Frequently Asked Questions
Directions to and Parking at UCR
UC Riverside is located adjacent to the 60 freeway in the city of Riverside. Exit at University Avenue, turning left. Continue on University as it turns left and becomes Canyon Crest. Event Parking will be marked. For regular parking, make a right onto Campus Drive and go to the kiosk for parking information. For events at the Riverside Sports Complex, follow Canyon Crest to Linden, turning left. Turn right at Rustin and follow the signs for baseball parking.

Parking Permits
Parking at UCR is enforced from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week. Visitor parking @ \$6/day; $\$ 5 /$ after 4 p.m. and on weekends. Parking for special events varies. Visitor permits and campus maps may be obtained from either of the Information Kiosks located off of University Avenue near Hinderaker Hall or off of Martin Luther King Blvd. on Canyon Crest Drive. Hourly permit dispensers are located throughout various lots.

Media Regulations
Seating in the press box is restricted to working members of the media. A working member is an individual actively engaged in reporting, scouting, or conducting the game. All requests for media and photo credentials should be made to the UC Riverside Athletics Media Relations Department at least two days in advance of the event. Requests may be made by phone (951) 827-4571 or via e-mail at lauren.kane@ucr.edu. Room in the press box is limited and we will make every effort to accommodate you. Arrangements for radio and television credentials must be made no less than 30 days before the game.

Interviews
Player interviews must be arranged through the Athletics Media Relations Department. If a phone interview is desired, student-athletes will be contacted by the Athletics Media Relations Department and given the media's number. If an in-person interview is desired, the Athletics Media Relations Department will make arrangements and ensure that the student-athlete has no academic conflicts. There will be no day-of-game interviews prior to first pitch.

Photography
Photographers are welcome at UCR sporting events but will be limited to designated areas adjacent to the playing area. Please contact the media relations office to arrange a photo credential.

2010 Season Preview Q\&A with Head Coach Doug Smith

Q: Before we look ahead to 2010, let's take a look back at 2009: what did you expect heading into last year and how did you feel about the team's performance once the season ended?

A: Sitting here at this time last year, I think there was a lot more uncertainty on last year's team than there is this year. There was no indication that Paul Applebee was going to go 10-2. There was no indication that Dustin Emmons was going to step up and be an All-Big West Conference pitcher out of the bullpen.

We thought we knew what we had in Joe Kelly. We didn't know quite how Paul Bargas was going to throw. He threw very, very well. Matt Montgomery had to bounce back from an injury. So at least from a pitching staff standpoint there were a lot of uncertainties at this time last year. While we've lost a lot of those guys, I think we have more certainties this year

How was last year? I think you have to call it a successful year. We went 33-20, missed a couple of games due to rain and scheduling
 Highlanders a year ago and it the lone member of the pitching staff in 2010 who started a game in 2009.

Q: As is the case every year, you lose people to graduation and, specifically in college baseball, you lose players to the professional ranks. Can you remind the fans at home who Riverside has lost to graduation and to the pros?

A: We lost a significant portion of our club. On the position player side we were lucky. We only lost two players. Brandon Schnebly who bounced around the outfield and DHd for us along with our starting center fielder Carl Uhl who was one of the catalysts of our club.

Where we really got hurt is our starting pitching just went away. Losing Applebee, Bargas and Montgomery out of the rotation, and then Ryan Platt on Tuesdays, we went 9-3 in games that Ryan started. And then we lost Joe Kelly who set our career saves record. So we lost a lot.

Q: You mention the pitching staff losses. Whom do you see filling out your starting rotation and primary relief corps?

A: We like our pitching in the sense that while we lost a lot of starting pitching, we bring back Matt Andriese who had six or eight starts for us last year and had a very good summer in the NorthWest League.

Matt Larkins started as a freshman and won six games. Dustin Emmons out of the bullpen last year was an All-Big West performer. That's going to make up the beginning of the year our starting rotation for the weekend.

During the midweeks we've got Eddie Orozco who will go right now along with a freshman, Trevor Frank. And we think those four or five guys can hold it together and throw well for us.

Losing Joe Kelly is significant. You knew what you were going to get out of Joe. And moving Dustin Emmons to the starting rotation leaves a big void in the bullpen.

We're looking at a couple of guys specifically to fill that. We're looking for Kevin Dickey to step up and have a big year for us out of the bullpen initially. He has earned a starting job in the rotation, but just because of numbers we need him to throw out of the bullpen. Mike Wolford will step into the closers roll. He's had a very good fall, coming off of a very good summer in the M.I.N.K. league. and we have a freshman Mitch Pitito drafted by the Marlins last year-very good arm - we anticipate those guys stepping up and picking up the bulk of the relief innings.

Q: Most of your starting position players are back, with the biggest exception as you mentioned being Carl Uhl? Who fills his shoes in 2010?

A: We're going to move Tony Nix, who played a lot of left field last year, to center field. He has great instincts as a defender. He is a plus outfielder defensively. Then we're going to take Mike Hur from the DH role and roll him out into left field.

Q: Looking at the recruiting class, incoming freshman and incoming junior college players, who can we look forward to seeing?

A: We didn't have a lot of newcomers come in in the sense that we knew we were going to return so many position players. But from the new guys' standpoint, Phil Holinsworth, a freshman out of Chino Hills, has really had a good fall. He's one of our more versatile guys. He can play anywhere in the infield, anywhere in the outfield. In fact in the fall, he played every place on the field with the exception of pitcher and catcher. He's a very good athlete. I anticipate him having a very significant impact on our club. We've got to find a way to get him into the lineup somehow.

Q: As newcomers get used to the collegiate game as freshman, what's the biggest transition from high school to the collegiate ranks?

A: I think the biggest things are, one speed of the game. The game is just faster. People are bigger and stronger and faster than they were. And then I think the length of the playing season. We've already played more games in terms of intersquads and practices than the typical high school guy will play in a full year. We haven't played our first regular season game yet and they've already had the equivilant of what they would have had last year in high school.

Q: If first pitch was fifteen minutes from now, what would your starting lineup look like?

A: If we were to start today, we'd go with Rob Brantly behind the plate, Bryan McConkey at first base, Bryan Horst at second, Ryan Goetz at third. Trevor Hairgrove at short, in left field, Michael Hur, Tony Nix in center, Joey Gonzales in right, and we have a real battle going on for the DH spot. Justin Shults and Mike Nesbitt both had really good falls and are both swinging the bat very, very well right now, and it is going to come down to the tail end. We're going to find a way to get them both in the lineup because they can both hit.

Q: Would you prefer to have one set player as your DH or play platoon splits and things like that?

A: Given my druthers, I'd rather play the same nine people all the time. I think the continuity of it gives guys when they come to the ballpark knowing what's going to happen, you're going to fight through your slumps, all those things. I think as a position payer it is easier if you know you're going to play every day.

