
I wish to thank His Highness Sheikh

A city without limits

In an exclusive interview with Update, one of Dubai Sports City's directors, Mr Abdul Rahman Falaknaz explains what he hopes the project's legacy will be

ince its launch in 2004, many onlookers have questioned the reasoning behind Dubai Sports City, asking why the project developers have chosen to blend international sporting facilities with residential and lifestyle offerings. But as Mr Falaknaz explained, this is at the core of the reasoning behind the project: "Sports facilities anywhere in the world are primarily government funded and are very often white elephants. I mean, look at what happened with the Montreal Olympics back in 1976, the Canadians are still paying taxes for that after 30 years," he said. "Here, myself and the other partners went to the government with a private plan and we are all working towards the same goal. I'm no idealist; I don't expect us to make money from the stadiums, because its proven across the globe that you don't, but I'd be happy to break even with the stadiums as the options for them are endless, and this is what will set the project apart for potential residents. Where else in the world can you find such facilities on your doorstep?"

These are undoubtedly the fundamentals that the city has been built on. From the vision of the three private partners—Abdul Rahman Falaknaz, Abdulrahman Bukhatir and Abdul Rahmin Al Zarooni—to the full support of Sheikh Mohammed and the Dubai Government, it's a project that might include sport in its title, but is much more than that. "It's important for us to emphasise, that while sports are a major part of the project, Dubai Sports City is all about providing a lifestyle. It's been conceptualised as a city within a city, where you can get everything that you dream of on your doorstep—from international sporting events, to recreational sporting facilities, to hospitals and schools. More than just creating wonderful sporting facilities, we are creating a lifestyle," added Mr Falaknaz.

The project has enjoyed unprecedented publicity across the world, has already received several industry awards and, in what perhaps is the surest sign of success, is being eyed by other developers in the region and across the globe. But, that's not something that worries Mr Falaknaz. "They say that copying is the best form of flattery," he says with a knowing grin. "We have the right team in place, we are well ahead of the rest, we are creating a city within a city, not a stadium with a few towers around it. It doesn't worry us. In fact it keeps us on our toes and all we are focused on is seeing this project through to completion and then making it a real success for years to come."

"We want this to be an international sporting venue, we recognise that sport is a global entity, and that sports differ in different parts of the world. To that end we have the facilities to cater to any demand," explains Falaknaz. "We could have American football, ice-hockey and cricket all taking place at the same time. We even have the ability to host Australian Rules football, which requires the biggest playing surface in sport, which in itself proves that we have the facilities to

host almost any sporting event."

And with any talk of sport in the Middle East comes the age-old question of the region's first ever Olympic Games. Dubai certainly seems to be positioning itself for a bid for the Games, but is this just another white elephant on the charge? "If Sheikh Mohammed wants it he will have it, and I'm sure at the back of his mind there is a thought there," says the ever-diplomatic Mr Falaknaz with a wry smile. "All I can reiterate is that we will be a part of what is required. We are a small facility when you talk in Olympic terms where you need at least 20 dedicated stadiums—but we are ready to assist, promote and work with the government in whatever direction they choose to take." An Olympic closing ceremony within the next 20 years? Maybe. Opening ceremony of the world's first purpose-built sports city within the next four years? Definitely!

Mastering the skills

Dubai Sports City looks to broaden the horizons of sport in the region by incorporating the best of today with the legends of yesterday

Dubai hosted several legends of football earlier this year as part of the inaugural Masters Football event in the region, known as the Masters Football Dubai Challenge. And in its endeavours to support sport in the region, Dubai Sports City was more than happy to come on board as the major sponsor of the hugely popular and well-received event, which is now set to become a highly anticipated annual event.


The Masters Cup is nothing short of a footballing phenomenon. From humble beginnings, the competition between some of football's most famous names has now attracted over one million fans to venues in the UK, and the Masters Cup is now spreading the word beyond the UK to stage similar events across the globe.

Playing a five-a-side format and using a sin bin, the Masters organisers have been able to convince some of the biggest names in the sport to become regular competitors

again. The Dubai event was no different, with some of the greats from Chelsea, Manchester United, Newcastle United and Liverpool turning out for the respective teams, much to the delight of the crowd at the packed Aviation Club.

