

The Lumberjacks have made Homer Bryce Stadium one of the toughest places for opponents to play. SFA has posted a 19-3 (.864) record at home in the last three seasons.

The 'Jacks ushered in a new era in 2003 with the addition of luxury suites and the Touchdown Club located in the remodeled press box. The suites and Touchdown Club continue to be a big hit.

Prior to the start of the 2013 season, SFA replaced the surface at Homer Bryce Stadium. During the summer, a Hellas' Matrix Turf was installed. The surface

includes more color than the previous turf. It consists of purple end zones with white lettering. The north end zone will have "Stephen F. Austin" and the south "Lumberjacks" with the new SFA logo at the 50-yard line.

Prior to the press box renovation, the last major reno-

vation was the addition of a new wing to the field house, located at the north end of the stadium.

The east wing of the field house is a two-story structure housing football offices and meeting rooms on the top floor and visitor dressing rooms on the ground floor.

Lumberjack Stadium, as it was first called, opened in time for the 1973 season with 14,575 seats, all between the 20-yard lines. The bowl-type construction of the stadium also affords blanket seating on the steep grassy banks that surround the field, increasing capacity to more than 25,000. In fact, the largest crowd to ever see a football game in the stadium was listed as 23,617 when the

Lumberjacks took on McNeese State in 1995.

The 'Jacks defeated Cameron University 17-0 in the first game played in the stadium on Sept. 8, 1973, and have gone on to post a 138-96-2 (.589) record in the facility. SFA also is 4-1 in postseason play in the stadium.

In 1986, the stadium was renamed Homer Bryce Stadium in honor of SFA benefactor Homer Bryce. Bryce's association with SFA began in the 1930s when he attended the school as a student and ran track for the Lumberjacks. He served as a member of the SFA Board of Regents from 1974 until his retirement in 1994. Bryce passed away in July 1996.

The stadium also is one of the top track and field facilities in East Texas. During the summer of 2006, the track surface was replaced with a state-of-the-art Tartan polyurethane surface. The 400-meter track surface meets all NCAA and IAAF requirements.

Prior to the 2007 season, SFA remodeled the football locker room. SFA replaced the carpet, added

more lockers and installed four flatscreen, high-definition televisions.

The artificial playing surface has made an impact on SFA and Nacogdoches. Homer Bryce Stadium is the host to numerous high school football playoff games and marching band contests involving East Texas public schools. The stadium has also hosted the Region III Class A Track and Field meet. Three times in the past 13 years SFA

and Homer Bryce Stadium hosted the SLC Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

The Lumberjacks will play five home games at Homer Bryce Stadium this fall.

Two-Time SLC Coach of the Year

Entering his ninth season with the Lumberjack football program, J.C. Harper is in his seventh season as Stephen F. Austin's head coach. The architect season as Stephen F. Austin's head coach. The archite of SFA's most successful two-year stretch in program history, and one of the nation's most explosive offenses, the 'Jacks hold one of the Southland Conference's best records over the course of the past four seasons, a stretch which includes two SLC titles, two top-10 finishes and consecutive trips to the NCAA playoffs. The two-time SLC Coach of the Year is only 14 wins shy of becoming the school's all-time winningest head coach.

Harper had to build the Lumberjack program from the ground up. Taking over a program that went 0-11 during his first season, Harper orchestrated one of the nation's biggest turnarounds guiding the Lumberjacks to a conference title just two seasons later. SFA ended the season ranked among the nation's top 10, and advanced

to the second round of the FCS playoffs. It was the first Southland Conference title for SFA since 1999.

Following the '09 campaign, Harper was recognized for his efforts being named the SLC Coach of the Year, and finishing second by only two points for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award.

Just for good measure, Harper's troops repeated that winning formula the following season by recording another Southland title, its second-straight top-10 ranking and received a bye in the opening round of the playoffs. It marked the first time in program history that a Lumberjack football team won back-to-back conference titles at any level. In addition to the

team's success, quarterback Jeremy Moses became the first player in SFA and Southland history to win the Walter Payton Award, the FCS' version of the Heisman Trophy.

Although Harper's background was on the defensive side of the ball, the two-time Southland Coach of the Year has produced some of the nation's most explosive offenses since 2008. The 2013 season marked the third time in the past four years SFA has led the nation in passing offense during the regular season. The Lumberjacks have been ranked among the nation's top six in passing each of the past five seasons, with two passing national titles. SFA has ranked among the nation's top 10 in total offense each of the past four seasons, and among the nation's top 10 in scoring offense in three of the last four seasons.

In addition to the two passing national titles recorded under Harper, SFA has also led the nation in several other categories. During the 2011 season, the Lumberjacks posted the nation's top mark in sacks, tackles for losses and pass protection.

Harper's athletes have reaped the benefits of his time as head coach. Over the course of the past six seasons 93 SFA athletes have earned All-SLC honors. including 26 first-team selections and 55 have received All-America honors including 2010 Walter Payton Award winner Jeremy Moses, and 2013 CFPA Elite Defensive Performer Willie Jefferson. In addition to that, Harper has produced three league newcomers of the year, two players

> of the year, two defensive players of the year, an SLC offensive player of the year and has had two players drafted, and nine others signed free agent contracts.

> Harper came to Nacogdoches as the defensive coordinator prior to the 2005 season. In his first year, Harper was given the task of guiding a youthful defense through the rigors of one of the nation's toughest schedules. During his second year on the job, Harper began to see some of the fruits of his labor. Harper turned a defense that finished near the bottom in every statistical category in 2005, into the most effective defense in the league. SFA led the SLC in scoring defense, rush

defense and total defense during league games in 2006.

A 23-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Harper was at Western Michigan prior to joining the SFA staff. He was the defensive coordinator for coach Gary Darnell in 2004 and served as the defensive line coach in 2003. His defensive line was ranked third-best in the MAC. He also coached Jason Babin, a first-round draft pick of the Houston Texans while at WMU.