I don't think we're going to have that situation. I think we're going to have probably 12 guys if I were to look at it right now who are going to work in on some kind of a rotation basis.

Q: One of the positives of being a UCR baseball fan is getting the chance to see some of the best teams in the country. One of the negatives of being a UCR baseball coach is that you have to play against some of the best baseball teams in the country. This year is no exception as you have 13 games on the docket against 2009 NCAA particpiants. What are your general thoughts to scheduling, especially the non-conference schedule leading up to the start of Big West play.

A: The non-conference schedule is always a challenge to, one, just get scheduled in the sense that you're trying to look-we're already scheduled through 2012. And you're trying to make the best guess that you can in that you want to play a difficult schedule and yet something that is manageable, something that is affordable. All of those things. And you'll look at a club now and you say that ought to be someone who we can bring into town and hopefully beat up on a little bit, and two years from now, they've had a great recruiting class and they're very, very good.

On the flip side you may have someone you think is a great RPI weekend and their club struggles a little bit sand it doesn't help as much as you thought. But traditionally our strength of schedule is pretty good.

## Q: Does the fact that you play in the Big West, one of the toughest if not the toughest conferences in the nation, play into your non-conference scheduling?

A: Yes, it does. We don't have to worry so much about RPI numbers because our conference is going to bring our RPI numbers up. In addition to that, our mid-week games, being located where we are, we're going to play San Diego, San Diego State, UCLA, USC, Loyola, Pepperdine, etc. Those are all good RPI games. Those are all top-notch programs, and there are no easy games in that mix, If you don't go out and play well, you could go out and lose all of them.

Q: When fans see a schedule card when it first comes out, they circle certain games that are meaingful to them. As players and coaches, are there certain games, or certain rivals that you circle that are benchmarks for you?

A: We try and break it down one at a time, that old cliché. We're just going to play them one at a time, but I think the tournament we're going to play at Arizona State is going to be a bellweather for us in terms of, we will have 10-12 games under our belt by then. That tournament has Arizona State, Oregon State, Florida International, Cal Poly, us. We ought to have a fairly good idea about what type of team we are by the time that weekend is over. Q: You obviously haven't seen any other con-
ference teams so far; you've only been with your
team for a few rain-shortened weeks in practice,
but how do you see the Big West shaking out as a
conference and where do the Highlanders fit in?

A: I think the Big West is going to be better than it has been and deeper than it has been since we've been in the Big West. You look at the top two teams in our conference with Irvine and Fullerton, both of them are in just about every preseason top-10. Cal Poly was in the top-20 the majority of last year.

We know Long Beach State is going to be good again. Santa Barbara was on the cusp of doing special things last year. U of P is really an underrated club, They're so stacked offensively it is frightening. Cal State Northridge, in listening to Coach Rousey talk the other day at Media Day, he's really happy with their program.
I have not seen Coach Peterson so I don't know what's going on at Davis, but they were in

Regionals just two years ago so they're going to be fine. I think our conference is really, really good.

Where do I see us? I think we can compete with anybody in our conference on any day. What that means is is how well are we going to do on a given day? I think we're good enough to where we can be competitive, in the top half of our conference. But our conference is pretty deep. If you don't play well, it would be easy to not do that.

Q: We talked earlier about the number and caliber of the players that you lost to graduation and the pros. I would think that one of the things that helps you in terms of preparing from year to year now is that you've had the same coaching staff in place for the better part of three seasons. Can you let everybody know what the division of duties is amongst the assistant coaches and how that continuity does benefit you?

A: It does benefit us. Coach Randy Betten has been with us for six years now, and he handles all of our defense. He's a former All-Pac 10 shortstop at Arizona State. He helps with the offense as well.

Nathan Choate is our pitching coach. This is his third year with us. We've been in the top 10 in the country over the last few years since he's been here in fewest walks allowed, and I believe we were in the top-20 in earned run average last year.

Coach McNamara, our volunteer coach, does a great deal of the work with our offense and shares that with me. And Coach Brett Martinez works with our catchers and helps with the offense.

Having all of those guys together for three or four years in a row, players know what to expect from us each day. It is easier for us to figure out what we're going to get out of each other as well..

## Q: If UC Riverside in several months is preping

 for a first round NCAA Tournament game, what has gone right? What key things have happened?A: First and foremost we have to stay healthy, particularly on the mound. We just don't have enough experienced depth to be able to overcome a bunch of injuries. We will have to play well defensively. We think we have a very, very good defensive club. If we can do those two things, and have a couple of the freshmen on our pitching staff step up, we could look up at the end of the year and say we've got oursevles in position, and we'll see where things go from there.

## Doug Smith Head Coach

Doug Smith was appointed as the fourth head baseball coach in UC Riverside history in September 2004, following 25 years as the top assistant and hitting coach at his alma mater.

Entering his sixth season, Smith has compiled an overall record of 149-126 including a 62-49 mark in Big West competition. That includes UC Riverside's first Big West Conference Baseball Championship in 2007 and a trip to the NCAA Regionals that same year. After the season, with a program-best conference record of 16-5 in tow, Smith was named Big West Coach of the Year.

In a collegiate career spanning over 1,600 games, Smith has helped the Highlanders to 10 postseason appearances, including one Division II National Championship, one Big West Conference Title, and two NCAA Division I West Regional appearances.

As the Highlanders' hitting coach, Smith has seen his teams set nearly every significant offensive school record, including batting average, home runs, runs, RBI and extra base hits. In addition, the 2003 Highlanders led the Big West in batting average and homers and had the fourth highest team batting average in Division I.

In his career, Smith has coached over 150 all-conference selections and 34 All-America selections. During that time, nearly 100 of his players have been signed to professional contracts, and five former Highlanders - Anthony Claggett (Yankees, Pirates), Troy Percival (Rays), Dan Runzler (Giants), Marc Rzepczynski (Blue Jays) and Chris Smith (Brewers)saw action in the major leagues in 2009.

Smith graduated from UC Riverside in 1975 with a bachelor's degrees in sociology and political science. An outstanding catcher, his senior year was highlighted by his performance in the All-Riverside Baseball Invitational Tournament, where he helped lead the Highlanders to their first-ever title and was the leading hitter at .471 . Following the season he was named All-CCAA First Team.

Smith served as a part-time assistant coach from 1976 through 1980 while he pursued a master's degree in Physical Education from Cal Poly Pomona. After taking three years off to venture into private business, Smith returned to the Highlanders in 1983 and has been on the staff ever since. Randy Betten joined the UC Riverside coaching staff in September 2004, coming to the Highlanders after one year at Cal Baptist University and eight seasons at Riverside Community College.

