Gosnell is just the tip of the genocidal iceberg

The conviction of Philadelphia's infamous child murderer, Dr. Kermit Gosnell, is just the tip of the genocidal iceberg that is sinking America. An objective study of the impact of abortion on America and its minorities will show that abortion is sinking America just as surely as the iceberg that sank the Titanic a century ago.

I should know because I've been pursuing such a study ever since the economic impact of abortion caught my attention 20 years ago. Back then, abortion had already taken the lives of 32 million people. That was equivalent to the population of our 25 largest cities, from New York all the way down to cities the size of Washington, DC.

The only comparison I could think of was the impact of a major nuclear war. That's why I called my report, "The Abortion Bomb." In it, I predicted the demographic crisis that has since hit our economy. Nobody on Wall Street even saw it coming.

Today, the abortion toll has risen to more than 56.5 million people -- equal to the population of our 82 largest cities.

Every year abortion wipes out the equivalent of 5 more cities the size of Madison, Wisconsin. The toll is now equal to 18% of our total population.

How can that not have anything but a major dent on our economy? On housing and consumer demand? On production and the wages workers are paid?

In overall economic terms, the loss represents at least \$50 trillion in lost GDP.

Yet the power of the politically correct ideology that protects the abortion industry is so strong that this massive toll largely escapes the attention of our media, our major institutions, Wall Street, and sadly even most of our churches.

All of them have suffered massively from its impact, yet few powerful voices are raised against it. Amazing!

The relative silence of the majority is reminiscent of Germany in the mid-1930's when few voices of conscience were raised against the imposition of conformity to Nazi ideology even among Germany's churches. Those who dared to speak out against it, like Dietrich Bonhoeffer, soon found their way to Hitler's extermination camps.

To defeat that ideology, it took a world war and the loss of 45 million lives.

The irony is that the central idea behind Nazism is exactly the same idea behind today's "culture of death" -- namely that some lives are worthier than others, and that a civilization willing to suspend the unalienable right to life of every human person can long endure.

In Germany, Hitler thought he could get away with murdering 6 million Jews and 6 million more dissidents on top of that. But the abortion industry in America today not only gets away with exterminating 56.5 million future taxpayers, producers and consumers, but government subsidizes it to the tune of \$450 million taxpayer dollars a year.

Thanks to mass murderer Kermit Gosnell, however, that may soon be changing.

Here is a black abortionist, trained by Naral abortionists in New York in the late 1960's, who proved himself guilty of the worst practices of the so-called "back alley abortion" scourge. Yet, for 40 years, Gosnell escaped even the most superficial scrutiny by government authorities in the State of Pennsyvania.

If you ran a saloon or drove a car in Pennsylvania, you got more public scrutiny every year than Gosnell got all through his long, murderous career.

That's because he was one of the abortion industry's elite -- one of the nation's top 1,000 abortionists who account for a million abortions a year among them.

However, Gosnell didn't get his come-uppance because of abortion. He got caught when the FBI began investigating him for drug trafficking. Only then did they discover Gosnell's "House of Horrors," where black women died and hundreds, if not thousands, of black babies were born alive only to have their spinal cords scissored.

For that, Gosnell collected \$1600 or more for each "late term" abortion. He gave "black-onblack crime" a whole new meaning by exploiting his own poorly paid and badly treated workers while pocketing millions.

Yet when the news broke, the lamestream media was too busy giving 24/7 coverage to the Jody Arias trial to cover the far more significant Gosnell case. Fox News' covered it, including a 1-hour special with Bret Baier. CNN's Anderson Cooper covered it, too, but missing were the major networks and the liberal print media like the NY Times.

Coincidental with the Gosnell verdict is another major new factor -- the growing unrest in the black community over abortion's genocidal impact.

Thanks to a new **National Black Pro-Life Coalition**, that issue is about to explode. More than a dozen black leaders have formed a coalition that promises to bring a new spirit of unity and solidarity to the whole pro-life movement.

They also happen to have the facts on their side, not just empty ideology.

- To date, there have been an estimated 20 million black abortions. That's nearly half the current U.S. black population of 41 million. If that's not genocide, what is?
- Blacks currently make up 12.9% of the population, but account for a whopping 35.5% of all abortions -- nearly 3 times their weight in the population.
- Even more dramatic is the fact that 54.4% more black lives are lost every year from abortion than from all other causes of death -- including old age, diseases of every kind, street crime, drugs, you name it.
- Among whites, the ratio is dramatically lower -- 80% fewer abortions than deaths from all other causes. The contrast is stark.

The new Black Pro-Life Coalition argues convincingly that none of these disparities would exist were it not for two factors:

- 1. Deliberate targeting of minority communities as part of an ideologically-driven marketing strategy by the abortion industry. From its beginning, the abortion movement has called for targeting "inferior" races. Today, every major urban center with large minority populations are ringed by abortion mills. Public schools in minority neighborhoods are also the focal point of school-based clinics promoting condom use, freer sex, and inevitably -- more teen abortions.
- 2. Complicity by leading black politicians who have essentially sold out their own

people in return for political and financial support from the abortion industry.

The president is a case in point. As an Illinois Senator, he voted three times to prevent the passage of a law requiring medical attention for children born alive after botched abortions. There isn't a hair's difference between his position and the day-in, day-out practice at the Gosnell clinic, where babies born alive were routinely murdered.

In a recent speech, Obama told Planned Parenthood, "You've got a president who's going to be right here with you fighting every step of the way," mainly against state laws imposing new restrictions on abortion. He left no doubt about his support of abortion.

But that doesn't deter this new generation of black leaders like Star Parker, Walter Hoye, Dr. Alveda King, Ryan Bomberger and more than a dozen others who gathered for two recent 45-minute conferences in Washington, DC.

In a statement, the Coalition said:

"Abortion is the #1 killer of African-Americans. More precious lives are killed by this unjust act than all other causes of death—combined! Yet, certain black leaders (including Jesse Jackson, Julian Bond, and the Congressional Black Caucus) continue to embrace death as a solution to unplanned Life. We are calling these leaders out for allowing political and personal gain to monumentally shift their consciences."

Two 45-minute videos were produced at the conference, including testimonies by each of the participants. Both videos are well worth watching by pro-life leaders across the racial and religious spectrum. Indeed, one of the Coalition's most important contributions may well be its example of pro-life unity and solidarity across organizational lines.

Until that same kind of unity and solidarity exists throughout the pro-life movement, there is no way we can win this struggle. Restoring America's Right to Life depends on it.