Prior to Western Michigan, Harper spent four seasons as an assistant in the SLC helping Northwestern State and McNeese State to three playoff appearances. Harper was the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach for Scott Stoker at Northwestern State in 2002 when the Demons posted a 9-4 record and earned an FCS playoff spot. The Demons were first in the SLC in total defense in 2002, giving up only 276.6 yards per game.

Harper also spent a season as the defensive coordinator at Southwest Missouri State in 1997 and served an earlier stint as the defensive line coach at Western Michigan in 1996. He spent four seasons as the defensive line coach at Southwest Missouri State from 1992-96.

Following a four-year playing career at Clemson, where the Tigers won three ACC Championships, Harper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at North Carolina under Mack Brown. He later served two seasons as a graduate assistant for coach Lou Holtz at Notre Dame.

Harper and his wife, Marcie, are the parents of a son, Michael (7) and daughter, Emma (3).

NINTH SEASON

Clemson, 1991

Arlington Nunn is in his second stint at SFA, returning to the Piney

Woods in January 2005 and entering his eighth season with the 'Jacks and his third working with the SFA secondary. Nunn is entering his first season coaching the running backs, and serving as the special teams coordinator, after spending the previous eight seasons working with the Lumberjack receivers and secondary.

Nunn has made a name for himself in Nacogdoches of transforming his athletes into one of the best groups in the Southland Conference. In three seasons working with the Lumberjack wide outs, he has produced three all-conference selections, including Dominique Edison who would go on to become an All-American, the school's all-time leading receiver and a NFL draft selection. Nunn was then switched to the defensive side of the ball taking over the Lumberjack secondary. He immediately turned the defensive backs into one of the most improved units in the nation. In 2009, newcomers Andre Banks and Josh Aubrey earned all-conference honors, while Cory Barlow turned in a career year closing out his senior season earning honorable mention All-America honors.

Nunn has produced 12 All-SLC selections in the past eight years, including three first-team selections. Nunn has also coached a former conference newcomer of the year and four All-Americans.

Nunn originally came to Nacogdoches in 1996 where he spent five seasons working with the 'Jacks' linebackers and secondary. He helped tutor two-time All-American and former Pro Bowl linebacker Jeremiah Trotter. He also was a member of the 1999 coaching staff that guided the 'Jacks to a Southland Football League title. The Clearwater, Fla., native has made stops at Baylor, Navarro Junior College and Sam Houston State before arriving on the SFA campus in 1996. After leaving Nacogdoches, Nunn spent three years as the receivers' coach at Troy State and was the running backs' coach at Mississippi in 2004.

A 1991 graduate of Clemson, Nunn was a standout performer for the Tigers, helping Clemson to fourstraight 10-2 records and two ACC titles. An Academic All-ACC pick as a junior, Nunn was a member of the Tigers' top-ranked defensive unit during his final season.

A 19-year college coaching veteran, Nunn holds a Bachelor of Science in marketing from Clemson and a Master of Science in education from Baylor. Nunn and his wife, Monique, are the parents of two daughters, Alyssa (10) and Aria (4).

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/ LINEBACKERS

SIXTH SEASON

SFA, 1989

David Gibbs is entering his sixth season as SFA's defensive coordinator

and also coaches the Lumberjack linebackers.

SFA has had one of the most productive defenses, and produced some of the nation's top talent during Gibbs' five years on campus. The Lumberjacks have ranked among the nation's top 25 in sacks every season under Gibbs, including three top-10 marks. SFA has also landed among the nation's top 20 in tackles for losses (TFLs) in each of the past four years, including the 2011 season when it led the nation in sacks and tackles for losses. The 'Jacks' rush defense has been ranked among the top 25 three times during that stretch, and SFA was 14th nationally in total defense during the 2011 season.

The players have reaped the benefits of Gibbs' tutelage during his time as coordinator. The Lumberjack defense has produced numerous All-Americans, including Willie Jefferson who was named 2012 CFPA Elite Defensive Performer, two conference defensive players of the year, and former linebacker Jabara Williams was drafted by the NFL. In addition to Williams' selection in the 2011 draft, Jefferson and corner Josh Aubrey signed NFL free agent contracts.

After a slow start to the 2011 season that saw SFA stumble to a 1-5 start, Gibbs made some changes and the Lumberjacks immediately became one of the more stingy units in the country. The 'Jacks had only 11 sacks through the first six games, but closed the season strong leading the nation in both sacks (4.4 pg) and tackles for losses (10.2 pg). Led by an intimidating defense, SFA won its final five games and produced the SLC Newcomer of the Year, Willie Jefferson. The Baylor transfer set school (4.5 sacks) and conference (5.0 sacks) records for sacks in a game.

As a team SFA closed out the 2011 campaign ranked among the nation's top 15 in total defense. The 'Jacks allowed their opponents fewer than 310 yards of offense per game, and also ranked among the nation's top 25 in rush defense (128.7 pg).

The Lumberjack defense was at the top of the conference in 2010 as well. SFA led the league in total defense during conference games surrendering less than 317 yards per game. Senior linebacker Jabara Williams and Kenneth Charles received numerous All-America honors, and Williams was once again named as a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award. The 2010 season also marked the second consecutive year that SFA had a player named league defensive player of the year (Tim Knicky and Jabara Williams).

In addition to the NFL selections, several athletes have received individual honors under Gibbs' guidance. A former All-American during his playing days, Gibbs has coached 37 all-conference selections, including 13 firstteam honorees, 21 All-Americans, two SLC Defensive Players of the Year and two league newcomers of the year.

Gibbs came to SFA from Texas A&M-Commerce where he was the defensive coordinator for one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Lions finished 31st in the country in total defense, and 26th in run defense, while helping guide Commerce to its first LSC North Division title in school history. Gibbs' defense produced six first-team all-conference selections, including the conference defensive lineman of the year, and two all-region honorees.

Gibbs began his coaching career in 1989 as a student assistant at SFA, before being promoted to defensive tackle coach, where he served for the next six seasons. During his final five seasons, Gibbs also took on the role of recruiting coordinator and helped bring in some of the biggest names to wear the Lumberjack uniform.