The 2007 version of the Highlanders won the Big West Conference Championship and was ranked as high as 13th in the nation during the year. That championships marked the first time in 20 years that a Division I program in the UC system won its conference championship outright.

While at Cal Baptist, Betten served as an assistant to former UCR assistant Gary Adcoc, where the Lancers overcame a slow start to post a 30-22 record and finished as runners-up in the 2004 Region II Tournament.

A graduate of New Life Christian High School in Highland, CA, Betten began his college career at RCC, earning All-American, All-Southern California and AllOrange Empire Conference honors for Coach Rogers in 1992 and 1993. In 1995, Betten earned All-Pacific 10 Conference first team honors. He also served as a team captain.

Betten earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Thomas Edison State College in 1998. He also earned a master's degree in physical education from Azusa Pacific in 2002.

Betten's hobbies include playing golf and cooking. He and his wife, Amy, have three young children, Beau, Cody and Grace, and reside in Riverside.

Nathan Choate Assistant Coach

Nathan Choate was hired as the Highlanders' pitching coach in September, 2007.

Choate spent the 2007 season as pitching coach for the Anteaters under then-Head Coach Dave Serrano, where he played a key role in the team's success. The Anteaters finished the 2007 season ranked fourth in the nation and reached the College World Series in Omaha, NE. Choate had previously served one year as the Anteaters' director of baseball operations.

Choate pitched at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo for two seasons, where he was awarded the "Jim Newkirk Fireman's Award," given to the team's best relief pitcher in his junior and senior seasons. In his two-year career he posted a $6-5$ record and struck out 52 batters in 67.2 innings pitched. Choate made 45 appearances for the Mustangs and logged eight saves during his stint.

James "Rusty" McNamara Assistant Coach

James "Rusty" McNamara joined the Highlander staff as a volunteer assistant coach in September 2007 after serving as an assistant coach for Huntington Beach High School under Head Coach Benji Medure.

In the summer of 2009, McNamara was the manager of the Rochester Honkers of the Northwoods League where they won the NWL Championship, and he was named Manager of the Year. Rivals.com named the Honkers the fourth best summer league team in the nation at the conclusion of the season.

A year earlier, McNamara was the assistant head coach of the Anchorage Glacier Pilots of the Alaska Baseball League, and that squad also won its league championship.

McNamara's collegiate playing career began in 1994 at Riverside Community College where he played under Head Coach Dennis Rodgers.

He then transfered to Oklahoma State where he was a member of the Cowboys from 1995-97. McNamara received Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1996, earning First Team All-Big XII accolades, and playing in the College World Series. UC Riverside Wall of Honor


1977 - Division II National Champions

In head coach Jack Smitheran's fifth season at UC Riverside, the Highlanders claimed the program's first national title while setting a new single season record for victories with a 43-19 mark. The Highlanders were led by Division II's top two hurlers, as Dale Reis went 16-1 and Steve Glaum was 13-4. UCR's staff also featured future Major Leaguer Eric Show. At the plate, Jeff Carsley led the nation with 102 hits en route to a .416 batting average. Another future big leaguer, Steve Lubratich, stepped up with a .344 average.

UCR opened the season in non-descript fashion, going 6-4 over its first 10 games. The Highlanders seemed to catch fire in March, rattling off eight straight victories. After two losses, UCR again posted an eight-game winning streak to improve to 22-6. UCR rolled through the California Collegiate Athletic Association schedule with a 15-9 record to earn the program's second trip to the West Regional in three seasons.

The double-elimination regional, held at Riverside, saw UCR open with victories over Cal State Hayward and Cal State Northridge. In the championship, Hayward bounced back for a 7-3 win to set up
a winner-takes-all rubber match. Up stepped Show, who tossed a three-hitter to send the Highlanders to their first College World Series appearance.

Traveling to Springfield, Illinois, for the World Series, UCR pounded its first two opponents, beating Delta State 8-2 and blanking Missouri-St. Louis 12-0. The Highlanders stumbled against Eckerd College 8-2, but recovered to squeeze out an 8-7 win over Valdosta State. UCR then downed Delta 5-3 to set up a rematch against Eckerd.


UC Riverside Wall of Honor 1982 - Division II National Champions
While the 1977 championship team started strongly, the 1982 squad didn't figure it out until a little later in the year. After their second College World Series appearance had ended after two games the year before, UCR got off to a rocky start in 1982, losing six of its first eight games and didn't cross over the .500 mark until the 39th game of the year. Still, it's not how you start, it's how you finish, and boy did the Highlanders finish. UCR won


2007 - Big West Conference Champions

On the strength of veteran pitching and timely hitting, the Highlanders went 38-21 on the season and 16-5 in conference, winning their first Big West title.

Junior righthander James Simmons was dominant as UCR's Friday starter, posting an 11-3 record with a 2.40 ERA in 123.2 innings. Senior southpaw Marc Rzepcynski was 6-2 with a 2.72 ERA, giving UCR a solid one-two punch at the top of the rotation. On the back end, freshman closer Joseph Kelly, a converted outfielder, had a dominant campaign with a 3-1 record, 6 saves and a 1.32 ERA. As a team, UCR posted a 3.68 ERA.

At the plate, freshman Joey Gonzales paced the team with a .356 batting average. Senior shortstop Jaime Pedroza hit .325 with team highs of 13 homers and 55 RBIs and junior left fielder Aaron Wible was right behind with a .313 average, 10 homers and 51 runs batted in.


19 of its last 23 games, dropping just one of its final 12 to roll through the postseason and finish at 36-23.

UCR went 19-10 during CCAA play, completing the schedule with four straight wins to claim the league title.

Hosting the NCAA West Regionals, UCR beat San Francisco State and Cal State Northridge but the Matadors returned the favor in the third game. Facing off in another one-game series, UCR emerged victorious over CSUN with a 7-4 win.

UCR would stay at home again for the College World Series, opening up with a 6-1 win over Longwood.
Back-to-back one-run victories over New Haven and Florida Southern set up the championship game rematch against Florida Southern. The Highlanders made it no contest, routing the Moccasins 10-1 for their second national title. In doing so, UCR became the sixth team to go undefeated through CWS play.

UCR was led by All Americans Curtis Smith and Matt Held, who hit .378 and .341 , respectively. On the mound, Scott Wanzer went 13-6 with 17 complete games while Bill Mierzwik had a 10-5 mark.

For the second time in his career, Smitheran was named the Division II Coach of the Year.

To win the conference title, the Highlanders needed to win just one game over No. 10 UC Irvine. That win came on Saturday, May 26 behind an outstanding pitching performance by Matt Montgomery, who moved into the rotation following an injury to Rzepcynski. Montgomery, who went 5-0 in the regular season, dominated the Anteaters, throwing 8.1 innings of seven-hit work to help the Highlanders to a 4-2 win and the title.

