Easy to Access

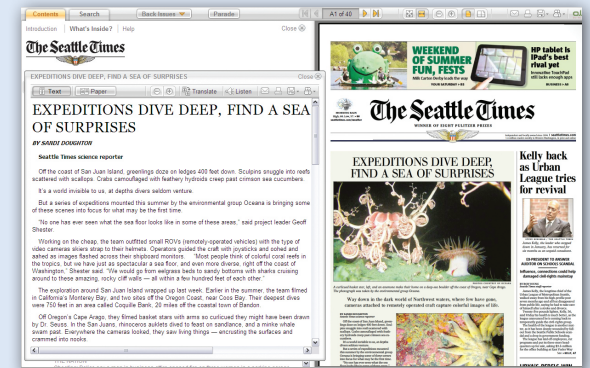
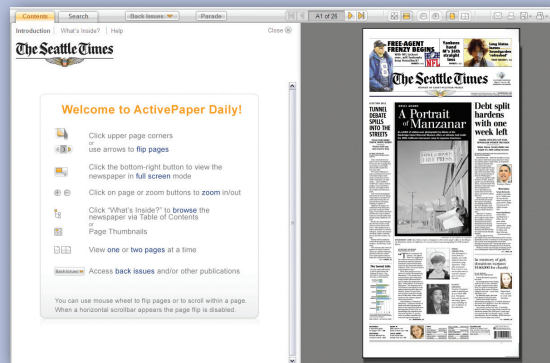
Viewing the latest edition is a snap! Log in from any computer with internet access to see each day's e-Edition, as well as an archive of the previous 14 editions.

To get started with your electronic edition (e-Edition) subscription, please follow these instructions:

STEP 1 To activate your e-Edition account, look for an email from our Customer Service department. This email will prompt you to create a user ID and password. Make sure your user ID and password are easy to remember and that you are comfortable sharing them, since your students will be using them to log in to your classroom e-Edition account.

Note: Your e-Edition account is different from most subscriber accounts, as it includes multiple licenses. These licenses allow all of your students to log in to The Seattle Times e-Edition at the same time, using the same user ID and password on different computers.

STEP 2 After you have set up your account, save the login page to your internet favorites — or log in using the “Access your e-Edition” link in the sidebar on the right side of the NIE website (seattletimes.com/nie).

STEP 3 The Help menu will teach you how to navigate the e-Edition. You can also request a PDF tutorial or an in-person training session that will walk you through the many features available, including the ability to print, email or download articles (or the entire paper).