During that time, SFA had five nationally ranked teams, including two top-five squads (1989 and 1995). The 'Jacks set a school record for wins (12 in 1989), recorded their highest finish in the NCAA Division I-AA poll (3rd in 1989), won an SLC title and advanced to the finals of the 1989 Division I-AA playoffs and the semifinals of the 1995 playoffs.

During his playing days, Gibbs was a member of one of the best defenses in school history. A four-year letterman, Gibbs wrapped up his collegiate career by earning first-team All-America honors.

Gibbs received two bachelor's degrees from SFA. He and his wife, Katy, have two sons, Benjamin and Harrison.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/ OFFENSIVE LINE

EIGHTH SEASON

LSU, 1992

Truax enters his eighth season on the 'Jacks' coaching staff and his sev-

enth coaching the Lumberjack offensive line. He also takes over as the Lumberjack offensive coordinator for the 2013 season. Truax will be in charge of an offense that returns senior quarterback Brady Attaway. The Whitehouse, Texas native sparked an offense that led the nation in passing through the 2012 regular season, and finished second overall. The Lumberjacks also finished second in total offense last season.

Truax's lines constantly rank among the nation's leaders in pass protection despite the quarterbacks being at, or near the top, in pass attempts. The 'Jacks have been

ranked in the top 20 in pass protection each of the past four seasons, and among the nation's top 10 in three of the past four years. The 'Jacks led the nation in pass protection in 2011 despite attempting nearly 550 passes. Truax has coached 19 All-SLC athletes, including three first-team selections. Among these, Truax has had five All-America honorees, including John Steel who closed out his career by earning honorable mention All-America honors last season. In addition to the individual honors, former linemen Brock Pasteur, and 2011 All-American George Bias, signed NFL free agent contracts. Both Pasteur and Bias signed with the Tennessee Titans.

The 2010 campaign marked the second consecutive season that SFA led the nation in passing offense. The offensive line protected quarterback Jeremy Moses who was a unanimous All-America selection, and the school's first-ever Walter Payton Award winner.

Truax made his way to SFA after spending four seasons at Northwestern State serving as the associate head coach and co-offensive coordinator. During his time in Natchitoches, Truax helped produce one of the more potent offenses in the SLC. In 2004, the Demons finished second in the league averaging more than 33 points per game, more than 400 yards of total offense per contest and won a share of the SLC title.

A 18-year college coaching veteran, Truax has left a paper trail of success as a coach. He helped McNeese State reach the 1997 Division I-AA National Championship game. The Cowboys compiled a 48-17 (.738) record with two SLC titles, a trip to the 1997 NCAA FCS National Championship game and a 1995 FCS semifinal appearance while Truax was on staff. Truax also coached three future NFL players, four All-Americans, six All-SLC picks and three Academic All-Americans during his time in Lake Charles.

Truax graduated with his bachelor's degree from LSU in 1992. He and his wife, Michelle, are the parents of Lexie, the late Harold Christopher and daughter, Tatum (3).

Troy ROGERS



OUTSIDE RECEIVERS SECOND SEASON

SFA, 1999

Troy Rogers is entering his second season on the Lumberjack coaching staff. He came to the Piney Woods

following a 13-year career in the high school and assistant head he served as an offensive coordinator and assistant head coach at Lewisville High School, and offensive coordinator at Clear Creek High.

Rogers impact on the Lumberjack receivers could be felt among opposing defensive coordinators throughout following a 13-year career in the high school ranks where

Rogers produced two all-conference selections, and one All-American.

Senior Cordell Roberson took his ability to another level under Rogers' guidance. Roberson led the league, and finished among the national top 10 in catches (8.56 pg) and receiving yards (111.8) per game. Already one of the school and conference's all-time leading receivers entering his final season. Roberson finished his career as the school's all-time leader in receptions, receiving yards and touchdown catches, and also set a new conference mark for career touchdown receptions. Following the season, Roberson garnered first-team all-conference honors for a third consecutive year and was named to numerous All-America squads. Before season's end, Roberson was named as a finalist for the Walter Payton Award before injuries kept him out of the lineup in two of the final three games.

Rogers' ability to produce results was evident in his first season at CCHS. He assisted with a team that was 0-10 the year before, and helped them advance to the playoffs in the next four seasons. That offense scored 28 more touchdowns in his first season than in the previous campaign. Clear Creek also won its first playoff game since 1962. Rogers' offenses have produced several 5A all-state selections, including Drew Tate, who set the 5A all-time passing mark in 2002.

During his time in the high school ranks, Rogers help produce nine playoff teams over a 13-year span, and coached numerous all-state athletes.

Following his stay in Baytown, Rogers spent two seasons as the offensive coordinator at Lewisville High School. He has also made stops at Baytown Lee and Copperas Cove before coming to SFA.

Rogers, and his wife, Zoey, are both graduates of SFA. Rogers received his bachelor's degree from SFA in 1999. He graduated from Tarleton State with a master's in educational administration in 2002.

Jake MORRISON



DEFENSIVE TACKLES THIRD SEASON

McNeese State, 2001

Jake Morrison was named an assistant football coach May 10, 2011,

and is entering his second season working with the defensive tackles. Morrison joined a staff whose defense led the Southland Conference in 2010, and had produced at least one All-America selection in the two previous seasons, a trend that has continued each of the past two seasons.

Despite the loss of All-American Kenneth Charles, Morrison moved Jefferson from the offensive side of the ball to defensive end. He responded by setting school and conference records for sacks in a game, earning SLC Newcomer of the Year honors, and being named to several All-America squads. In addition to Jefferson, Malcolm Mattox garnered second-team all-conference recognition. The duo was a huge reason SFA led the nation in sacks and tackles for losses in 2011.

A former assistant coach in the Southland Conference, Morrison comes to Stephen F. Austin from La Marque High School where he spent the past season as the defensive coordinator, and worked with the team's linebackers. Prior to his stop at La Marque, Morrison spent three seasons on the staff at McNeese State where he helped lead the Cowboys to consecutive conference titles. During his time in Lake Charles, Morrison worked with the Cowboys' defensive line.