The Highlanders made their second trip to the Division I postseason, heading the Arizona State Regional as the No. 2 seed. UCR opened the tournament with a 10-5 win over No. 3 seed Nebraska, but lost to top-seed and No. 6 ranked Arizona State and then fell to Nebraska ending their postseason aspirations.

Following the season, eight Highlanders earned AllConference honors, led by First-Team selections Pedroza, Simmons and Kelly. Simmons was named Big West Pitcher of the Year, Gonzales Big West Freshman of the Year, Kelly Big West Freshman Pitcher of the Year, and Coach Doug Smith Big West Coach of the Year.

Kelly and Gonzales each earned Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and Ping! Baseball Freshman Second-Team honors. Pedroza and Simmons became the first Highlander teammates at the Division I level to earn Baseball America All-America honors, each being named to the Second-Team.

Simmons also earned Collegiate Baseball Third Team All-American honors and Rivals.com First Team AllAmerican. A few days later, he was selected 26th overall by the Oakland Athletics in the Major League Baseball Draft. A total of 10 Highlanders were selected in the draft. Freshman Kelly was named to the USA Baseball National Team.

Jack Smitheran - \#2
On January 28, 2006, former UCR head coach Jack Smitheran added to his list of numerous honors by having his \#2 jersey retired in a ceremony during the Alumni Game at the Riverside Baseball Complex. It was the latest in a long list of accolades for the Hall of Fame head coach who led the Highlanders for 31 seasons.

In a collegiate coaching career spanning 35 years, Smitheran posted a record of 1,097-770-3, including a 974-709-3 mark in 31 years at UC Riverside and a 123-104 record in four years at the Division I level. In his tenure, he guided the evolution of the Highlander program from an unknown Division II school into a Division II NCAA champion and eventually into a Division I postseason qualifier.

Among his coaching successes are the Highlanders' 2003 appearance at the NCAA Division I West Regional, eight California Collegiate Athletics Association titles, 10 NCAA Division II West Regional appearances, trips to five Division II College World Series and two NCAA Division II National Championships. He had also been named CCAA Coach of the Year eight times in his career and has had nine of his former players reach the big leagues, including Tampa Bay Rays closer Troy Percival.

Fontana native Troy Percival spent three seasons at UC Riverside wearing the number 26 underneath the "tools of ignorance" associated with the catching trade. So naturally, when honoring the 13-year major league veteran on January 25, 2003, the Highlanders retired the number 40 associated with a pitcher who recorded 352 major league saves (eighth on the career list).

Always known for his cannon arm, Percival was a defensive-minded catcher with the Highlanders. In his final season at UCR, Percival recorded the best fielding percentage by a catcher in school history, with a .993 fielding percentage, 240 putouts and 49 assists. His superb defense and strong arm perked the then California Angeles' interest, and they drafted him in the sixth round of the 1990 draft eventually converting him to a pitcher.

Playing for the Angels for his first 10 seasons in the bug leagues, Percival emerged as one of the best relievers in the game. A four-time all-star, Percival is the Angels' alltime leader in saves, including a career-high 42 in 1998.

In the 2002 postseason for the Angeles, Percival recorded seven saves and picked up the final out of the World Series, to clinch the first World Series Championship in franchise history - a thrilling four games to three win over the San Francisco Giants.

After stops in Detroit, St. Louis and Tampa Bay, Percival retired following the 2009 season with 358 career saves to his credit along with an earned run average of 3.17

As an alumnus, Percival continues to make many contributions to the Athletic Department at UCR including in 2007 when he built the baseball team's current state-of-the-art locker room facilities with his own two hands.

## \#19- Eric Show

A native of Riverside, Eric Show was a four-year starter for the Highlanders from 1975-78 and a key member of the rotation during UCR's first national championship seasion of 1977. In the double-elemination regional that season, Show pitched a threehit, 6-0 shutout over Cal State Hayward to send the Highlanders to their first College World Series appearance.
"Baseball's only right-handed flake," as he once described himself to the PressEnterprise, led UCR in wins as a freshman and a senior, and his 14 compelte games still rank 6th on the Highlanders career charts. Upon graduation, Show's 279 innings pitched were the tops in the history of the program as were his 187 strikeouts

In June of 1978, the San Diego Padres selected him in the 18th round of the draft. Three years later, he made his major league debut, and in 1983, Show moved into the Padres starting rotation. He won 15 games that year for San Diego and was the team's ace again the following season when the Padres made their first World Series appearance.

The Highlanders retied Show's No. 19 in 1985, and inducted him into the UC Riverside Athletics Hall of Fame on June 12, 1986.

Baseball infamy came calling for Show on September 11, 1985 when he gave up a single to Pete Rose, allowing Rose to pass Ty Cobb as Major League Baseball's alltime hit king.

In 1989, Show and his wife, Cara Mia, provided the funds to endow a baseball scholarship at UC Riverside which continues to provide Highlanders student-athletes with the opportunity to excel in the classroom and on the diamond.

Show would go on to win 101 games in his big-league career including 100 for the Padres - a franchise record which still stands.

The Padres released Show following the 1990 season, and he signed with the Oakland Athletics for the 1991 campaign. He appeared in five games the A's that seasonmaking his final major league appearance on September 30, 1991 against the Kansas City Royals.

An accomplished musician, especially on the guitar, Show recorded two albums - "America . . $4 / 4$ to Go" and a 1989 Christmas album entitled "Oh Holy Night." Sadly, on March 16, 1994, Eric Vaughn Show passed away at the age of 37.

Jack Carroll - \#1

Jack Carroll (far right) never played a game for the Highlanders, but he was honored posthumously in 1998 as UCR's No. 1 fan. A long time booster, Carroll was involved in all levels of baseball in the Riverside community.

Said Highladners Head Coach Doug Smith, "if you grew up in Riverside and you played baseball, there's a good chance that at one time Jack Carroll gave you a glove or a pair of cleats or helped you out in some way or another. He was just a great believer in the long-term benefis of children participating in sports, particular baseball, and he gave a good part of his life to helping others using youth baseball as his medium.
"His presence in the community is sorely missed, but hopefully by keeping his memory alive on our Wall of Honor new generations of Riverside baseball players will learn about Jack's good works and be challenged to emulate him and give back to the community as he did."

The Highlanders still use the number 1, but Jack Carroll will always be known as the team's number 1 fan.

Stan Morrison Director of Athletics

Nationally known for his work as a head basketball coach and as an athletics administrator, Stan Morrison has led the Highlanders in the transition to Division I. Morrison joined UCR in August 1999, an appointment that Chancellor Raymond L. Orbach described as "one of the most significant in UCR's distinguished athletic history." As director, he oversees all aspects of the athletics program and guided UCR through the transition into Division I, including the selection of the Big West Conference and the expansion of sports programs.

