SPURS/HEAT POSTSEASON INFO: Marks the first time the Spurs and Heat have met in the NBA Finals ... San Antonio leads the series 3-2 ... the Silver and Black outlasted the Heat in Game 1 92-88 at Miami on 6/6 ... Tony Parker connected on a double-clutched bank shot in closing seconds of the shot clock to secure the Spurs victory ... Parker finished with a game-high 21 points, while adding 6 assists ... Tim Duncan chipped in with 20 points, 14 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 blocks ... Kawhi Leonard add his own double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds ... Danny Green tallied 12 points, including 4 three-pointers and 5 rebounds ... LeBron James posted a triple double with 18 points, 18 rebounds and 10 assists ... the Spurs fell to the Heat 84-103 in Game 2 at the AmericanAirlines Arena ... Danny Green finished with a team-high 17 points and shot a perfect 6-6 from the floor and 5-5 from three-point distance ... Parker tallied 13 points and 5 assists ... Leonard pulled down a game-high 14 rebounds ... James led the Heat with 17 points, 8 rebounds, 7 assists, 3 steals and 3 blocks ... Mario Chalmers posted a game-high 19 points and 4 rebounds ... the Silver and Black routed the Heat 113-77 in Game 3 at the AT&T Center ... San Antonio was led by Green's postseason career-high 27 points, including 7-9 from three, 4 rebounds and 2 blocks ... Neal recorded a postseason career-high 24 points, including 6-10 from three-point range, 4 rebounds and 3 assists ... Leonard and Duncan each added a double ... Leonard tallied 14 points, 12 rebounds and 4 blocks ... Duncan chipped in 12 points, 14 rebounds and 2 blocks ... San Antonio fell to the Heat, 93-109, in Game 4 ... the Spurs were paced by Duncan's 20 points and 5 rebounds ... Parker added 15 points and 9 assists ... James tallied a game-high 33

points, 11 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals and 2 blocks ... Wade added 32 points, 6 rebounds, 4 assists, and 6 steals ... Bosh finished with 20 points, 13 rebounds, 2 steals and 2 blocks ... HOW THE SPURS ADVANCED TO THE FINALS: The second-seeded San Antonio Spurs swept the seventh-seeded L.A. Lakers in the first round ... proceeded to beat the sixth-seeded Golden State Warriors 4-2 in the Western Conference Semifinals ... progressed to sweep the fifth-seeded Memphis Grizzlies in the Western Conference Finals.

HOW THE HEAT ADVANCED TO THE FINALS: The first-seeded Miami Heat swept the eighth-seeded Milwaukee Bucks in the first round ... progressed to beat the fifth-seeded Chicago Bulls 4-1 in the Eastern Conference Semifinals ... proceeded to defeat the third-seeded Indiana Pacers 4-3 in the Eastern Conference Finals.

SPURS/HEAT REGULAR SEASON SERIES INFO: The Silver and Black fell to the Heat 2-0 in the regular season series ... the Heat handed the Spurs a 105-100 setback on 11/29/12 at the AmericanAirlines Arena ... Gary Neal paced the team with 20 points and 7 assists off the bench ... Tiago Splitter added 18 points and 9 rebounds ... Matt Bonner posted a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds ... Nando De Colo chipped in 15 points, 6 rebounds and 5 assists ... the Big Three and Danny Green did not play ... Miami was led by LeBron James, who finished with 23 points, 9 rebounds, 7 assists and 4 steals ... Dwyane Wade added 18 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists ... Chris Bosh posted 18 points and 12 rebounds ... in the second meeting, Miami outlasted the Spurs 88-86 on 3/31/13 at the AT&T Center ... Duncan finished with 17 points, 12 rebounds and 2 blocks ... Kawhi chipped in 17 points, 11 rebounds and 2 steals ... Splitter added 7 points, 10 rebounds and 2 steals ... marked the first time three Spurs recorded double-digit rebounding this season ... Tony Parker finished with 12 points and 8 assists ... Bosh had a game-high 23 points and 9 rebounds ... the Heat were without LeBron James, Dwyane Wade and Mario Chalmers ... San Antonio has an overall record of 34-17 against the Heat.