As a member of the Cowboys' staff, Morrison coached four All-SLC players, including third-round draft choice Brian Smith. A first-team All-American, Smith was named the league MVP and was invited to play in the Hula Bowl.

Morrison got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant at Northwestern State. During his two seasons in Natchitoches, he helped coach the Demons to the 2004 conference title and a berth in the playoffs.

Morrison received his masters degree from Northwestern State in 2005. He graduated with his bachelor's degree from McNeese State in May 2001. He was a fouryear letterwinner with the Cowboys, and guided them to the 1997 SLC Championship and a spot in the national championship game. A first-team all-conference and All-America selection, Morrison set the school sack record in 2000.

Kevin CARBERRY



DEFENSIVE ENDS
SECOND SEASON

Ohio, 2005

Kevin Carberry is coming off a very productive first season as the Lumberjacks defensive ends coach. In just one season, Carberry produced

the league's top-two defensive ends in Willie Jefferson and Darren Robinson. Both first-team All-Southland selections, Jefferson capped the year earning All-America honors and being named the CFPA FCS Elite Defensive Performer, while Robinson garnered his all-conference recognition after sitting out the 2011 campaign due to injuries.

From an outsiders perspective, one might think that Carberry was just fortunate to have a returning All-American heading into 2012. But Carberry was placed in the unenviable position of replacing 2011 All-SLC selection Malcolm Mattox who was moved to tackle last season. Mattox's move, along with the fact that Robinson didn't play a snap in 2011, presented numerous question marks entering the season.

The 'Jacks tandem of Jefferson and Robinson took no time to answer those questions. They finished they year one-two in the conference in sacks, and finished tied for seventh in the league in tackles for losses. Carberry joined the Lumberjack staff after spending the past three seasons as a graduate assistant coach at Kansas working with the Jayhawk defensive linemen and linebackers. Under Carberry's guidance the Jayhawks finished 26th in the nation in sacks, averaging better than 2.5 per contest.

Carberry helped produce some of the Big 12's top defensive talent during his time in Lawrence. Defensive ends Jake Laptad and Max Onyegbule combined for 23 tackles for losses in 2009, and Laptad was a two-time honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. Three players earned all-conference recognition during Carberry's stint with KU.

Prior to joining the collegiate ranks, Carberry spent three years as an assistant coach in the Illinois high school ranks. He was an assistant at Chicago's St. Rita High School during its run to the 2006 7A state title. He spent the next two seasons at St. Ignatius where he was a special teams coordinator, and in 2008 served as the team's defensive coordinator.

A four-year letterwinner at the University of Ohio, Carberry was the 2004 team captain. He earned all-conference honors during his senior season and was named to the 2004 Villages Gridiron Classic College All-Star game.

Carberry played professional football following his career at Ohio, which included stops with the NFL's Detroit Lions, Cleveland Browns and Carolina Panthers before spending the 2006 season with the Berlin Thunder of the

NFL Europe league. In 2007, Carberry played for the New York Dragons before closing out his playing career the following season with the Arena Bowl Champion Philadelphia Soul.

Carberry graduated with his bachelor's degree from Ohio in 2005. He received a master's in sports management from Kansas in 2010.

Nathan SCHNEIDER

LSU, 2007

Entering his fourth season at Stephen F. Austin, Nathan Schneider took on the responsibility of a more expand-

ed role last season. In addition to serving as the director of operations, Schneider moved to the sidelines where he coached the Lumberjack running backs.

Schneider's troops averaged nearly 120 yards per game last season, and rushed for 16 scores. Sophomore Gus Johnson had a breakout season becoming one of the league's elite backs. He earned first-team all-conference honors during a year that saw him average nearly 100 yards per game, and score 14 touchdowns. Johnson finished the year with five 100-yard games, including two 200-yard outings. He was named league player of the week, and a College Sporting News Weekly All-Star after carrying the ball 32 times for 215 yards and four touchdowns in the win over nationally ranked Central Arkansas.

Schneider will stay on the offensive side of the ball in 2013, but will work with the Lumberjack inside receivers.

Prior to moving to the sidelines, Schneider worked directly with the football team, overseeing all aspects of academics and travel as the Lumberjacks' director of football operations.

A 2007 graduate of LSU, Schneider has spent the past year working in the Student-Athlete Academic Center at his alma mater. During that time, Schneider was directly involved with the LSU football team coordinating class check schedules, and supervising the team's study hall. He also assisted the coaching staff with on-campus recruiting.

Prior to his time at LSU, Schneider spent four seasons at University High School as an assistant football and baseball coach. During his final season at UHS, he also worked as an administrative assistant in the Louisiana State Senate.

Schneider received his bachelor's degree from LSU in May 2007. He graduated with a Masters of Kinesiology from LSU in May 2009, and is currently working toward a master's in public administration.

Jeremy MOSES



QUARTERBACKS SECOND SEASON

SFA, 2011

One of the most decorated players in Stephen F. Austin history, Jeremy Moses returns to his alma mater as an

assistant coach. The first player in school or Southland Conference history to win the Walter Payton Award, Moses will coach the SFA quarterbacks after spending last season working with the inside receivers.

Moses enters the 2013 season with the advantage of working with a senior quarterback in Brady Attaway.

Moses and Attaway already have a strong understanding of each other's strengths. Attaway served as the backup to Moses during the 'Jacks' 2010 Southland Conference title run.

Named to numerous All-America teams during his collegiate career, Moses rewrote the school and conference record books on his way to being named the NCAA FCS National Player of the Year. A two-time SLC Player of the Year selection, Moses left SFA as the NCAA's all-time leader in completions at the FCS level. He also became the first player in Southland history to receive the Walter Payton Award, an award given to the national player of the year.

Moses' biggest career highlight did not come in the form individual honors, but team gains. Moses was a key factor in helping SFA transform itself from an 0-11 program in 2007, to a top-10 team that won the conference title two years later. The following season the Lumberjacks rattled off another top-10 campaign and their second-straight conference title. It was the first time in school history SFA recorded back-to-back conference titles.