Prior to UCR, he served as vice president for The Dudeck Group, an executive effectiveness-coaching program for high achieving individuals. He has achieved national recognition as a basketball coach and athletics administrator at four Division I universities -- San Jose State, the University of Southern California, the University of Pacific, and the University of California, Santa

Barbara. He also has worked as a


Championship Tournament, including selecting the 65 teams that participate in the tournament. His five-year appointment to the 10 -member committee began on September 1, 2006.

Morrison first gained national attention as a center for the University of California, Berkeley, as the Bears won the NCAA title in 1959 and were runners-up in 1960. After earning a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1961, Morrison was a European All-Star and helped the Real Madrid team to the European Cup finals. He returned to Cal in ' 62 as a graduate assistant and played AAU basketball for the San Francisco Olympic Club, earning All-American honors.

Morrison's first collegiate head coaching position was at the University of the Pacific (1972-79), where he led the Tigers to the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament in 1979. He moved to the University of Southern California for seven seasons (1979-86) and led the Trojans to the NCAA Tournament in 1982, then repeated the feat in 1985 after USC won a share of the Pacific-10 championship.

In 1986 Morrison was appointed director of athletics at the University of California, Santa Barbara. While at UCSB (1986-89), he was administrator over the Gauchos 21-sport program, helped raise significant funds annually for UCSB Athletics and served on the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament Committee. In 1989, he returned to the coaching ranks at San Jose State University, guiding the Spartans for nine years (1989-98). His stay in San Jose was highlighted by a Big West Co-Championship in 1994, and Big West Tournament Championship, NCAA bid, and first round match-up with Rick Pitino's Kentucky Wildcats in 1996. He is one of a handful of coaches to take three different schools to the tournament, and the only NCAA coach to do it with three schools from the same state.

Upon leaving San Jose State, Morrison served as a personal coach and consultant to Los Angeles Lakers’ center Shaquille O'Neal. He has also worked as a color commentator for Pac-10 and West Coast Conference basketball for FOX Sports and BAY TV.

Morrison has served the last 18 years as Chairman of the Board for High Five America, a San Diegobased organization, which uses basketball as a vehicle to combat gang violence, drug, and alcohol abuse issues. He currently serves as president of the board of trustees for Olive Crest, group homes for abused teenagers. Morrison serves on the executive board of the Inland Empire Boy Scouts of America, on the board of directors of the Riverside Humane Society, on the board of directors of ARC Riverside, and as a participant for "The Unforgettables" which provides dignified burials for children from poverty stricken homes. Morrison was event chair for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society "Light the Night" event on the UCR campus.

In his free time, Morrison enjoys working on his home and spending time with his grandchildren. He and his wife, Jessica, have two grown children and four grandchildren, and reside in Riverside.

## Timothy White <br> Chancellor

Timothy P. White, president of the University of Idaho, was named chancellor of the University of California, Riverside by the UC Board of Regents on May 15, 2008. The appointment, made on the recommendation of UC President Robert C. Dynes, took effect in August of 2008.

An immigrant from Argentina who attended all three systems of California public higher education and received his Ph.D. from UC Berkeley, White has three decades of experience in public research universities. He has held faculty appointments at Michigan, UC Berkeley, and Oregon State, where he served as provost and executive vice president, and as president on an interim basis, before joining Idaho as president in August 2004.

White, 58, led the renewal of the University of Idaho as president, placing a focus on strategic planning, diversity, improved communication, multidisciplinary research initiatives and the fostering of a student-centered culture. His academic background is in physiology, kinesiology and human biodynamics, and he is internationally recognized for his work in muscle plasticity, injury, and aging.

White succeeds former UCR Chancellor France A. Córdova, who stepped down last summer to assume the presidency of Purdue University. Robert D. Grey, a University of California veteran who previously served as provost and executive vice chancellor at UC Davis, has been serving the Riverside campus as acting chancellor.

Born in Buenos Aires, White as a child moved with his family first to Canada and then to Northern California. He is a naturalized U.S. citizen. A first-generation college
student, White began his higher education at Diablo Valley Community College. He achieved his B.A. at CSU Fresno; his M.S. at CSU Hayward; and his Ph.D. at UC Berkeley.

Upon completion of his Ph.D., White served as a postdoctoral scholar and then faculty member at the University of Michigan, ultimately serving as chair of the Department of Kinesiology. From 1991 to 1996 he was at UC Berkeley, serving as professor and then chair of the Department of Human Biodynamics. He subsequently joined Oregon State, where he served as dean of the College of Health and Human Sciences. In the early 2000s he




## Executive Associate AD/Senior Woman Administrator

UC Riverside hired veteran athletics administrator Janet Lucas as the department's executive associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator on November 1, 2006. She joined the Highlanders from Cal State Northridge, where she worked the previous three years as the senior associate athletics director and senior woman administrator. She was the interim director of athletics at Northridge from August 2005 to August 2006.

Serving as the department's second in command, Lucas assists with providing leadership, direction, and management for UC Riverside's seventeen-sport athletics program. Her responsibilities include supervising fourteen sports; overseeing the internal and day-to-day operations of the athletics department; supervising support service areas including academic services, business operations, compliance, event management, and sports medicine; overseeing the Academic Progress Program; managing the department's athletic scholarship program; serving as the university's senior woman administrator; and serving on various Big West and campus committees and the NCAA Division I Legislative Review and Interpretations Committee.

While at Northridge, Lucas supervised the internal operations of the athletics department, including all sport supervision and support services. She helped guide the department through a period of tremendous change and achievement and worked to enhance the program's visibility and external operations. Accomplishments included the addition of a $\$ 1$ million office building for athletics staff and coaches, stabilizing the financial foundation of the department, strengthening the campus integration of the department, and transforming the institution's compliance program.

She previously spent 15 years at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, VA, reaching the position of senior associate director of athletics/senior woman
administrator prior to heading west to Northridge in 2004. Her duties at James Madison included the supervision and evaluation of intercollegiate sport programs and coaching staff members as well as overseeing a comprehensive compliance program, eligibility certification for over 600 athletes, a $\$ 3.2$ million athletic scholarship program, and supervising various support service areas. During her tenure, the Athletics Department experienced a $56 \%$ increase in scholarship support, an overall operating budget increase of $74 \%$, and the addition of two varsity sports for women. The expansion of athletic facilities included the construction of a softball facility, a men's and women's soccer complex, and a new track facility. Program accomplishments included an NCAA national championship in field hockey and participation in NCAA tournaments for women's basketball (Sweet Sixteen), field hockey (Final Four), football, women's lacrosse (Final Four), men's soccer, and women's soccer (Sweet Sixteen).