SPURS/HEAT CONNECTIONS: The Heat's 90-79 win at San Antonio 12/23/96 was big for several reasons ... in the second quarter of the game, David Robinson suffered a broken bone in his left foot and missed the remainder of the 1996-97 season ... in addition, it was the first time in Heat history that Miami had won a game in San Antonio ... prior to the win, the Heat had dropped 10 straight games in San Antonio ... later that year Miami handed the Silver and Black a 79-72 setback on 3/2/97, making it the only season the Heat have swept the regular season series from the Spurs ... on 2/1/03 Tim Duncan set a Heat opponent's record when he grabbed 23 defensive rebounds at Miami ... he also had two offensive rebounds in that game for a total of 25 rebounds, the second-most by a Heat opponent ... the Spurs own two of the top three opponent-highs for steals in a game in Heat history ... San Antonio has 22 steals on 1/23/89 (tied for first) and 21 on 11/30/88 (second) ... In the same season (2010-11), the Spurs tied their largest margin of victory (30) over the Heat in a 125-95 win, while the Heat set the mark for their largest win over the Spurs (30) by a score of 110-80 in Miami ... Spurs Matt Bonner and Heat Udonis Haslem were teammates at the University of Florida from 1999-2002 ... Spurs Danny Green and Heat LeBron James were teammates at Cleveland during the 2010-11 season.

Tim Duncan paced the Spurs with his 10th double-double of the postseason, recording 30 points and 17 rebounds. Kawhi Leonard added 22 points, 11 rebounds and 3 steals. LeBron James powered the Heat with 32 points, 11 assists and 10 rebounds. With 5 three-pointers in Game 6, the Spurs have totaled 55 three-pointers in six NBA Finals games, which surpassed the all-time NBA Finals record for threes made in a series of any length. The Spurs trailed by two after a back-and-forth first quarter. San Antonio held a 50-44 lead at halftime led by Duncan, who had 25 points at half. The Spurs took a 10-point advantage going into the final quarter. The fourth quarter was full of drama as Miami rallied a 10-2 surge to take the lead, 87-84, with 2:57 remaining in the fourth. The Spurs countered with their own 8-0 run to take a five-point lead, 94-89, with 28 seconds remaining in the game. Leonard and Ginobili each missed one free throw which would prove costly as two three-pointers by LeBron James and Ray Allen sent Game 6 into overtime. The Heat outscored the Spurs 8-5 in extra time to extend the Finals to a Game 7.</p>

Manu Ginobili made his first postseason start since June 4, 2012 vs. OKC in the Conference Finals. Ginobili 24 points and 10 assists. Tony Parker had 26 and 5 assists. Danny Green continued his hot shooting tallying 24 points, including 6 more three-pointers and now has 25 in the series, breaking Ray Allen's Finals record of 22. The Silver and Blacks' starters accounted for 107 points in Game 5. The Spurs got out to a 17-point lead in the first half. The Heat cut the Spurs lead to one point in the third quarter and the San Antonio answered back with a 19-1 run. The Spurs lead the entire game, with the game being tied only three times. The Spurs largest lead was 20 points in the fourth quarter. The Spurs shot 60 percent from the field in Game 5, tying for second for the highest field-goal single-game playoff percentage in the Gregg Popovich/Tim Duncan era.</p>

Dwyane Wade added 32 points, 6 rebounds, 4 assists and 6 steals. Chis Bosh finished with 20 points, 13 rebounds, 2 steals and 2 blocks. The Silver and Black opened the game with a 15-5 run to take an early lead. Miami responded with a 36-17 rally from the first quarter through the five minute mark of the second quarter. The Spurs responded with an 18-8 run tying the game, 49-49, going into halftime. In the third the Spurs cut the deficit to two points but the Heat would take a two-possession lead into the final act. HEAT (13-6, 1-2) – 77 SPURS (14-3, 2-1) – 113 AT&T CENTER 06/11/13 NBA Finals Game #3 Playoff Game #17		SAN ANTONIO – In Game 3 of the NBA Finals, the Silver and Black outlasted the Heat 113-77. The Spurs were paced by Danny Green, who finished with a game-high and career postseason-high 27 points and made a postseason-high 7 three-pointers. Gary Neal finished with a postseason-high 24 points, connecting on a career postseason-high 6 threes. The Spurs set a Finals record with 16 three-pointers. Green and Neal became the first two teammates to each make 6+ three-pointers in an NBA Finals game. The Spurs held a four-point advantage after the first quarter, 24-20. Miami climbed out of an eleven-point deficit to tie the game at 44. San Antonio closed the half with two 3-pointers, including a buzzer-beater by Neal. In the second half, the Silver and Black went on a 29-8 run and never looked back. In the fourth quarter, Green powered the rally by scoring 14 points and connected on 4 three's. LeBron James was limited to 15 points on 7-for-21 shooting. The Spurs committed just 13 turnovers and out rebounded the Heat 52-36.