Ian Rush led his Liverpool side to the title, with a closely fought 1-0 victory over Newcastle in the final. Greats of the game included former England stars Paul Gascogine and Chris Waddle and Scottish international Ally McCoist.

Dubai Sport City's sponsorship included a visit by some of the Manchester United Masters to a session of its Manchester United Soccer Schools, and an opportunity for the students to demonstrate their skills at half time.



ELS IS ON COURSE

Ernie Els, threetime Dubai Desert Classic winner and one of the world's top ten golfers, recently visited the site of the golf course which he is designing at the heart of **Dubai Sports** City. The course is to be located at the Victory Heights residential development.

In his first visit

since the unveiling of the project last year, Els toured the site with his design team and checked out the building progress now that full construction of the course is underway. Septech/Turnpoint is the construction contractor selected to build the course by Victory Heights and Troon Golf, the world's leading golf

The international level of expertise involved in the project is extremely high, and Els confirmed that he was very happy with the work to date.

SOCCER SCHOOL SEES RED SUCCESS

After 16 weeks of intensive football coaching, the participants of Dubai's inaugural Manchester United Soccer Schools (MUSS) programme were awarded with their end-of-season certificates at a ceremony held for families and friends at the Al Wasl Sports Club.

The first MUSS programme saw over 559 students experience the MUSS coaching



philosophy adapted from the coaching programme at Manchester United's Youth Academy.

Jamie Donovan was the overall winner of the Skills Tests and will represent Dubai in the MUSS World Skills Tests in Manchester on November 4, when United play Portsmouth. As part of this prize, he will have the chance to follow in the footsteps of some of the greatest players in the world and play on the famous Old Trafford pitch, home of Manchester United.

The Skills Test runner-up was

Glen Reid who won the opportunity to join an MUSS residential course to be held in the UK during the summer. The other winners were Saeed Al Rais (7-8), Philippe El Khoury (9-10), Scott Trafford (13-14) and Mohammed Rushdi Rafeek [15-16] who each received a trophy and signed Manchester United football shirt.

central waterway, beautifully landscaped
promenade, stadiums and golf course.

The develpoment is intended to provide complete peace of mind through design and is due for completion at the end of 2008. Prices start from AED380,000 for a studio apartment, and attractive financing is available through Tamweel.

Canal takes shape

The canal will deliver a feel of the Riviera to the heart of the city

One of the highlights of the DSC project has already been dug out and is now taking shape. The 1.5 kilometre-long canal that acts as a focal point to the Canal Residence buildings is starting to look like what has for so long been reserved to artists' impressions. With the excavation work all but completed, we can expect to see this part of the project completed by the end of 2007.

CRICKET SET FOR AN IMPRESSIVE NEW HOME

The contract for the construction of the world-class cricket stadium at Dubai Sports City was awarded in March to a joint venture between Alpine Bau Deutschland AG and Belbadi Engineering (Alpine-Belbadi). The contract commenced immediately

with anticipated completion of the project in the first half of 2008. The total cost of the cricket stadium when finished will be AED300 million. The stadium has been designed by world renowned architects Gerkan, Marg und Partner (GMP).



MAKING TRACKS

Wade Adams Contracting has been awarded the AED400 million contract to build the infrastructure for the 50-million square feet Dubai Sports City project. The contract is one of the single largest private sector infrastructure contracts to be awarded for a local development in the Emirates. It covers the installation across the Dubai Sports City and Victory Heights projects of 50 kilometres of roads, 70.5 kilometres of portable water piping, 120 kilometres of telecommunications multiple ducts and 41.5 kilometres of irrigation ducts.




ON COURSE

The contract for the construction of the Ernie Els Design golf course was awarded to the UAE-based Septech and its joint venture partner, Turnpoint Australia. Construction of the course, that spans 86 hectares, started in January 2006 and is scheduled for completion in September 2007. Progress is well underway with eight holes having now been shaped and the green complexes and bunkers already marked for growth. At 7,563 yards from the back tees and featuring more than 60 bunkers, it will be a spectacular course.



IT'S ACADEMIC

The academies at Dubai Sports City are an integral part of the development and their construction received yet another boost recently with the announcement that the affection plan for the Manchester United Soccer Schools, ICC Global Cricket Academy, Butch Harmon School of Golf and David Lloyd Tennis Academy had all received the thumbs up and construction would start forthwith. Once complete, the academies will provide a unique lifestyle choice on the doorstep for residents who choose Dubai Sport City as their home.