Lucas earned her bachelor of science degree from Wake Forest University, graduating with honors in physical education. She received her master of sports administration from Ohio University in 1980 and shortly thereafter began her career in collegiate athletics administration with an internship at Baylor University. She joined the University of Maine in 1981 where she was promoted from assistant athletics business manager and ticket manager to the position of assistant director of athletics for finance and served as the senior woman administrator. Her responsibilities included budget development and supervision, athletic scholarships, ticket operations, and managing the athletic store. During her tenure at Maine, the sports programs qualified for thirteen different NCAA championship tournaments including five appearances in the College World Series.

## Dr. Anthony Norman Faculty Athletics Representative

In addition to his duties as professor of biochemistry and biomedical sciences at UC Riverside, Dr. Anthony W. Norman serves as the university's faculty athletics representative, the liaison between the campus and the NCAA.

Now the presidential chair and distinguished professor of biochemistry and biomedical sciences, Norman's career at UCR dates back to 1963 when he started at the school as an assistant professor. Since then he has served as chairman of the Department of Biochemistry and as dean of the UCR/UCLA Program in Biomedical Sciences and is internationally recognized for his research achievements in the study of vitamin D.

His research discovered that vitamin D is a steroid hormone. In 1967 his laboratory discovered the active form of vitamin D, namely 1,25-dihydroxyvitamin D3.

A number of drug formulations of hormone D have been prepared by pharmaceutical companies based on the pioneering work done at UCR. Additional research includes studies of molecular endocrinology, signal transduction and biomedical research. Norman has been honored with many awards and has been a visiting faculty member at the Mayo Clinic and Prix Andre Lichtwitz in Paris, France.

Norman received his undergraduate degree from Oberlin College in 1959, where he was a member of the nationally ranked soccer team and captain of the tennis team. He earned his Ph.D. in biochemistry from the University of Wisconsin, Madison, in 1963. Norman resides in Riverside with his wife, Helen Henry, who is also a professor of biochemistry at UCR.

Everett was a two-sport athlete as an undergraduate at Ohio Northern, competing in football and track and field. He was a five-time conference champion in hurdle and relay events and earned All-American Outdoor Track \$ Field honors in the $4 \times 100$ relay. He

After graduating with a BA in physical education, he went on to Ohio University to obtain a master's degree in athletic administration while serving as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach from August 1998 to June 1999.


Everett is a 1993 graduate of Shawnee High School in Lima, Ohio. While in high school he played three years of varsity football and earned first team all-conference and all-city honors his senior year. He also competed in four years of varsity track and was a state finalist in high hurdles. In his free time, Everett enjoys lifting weights, running, reading and watching movies. He and his wife, Mary, reside in Moreno Valley.

## UCR's Plan Of Attack For Building The Athlete

Strength and Conditioning Coach Josh Everett oversees a program designed to help UCR student-athletes reach new heights of physical excellence.
"Great athletes possess great strength, power, and flexibility in the 'core," Everett said. "This is where we place most of our emphasis." The UCR program consists of Olympic lifting, strength lifting, body weight calisthenics, plyometrics, medicine ball throws, agility work, speed work, stretching and tumbling routines, all designed to increase the strength of the 'core' of the body. Workouts are designed to compliment the practice schedule.
"The most important activity an athlete can do to improve at their sport is to work on the skill of the sport," he said. "But there are very few champion athletes today who are physically weak. Strength training is a must to become a standout athlete."
"We attack the weights in the same manner as we attack within the athletics arena," Everett said. "Since most sports are stand up power sports that involve multiple joints and muscle groups, we lift a large percentage of the time on our feet performing free weight, multiple joint/muscle exercises in an explosive fashion. We vary intensities in our training to develop speed, strength, and power. By doing these activities we maximize each athlete's potential and produce winning teams."

Balancing athletic commitments with academic commitments, representing ones school and community while finding one's own individual identity, developing chemistry with their teammates while trying to build lasting relationships with other students. These are just a few of the challenges that face student-athletes each and every day throughout their collegiate careers. All this in an attempt to get the most out of their college experience while trying to determine what the future holds for them.

To help them deal with these challenges, student-athletes have three resources to help them throughout their collegiate career: The CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, the Student-Athlete Mentors and the Student-Athlete Advisory Council.

CHAMPS / Lifeskills
UCR has participated in the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program since 1999. The program was developed to help student-athletes succeed in the classroom and community as well as in athletic competition. The five key components of the program are Academic Excellence, Athletic Performance, Personal Development, Career Development, and Community Service. While this program was developed specifically for student-athletes, the materials and resources benefit the entire campus. Programs and workshops are targeted specifically to student-athletes and teams, but most are open to other students as well.

UCR's program is run by CHAMPS/Life Skills Coordinator Doug Everhart, a health educator from the Division of Student Affairs. His expertise is in substance abuse and related health issues, as well as leadership training and development. He has had significant success in developing nationally recognized peer education programs. Under his leadership, UCR's "Golden ARCHES" (Advocating Responsible Choices through Health Education and Support) Peer Education Program has become one of the most respected in the nation. This
expertise and experience has earned him a spot on the NCAA's 12-member CHAMPS/Life Skills Advisory Team, which provides leadership and oversight for the overall program.

The cornerstone of the program is the Educational Speaker Series. This series brings in a number of guest speakers over the course of the school year on topics such as substance abuse, motivation, nutrition, date rape, and eating disorders. Topics are based on current concerns of the individual teams and address issues that can affect the entire campus community.

Each year, participating schools in the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program have the opportunity to send a studentathlete to the NCAA Foundation's Annual Leadership Conference in Orlando, FL. This unique opportunity brings together more than 700 student-athletes, from all sports and all divisions, for an intensive, two-day leadership conference. ## Student-Athlete Mentors

As one of the three organizations that make up the nationally acclaimed "Golden ARCHES" Peer Education program, the UCR Student-Athlete Mentors (SAMs) are committed to displaying a positive image to fellow athletes by providing help and support through education, awareness, and the promotion of healthy lifestyles. By utilizing comprehensive training and refined leadership skills, these dedicated student-athletes translate their own knowledge and passion into being a powerful influence and resource for their peers. While their primary objective is to prevent harmful situations from occurring, they are also equipped with the skills necessary to recognize areas of concern and to take action by involving the appropriate resources to address the problem.

Through awareness campaigns, educational workshops and speakers and informal interaction with their fellow student-athletes, they combine an ideal mix of education, peer influence, and role modeling to have a positive impact on their peers and the campus community. They have also taken this responsibility into the local community and around the country with active roles in community programming efforts as well as regional and national conferences. It is no coincidence that each UCR participant in the NCAA Foundation's annual Leadership Conference has taken an active leadership role in the Student-Athlete Mentors program.