The Spurs were powered by Tony Parker, who finished with a game-high 21 points, while adding 6 assists. Tim Duncan posted a double-double with 20 points, 14 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 blocks. Kawhi Leonard added his own double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. Danny Green tallied 12 points, including 4 three-pointers and 5 rebounds. LeBron James paced Miami with a triple double, notching 18 points, 18 rebounds and 10 assists. The Spurs went on a 9-0 spurt early in the first quarter but trailed by one, 24-23, heading into the second quarter. Duncan hit an 18-foot shot with 0.8 seconds left to cut the deficit to three, 52-49, at halftime. San Antonio went on a push in three quarters, cutting Miami's lead to one in early minutes of third. Miami would respond and maintain their lead in the quarter, while taking a 72-69 lead into the final act. The Silver and Black claimed the lead for good on a jumper by Leonard, 79-78, with seven minutes remaining in the game. The Spurs had their largest lead of seven points, 88-81, after Green's three-pointer with 2:13 remaining. Miami would score five straight points with 1:28 left in the game. Duncan and James would exchange free throws, but it was Parker's heroics that sealed the Spurs fate. With the shot clock winding down, Parker released a double-clutched bank shot just as the buzzer sounded with five seconds left. His shot secured the Spurs a 1-0 advantage in the Finals. Game 1 featured seven lead changes and was tied six times. The Spurs are now a perfect, 5-0 in Game 1's of the NBA Finals.

NBA FINALS NOTES

QUICK HITS:

- **Tim Duncan, Tony Parker** and **Manu Ginobili** are the **first trio** on a team other than the Celtics and Lakers to reach the **NBA Finals four times together** (Elias).
- With an **NBA Championship** in **2007**, the **San Antonio Spurs** became just the **third** team (Lakers and Bulls) since the 1976-77 ABA/NBA merger to **win four championships in a nine-year span**.
- **Tim Duncan, Tony Parker** and **Manu Ginobili** have combined to play **62 NBA Finals games**.
- With their first trip to the **NBA Finals** in **1999**, the **Spurs** became the **first** former **ABA team** to advance to the **Finals**.

SPURS IN THE FINALS: The San Antonio Spurs are making their fifth appearance in the NBA Finals, which ranks eighth all-time in Finals history. San Antonio is 4-0 in their previous appearances, winning titles in 1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007, making them only one of two teams (Chicago Bulls, 6-0) in NBA history to make more than one trip to the NBA Finals and never lose a series. The Spurs are .679 (19-9) all-time in NBA Finals games, which marks the second-best winning percentage of any team in Finals history. The Silver and Black own an 11-3 (.786) overall home record in the NBA Finals and an 8-6 (.571) road record. Here's a look at the best winning percentages of all-time in NBA Finals history:

NBA FINALS THREE-POINT RECORD: Danny Green has connected on 26-of-43 (.605) three-pointers in the NBA Finals. With 6 three's in Game 5, Green broke the NBA Finals record for three-pointers made for a Finals series of any length. He surpassed Ray Allen's (Celtics) 22 threes in Boston's six-game win over the Lakers in 2008. Green is also just 3 three-pointers away from surpassing the overall NBA Playoff record for three-pointers made in a series (any length), which is held by Ray Allen (Milwaukee in 2001 vs. Philadelphia)* and by Dennis Scott (Orlando in 1995 vs. Indiana)* with 28 treys. *Both seven-game series.