Following his playing career, Moses spent one season at North Alabama as an assistant on Terry Bowden's coaching staff. The 2011 SFA graduate is married to the former Jessica Miller.

Devin DUCOTE



DEFENSIVE BACKS
SECOND SEASON

SFA, 2011

Following a four-year playing career as one of the top linebackers in the Southland Conference, Devin Ducote

is now on the sideline as an assistant coach. He begins his second season as an assistant coach with the Lumberjacks, and his first working with the Lumberjack secondary.

During Ducote's four years on campus, he overcame significant injuries to be a member of one of the strongest linebacking corps in school history. The Baton Rouge, La., native was the leader of the SFA defense helping SFA go from an 0-11 in 2007, to a conference championship just two years later. The Lumberjacks followed up their first conference championship in 10 years, by repeating as conference champions in 2010. It was the first time in program history an SFA team repeated as conference champions.

A three-time All-Southland Conference selection, Ducote garnered second-team all-conference honors after a sophomore season that saw him lead the league and finished tied for second in the nation in tackles. For an encore, Ducote closed out his career by helping the Lumberjacks lead the nation in sacks and tackles for losses. Ducote left SFA recording 407 career tackles, including 175 solo stops. He was also credited with 33 tackles for losses, 5.5 sacks, recovered 10 fumbles and intercepted 10 passes.

Ducote received his bachelor's degree from Stephen F. Austin in May 2011.

Dan **EASON**



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING 13TH SEASON

Southwest Missouri State, 1995

Dan Eason is in his 13th season in charge of the Lumberjacks' strength and conditioning program. During

Eason's time in Nacogdoches, he has helped strengthen the 'Jacks with his workout programs. That fact was no more evident that in the 2009-10 academic year when the Lumberjacks won the 2009 Southland Conference title, in addition to five othere sports who brought home titles to lock up the 2010 Commissioner's Cup – the first in program history. SFA became only the second school to sweep the men's, women's and all-sports trophies since its inception. The university followed that up by winning the men's all-sports trophy in 2010-11. The following season SFA recorded its second Commissioner's Cup in three years, and won the men's all-sports trophy last season, making SFA the league's strongest department in the past three years.

A 1995 graduate of Southwest Missouri State, Eason joined the SFA program after one season as a strength coach at the University of Central Florida. Eason also spent two years as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach and coordinator of sports nutrition at the University of Tennessee from 1998-2000.

The former Southwest Missouri State letterman also spent two seasons as the defensive line and strength coach at Chowan College from 1996-2000.

Eason's undergraduate degree is in dietetics, and he holds a master's degree in human performance and sport studies from the University of Tennessee.

Eason, and his wife Angel, have a daughter, Violet.

SFA had to wait an extra day to start the 2012 season, but they got the win beating Southwestern Oklahoma, 49-14 in Homer Bryce Stadium. The 'Jacks jumped out to a 28-0 first-half lead and never looked back scoring 49 unanswered points before SWOSU cracked the scoreboard. It marked the first points surrendered by a Lumberjack defense since the fourth guarter of the game against Southeastern Louisiana last season (117 minutes, 16 seconds).

SFA held the Bulldogs to 206 yards of total offense, including just five on the ground. Sophomore Darren Robinson had a successful return to the field after sitting out all of last season with an injury finishing with six tackles, including two for losses and 1.5 sacks.

Junior Brady Attaway finished the night completing 21-of-37 passes for 354 yards and three touchdowns, while SFA racked up 517 yards of total offense. Senior Cordell Roberson caught eight passes for 100 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Gus Johnson recorded a career-high with his 10 carries for 107 yards and two touchdowns.

The Lumberjacks had a chance to steal back some of the momentum heading into the locker room, but SMU blocked a field goal attempt and returned it for a touchdown. Despite outgaining SMU, 466-328, SFA was unable to crack the scoreboard in the second half.

Trailing by 24 points midway through the third, the 'Jacks began chipping away at the lead, pulling within four, 41-37, with 8:35 remaining. SFA forced a fumble on the ensuing Bobcat possession but couldn't convert it into points. SFA got the ball back with two minutes remaining, but the drive stalled as time expired.

SFA finished the game with 505 yards of total offense. Attaway finished the night completing 44 passes for 385 yards and three touchdowns, and moved to fifth on the school's all-time completions list. Roberson recorded his third 100-yard receiving effort of the season hauling in 10 passes for 109 yards and two scores. Sophomore Gus Johnson added 15 carries for a career-high 105 yards rushing and two touchdowns. He also hauled in his first career TD reception.

SFA didn't make its fans wait long for the outcome of its Homecoming contest against Nicholls State. The 'Jacks scored 31 unanswered points to open the game and recorded a 44-10 victory over the Colonels. The 'Jacks moved to 3-4/2-1 on the season.

Junior quarterback Brady Attaway completed 41 passes for 474 yards and five touchdowns, while SFA rolled up 575 yards of total offense, nearly doubling the Colonels' output (275). It marked the third time this season Attaway has thrown for at least 400 yards in a contest. He also recorded the fourth-best single-game mark in school history with his 41 completions.

Freshman DJ Ward hauled in nine catches for 111 yards and a touchdown. Ward was one four 'Jacks to catch a touchdown pass from Attaway, including Aaron Thomas who hauled in two TD receptions. Roberson finished the day with six catches for 85 vards.

While the SFA offense was busy moving the ball up and down the field, the 'Jacks defense made sure Nicholls' offense was ineffective. The Colonels had the ball for nearly six minutes longer than SFA but the visitors could only muster 287 yards of total offense. The defene recorded 10 tackles for losses and four sacks on the night.

That would be the last score for more than 15 minutes as the Cowboys tacked one last score after an SFA interception.

Attaway completed a stadium record 42 passes for 378 yards and two scores. SFA rolled up 529 yards of total offense, while holding the Cowboys to 368. Freshman Aaron Thomas had seven catches for 99 yards. The 'Jacks carried the ball 32 times for 151 yards.