The group is open to any student-athlete who wants to take on this leadership role. Members complete an application process that includes a written application and panel interview, which ensures that applicants truly understand and appreciate the commitment and dedication this important role requires.

## Student-Athlete Advisory Council

UC Riverside's Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student-athletes assembled to provide insight on the student-athlete experience. The SAAC also offers input on the rules, regulations, and polices that affect student-athletes' lives on NCAA member institution campuses.

An association-wide SAAC was adopted at the 1989 NCAA Convention and was formed primarily to review and offer student-athlete input on NCAA activities and proposed legislation that affected student-athlete welfare. In August 1997, the NCAA federated along divisional lines. The federation caused the SAAC to expand to three SAACs representing NCAA Divisions I, II and III. The mission statement of the National SAAC is "to enhance the total student-athlete experience by promoting opportunity, protecting student-athlete welfare, and fostering a positive student-athlete image."

NCAA legislation mandates that all member institutions have SAACs on their respective campuses. Further, NCAA legislation requires that all member conferences have SAACs. UC Riverside's SAAC team consists of two representatives from each sport program. In addition to their normal duties, they have been involved with several charitable events, including Adopt-A-Family at Christmas and the Special Olympics.

How To Become A Highlander Michael Scarano, Associate AD/Director of Compliance

What do I need to do to play at UCR as a freshman?
If you intend to participate in NCAA Division I or II athletics as a freshman, you must register and be certified by the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Center and the NCAA Amateurism Center. You can register on-line at https://web1.ncaa.org/eligibilitycenter/common/. You will need a major credit card to complete the on-line registration. When you are finished, print out the registration form and present it to your high school counselor. They will send the form along with your materials to the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Center for processing. After graduation and before your high school closes for the summer, your high school must send the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Center your final Official transcript that confirms graduation from high school. Your test scores (SAT, ACT) must be sent directly from the testing agency. The NCAA Initial-Eligibility Center no longer accepts test scores from high schools.

How do I know if I am being recruited?
You become a "prospective student-athlete" (PSA) when you start ninth-grade classes. Before the ninth grade, you become a prospective student-athlete if a college gives you (or your relatives or friends) any financial aid or other benefits that the college does not provide to prospective students generally. You become a "recruited prospective student-athlete" at a particular college if any coach approaches you (or any member of your family) about enrolling and participating in athletics at that college. Activities by coaches that cause you to become a recruited prospective student-athlete are: (1) providing you with an official visit; (2) placing more than one telephone call to you or any other member of your family; (3) visiting you or any other member of your family anywhere other than the college campus; or (4) issuing a National Letter of Intent or the institution's written offer of athletically related financial aid to you.

When may coaches talk to me and watch me play?
There are many specific NCAA rules which dictate when a coach may talk to you or watch you play. These rules vary depending on the sport, and the time of year. Often, calls are limited to a certain month, or to certain times every month. To get more information on what these rules are and which ones apply to you, please visit ncaa.org, or contact Michael Scarano at michael.scarano@ucr.edu.

What about making off-campus contact?
A contact is any face-to-face meeting between a college coach or athletics staff member and you or your parents, during which any of you say more than
"hello." Also, any such face-toface meeting that is prearranged or that takes place on your campus, at an organized competition or practice involving you or your high school, preparatory school, two-year college or all-star team shall be considered a contact, regardless of the conversation. Currently in all sports other than football, college coaches may contact you off the college campus no more than three times. However, a college coach may visit your high school (with the approval of your high school principal) only once a week during a contact period.

What are evaluations?
An evaluation is any off-campus activity used to assess your academic qualifications or athletics ability, including a visit to your high school (during which no contact occurs) or watching you practice or compete at any site. Currently in all sports other than football and basketball, a college coach is limited to seven opportunities (contacts and evaluations combined) to recruit you and not more than three of the seven opportunities may be contacts. In basketball, coaches have a limit of five opportunities with which to recruit you (contact and evaluations combined) off the college campus. Not more than three of those five opportunities may be contacts. Once you sign a National Letter of Intent, you may be evaluated an unlimited number of times by a college coach from the college with which you have signed.

When can coaches send me letters and e-mails?
In sports other than men's basketball, a member institution may not provide recruiting materials to a prospect (including general correspondence related to athletics) until September 1 at the beginning of the prospect's junior year in high school. In the sport of men's basketball, an institution may not provide recruiting materials to a prospect (including general correspondence related to athletics) until the conclusion of the prospect's sophomore year in high school.

Are there rules for boosters?
In addition to general recruiting regulations, no alumni, boosters or representatives of a college's athletics interests can be involved in your recruitment. There may be no phone calls or letters from boosters. If a UCR booster is contacting you, please contact the UCR Compliance Office as soon as possible at Michael.scarano@ucr.edu

On-campus living is an enriching part of the education experience. It allows students to become a part of the college community, providing an environment conducive to academic, as well as social, cultural, and personal growth.

A recent survey showed that students who live in the residence halls during their first year in college achieve a higher level of academic success.

The housing system also features Campus Apartments and Family Housing. Each format, as well as the individual complexes within the formats, exhibits its own unique flavor and advantages. Residential life provides a living environment close to campus, student development, educational, social, cultural and recreational programs, counseling and guidance services; supportive study environments, job and leadership opportunities, as well as wheelchair accessibility and convenient facilities for disabled students.

Students who plan to live in apartments or homes near the campus will find reasonably priced and readily available accommodations. In fact, the University of California Students Association found both on- and off-campus housing to be more affordable at Riverside than at any other University of California campus.

UC Riverside currently guarantees housing for one year for all freshmen and transfer students who comply with housing deadlines and requirements.



Located in the heart of the Inland Empire, the City of Riverside is situated in the Santa Ana River Valley, approximately 60 miles east of Los Angeles and 100 miles north of San Diego. The city offers a rich mix of recreational opportunities and cultural attractions and is also within an hour's drive of Southern California beaches, mountain ski resorts, and desert parks and preserves. The area enjoys a year-round temperate climate and an exceptional quality of life with its diversity, architectural beauty, cultural art museums, quality housing, and wide variety of recreational opportunities.