SPURS THREE SPREE: With 5 three-pointers in Game 6, the Spurs have made 55 three pointers in six NBA Finals games, surpassing the all-time Finals record for threes made in a series of any length, which was held by the Celtics with 52 threes in six-game Finals win in 2008 over the L.A. Lakers.

GAME 3 THREE-POINT SHOOTING: The San Antonio Spurs set an NBA Finals single-game record with 16 three-pointers. The previous Finals mark was 14 3PT FGM by Houston (vs. Orlando in Game One in 1995), Orlando (vs. Houston in Game Four in 1995) and Miami (vs. Oklahoma City in Game Five in 2012).

THREE'S COMPANY: The Spurs Danny Green (7-9 3FG) and Gary Neal (6-10 3FG) became the first two teammates to each make at least six-or-more three-pointers in an NBA Finals game and were career postseason highs for each payer.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The San Antonio Spurs 36-point victory, 113-77, in Game 3 is the third-largest margin in NBA Finals history and the second-largest in Spurs postseason history. It was surpassed only by Bulls over Utah in Game Three in 1998 (96-54, 42 points) and by Celtics over Lakers in Game Six in 2008 (131-92, 39 points).



NBA FINALS NOTES

GREEN FOR THREE: Danny Green has made 26 three-pointers through four Finals games, which marks the most threes in a Finals series in Spurs franchise history. The previous record was held by Robert Horry, who connected on 15 three-pointers in 2005 NBA Finals against the Detroit Pistons.

SHOOTING TOUCH: Danny Green went 5-for-5 from three-point range in Game 2, setting a Finals record for most three-pointers made without a miss. The previous record was four, held by Boston's Scott Wedman (1985) and Paul Pierce (2008).

BALL SECURITY: The Silver and Black tied an NBA Finals record for fewest turnovers in a game with four turnovers in Game 1. The previous record was held by the Detroit Pistons when they recorded four turnovers in Game 4 vs. San Antonio on June 16, 2005. The Spurs (4) and the Heat (9) combined for 13 turnovers, which marked the fewest amount of turnovers for both teams in a Finals game.

GAME ONE WINS: The Spurs won Game 1 92-88 against the Heat and have won the first game of each of the five NBA Finals series they have appeared in since joining the NBA. San Antonio joins the Boston Celtics as the only teams in NBA history to win at least five consecutive Game 1's in the Finals. The Celtics won Game 1 in seven consecutive Finals appearances from 1959 to 1965.

PARKER'S GAME ONE: Tony Parker finished with game-high 21 points, 6 assists and zero turnovers and became just the fifth player in NBA Finals history to record at least 20 points, 5 assists and zero turnovers. Here's a look at the other five players:

GROUNDHOG DAY: Tim Duncan tallied 20 points and 14 rebounds in Game 1 at Miami, which marked his 15th NBA Finals game (has played in 24 Finals games) with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds.

TIM DUNCAN IN THE FINALS: Tim Duncan, AC Green and John Salley are the only players in NBA history to make an NBA Finals appearance in three different decades. Salley is the only player to win three Finals in three different decades, winning titles with Detroit in 1989, Chicago in 1996 and the L.A. Lakers in 2000. Duncan has appeared in the NBA Finals in 1999, 2003, 2005, 2007 and now 2013. That 13-year span between his first and most recent Finals appearance is the most years with the same time in NBA history (Elias).

LEONARD IN THE POSTSEASON: In his two playoff stints before his 22nd birthday, Kawhi Leonard has won 25 games in 34 appearances, which ranks only behind Kobe Bryant (27 wins) and Tony Parker (26 wins). The NBA sophomore is averaging 11.3 points, 7.6 rebounds and 1.56 steals while shooting 53.5 from the field and 42.1 from three-point range in his postseason career. Leonard is the only player in NBA postseason history to appear at least 10 playoff wins with those combined statistics before their 22nd birthday. His 53.5 percent shooting from the floor is the best shooting percentage among all NBA players who've made at least 50 field goals in the postseason among players under 22 years old.