CONSULTANT PROFILE

The architectural contract for the stadium has been awarded to gmp. The practice was founded by Meinhard von Gerkan and Volkwin Marg in 1965, and now consists of eight more partners. Gmp is active internationally and has more than 290 employees in seven offices. They have designed small-scale homes, hotels, museums, theatres and concert halls, office buildings, commercial centres and hospitals as well as research and educational facilities. They are internationally recognised for projects like the reconstruction of the Olympic Stadium in Berlin, the RheinEnergie Football Stadium in Cologne and Berlin's New Central Station.



CAPACITY

- The overall capacity is approx. 25,000 spectators— expandable to 30,000
- O Seats are divided into five categories: enclosure 1 (6,569 seats), enclosure 2 (13,640 seats), members (3,798 seats), VIP (approx 750 seats), WIP one box, with outdoor box for 30 guests
- 98 seats for associated press, including seven commentary boxes

PITCHES

- Pitch diameter of 147.80 metres
- Five pitches 3.66 x 22.56m on the square
- Field dimensions are according to ICC standard for one day international match playing conditions
- Two entry points for officials and emergency cars

Cricket's the winner

The cricket stadium at Dubai Sports City will be one of the focal points of the development as a whole. Update previews the stadium that promises to put Dubai on the cricketing map in more ways than one

he game of cricket has come a long way from its humble origins of bat and ball. Wherever you go in the cricket playing world, you'll find patches of land that have been converted into temporary cricket pitches, underlying the huge interest that the game generates across the globe. But with that interest comes the added demands of the international game and one of those is the spread of the game to developing cricketing nations.

The UAE is one such nation that is being fast-tracked by cricket's governing body for international competition, and the city of Dubai has already been earmarked for big tournaments in the future, given its sporting pedigree and geographical position. In keeping with this theme, Dubai Sports City has had a world-class all-seater cricket stadium at the heart of its plans since the start.

"In my office I still have a scale model of the cricket stadium that we wanted to build here about 20 years ago," explains Abdul Rahman Falaknaz, one of Dubai Sports City's board of directors. "We used that as a central theme for the plans as they are today, so cricket has always been an integral part of what we are trying to do at Dubai Sports City."

The 25,000-seater stadium, which is expandable to 30,000, will have the best facilities for players, match officials, VIPs, spectators and the media. It will be one of the most advanced of its kind in the world and the ICC has been involved at all stages of the design process to ensure that the stadium meets all the relevant specifications for hosting international cricket.

The stadium will be built by a joint venture between Alpine Bau Deutschland and Belbadi Engineering (Alpine-Belbadi), with anticipated completion of the project in the first quarter of 2008. The total cost of the cricket stadium when finished will be AED 300 million.

The stadium will feature a unique roof structure based on the traditional Arabic tent framework and will become a landmark throughout Dubai Sports City and Dubailand. The pitch is being built by expert pre-qualified contractors in line with ICC standards. "The stadia at Dubai Sports City will set a benchmark for sporting venues in the region and beyond," says U. Balasubramaniam, CEO of Dubai Sports City. "We are working with the best architects and contractors to ensure that the cricket stadium complies with the standards set down by the global governing body of cricket. The Emirates Cricket Board is currently bidding for major international ICC cricket events, and the cricket stadium at Dubai Sports City forms a central part of that bid. Our ambition is for Dubai Sports City to become a global centre of excellence for cricket—we will not only have the best cricket stadium in the world but we will also host the first ever ICC Global Cricket Academy under the helm of Rodney Marsh as Director of Coaching."

The announcement of the Dubai Sports City cricket stadium comes as a huge boost to cricket fans and players in the region, but it has also attracted much international exposure from some of the biggest names in the game. Sir Clive Lloyd, veteran cricketer, ICC match referee and ex-West Indies captain, is one of many international cricketers who has thrown his full support behind the project, heralding it as a first of its kind.

"Dubai Sports City is an amazing project and I have seen nothing else like it," said Lloyd at the launch of the cricket stadium. "It really pleases me to see a venture that is so dedicated to the growth and development of the game of cricket at all levels, and where better than the city of Dubai with its geographical advantage at the centre of the ever-expanding cricketing world I shall personally be following the progress of this breathtaking development and I am sure the cricketers of today and tomorrow will find this a fantastic venue in which to play cricket."

