnic Way

Picnic way was named by McCloy Developments Pty Ltd, 2001. This name is symbolic of the parkland in Valentine.

Plumeria Place

Plumeria Place was a McCloy development in 2001. Plumeria are a family of exotic frangipani trees.

Redondo Road

Redondo Road was subdivided by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd, 1968. A first name street.

Regal Way

Regal Way was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1970.

Riawena Street

Riawena is an Aboriginal word meaning 'games' (Source: "Aboriginal Words of Australia" by AH & AW Reed) part of the Valentine Estate and subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916.

Robertson Road

Robertson Road was developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd, 1968. It is believed the name came from a Robertson family who once owned former mining company land in Valentine. There may be a connection here with the Hon. John Robertson who was involved with re-opening the Hartley mine.

Roma Road

Roma Road was a McCloy Developments Pty Ltd subdivision, 1995. A companion name with Ludwig Court and Leichhardt Road. The explorer Ludwig Leichhardt left the town of Roma in Queensland and on an exploration and was not heard of again. Roma is named from the maiden name of the wife of the first Governor of Queensland.

Rothglen Close

Rothglen Close was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1977.

Ruston Avenue

Ruston Avenue was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1970. A town in the UK. From the LMSC street name list.

Sassafras Close

Sassafras Close was a McCloy Developments Pty Ltd subdivision, 2001. Sassafras is a native tree.

Scotswood Place

Scotswood Place was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1975. A town in the UK.

Simpson Street

Simpson Street was named after Edward Percy Simpson. He received a land grant in 1869. Simpson Street was named in 1967. Simpson Street is a companion street with Minter.

Squire Close

Squire Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1989.

Stonehaven Place

Stonehaven Place was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1977. A town in Scotland. From the LMMC street name list.

Suffolk Drive

Suffolk Drive was a Fairfax Land and Investment Pty Ltd project, 1979. Suffolk is county in the UK.

Tallawalla Road

Tallawalla is an Aboriginal word meaning 'to sit down' (Source: "Australian Aboriginal Words" by HM Cooper) part of the Valentine Estate and subdivided by Henry F Halloran in 1916. The primary school is in this street.

Thames Court

Thames Court was a Scenerama Estate Pty Ltd subdivision, 1989. The Thames River is a London landmark.

The Crest Cove

The Crest Cove was a McCloy Group development in 1996. There is a name connection with Cockatoo Court- a cockatoo is a parrot with a crest.

The Hill

The Hill was named by McCloy Developments Pty Ltd, 2001. Named because it has a hill.

The Park Chase

The Park Chase was named by McCloy Developments Pty Ltd, 2001. This name is symbolic of the parkland in Valentine.

Tower Close

Tower Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1990.

Trafalgar Crescent

Trafalgar Crescent was built in 1988. Trafalgar Square is a London landmark.

Turret Close

Turret Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd subdivision, 1994.

Valentine Crescent

Early settlers, the Croudace Family, built their house near Valentine Crescent. The name Valentine was given by Henry F Halloran to commemorate the previous owner of the land, Valentine Geary in 1916 (Source: "Green Point, Valentine, Eleebana and Croudace Bay" by Peter Murray). Valentine Crescent was named in 1960.

Valiant Avenue

Valiant Avenue was a Copacabana Property's Pty Ltd development in 1967. They usually choose first names for their subdivisions.

Victor Avenue

Victor Avenue was surveyed by Bannister & Hunter and developed by Copacabana Properties Pty Ltd in 1962. Named after Victor, a member of the Toll family. A.F. Toll Pty Ltd had been landowners here.

Warwick Way

Warwick Way was a Scenerama Estate Pty Ltd subdivision in 1989. Warwick Castle is a UK landmark.

Werona Crescent

Werona is an Aboriginal word meaning 'quiet' (Source: "Australian Aboriginal Words & Place Names" by S.J. Endacott). This was part of A.R. Minter and E.P. Simpson's land grant and subdivided by Henry F. Halloran in 1916.

Westminster Close

Westminster Close was an R.W. Sheargold Pty Ltd development in 1992. Westminster Abbey is a London landmark.

Wildwood Way

Wildwood Way was a McCloy Group development in 2001. This name is symbolic of the Green Point Foreshore Reserve.

Windsor Close

Windsor Close was a Stockland Constructions Pty Ltd development 1989. Windsor Castle is a London landmark.