NBA D-LEAGUE IN THE NBA FINALS: The Spurs have three players (Aron Baynes, Nando De Colo and Cory Joseph) who appeared in a NBA D-League game this season which marks the first time in NBA history a Finals team has featured at least three players who played in the D-League and be on a NBA Finals roster in same season. Since the NBA D-League's inaugural season in 2001-2002, there have been a total of 19 players to appear in the NBA D-League and appear in the NBA Finals in the same season. Seven out of the 18 players were part of an NBA Championship team that same season. The last Spur to appear in the D-League, advance in the NBA Finals and win was James White during the 2006-07 season.

INTERNATIONAL FLAIR: Entering the 2013 NBA Finals, San Antonio has nine internationally-born players on its roster, which marks the most in NBA Finals history. Aron Baynes (Australia), Nando De Colo (France), Boris Diaw (France), Tim Duncan (Virgin Islands), Manu Ginobili (Argentina), Cory Joseph (Canada), Patty Mills (Australia), Tony Parker (France) and Tiago Splitter (Brazil) help make up a group of 58 internationally-born players to ever reach the Finals in NBA history.

FOREIGN REIGN: Tim Duncan is the only internationally-born player to reach the NBA Finals five times. Duncan, Manu Ginobili and Tony Parker are the only internationally-born players to ever reach the NBA Finals four-or-more times. Parker became the first European-born player in NBA history to earn the Finals MVP award in 2007.

FOUR FINALS MVPS: The 2013 NBA Finals will feature four former NBA Finals MVPs in Tim Duncan and Tony Parker of the Spurs and LeBron James and Dwyane Wade of the Heat. This marks the fourth time in NBA Finals history that at least four former NBA Finals MVPs played in the same NBA Finals. Here's a look at that list:

COACH POP IN THE FINALS: With four NBA titles, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich is one of just five NBA coaches in NBA history to have won at least four NBA championships, while being the only active coach. Among the five coaches, Coach Pop has the highest winning percentage .679 (19-9) of any in the Finals. Here's a closer look at head coaches to win four-or-more NBA Finals:

QUICK HITS:

- **San Antonio** has won a playoff series against every team in the Western Conference **except** the Houston Rockets after outlasting the Golden State Warriors in the semifinals.
- **Tony Parker** scored 32 points at Golden State on 5/10, which marked his 14th career postseason game to score 30-or-more points.
- **Manu Ginobili** has scored 18-or-more points off the bench 29 times in the playoffs ... the Spurs are 23-6 in those games, while winning 18 of the last 20 games.
- **Tim Duncan** has won more playoff games in his career (132) than 20 of the other 29 current NBA franchises.
- The **Spurs** have the **third highest defensive efficiency** in the 2013 Playoffs at **98.7** and **second highest offensive efficiency** at **106.5**.

DUNCAN ALL-NBA: Tim Duncan was named to the 2013 All-NBA First Team, which is his 14th All-NBA selection in his career. Duncan's 14th All-NBA Team selection ranks tied for second all-time in NBA history with Karl Malone and Shaquille O'Neal. Ahead of him are Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Kobe Bryant with 15 All-NBA selections. Duncan has been named to the All-NBA First Team 10 times becoming just the ninth player in NBA history with 10-or-more selections. He joins Kobe Bryant (11), Karl Malone (11), Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (10), Elgin Baylor (10), Bob Cousy (10), Michael Jordan (10), Bob Pettit (10) and Jerry West (10). This year marks Duncan's NBA-record 14th time he has appeared on both the All-Defensive Team and All-NBA Team in the same season. On May 13, Duncan was named to the NBA All-Defensive Second Team. Duncan becomes the oldest player selected on the All-NBA First Team since Abdul-Jabbar (38-years-old) was named to the First Team in the 1985-86 season.

PARKER ALL-NBA: Tony Parker was named the league's 2013 All-NBA Second Team. The honor marks his third All-NBA Team selection. Parker was named to the All-NBA Second Team in 2012 and was an All-NBA Third Team selection in 2009, when he became the first European-born point guard to be named to an All-NBA team. Duncan and Parker's All-NBA honors mark the seventh time in Spurs franchise history that two teammates have earned All-NBA honors in the same season. The last time was when Duncan (Second team) and Parker (Third team) were selected in the 2008-09 season. The selections mark the 38th time in team history that a Spur has been selected to an All-NBA team, which includes 19 First Team selections, 10 Second Team selections and nine Third Team selections.

ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM: Tim Duncan was named to the 2012-13 NBA All-Defensive Second Team and leads all players in NBA history with 14 All-Defensive Team selections over the span of his 16-year career with the Spurs. Duncan's 14th All-Defensive Team selection ranks him two ahead of Kobe Bryant and Kevin Garnett who have each been selected to 12 NBA All-Defensive Teams. Also trailing Duncan on the list are Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (11) and Scottie Pippen (10). The NBA introduced the All-Defensive Team in 1968-69. Duncan was named to the NBA All-Defensive First Team eight times in his career (1999-2003, 2005, 2007 and 2008) and to the Second Team on six occasions (1998, 2004, 2006, 2009, 2010 and 2013).

PLAYOFF TRIOS: With a 94-82 win at Golden State on 5/16/13, the Spurs trio of Tim Duncan, Manu Ginobili and Tony Parker won their 94th playoff game together which surpassed the Lakers trio of Magic Johnson, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Byron Scott for the most wins in NBA postseason. 18 DIMES: Tony Parker handed out a postseason career-high 18 assists, 8 of those coming in the third quarter which tied a franchise playoff record for assists in a quarter vs. Memphis on May 21. Parker's previous playoff high was 14 vs. Utah on 5/22/07. The last time a Spurs player had 15-or-more assists in a game was Avery Johnson vs. Phoenix on 4/26/96. Parker also scored 15 points and is the second player (Johnny Moore) in Spurs history to have that many points and assists in a playoff game.

500: Tim Duncan, the NBA's all-time postseason leader in blocks with 509, became the first player in NBA postseason history to record 500 blocks after blocking four shots vs. Memphis on 5/21/13. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar is second all-time with 476 career playoff blocks.

200 GAMES: Tim Duncan played in 200th playoff game at Golden State on May 16 and became just the seventh player in NBA postseason history to reach the 200-game plateau. Here's a look at the seven players to play in 200 playoff games:

PLAYOFF EXPERIENCE: The Spurs have played in 210 playoff games since Tim Duncan's arrival to San Antonio in 1997. Since 2003, Duncan, Manu Ginobili and Tony Parker have played in 156 playoff games together, the most playoff games played as an active trio in the NBA. He has notched 146 career postseason double-doubles, which ranks second all-time after surpassing Wilt Chamberlain when he posted 24 points and 10 rebounds at Memphis on 5/25/13. Duncan has scored in double figures in 201 of 210 career playoff games and has also tallied 96 20-point and 10-rebound performances, which ranks fourth all-time. 4,000 POINTS & 2,000 REBOUNDS: Tim Duncan scored 17 points vs. Utah on 4/29/12 to become the seventh player in NBA history with at least 4,000 career points in the postseason. Duncan also joined an elite group with Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Karl Malone, and Shaquille O'Neal as the only players with both 4,000 points and 2,000 rebounds in the NBA playoffs.

