FINALLY THE GAMES HAVE BEGUN. NO MORE WAITING, IT'S TIME TO BREATH AND TO HIT THAT TARGET, TO SHOOT THAT 10.9. NO MORE HESITATIONS: WE ARE IN MUNICH, TO TAKE PART IN THE 50TH ISSF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP IN ALL EVENTS, THE MOST IMPORTANT COMPETITION OF THIS OLYMPIC CYCLE, A MILESTONE OF THE INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING SPORT FEDERATION'S HISTORY. THE ROAD TO MUNICH HAS COME TO AN END, AND THE MUCH-AWAITED FOR COMPETITION BY THE WORLD'S LEADING SHOOTERS AND SHOOTING FANS FOR FOUR YEARS HAS FINALLY BEGUN! AN EXTRAORDINARY COMPETITION, WHICH CAN BE BETTER DESCRIBED USING SUPERLATIVES: THIS IS GOING TO BE THE BIGGEST, THE HARDEST AND THE BEST SHOOTING COMPETITION OF THE SHOOTING SPORT HISTORY, KEEPING THE PATH OF TRADITION (WE ARE NOW AT THE 50TH EDITION), LOOKING THROUGH A WINDOW TOWARDS THE FUTURE, WITH THE FIRST OLYMPIC QUOTAS FOR LONDON 2012 TO BE DISTRIBUTED DURING THESE COMPETITION DAYS.

THE BIGGEST:

Undoubtedly, the 2010 ISSF World Championship, the 50th championship in all events of our Federation, is going to be the biggest shooting competition ever. About 2500 athletes from more than 90 countries, more than 100 different shooting federations, will compete on the lines of the 1972 Olympic Shooting Range of Munich from the July 29 through August 11. Ever since the first Shooting World Championship held in Lyon in 1897, it is unprecedented that so many shooters stand to compete against each other in a world-class event, in such a short time span! The schedule of the event is simply incredible: 55 shooting competitions, including Pistol, Rifle, Shotgun and Running Target events will take place during the days of the World Championship, when the organizers will have to deal with over 4300 starts. Counting the team events, 110 Gold medals will be assigned, which is probably an unparallel number of awards in an international sport event.

THE HARDEST:

Nobody ever said that it was going to be easy, but this time the ISSF World Championship is probably going to be harder then ever. Thousand of competitors, thousand of paying fans

on site, TV spectators from over 100 countries and territories... millions of eyes are going to follow the competitions, waiting for that 10.9 which could be worth a Gold, millions of ears waiting to hear the sound that means "lost target" and often "lost medal". The pressure is going to be as intense as ever, at the 50th ISSF World Championship in all shooting events. This is the first Olympic qualifying event for London 2012: the first 69 Quota Places, the "entrance tickets" to the next Olympic Games, are going to be distributed here, in Munich, to the best shooters of the world, those who will be able to face the pressure, get that 10.9 and shoot down that last clay. There are no second chances this time.

THE BEST:

Drama and emotions are going to be at the heart of this 50th ISSF World Championship in all shooting events. More than 2500 shooters, from expert Olympians to Junior athletes, from World Title Holders to 21-year old new faces, all of them are pursuing their golden dream, a dream of excellence and perfection, a dream that leads all the way up to the highest step of the podium. Olympic Quota places are there to be earned and none of the 2500 participants will do less than his best trying

to obtain one of the first Olympic qualification tickets. And, aside from the on-court drama, when referring to "the best" shooting championship, we should not forget that never before, in the history of shooting sport, has so much effort been put into the organization of a World Championship.

The organizational machine which has been set up to manage this huge competition is impressive: over 100 officials and 400 volunteers will be responsible for running the competition in one of the largest and better organized shooting ranges of the world, the 1972 Olympic Venue of Munich. For the first time in the history of ISSF World Championship, spectators' tickets were sold for all the competition days, starting with a simple entry pass for the common areas, right up to the VIP chair next to the field of play. Undoubtedly that this is going to be a great show, a show which will be covered by ISSF TV, which will be broadcasting over the internet and over satellite all the Olympic events' finals live as well as the Running Target medal matches, distributing the footage of the "best ISSF shooting competition ever" all around the globe, in over 100 countries, in collaboration with some of world's best networks.

