#### **INTRODUCTION**

This finding aid covers the gubernatorial papers of Tennessee Governor William Bowen Campbell, who served from 1851-1853. It consists of two boxes, in thirteen folders, of materials that consist of correspondence, petitions for pardons, and miscellaneous materials.

# **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

## William Bowen Campbell

1807	Born August 19, the first child of David and Catherine (Bowen) Campbell on his father's farm in Sumner County, Tennessee, within a few miles of Nashville. He studied law under the direction of his cousin Governor David Campbell of Abingdon, Virginia, and began the practice of his profession at Carthage, Tennessee.
1835	Married Frances Owen.
1836	William B. Campbell volunteered for the Seminole War and faught with gallantry as a Captain of a company in a regiment commanded by Col. William Trousdale. In the following year he defeated Trousdale in a campaign for the lower house of Congress despite the fact that the latter had the support of Ex-President Jackson.
1851	William Campbell was the gubernatorial Candidate of the Whigs, and again William Trousdale was his Democratic opponent. He was the last Whig governor of Tennessee.
1860	The final phase of his life began with the fateful presidential campaign. He gave his support to John Bell, the Union Candidate, he opposed secession and remained loyal to the Union throughout the war.
1865	Elected to the lower house of Congress, he supported the conservative policies of President Johnson.
1867	Died August 19.