Importance of being Ernie

When Dubai Sports City unveiled Ernie Els as the designer of the project's signature golf course last year, it was immediately apparent that this was a development that was going to settle for nothing but the best in every sporting field. Update looks at the life and times of the Big Easy

rnie Els is no stranger to Dubai. He has won the Dubai Desert Classic on a record three occasions and is a keen ambassador of the tournament and golf in Dubai. Now that he has agreed to appear in next year's Dubai Desert Classic, where he will be hunting for an unprecedented fourth Classic title, he is on the verge of making history. But Els' name will forever be associated with Dubai, regardless of what happens on the Majlis course next February.

During his last visit to Dubai, Els took part in a dramatic playoff for the Classic title with the world number one, Tiger Woods, only to see his hopes get wet in the lake in front of the final green. While personally disappointing for the big South African, it was yet another intriguing global chapter in the rivalry between two of the world's

finest golfers. However, it was anything but a wasted trip for Els, who also took the opportunity to visit Dubai Sports City, the site for his first design golf course in the Middle East.

Stretching 7,563 yards, with five sets of tees allowing players a selection of different lengths from which to play the golf course, and featuring more than 60 bunkers, the course will be a showpiece that can be transformed from a friendly, every-day player course to one that offers a challenge to the world's best golfers. The course will be managed by Troon Golf, the world leader in upscale golf course management, which will also operate a Butch Harmon School of Golf within the Victory Heights development. Construction of the golf course began in January 2006 and will be completed by September 2007.

"Dubai Sports City is one of the most exciting projects I have been involved in and I truly believe there is nothing else like it in the world at the moment," explained Els. "I am very excited and honoured to have been invited to design the golf course at Victory Heights. I know it will be a world-class facility aimed at families and individuals, and will stand out as something quite special in this market," he added.

Els also showed his commitment to golf in the region, by signing a long-term contract with golf in DUBAI (giD), the promoters and organisers of the richest tournament in the region. "With three wins to his name, Ernie has become synonymous with the Dubai Desert Classic and he is also one of our four global ambassadors, something which we are all proud of," said HE Mohamed Ali Alabbar, chairman of giD.

Els was born in Johannesburg, South Africa. While growing up, he played rugby, cricket, tennis, and, starting at age eight, golf. He was a skilled junior tennis player and won the Eastern Transvaal Junior Championships at age 13. But by age 14 he decided to focus only on golf. Els first achieved prominence in 1984, when he won the Junior World Golf Championship in the Boys 13-14 category. Els turned professional at the end of 1989, and won his first professional tournament in 1991 on the Southern Africa Tour (today the Sunshine Tour). Among his numerous victories since are three major championships: the US Open in 1994 and 1997, and the British Open in 2002.

Other highlights in Ernie's career include topping the 2003 and 2004 European Tour Order of Merit, and winning the World Match Play Championship a record six times. He has held the number one spot in the Official World Golf Rankings and is consistently ranked in the top five. In 2003 he was voted 37th on the SABC3's Great South Africans and also finds time amidst his busy international schedule to run a very successful, and much recognised, wineproducing company.

Unlike most of his contemporaries, Els is known for his willingness to participate in tournaments all around the world (he regularly plays in European Tour-sanctioned events in Asia, Australasia, and his native country of South Africa). He says that his alobe-trotting schedule is in recognition of the global nature of golf, but it has caused some friction with the US PGA Tour, an organisation that would prefer Els to play more tournaments in the United States.

Els has designed courses in the UK, USA, China and South Africa, with the Victory Heights course being Ernie Els Design's first golf course in the Middle East. The 18-hole championship golf course, combining a links course with traditional 'classical-era' design, will feature broad and gently-rolling fairways receptive for drives off the tees while steep greenside bunkers and grass swales will present significant challenges for the incoming second shots. Commenting as he walked the site, Els said: "The design is fabulous on paper, and the most important step from here is that our shaper gets the greens and bunkers in the style that I envisaged from the beginning. I am happy to report that I am very satisfied with what I saw today."

young footballers and we have received extremely positive feedback from participants and parents about this first course."