DUNCAN ATOP ACTIVE POSTSEASON LEADERS: Tim Duncan ranks highly among active players in several postseason statistical categories and is the Spurs franchise leader in numerous statistical categories. Duncan is the NBA's all-time playoff leader in defensive rebounds with 1,830. (NBA started tracking defensive rebounds during 1973-74 season). - The Spurs were one of four teams (Miami, Oklahoma City and L.A. Clippers) ranked in the top-ten in offensive efficiency and defensive efficiency. San Antonio was tied for **third** in **defensive efficiency at 99.2** and **seventh** in **offensive efficiency at 105.9**.
- The Spurs ranked **third** in **points per game differential** (103.0 to 96.6); averaging **6.4 more points** than their opponent.
- The Silver and Black were **one** of **two** teams (OKC) to rank in the **top-five** in points, field goal, three-point field goal and free throw percentage. The Spurs ranked **fourth** averaging **103.0 points**, **second** shooting **.481** from the **floor**, **fifth** shooting **.376** from **three-point range** and **fourth** shooting **.791** from the **free throw line**.
- San Antonio used **13 different starters** this season and had the **most players** with at least **one start** in the NBA.
- The Spurs set a **franchise-high** connecting on **20 three pointers** vs. Dallas on 12/23. The 20 treys ranks tied **fifth** in the NBA for the most three-pointers in a game since 1986-87. San Antonio's previous record was set earlier this season with 19 three-pointers at Charlotte on Dec. 8, 2012.
- The Silver and Black set a NBA 2012-13 **single game season-high** handing out **41 assists** vs. Sacramento on 3/1.
- **Tony Parker** was named Player of the Month in January as he averaged a team-high 21.9 points, 7.9 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 1.13 steals in 33.3 minutes while shooting .563 (135-230).
- **Tony Parker** recorded his **first career triple-double** at Houston on Dec. 10 recording 27 points, 12 assists and 12 rebounds.
- **Tony Parker** scored in double figures in a career-high **56** straight games.
- **Tim Duncan** was named the NBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, Nov. 19, through Sunday, Nov. 25, which was his 21st time earning Western Conference Player of the Week honors.
- **Tim Duncan** leads the NBA with **767 career double-doubles** among active players and posted **36 double-doubles** during the 2012-13 campaign.
- **Tim Duncan** and **Tony Parker** have played in **816 regular-season** games together which is the **highest total** for any pair of current NBA teammates. The next active duos are **Ginobili** and **Duncan** with **678**, **Parker** and **Ginobili** at **661**, then Udonis Haslem and Dwyane Wade at 569 (games through 04/17/13).
- **Manu Ginobili** is one of just two players (Kyle Korver) since 1985 to be drafted 45th or lower and appear in over 700 NBA games.
- Baynes, De Colo, Diaw, Ginobili, Mills, Parker and Splitter all competed in the 2012 Summer Olympics and the **seven Olympian** participants are currently the **most** on a NBA roster this season. The Spurs set a new **NBA-record** with **nine international players** with the addition of Aron Baynes.
- **Tim Duncan** was selected as a reserve to his **14th NBA All-Star game** and **Tony Parker** was selected as a reserve to his **fifth NBA All-Star game**.
- **Kawhi Leonard** was selected to Team Chuck in the BBVA Rising Stars Challenge, marking the second time he was selected to the event.

SOUTHWEST SEASONING: With a 99-97 win vs. Atlanta the Spurs clinched the Southwest Division title for the third consecutive year. Since joining the NBA in 1976-77, San Antonio has won 19 division titles which is the most of any team during that time period, surpassing the L.A. Lakers 18 division titles in that time period. In the Tim Duncan era starting in 1997, the Silver and Black have posted 10 division titles, the most in the NBA during that span.

LONGEST PLAYER/COACH TANDEM: Tim Duncan and Coach Popovich have been together for 16 seasons which is the longest with in the NBA history. There hasn't been a pairing in the NFL or NHL which was 16 seasons long. In MLB, there has been many combo's with 16-or-more seasons in MLB with the longest being Honus Wagner who played for Fred Clarke for 19 seasons.

NIFTY-FIFTY: The Spurs extended their NBA-record of 50-or-more wins to 14 consecutive seasons with a 92-91 victory vs. Dallas on 3/13. Last season, San Antonio surpassed the previous record by the Los Angeles Lakers, who won 50-plus games in 12 straight seasons from 1979 to 1990. GAME LEADER: Tim Duncan was the outright leader in points, rebounds and blocks in five games this season which is the highest total for any player in the NBA. He did this most recently on 3/29 vs. LAC, and previously on 3/27 vs. Denver, 3/20 vs. Golden State, 11/9 at Sacramento and 12/18 at Denver. Only Dwight Howard (2) has done this more than once.

DUNCAN'S 2013 NBA MILESTONES: Tim Duncan supplanted Charles Barkley into 22nd on the NBA's all-time scoring list at L.A. Lakers on 4/14. He surpassed Shaquille O'Neal into 13th on the NBA's all-time career rebounding list vs. Utah on 3/22/13. The Big Fundamental surpassed Robert Parish into 23rd on the NBA's all-time scoring list at Golden State on 2/22/13. The former Demon Deacon surpassed Tree Rollins into eighth on the NBA's all-time blocked shots list vs. Houston on 12/28/12.