Riverside is a pleasant oasis in the inland region of Southern California. Its "Mediterranean image" derives from the many examples of fine architecture in the California Mission Revival and Spanish Colonial styles that dot its landscape, including the world famous Mission Inn Hotel in downtown Riverside.
Founded in 1870 by John North and a group of Easterners who wished to establish a colony dedicated to furthering education and culture, Riverside was built on land that was once a Spanish rancho. Investors from England and Canada transplanted traditions and activities adopted by prosperous citizens; the first golf course and polo field in Southern California were built in Riverside.
The first orange trees were planted in 1871, but the citrus industry Riverside is famous for began two years later when Eliza Tibbets received two Brazilian navel orange trees sent to her by a friend at the Department of Ag-
riculture in Washington. The trees thrived in the Southern California climate and the navel orange industry grew rapidly. Within a few years, the successful cultivation of the newly discovered navel orange led to a California Gold Rush of a different kind: the establishment of the citrus industry.
By 1882 , there were more than half a million citrus trees in California, almost half of which were in Riverside. The development of refrigerated railroad cars and innovative irrigation systems established Riverside as the wealthiest city per capita by 1895 .
Today, the city is a vibrant, culturally diverse center of commerce, finance, industry, and education in the Inland Empire with a population of more than 294,000. It has libraries, art and history museums, theaters, concert venues, a convention center, fine restaurants, quaint shops, modern shopping malls, and a wide variety of sports and other recreation ac-

tivities that make living here comfortable and fun. Its people reflect the same cultural and ethnic diversity found throughout Southern California, giving the city a rich, cosmopolitan feel. The city has over 96,000 trees, prompting the receipt of a Tree City, USA Award. Over 100 City Landmarks, 20 National Register Sites and 2 National Landmarks have been designated by the City Council, all offering enjoyment and education to city residents and visitors.
Riverside County, with a population of over 1.5 million people, borders densely populated Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, and San Bernardino counties. The county was formed in 1893 from almost 7,200 square miles of fertile river valleys, low deserts, mountains, foothills, and rolling plains, that extend from within 14 miles of the Pacific Ocean to the Colorado River.

## Southern California

Since World War II, Southern California has been a "go-to" destination for everyone from vacationers looking for the warm sun and beautiful weather to people looking to chase their dreams in the Golden State.

And what is not to love? From the mountains to the sea, all of Southern California has something to offer to everyone. It features diversity in all things: people, places, recreation and entertainment, academia, art, and neighborhoods.

UC Riverside is located in the "Inland Empire," a region that consists of both Riverside and San Bernardino counties. In recent years it has become one of the fastest growing and most vibrant and diverse areas in the nation. Once home to dairy farms, citrus groves and vineyards, the "IE" stretches some 27,363 square miles from the outskirts of Los Angeles to the Arizona and Nevada borders.

You name it, you can find it here. From the numerous golf courses and spa resorts of Palm Springs, the ski slopes of Big Bear Mountain, the water-skiing havens of Lake Elsinore and Lake Havasu, the Inland Empire is a yearround paradise for outdoor activity lovers. The San Bernardino National Forest and Joshua

Tree National Monuments provide a multitude of wildlife to the region while the Salton Sea is one of the most dynamic ecological studies on the West Coast. ## Climate

Riverside enjoys a Mediterranean-type climate: warm to hot, rain-less summers and mild winters with light rainfall. For the most part, the city offers dry air with a minimum of fog and rain. Summer daytime highs are frequently more than 90 degrees but evening temperatures drop greatly, ranging from 50 to 65 degrees and are accompanied by cool desert or marine breezes. Low humidity keeps even the hottest summer days from being overly oppressive, especially in comparison with eastern climates.

When UC Riverside opened in February 1954, it had classrooms, a new Physical Education Building, and a student body eager to inaugurate the new school. What it didn't have, however, was a mascot.
The controversy raged throughout the opening weeks of that inaugural school year as different factions argued over what symbol should represent the newest UC school. Many wanted a bear symbol that could compete with the Bruins of UCLA and the Bears of Berkeley, while others wanted to go in a completely different direction, demonstrating the independence and uniqueness of the school.

A total of 67 nicknames were initially suggested by the student body. The names ran the gamut, from the wild (Bearcats, Rams, Bisons, Badgers, Gorillas) to the uninspired (Rovers, Ramblers, Possums, Chihuahuas, Valencias). There were colorful names (Red Raiders, Golden Eagles, Bluejays, Golden Beavers, Orangemen), names befitting the area's heritage and environment (Caballeros, Friars, Vaqueros, Rattlers, Scorpions, Pioneers) and names that were, frankly, just weird (Aphids, Rocks, Bondsmen).

An election in November 1954 saw none of the proposed six nicknames receive a majority. While "Cubs" was the most popular of the six, many rallied against it because it showed the campus as a "little brother" to schools like UCLA and Cal. A write-in campaign, led by the men's basketball team, was begun for the name "Hylanders," a name suggested by freshman Donna Lewis. The name was changed to its current spelling and won easily. In recognition of her contribution to the university, Lewis received a lifetime pass to all athletic events.
"Highlanders" fit the campus well for several reasons. The Box Springs Mountains, which stand behind the campus, were known as the Highlands. In addition, UCR is the highest elevation campus in the UC System.

The name proved to be a solid compromise. UCR Publicity Director Howard Cook had a friend create an aggressive little bear wearing a kilt for the school's logo, and the campus took on a Scottish flare as buildings were named after Scottish regions. There was a brief uproar in 1988 when the athletics department proposed changing the mascot to a human figure in a kilt, a plan that was quickly scrapped.
But change was inevitable, and it occurred after the 1998 passing of the referendum that approved the move to Division I. Much as they had done years earlier, student-athletes took the lead, approaching the administration and saying that they "didn't want a teddy bear in a dress" to represent them.
The change took time, money and input from New York based SME Design, Inc., a logo development company. Several logos were designed, including the current one with a bear featuring a half-blue face in homage to William Wallace, the Scottish hero and the subject of the movie Braveheart.

## Why Blue \& Gold?

Every school in the University of California System has some combination of blue and gold as their school colors. The colors were selected for th $\square$
landscape, the student cadet uniforms and the number of Yale graduates who were instrumental in the founding and administration of the university. Gold was considered because of California's designation as the Golden State and the color of many native wildflowers, such as the California Golden Poppy. Unable to decide between the two, the committee asked their female classmates to decide. Student Rebekah Bragg Cummings suggested using both colors, and the committee agreed.

## Riverside Sports Complex



The home of UC Riverside baseball is the Riverside Sports Complex. The RSC is used for all UCR practices and all games, as well as for several high school events and the annual July 4 fireworks.

Located at the corner of Blaine and Rustin Streets, the stadium has a beautiful view of the nearby Box Springs Mountains and seats 2,500 fans. The field was the site of the NCAA Division II College World Series from 1980 to 1984 and was the home of the Riverside Pilots and Riverside Red Wave of the California League.

Several improvements were made during the 2007 season, including a new hometeam locker room along the left field line, constructed by former Highlander Troy Percival, and a statue of the UCR Bear in concrete near the entrance to the facility.

The stadium features excellent home team locker facilities and has a pair of hitting cages located underneath the grandstands. Dimensions of the field are 330' down the lines, 380 ' to the alleys and 400 ' to center field.