MUNICH – THE MECCA OF SHOOTING

Munich's shooting range was inaugurated for the 1972 Olympic Games organized in the city, and from there on it has been considered to be one of the best shooting venues of the world, as well as one of the most used to host prime international events. Munich's is the "Shooting Range of Records", as the statistical numbers confirm: 6 Olympic records and 34 World records were set on these shooting lines and on these ranges, throughout the last 38 years!

THE RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGES, as well as the final hall, have gone through some renovations in the last years, and since the 1972 Games they have provided the best possible conditions for high-level shooting. The 10 meters hall provides one hundred shooting lines, all equipped with the new 941 SIUS electronic targets, which should provide a smooth competition in spite of the incredible number of participants. The 50 meters range also complies with top international standards. With one hundred and two shooting lines equipped with Politronic targets, it will host Rifle and Pistol events at the same time. Forty 25 meters targets for Pistol events, forty-one 300 meters targets and Running Target layouts complete the technical infrastructure of Munich's range, which stands as one of the largest in the world.

THE SHOTGUN RANGE is brand new. After more than 30 years of well-rendered service, the old fashioned 1972 Olympic range was completely reconstructed, enlarged and refitted to keep up with international standards. The construction of the new layout started between 2007 and 2008, and it was a real challenge for engineers, who faced the challenge of soil water and had to build a big, new background wall in order to contain lead and noise. The construction, financed by the German Shooting Federation, the Bavarian Shooting Federation and the national and regional authorities, was first tested in 2009, within the frame of the ISSF World Cup Series. Trap and Double Trap shooters immediately liked it: a perfect green background, brand new Matterelli machines and precise settings turned out to be the best conditions for high scores.

SHOOTING TRANSLATES INTO UNIVERSALITY

This 50th ISSF World Championship in all events will be the stage of an outstanding international participation: more than 90 National Olympic Committees will be involved in this year's ISSF World Championship, meaning the arrival of athletes from 105 or more shooting federations from all around the world. Once again, the shooting sport proves to be a universal sport, which is practiced and loved throughout the five continents, in its different disciplines of Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun or Running Target.

A sport which was a founding discipline of the modern Olympic Games, and which has continued to improve throughout the years thanks to millions of fans and athletes who have supported the International Shooting Sport Federation and maintained alive the values of this sport with love and passion. Shooting is still one of the few sports in the world which is practiced at competitive levels by men and women, as well as junior athletes, in all continents, with no exclusions.

Since the very first edition, back in 1897, Europe has lead the overall medal rankings, closely followed by America and Asia, two continents which have vastly grown in these past years. But also Oceania and Africa finished in the spotlight more than once during the past 49 world championship editions, thus confirming the vitality of our sport at every level.

SHOOTING LEGENDS – THE MULTI-MEDALLISTS

Since its first edition, back in 1987, the ISSF World Championship has been a playground for champions: all the best shooters in the world, all the Olympic champions and those who wrote the history of our sport, participated in a World Championship, soon or later. Some of them may have not reached the desired results, but some others became living legends of the shooting sport, by competing on World Championship stages. Some names will be bound to shooting history forever. Such as **KONRAD STAEBELI** of Switzerland, an early legend of shooting who won the incredible number of 44 individual World Championship medals between

1898 and 1914, shooting both rifle and pistol events, and setting twelve new rifle World Records and five new pistol World Records! Outstanding results, but, in spite of what you might think, he has not been the only man of his kind. A few years later, between 1900 and 1925, it was Belgium's Paul Van Asbroeck who won ten World Championship medals in Rifle events, establishing one World Record, as well as earning ten World Championship medals in the 50m Pistol Men event, setting along the way three World Records in pistol!