THE AGELESS WONDER: Tim Duncan had one of the best seasons for a post player at 36 years old. The Big Fundamental averaged 17.8 points, his highest since 2009-10 when he averaged 16.6 and averaged 9.9 rebounds, which was his highest since 2009-10 when he pulled down 10.1 per game. Duncan has scored 20-or-more points in 23 games this season after only scoring 20-or-more in 11 games in all of last season. He also has recorded 19 20-point/10-rebound games this season. PARKER'S SEASON ACCOLADES: Tony Parker was the only player in the NBA to average at least 20.0 points and 7.0 assists while shooting over 50.0 percent from the field and 80.0 percent from the free throw line. He led all guards in the NBA in shooting percentage. The Frenchman was one of three players (LeBron James and Russell Westbrook) to rank in the top 10 in points and assists per game. Parker led the NBA in scoring off pick and rolls this season, with an average of 8.5 points per game and led all NBA point guards this season with a 10.1 points per game average in the paint.

SK: Tony Parker recorded his 5,000th assist of his career vs. L.A. Lakers on Jan. 9 becoming the first Spur to 5,000 assists in franchise history. Parker has accumulated 5,247 career assists and is one of seven active point guards (Kidd, Nash, A. Miller, Billups, Paul, Williams) in the NBA with 5,000 career assists.

PARKER'S DOUBLE-DOUBLES: Tony Parker accumulated a single season career-high 17 double-doubles (points and assists) surpassing his previous high of 15 during the 2008-09 season. Parker led the NBA this season in most games (30) leading his team in points and assists.

GINOBILI'S 15 DIMES: Manu Ginobili finished with a career-high 15 assists vs. Sacramento on March 1. His 15 helpers were the most by a Spurs player off the bench since John Lucas handed out a Spurs-record 24 assists vs. Denver on April 15, 1984. Ginobili now has had a 45-point game, a 15-rebound game and a 15-assist game in his career becoming just one of five active players to accomplish those statistics. Since 1985-86, the only other players to accomplish these numbers are Larry Bird, Clyde Drexler, Magic Johnson, Michael Jordan and Scottie Pippen.

BALL MOVEMENT: San Antonio ranked first in the NBA in assists averaging 25.1 and is the highest for the Silver and Black since the 1995-96 Spurs team which averaged 24.9 assists. The Silver and Black handed out a team season-high 41 assists vs. Sacramento on March 1, which is the most assists in a game in the NBA this season. KAWHI NOT: The Spurs forward had a career first by scoring 20-or-more points in consecutive games by recording 23 points, 6 rebounds, 2 steals and 2 blocks vs. Atlanta on 4/6. Leonard finished with 24 points, 14 rebounds and 6 assists in his previous game at Oklahoma City on 4/4.

SOPHOMORE SENSATION: Kawhi Leonard recorded career-highs of 14 rebounds and 6 assists, while scoring a team-high 24 points (third highest scoring output in his career) at Oklahoma City on 4/4. This marked the first time in his career he led the Spurs in points, rebounds and assists in a game. Earlier this season, he scored career-high 26 points and made a career-high 11 baskets at Chicago on 2/11.

STICKY FINGERS: Kawhi Leonard led the team in steals, swiping 1.67 per game and recorded two-or-more steals in 30 games. The former Aztec led all sophomores averaging 1.50 steals through his first two seasons.

GREEN LIGHT: Danny Green averaged a career-high 10.5 points this season after averaging 7.3 in his first two seasons. He ranked fifth in the NBA in three-point field goal percentage and shot .429 (177-413) from downtown. Green ranked sixth in the NBA with 177 treys made. When he connected on two-or-more three-pointers in a game the Spurs were 36-10.

THREE-POINT ASSASSIN: Danny Green's 177 three-pointers made ranked second in a single season in Spurs franchise history. He was 14 three's away from the Spurs franchise single season record of 190 three-pointers by Chuck Person during the 1995-96 season.

SPLITTING THE ROCK: Tiago Splitter was a formidable compliment to Tim Duncan in frontcourt throughout the 2012-13 season. Splitter averaged a career-high 10.4 points and a career-high 6.4 rebounds this season. He ranked seventh in the NBA, shooting .560 (315-563) from the floor. The Brazilian tallied a career season-high of 11 double-doubles; he had three career double-doubles entering this season.
