



Bus pick-up points

Buxton - the station car park.

Chapel-en-le-Frith - on the High Street - under the railway bridge for Manchester, and opposite the New Inn Pub for Buxton.

Davenport - Bramhall Lane - for Manchester and Stockport buses pick up at the entrance to Cale Green Park, and the opposite side of the road for Hazel Grove.

Deansgate - bus stops on Whitworth Street.

Disley - on Buxton Road Way (A6) - buses for Buxton will pick up outside the Rams Head Pub, and on the opposite side of the road for Manchester.

Dove Holes - the bus stops on Buxton Road - outside the Church for Buxton, the opposite side of the road for Manchester.

Furness Vale - on Buxton Road - buses for Manchester pick up outside of the Soldier Dick Hotel, and the opposite side of the road for Buxton.

Hazel Grove - from Bus Stop C in the station car park.

Heaton Chapel - the bus stops on Wellington Road - next to the junction with Brook Street for Stockport, and next to the junction with Claremont Avenue for Manchester.

Levenshulme - the bus stops on Stockport Road - same side of the road as the station for Manchester Piccadilly, the opposite side for Stockport.

Manchester Oxford Road - the bus stops on Whitworth Street West - on the same side of the road as the station for Liverpool, the opposite side for Piccadilly.

Manchester Piccadilly - the bus stops on the station approach.

Middlewood - the bus stops on Buxton Road (A6), next to the junction with Norbury Hollow - same side of the road at the station for Buxton, the opposite side for Manchester.

New Mills Newtown - at the bus shelter and bus stop located in the station car park.

Salford Crescent - outside the station next to the roundabout.

Stockport - at the rail replacement bus shelter outside the station entrance.

Whaley Bridge - at the Jodrell Arms on Buxton Road - same side as the pub for Manchester, the opposite side for Buxton.

Woodsmoor - on Bramhall Lane - the bus stop between Barnfield Road and Ashfield Road for Manchester and Stockport, and next to the junction with Woodend Road for Hazel Grove.

We're sorry but we can't carry dogs or non-folding prams, pushchairs, bikes and wheelchairs on the replacement buses.

Through trains and connections

At the side of the station name **a** means arrival time and **d** means departure time. If the train times are in **bold type** you won't have to change trains.

If your arrival time is shown in light type, change at the previous station whose time is printed in bold type unless a footnote gives other instructions.

If your departure time is shown in light type, change at the next station whose time is printed in bold type unless a footnote gives other instructions.



No smoking

Smoking is not permitted on stations or on trains.



Buying your ticket

It's a legal requirement to have a valid ticket or pass before you start your journey and you risk prosecution if you travel without one.

You must buy your ticket from the ticket office or ticket vending machine **before** getting on the train. If the ticket office is closed or you board at an unstaffed station you can buy your ticket from the conductor on the train. If you avoid using the ticket office or vending machine when they're available, the conductor will charge you the full Anytime Single/Return fare.
