NOTE: Obviously, there is a problem with the consistency of these studies; also there is a need to clarify methodology used, the sample size and geographical distribution, the definitions for each category, the possibility of sampling errors, etc. It appears that the "Protestant" category for the 1990 poll probably included Marginal Christian groups, such the Mormons and Jehovah's Witnesses, rather than including those groups in "Other Religions." Also, there appears to be a serious overcount in the category "None/No Answer" for the 2000 poll, which was reported to be 35% and an undercount in the category "Protestant," which was reported to be 10%.