But those were the old days, when athletes went back and forth between pistol and rifles within one afternoon and had more events to compete in, during ISSF (UIT at that time) Championships. Nowadays, top shooters are specialized in their event, and they would not go back and forth between one discipline and another so easily. Australian Champion **MICHAEL DIAMOND** is the top-ranked active shooter, among the Men's multi-medallist chart. The Trap and Double Trap champion has won a total of seven World Championship medals, and competing in Munich he will have a chance to climb higher on the chart, leaving far behind his historical opponent, Italy's **GIOVANNI PELLIELO**, who currently ranks in 40th place with a total of six World Championship medals.

Among women there is no competition: the absolute champion of the ISSF history is **SUSAN NATTRASS** of Canada, who solidly holds the lead in the overall World Championships medal standings with an outstanding total number of 14 medals, 7 Gold, 4 Silver and 3 Bronze. The six-time Olympian has won more than everybody else in the ISSF World Championships in shotgun events, and she stands as a real legend of the shooting sport. Susan started winning medals in this competition in 1971, and continued winning throughout 29 different World Championship editions, setting an unmatched record as she

claimed six World Championship titles back to back, between 1974 and 1981, setting in those years three new World Records. Natrass stepped on her last World Championship's podium in 2006, when she claimed the title at the 49th ISSF World Championship in all events of Zagreb. Nowadays, four years later, she is a star again here in Munich, where she is taking part in her 30th ISSF World Championship edition.

Therefore, the most valuable prizes to be awarded in Munich will be the 69 Olympic Quota Places which will be distributed among the best performers of the fifteen Olympic events. The Quota Places, which are sometimes called the "entrance tickets to the Games", represent one starting position for the Olympic Games, and are granted to the National Olympic Committee, not directly to the shooter who has won them. As in past editions, one shooter can only win one quota place for his/her country, and in case a shooter who has already won a quota place in any event earns a quota, that quota place will be granted to the next ranked shooter in that competition.

Sixty-nine out of the 390 Quota Places granted to shooting for the 2012 Games will be distributed at the World Championship in Munich, which confirms it will be the "biggest competition" of this Olympic cycle even in this regard. The qualification path for the next Olympic Games follows the new rules of the International Olympic Committee, accord-

ing to which, no quota places would be distributed until two years before the opening ceremony of the Olympic Games. Therefore, Munich's is going to be one of the first Olympic Qualifying events among all sports, and the remaining Quotas of the shooting sport will be assigned throughout the 2011 ISSF World Cup Series, at the 2011 ISSF Shotgun separate World Championship, and at the various Continental Championships which are going to take place around the world in 2011 and 2012.

With 69 Quota Places waiting for the shooters in the Finals of the 15 Olympic events, the matches are expected to be even tougher. From Olympians to World Champions, from first-time finalists to young shooters, everybody will try to at least make it into the final round, to earn an Olympic Qualification.

So, who are the favorites? Who will most likely be competing in those finals? It is always difficult to answer this question, as we know how the outcome of a competition can be determined by a number of unpredictable factors. Still, we tried to put together the data of the ISSF archives: numbers, statis-

tics, world ranking, win and loss, participations and success-rates, all was taken into account, trying to present the status quo in each of the 15 Olympic events of Rifle, Pistol and Shotgun shooting.

JUNIORS EVENTS – OUR WORLD'S FUTURE

The ISSF World Championship is a competition that means a lot also in terms of grassroots and juniors: here, younger shooters have the unique chance to compete against themselves in a world-class match within dedicated categories and competitions. The Olympic Champions of tomorrow are competing in an ISSF World Championship, and this is even more true in 2010, the year of the first Youth Olympic Games edition, which will take place in Singapore immediately after our World Championship. The qualifications for the first Youth Olympic Games have already been carried out (you can find an article about it in this magazine issue), but, undoubtedly, the World Championship will give our young athletes an outstanding chance to train and get ready for their first Olympic experience. But the ISSF World Championship is not only associated with the Games: since its foundations, the World Championship has held all shooting events, and juniors are no exception, as a consistent share of the 55 shooting events to be conducted in the following days are dedicated to them. And it couldn't be different, considering the vast interest of younger athletes for our sport. As seen in adult events, shooting is also widely practiced around the world among Junior shooters who compete at world-level standards in each continent, with no exceptions, proving that future participation in shooting sports is undeniably.
