Junior Athletics Success

Congratulations to our year 7 and year 8 students who performed so well in the recent District Championships held in Reading. Best team performance came from the year 7 boys who achieved an excellent third place overall.

Top individual performances came from: Max Barker (7N) who was runner up in the shot put and third in the 200m and Semiti Marautaki (8B) who came runner up in javelin and third in the 200m. Both the boys were selected to represent the District in the County Championships, along with: Matthew Bozier (7W) in the long jump, Katie Standen (7N) in the 1000m, William Hendry-Chrystal (7W) in the high jump, Tiarnan Power (7W) in the 600m, Brogen Nevitt (7N) in the javelin and Hannah Weaver (8B) in the high jump. Hannah did particularly well coming runner-up in the Hampshire Championships, achieving a personal best of 1.42mtrs.

Warhammer

On Wednesday 27th June the Warhammer School's League team went to Nottingham to compete in the National finals of the competition. Louise is currently participating in the World Choir Games in Cincinatti with the Farnham Youth Choir. They have taken part in two competitions, one for youth choirs (up to age 24) and the other for choirs of all ages (some of these choirs were professional). In the youth choir competition, Farnham Youth Choir won a gold medal, coming fourth overall (only beaten by two choirs from China and one from Israel). In the other competition they won a silver medal. These are fantastic results for the choir, the only competitors from Great Britain. School uniform

In response to concerns raised in the parents' survey, from September we have a new system in place to ensure high standards of uniform. Any students who fail to wear the correct uniform or present themselves incorrectly throughout the school day will be issued with a 15 minute detention for that evening; any further violations will lead to additional 15 minute detentions up to a maximum of an hour. When purchasing clothes for next term please bear this in mind; the specific uniform requirements are **listed below.** Sometimes students put their own interpretation on the requirements to their parents, which results in parents wasting money on items which are inappropriate for school. The presentation of students is important in terms of how the school is perceived in the wider community and also engenders a sense of pride in the school for students.

The skirt chosen by Court Moor and stocked by Brenda's is the Henley skirt by Blue Max Banner. Parents and students are also reminded that thin canvas shoes are not appropriate footwear for school.

Finance Information

Free School Meals

The free school meal allowance will remain at £2 from September. This amount will be automatically credited each day to the cards of students who qualify for free school meals. Please refer to our recent parentmail for information about making an application or see our website. We would like to urge all families eligible for this service to make an application, even in circumstances in which children opt to eat a packed lunch. Important decisions are made about additional funding for the school based upon the

numbers of children on roll who are eligible for free school meals and your child could be missing out if we are not aware of this eligibility. All applications must be made online: please contact Mrs Rothwell in the Finance office if this causes you any difficulty.

Music Tuition

If you returned a form requesting music tuition for next year for your child you should have received two copies of our contract, one to sign and return and one to keep. If you have not received a contract and your child is hoping to continue lessons, please contact Mrs Rothwell in the Finance office. Next year's fees will be £234, which can be paid in full in September or in two instalments of £117 in September and January. If you would like your child to start lessons, please write to Mrs Rothwell and your child's name will be placed on the waiting list for the appropriate instrument. No money should be sent until we are able to offer a place.