Gus Johnson tied a single-game SFA record with four rushing touchdowns but the 'Jacks (4-6/3-3 SLC) dropped a 42-27 decision at Southeastern Louisiana. Johnson finished the night with 124 yards on 28 carries. He had scoring runs of 13, 4, 19 and 11. SFA recorded 380 yards of total offense, ending a streak of four-straight games of at least 500 yards of total offense. It was also the first time in 2012 SFA has been outgained.

The Lions jumped out to a 14-0 lead before SFA rallied to score 21 points in the final 6:30 of the half. The 'Jacks went into the locker

room up a point after blocking the PAT.

The Lumberjacks pushed their advantage back to seven points when Johnson tied the school record with his fourth rushing TD of the night but the lead was short lived as the Lions responded by closing out the quarter with 14 unanswered points, to reclaim the lead. SLU tacked on one final score with 6:45 remaining.

SFA finished the game with 210 yards on the ground. In addition to Johnson, Doug Gentry added 86 yards on 14 carries. Junior Brady Attaway and freshman Joe Minden rotated at quarterback. Attaway got the start and completed 10-of-22 passes for 69 yards, while Minden was 9-of-23 for 101 yards. The Lumberjack signal callers were picked off three times, and did not have a touchdown pass.

Gus Johnson recorded his second 200yard rushing game of the season as SFA closed out the 2012 campaign with a 34-17 victory over rival Northwestern State. It was the fourth consecutive victory over the Demons, and equals longest stretch of consecutive wins over Northwestern in program history (1983-86). SFA jumped out to a 10-0 lead, but

Northwestern State responded by holding SFA scoreless for the next 35:52. The Demons cracked the scoreboard at the end of the first quarter with a field goal and went on to score 17 unanswered to take a seven-point lead.

SFA battled back to tie the game at 17 when Attaway found junior Kris Lott wide open in the back of the end zone. SFA reclaimed the lead only five seconds into the fourth quarter when Johnson scored on an eight-yard run, finishing the night with 33 carries for 211 yards.

Senior Cordell Roberson helped ice the game when he caught a 38-yard pass in traffic for a score. It was the 39th touchdown reception of his career tying him for 12th all-time at FCS level. The 'Jacks tacked on a field goal in the final minutes to close out the scoring.

SFA's offense finished the night with 533 yards, while the defense was impressive surrendering only 205. Attaway completed 37 passes for 326 yards, while Roberson had three catches for 55 yards and the score.

The 1989 season was the most successful in SFA history. SFA's 12 wins were the most for a Lumberjack team in a single season, and the Southland Conference title was the first outright conference football championship in school history. The Lumberjacks also became the first team in school history to play for a national championship, but lost at Georgia Southern in the I-AA title game before a national television audience (ESPN). SFA finished the season ranked third in the NCAA I-AA poll, the highest final ranking ever for a Lumberjack team.

Two losses during the last three games by the Lumberjacks kept SFA from another NCAA post season playoff bid. While the Lumberjacks were perfect at home in 1997, they managed only a 1-3 record away from Homer Bryce Stadium.

SFA started the 2000 season as the defending SFL Champions and ranked in the top 20 in the nation. However, two close games against Division II schools gave the 'Jacks a glimpse of the struggles ahead for the 2000 season.

RB Derrick Blaylock stepped into the shoes of KaRon Coleman and turned in the second-best rushing season ever by an SFA back with 1,382 yards. However, a defensive unit that gave up 366.5 yards per game of offense to their opponents proved to be the team's Achilles heel.

SFA did record several firsts with their first ever overtime game, overtime win and the program's first win over a Division I opponent (Louisiana Tech). David Crocker also became the first ever 'Jack DB to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a single season.

The 2001 season ended the same way it began with a pair of losses. Sandwiched between was a 6-1 streak that saw SFA enter the final conference game of the season with a chance to win a share of the SFL title. The season ended with a tough 58-3 loss to Texas Tech after a mid-September game when Northern lowa was wiped off the schedule due to the terrorist attacks on 9/11.

OB Wes Pate threw for 2,626 yards on the season, the second-highest single season total in SFA history. SS David Crocker also recorded 27 tackles in the loss to Northwestern State and ended the season with a team-high 112 tackles.

It also marked the first time since the 1991-92 seasons that the 'Jacks went two-straight years without winning more than six games.

It was a record-breaking afternoon at Homer Bryce Stadium as the third-ranked Lumberjacks had to come from behind to edge 13th rated Grambling State 59-56. The wild fourth quarter had a combined 50 points scored and 456 yards gained. SFA quarterback Todd Hammel set I-AA playoff and school records with his 517 passing yards and 539 yards of individual total offense. The 'Jacks led 7-6 after one quarter, but trailed at the half 27-21 and after three 34-31. Then came the fourth. Hammel tossed two quick TD passes to put SFA up 45-34. Grambling came back with a pair of touchdowns with two-point conversions sandwiched around another Hammel TD strike, cutting the 'Jack lead to 52-50. The 'Jacks held Furman on its first possession on fourth-and-one at the SFA 15, then let Todd Hammel do his duty on the next two possessions to take a 14-0 lead into the second quarter. As the snow and sleet fell harder, the 'Jacks allowed a Paladin touchdown before scoring their final touchdown on a Larry Centers 14-yard run for a 21-7 halftime lead. The 'Jacks and Paladins traded turnovers deep in the other's territory in the third. Furman found its snow treads in the fourth quarter, but a missed PAT kick after scoring early in the period left SFA up 21-13. As blizzard conditions took effect, Furman marched on a final drive culminating with a touchdown with 19 seconds left. Down two, the Paladins went for two, only to be stopped by the 'Jack defense to give SFA the victory.

