Let me tell you about a group in our congregation that needs your support. This small group takes on a very important and honored task for the congregation. While they may not think of their actions in this way, I view what they do as focusing us on who we are as a congregation: people who come to be with each other, to be counted and to pray. I urge you to consider join-

ing this group and encourage others to do so.

Who is this group and what do they do, you ask? This is the group of people who make the minyan at our Sunday and Wednesday morning services in the Beit Midrash. They choose to be a part of the group for personal reasons and they come with varying degrees of regularity. They come to be together, to offer certain prayers, to assist others and to join in prayer with the group. Each person adds so much to the experience and, I'm sure, each benefits from the experience as well.

There is the man who comes every week to say Kaddish for his father and another who says Kaddish for his mother. There is the wife who comes to make sure her husband does not have to (continued on page 3)



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Cantor Murray E. Simon

On behalf of the congregation, I want to thank Cantor Simon for his long tenure as he nears the end of his service to The Jewish Center as our Cantor. Sunday evening, May 16 at 6:00 p.m., we will gather in tribute to Cantor Simon. I hope you will join us for an evening of musical tribute to him after his 14 years with us.

In addition to being an outstanding presence on the bimah, projecting great warmth and caring, Cantor Simon has a distinguished academic record. He has been awarded honorary Doctor of Music degrees from Hebrew Union College and The Jewish Theological Seminary, a Master of Music degree from Hebrew Union College, as well as a Bachelor of Music degree in performance from Temple University.

Cantor Simon has helped prepare well over 600 of our students for their bar or bat mitzvah ceremonies, and beyond that he created the Yad Squad of over 50 teens to bring many of these b'nai mitzvah back to read Torah again and again. In fact, the Cantor has created a culture of lay daveners and leyners- including 75 Torah read- (continued on page 2)

We also want to thank and recognize Fran Amir, who will be retiring at the end of the year as Principal of the Religious School, to spend more time with her family.

Since becoming Principal of TJC's Religious School in 1997, Fran's accomplishments have been many and impressive. She introduced the Siyyum Tichon trip to Biloxi and inaugurated Gan Katan (our pre-kindergarten program), added Hebrew language enrichment to the three day program, strengthened and expanded our Shabbat morning youth services, increased opportunities for family learning, spear-headed our award winning Yachdav (special needs) program, created a cadre of teen madrichim (student aides), secured a grant to purchase Smart Board technology, initiated a youth program to complement formal religious school education, and so much more. CANTOR'S Notes



A TIME OF THE GIVING ... AND THE RECEIVING?

SHAVUOT, the Feast of Weeks,

is so-called because it falls a week of weeks or forty-nine days after the second day of Passover. This holiday gets the "short end of the stick" when it comes to celebrating the Three Festivals or Shalosh R'galim of Pesach, Sukkot and Shavuot. The other two pilgrimage holidays extend for a week (eight days outside of Israel), while Shavuot is just two days. The companion holidays have very strong symbols and rituals associated with them. The lulav and etrog and the beautiful sukkah grace the harvest festival of SUKKOT, whereas the strong symbols of the matzah and seder meal make PESACH the most celebrated of all of the Jewish holidays. What is the strong symbol for Shavuot? - the cheery, cherry, cheese blintz! How did it come to be that eating dairy foods is all we have to do to celebrate the Feast of Weeks?

SHAVUOT is described as "z'man matan torateynu" - the "time of the giving of our Torah". This is the historic and religious occasion that transforms a rag-tag rabble of former slaves into the People of Israel - thus they became an ordered and law-abiding society. It has always bothered me that the nomenclature for the holiday has been known as the time of the "giving" of the Torah - and not the time of the "receiving" of the Torah. "Receiving" would imply the active acceptance by the Jewish People of God's laws and mitzvot. You can give someone a beautifully wrapped gift for a special occasion, but if they don't unwrap it, open it up and, even m o r e, use and enjoy the gift for the purpose for which it w a s intended, of what



benefit is the gift? The Torah is a beautiful gift given to us by God on Shavuot. Let us unwrap it, open it up and "receive" its rewards and benefits.

Why dairy foods on Shavuot? One midrash states that the Torah is as nourishing to us as a mother's milk is to her offspring. Thus, the cheery, cherry, cheese blintz! Chag Sameyach.

say Kaddish alone. There is the couple who goes together to volunteer at the hospital after minyan. There is the man who says Kaddish for his daughter every time he is with us and one who always says a personal prayer for his father. There are two sisters that come together regularly to say Kaddish for their father. There is the person who loves to lead us at the weekday minyan, which he does very well. There are some who could not imagine missing the minyan because there is no place they would rather be. There is one who sits at the back table and enjoys going back and forth between speaking to God and speaking to his buddy next to him. There are some people who come so that others who need to say Kaddish have the required ten. Some people like the smaller, less formal, more succinct service which also allows them the opportunity to try new skills like leading the service or reading Torah.

There are many uplifting moments in our weekday minyan such as a recent anniversary, marking the end of the year of mourning, a teenager joining us to read. We also experience emotional times when people join us to say Kaddish, when we read the list of names for the healing prayer, when we recite the personal El Maleh Memorial prayer for a relative on their yahrtzeit or when we commemorate an important date in the Jewish calendar. There was a sad time recently when we only had nine people and were unable to say all of the prayers.

The weekday minyan can meet many personal needs. The timing, content, music, size and length of the service are all quite different from the Shabbat morning service. People attend the minyan for a variety of reasons. It can be a place to grow and look to the future as well as a time to reflect and remember a loved one. The only thing it needs is you.

Consider joining us in the Beit Midrash, on Sundays at 8:30 a.m. and on Wednesdays at 7:00 a.m. We would love to welcome you. You will be helping us guarantee our minyan of ten and your voice will be added to the others as we pray for the things we all need: health, strength and community.

PROF. ALAN MANN PREHISTORIC ART AND THE HUMAN COGNITION

WEDNESDAY, MAY 26 AT NOON

Humans are unique among the living creatures on the planet. It has often been suggested that language and symbolic representation are the singular attributes that distinguish our kind. But when and under what circumstances in our biological history did these features arise? By exploring the earliest manifestations of human art and symbolism left to us in archaeological sites and deep in caves, we can gain insight into how we came about. Many of these creations represent works of great genius but their meaning and significance to the people who made them remain a mystery.

ALAN MANN, professor of anthropology at Princeton University, is a most engaging lecturer. He also holds a research appointment in the Anthropology Laboratory of the University of Bordeaux. His primary interest is the fossil evidence for human evolution; he has done field work in Africa, Asia, Europe and Australia and now works primarily in the southwest of France. His current research focuses on the evolution of the Neanderthals and their relationships to modern peoples. A particular interest of his is the origin of language and art and their importance in the emergence of the quality of 'humanness' – a topic he explicates with striking graphics.



Fran is a devoted educator, gracious coworker and special person who shares many of the outstanding attributes of the four matriarchs – Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah.

Our matriarch Leah had thirteen children, the average size of one class in Religious School and coincidentally, the same number of years Fran has been the Principal of the Religious School. Fran is not only a teacher and administrator, but also an ima -a mother like Leah, treating the children who cross the threshold to the Religious School office and the classrooms

as her own. One of her greatest strengths is in making each class into a family of sisters and brothers, inspired and excited to learn. Fran becomes a family member who is there for all life cycle events, welcoming when students begin Religious School, proud when they are blessed in Gimmel, kvelling when they become a Bar/Bat Mitzvah and delighted to see them as teens at Siyyum Tichon and as madrichim

in the Religious School. While we will not see Fran in Religious School any more, she has been responsible for making hundreds of special Jewish memories for all of us that we will remember with fondness.

Our matriarch Rachel was beloved and cherished by her husband, Jacob. Likewise, there are so many things that students, their parents and staff cherish about Fran. Coming to school each day with an enthusiasm that is contagious, encouraging her staff to teach in creative ways, fine tuning programs for children and parents,

On May 12, the lower front parking lot, known to the Nursery School as the Riding Lot, will be transformed into a community--our community-- complete with a Synagogue, Post Office, Library, Flower Shop, Bakery and more. Each class will have the opportunity to visit the community and participate in an activity at all the establishments along the way. Then it's off to the Pizzeria for lunch with all our school friends before heading to, what might be for many, their 1St Rock Concert ever! That's right, Mr. Ray, a famous children's Rock artist will perform right here at The Joan Levin Nursery School! Community Day is surely a highlight event of the year and we're certainly looking forward to this one. If you happen to be in the neighborhood, please stop in and visit with us.