1989 NCAA DIV. I-AA CHAMPIONSHIP

Dec. 16, 1989 • Statesboro, Ga. Georgia Southern 37, SFA 34

The third-ranked Lumberjacks played for a national championship for the first time in school history as they visited top-ranked Georgia Southern. It was the first time in NCAA history that the I-AA Championship Game was played at the home site of a participant as Statesboro began a three-year contract to host the game. Because of this, a then-I-AA championship game record crowd of 25,725 turned out along with an ESPN national television audience to see the 'Jacks battle the Eagles. It was a classic battle of the SFA passing game against the powerful running attack of Georgia Southern. The Eagles grabbed an early 14-0 lead, but the 'Jacks battled back with a Hammel run and a pass to Larry Centers. GSC added two field goals, only to have SFA's Chuck Rawlinson add not one but two 53-yard field goals to knot the game at 20-all in the third. SFA jumped to its first lead with a Hammel pass to Joe Bradford, only to have the Eagles counter it. With three seconds gone in the fourth quarter, the game deadlocked at 27-all. Hammel broke the tie on SFA's next possession with a 46-yard strike to Centers to give the 'Jacks a 34-27 advantage. GSC came back to tie the game for a fourth time with 5:58 to play at 34-all. On the next series, Hammel threw an interception at the SFA 30. The Eagles then forced the ball down field. The 'Jacks kept them out of the endzone but not off the scoreboard, as a field goal with 1:41 to play tilted the game in favor of GSC. Hammel tried to pull it out, but was intercepted on fourth down, one of five interceptions for the Eagles in the game. It was a contest where SFA won a statistical battle with 422 total yards to 387, but lost the war.

John Pearce brought his 14th-ranked Lumberjacks to visit top-ranked Troy State, marking the 'Jacks' return as a national program. The Trojans took the opening drive in for an early lead, but the 'Jacks came back on Michael Pearce's touchdown catch from James Ritchey. But a blocked point after attempt foreshadowed things to come. Troy added another score, only to be matched by another Ritchey TD strike, this time to Kevin Goodwin. SFA failed on its attempt for the two-point conversion. TSU returned with another score to take a 21-12 lead into the half. It didn't take Troy State long to take complete control, as the Trojans took the second half kick off all the way for a score. TSU added two more scores before the 'Jacks added their final score. Troy State collected 402 yards of offense, while SFA tallied 325.

The Lumberjacks carried a No. 5 ranking into the 1995 playoffs and a home game with 12th-ranked Eastern Illinois. While the game was close, SFA never trailed in taking a 34-29 victory. The 'Jacks controlled the game through the air, with quarterback James Ritchey collecting 390 passing yards. SFA scored the first two touchdowns on the ground and added a Brian Minton field goal for 17 first half points. The Panthers got two second-quarter scores and a two-point conversion to trail 17-15 at intermission. It looked like EIU had carried the momentum from the half, when Panther Willie High (who had scored the two TDs) broke away on a 56-yard run. But cornerback Jason Speights stripped him of the ball on the tackle, and safety Ron Powell fell on it, giving the 'Jacks a break. Ritchey directed SFA to a pair of touchdowns on throws to Mikhael Ricks and added another field goal to go up 34-15. Eastern Illinois didn't give up and added two fourth quarter touchdowns before the 'Jacks' defense called it a game. SFA rolled up 491 yards of offense to 484 for the Panthers.

The number five Lumberjacks invaded Kidd Brewer Stadium at second-ranked Appalachian State as an underdog. But when they left, it was SFA that remained alive in the playoffs. The 'Jacks handed Appalachian State its only loss of the season, with a 27-17 triumph. The 'Jacks rode the shoulders of SFA's all-time leading rusher, Leonard Harris, for 180 yards and the triumph. After allowing ASU to post an early lead, the 'Jacks came back with two Brian Minton field goals and a Dameian Vallery TD run to a 13-10 advantage at the half. A fumble deep in ASU territory killed an SFA drive and gave the Mountaineers enough momentum to set up a five-play scoring drive in to snatch a 17-13 lead. With 6:45 remaining in the game, SFA held the ball on their own 26. Quarterback James Ritchey hit Chris Jefferson for 49 and nine yards to the ASU16, then handed it to Harris three times for the score to take a 20-17 lead. The defense held and sacked the ASU quarterback on fourth down. Harris accounts for all 30 yards needed in four plays and caped the scoring with a six-yard plunge. A final Mountaineer drive was snuffed by a Greg Axelrod interception and the 'Jacks advance again. SFA outgained Appalachian State in total yards 436 to 272 and in rushing 267 to 72.

The conditions and Grizzlies were too much for the fifthranked Lumberjacks as they fell to eighth-ranked, and eventual national champion, Montana 70-14 in a Missoula deep freeze. The temperature for the 10 a.m. Mountain kickoff (for a live national TV audience on Prime Sports) was six degrees with a wind chill of -15 degrees. The 'Jacks won the toss and took the first drive on the frozen field in for a Leonard Harris touchdown. Unfortunately, it

was SFA's only lead. Led by Walter Payton-award-winner Dave Dickenson, the Grizzlies came back quickly to tie the game then took a lead they would never relinquish. 'Jacks held tough in the bitter cold, as Harris pulled SFA within a score at 21-14 with 3:45 left in the half. However, Montana wasn't finished and added not one. but two scores using a quick passing game that caught the skidding 'Jacks' defenders out of position. As snow started falling in the second half and got heavier and heavier, the 'Jacks couldn't stop the Grizzlies, who kept adding to their lead. When it was over, Montana netted 669 total yards to just 264 for SFA.

SFA recorded its first postseason victory since the 1995 season with a 44-33 win over Eastern Washington at Homer Bryce Stadium in the opening round of the

NCAA FCS Playoffs. The 'Jacks took an 11-point lead into the locker room at halftime, and exploded in the second half. Junior quarterback Jeremy Moses guided SFA to back-to-back touchdowns to give SFA a commanding a 37-12 lead with 5:54 remaining in the quarter. The Jacks pushed their advantage to 25 points before the Eagles mounted a rally, but EWU could get no closer than 11 points.

The 'Jacks finished the game with 595 yards of total offense, while EWU recorded 563 yards. Moses completed 43-of-57 passes for 432 yards and four touchdowns, but also had three interceptions. Nicholls, the Big Sky Conference Player of the Year, was 43-of-76 for 461 yards and three touchdowns on the night.

Senior Duane Brooks who tied a school record with his 15 receptions for 124 yards, and also became the first player in SLC history to record 100 receptions in a season. Senior Vincent Pervis led the SFA ground attack with 16 carries for 125 yards. The SFA defense finished the night with five players in double figure tackles led by junior Jabara Williams 15 tackles.

SFA was unable to overcome 10 turnovers, as the Grizzlies rolled to a 51-0 victory at Washington-Grizzly Stadium in Missoula, Mont. The 'Jacks finished the season 10-3 overall, while the Grizzlies improved to 13-0. It was the first time SFA was shutout since 2007 (vs. #20 South Dakota State).

Turnovers were the story of the game as

Montana scored 38 unanswered points to start the game. SFA turned the ball over seven times in the first half, including three times inside the Grizzlies 20-yard line and one at the goal line. The top-seeded Griz made SFA pay for the mistakes taking a 38-point lead into the locker room.

The Lumberjacks were able to move the ball recording 220 yards of total offense in the first half, but were unable to dent the scoreboard.

The Grizzlies opened the scoring with a Brody McKnight 34-yard field goal at the 8:53 mark of the first quarter. Less than 2:30 minutes later, Montana tacked on its first of five opening-half touchdowns, when Chase Reynolds crossed the goal line on a three-yard run.

The Griz recorded 474 of total offense, while SFA finished the game with 280. Moses finished the game 22-of-34 for 204 yards, but had five interceptions. Senior Duane Brooks led all receivers with eight receptions for 54 yards. SFA was only able to manage 51 yards on the ground, led by senior Vincent Pervis who carried the ball eight times for 47 yards.

Senior quarterback Jeremy Moses set an NCAA FCS career record for completions but the Stephen F. Austin Lumberjacks lost to the defending National Champions, 54-24, Saturday afternoon at Homer Bryce

After jumping out to a 21-7 first quarter lead, the Lumberjacks struggled to hold on to the football and Villanova took advantage of the miscues. The Lumberjacks scored only three points on their next five possessions. which including an interception, and a fumble punt and kick return. Villanova seized the opportunity outscoring SFA, 27-3, over the next 16:33 to take a 10-point lead into the locker room. The Wildcats never trailed after that rattling off 40 unanswered points.

A two-time SLC Player of the Year and the school and conference all-time leading passer, Moses finished his career as the FCS all-time completions leader (1,184). It marked the first time since the 2009 playoff game at Montana that Moses did not record a touchdown pass.

Freshman running back Keith Lawson recorded all three of SFA's touchdowns on one-yard runs in the first quarter. He finished the night with 15 carries for 75 yards and the three scores. He also caught four passes for 25

Moses completed 33-of-51 passes for 340 yards. His favorite target was sophomore Cordell Roberson who hauled in nine passes for 71 yards.

Sophomore Josh Aubrev recorded a game-high 13 tackles, while seniors Sean Warren and Jabara Williams each added 10.

Play-by-play responsibilities will once again be handled by Assistant Athletics Director Rob Meyers. Meyers is entering his 17th season in Nacogdoches, but his eighth season behind the mic for the Lumberjacks.

A graduate of SFA, he joined the university staff after a 10-year career in radio and two years as editor-publisher of the East Texas Times. During his radio career, Meyers served as the news and sports director for several radio stations, including two in of for several radio stations, including two in the Lufkin/Nacogdoches market. Meyers also handles the play-by-play duties for the Lumberjack basketball team.

Newspaper Coverage

The Nacogdoches Daily Sentinel covers the Lumberjacks on a daily basis. Sports Editor Kevin Gore heads up the coverage, assisted by Brandon Ogden. Weekly features and columns highlight the achievements of SFA athletes, as well as keep track of statistics and standings for local readers.

The 'Jacks also receive considerable attention in the Tyler-Morning Telegraph and The Houston Chronicle. The student-run Pine Log newspaper also covers the 'Jacks on a twice-weekly basis.

Television Coverage

KTRE-TV, the local ABC affiliate in the Lufkin-Nacogdoches area, covers the Lumberjacks on a daily basis, providing viewers across East Texas with the latest news and information regarding the Lumberjack football team. The East Texas News on KTRE also highlights the accomplishments of one member of the Lumberjack football team each week in their weekly 'Jack of the Week feature.

The 2012 season marks the fifth year of the SLC-TV Network. In 2007, the SLC began streaming a 'game of the week' live over the internet. The conference covers a 'Game of the Week' on its SLC-TV Network. The 2013 television was not released at the time of print.

Tuesday is set aside as interview day and is the best day to talk with Lumberjack players. If a media agency needs a player interview on another day, it must be arranged through the Media Relations Office 24 hours in advance.

Credentials

All requests for credentials should be addressed to the SFA Media Relations Office. Requests for individual game credentials should be received in the office by 5 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to a home game. We prefer that these requests come via e-mail. Visiting media should make their requests through the visiting media relations office.

Credentials for members of the media covering visiting opponents will be mailed to that school's media relations director unless other arrangements are made in advance. Media parking is set aside in the southwest parking lot adjacent to Homer Bryce Stadium.

Credentials not mailed may be picked up in the SFA Media Relations Office until 4 p.m. on Fridays preceding home

The media will-call window is located in the elevator building just behind the SFA press box. The will-call window opens approximately 90 minutes prior to kickoff.

Stephen F. Austin State University follows the NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers are not allowed inside the team areas or on the playing field until after the conclusion of the contest. Sideline credentials are required.

Gameday Operations

The Stephen F. Austin pressbox facilities are managed on game days by members of the Media Relations Office. If you need any assistance, contact any member of the staff.

The first floor of the facility houses suites and a reserved seating section. The second floor is set aside for members of the working media, as well as radio, TV and coaches' booths.

Visiting Radio Phone Lines

Visiting radio stations will have the use of two courtesy phone lines. All long distance charges are the responsibility of the using party. If additional lines are needed, or special requests must be filled, call the media relations office to make arrangements.
